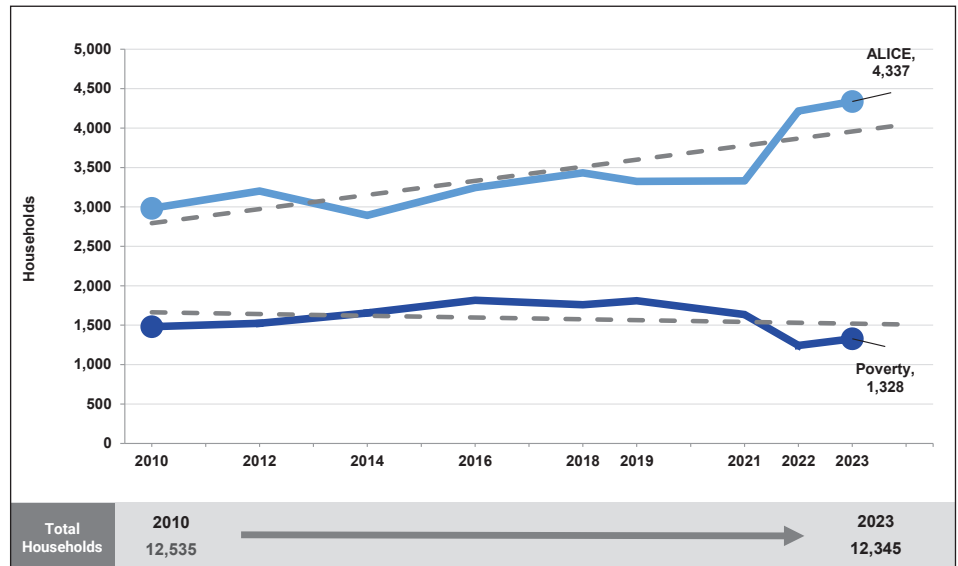

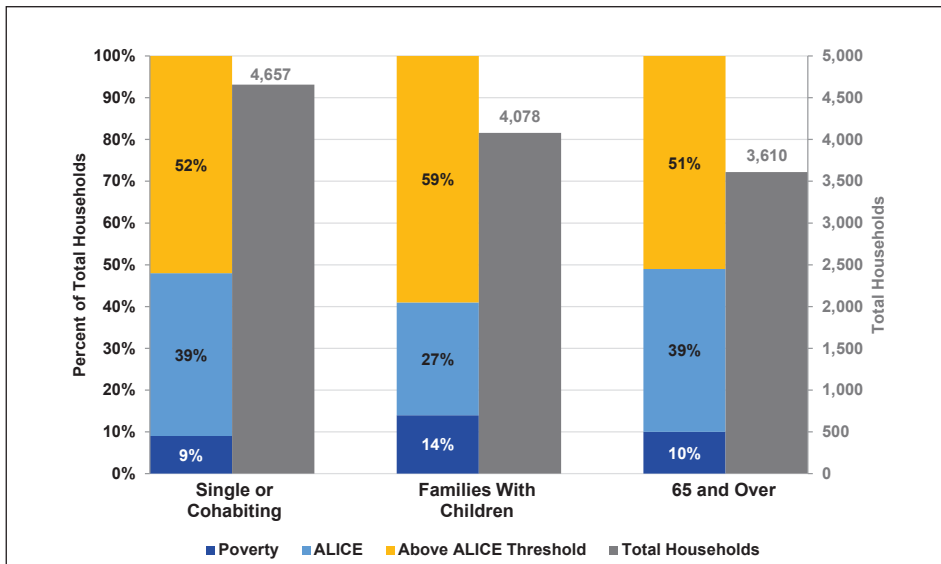

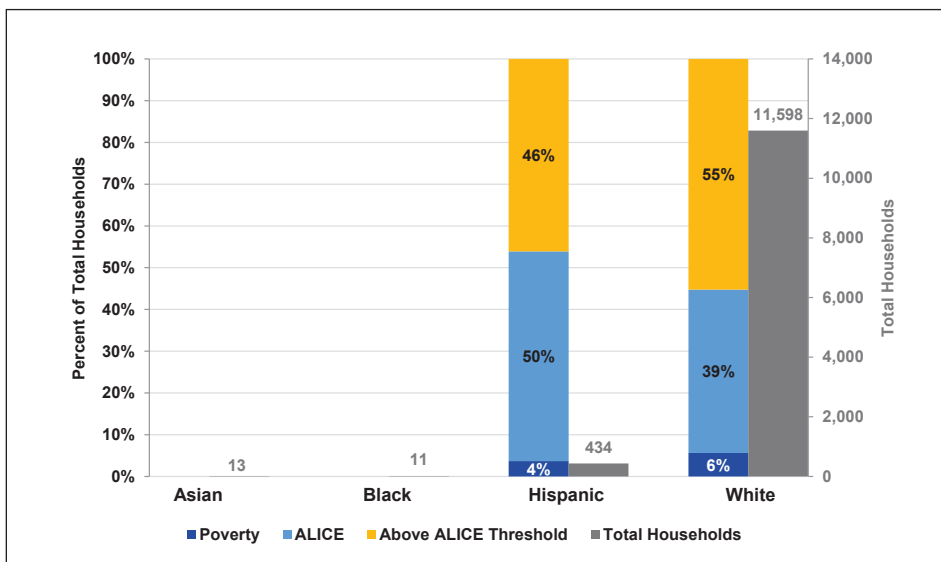
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Adams County, 2023

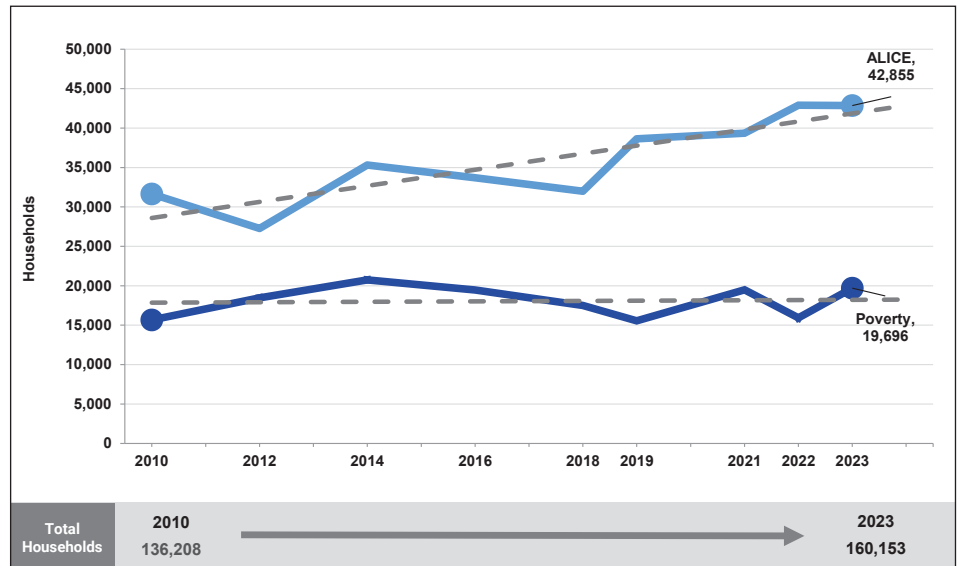

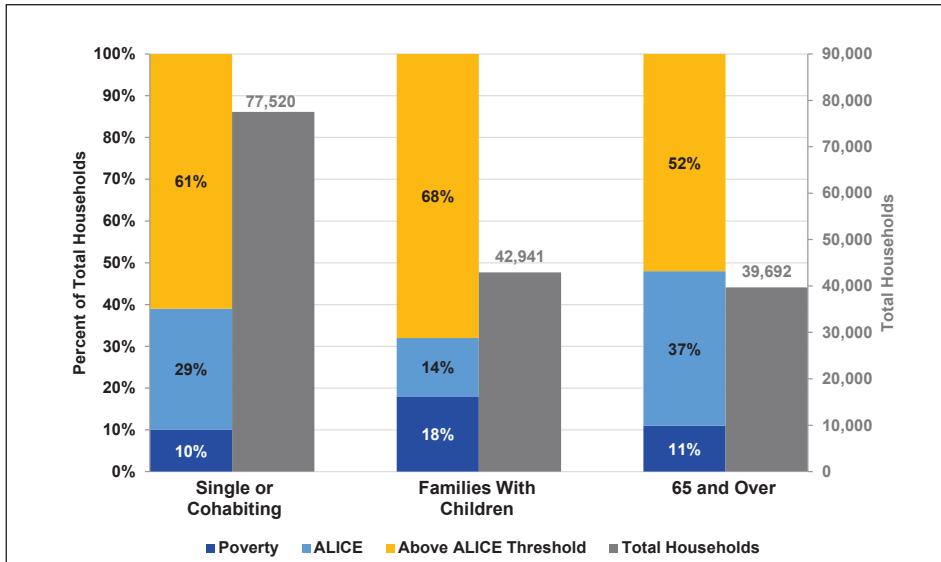

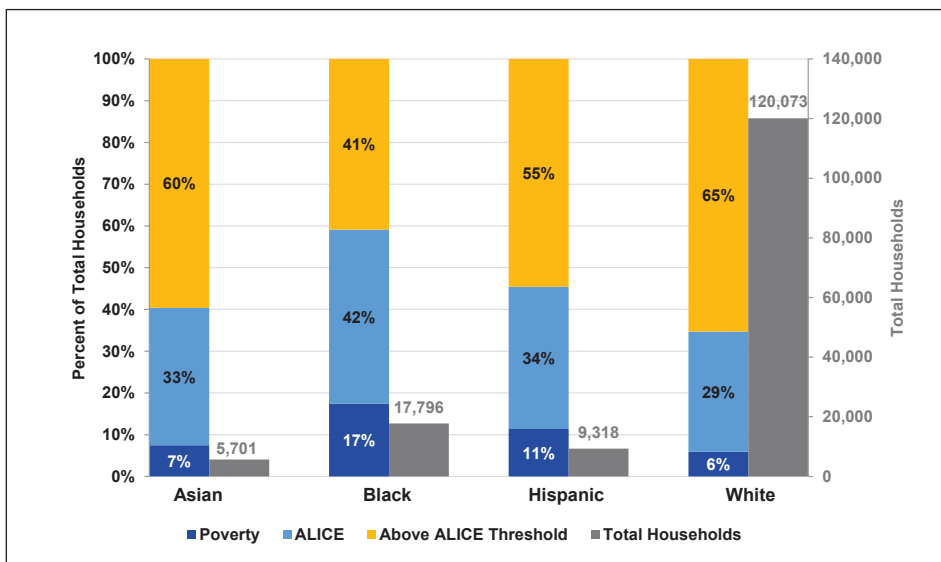
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Allen County, 2023

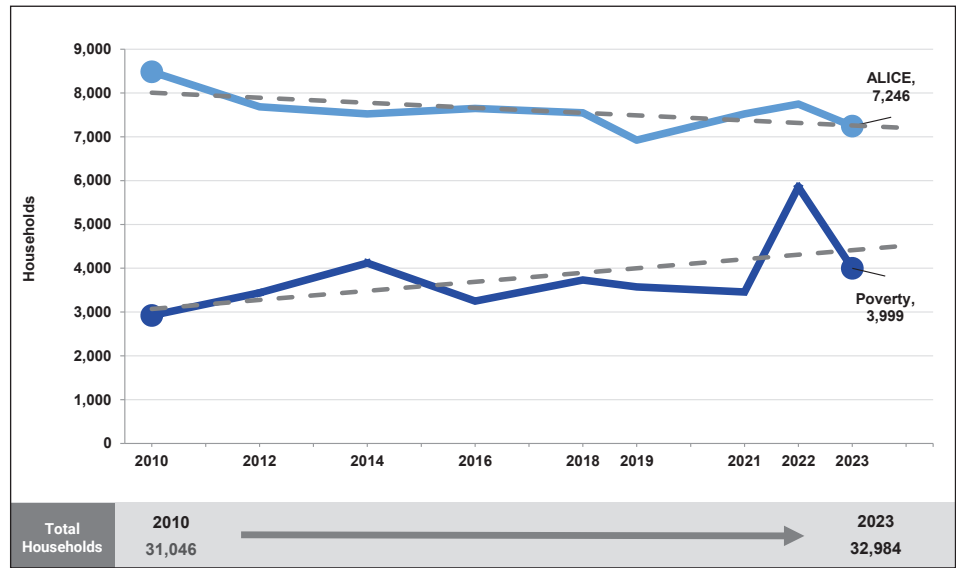

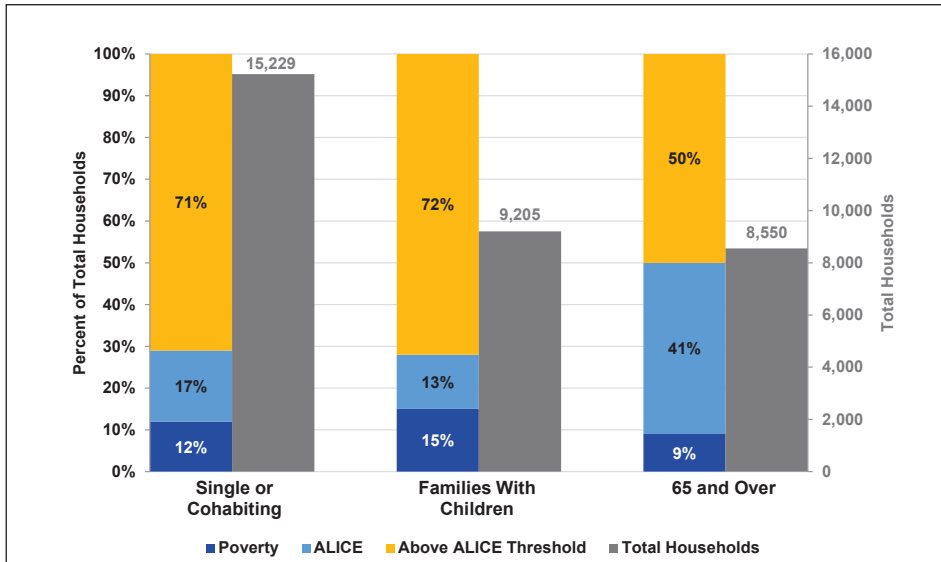

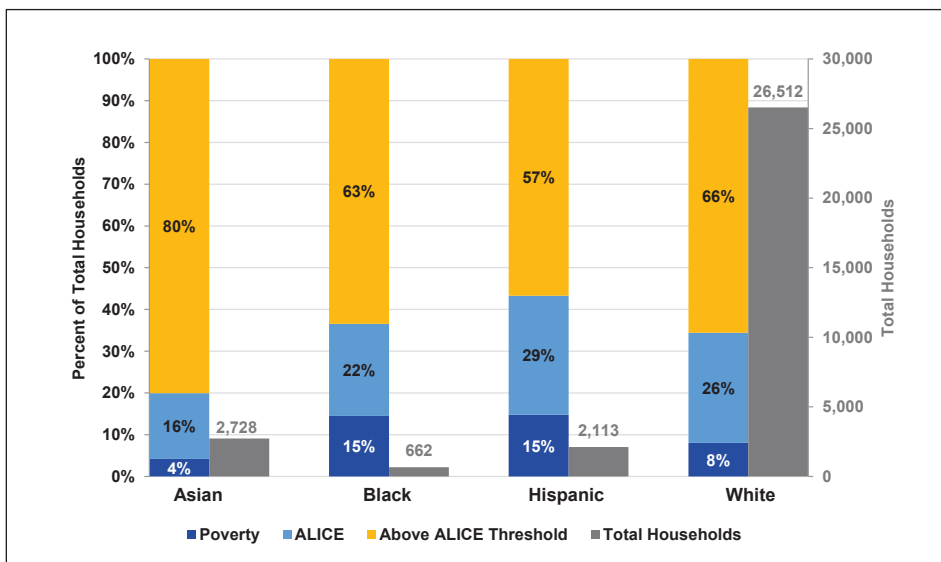
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Bartholomew County, 2023

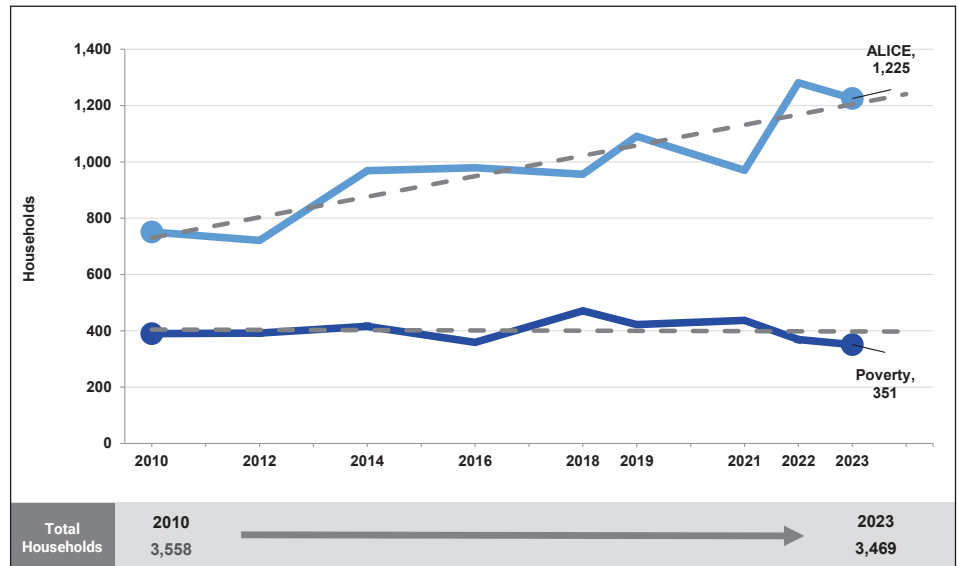

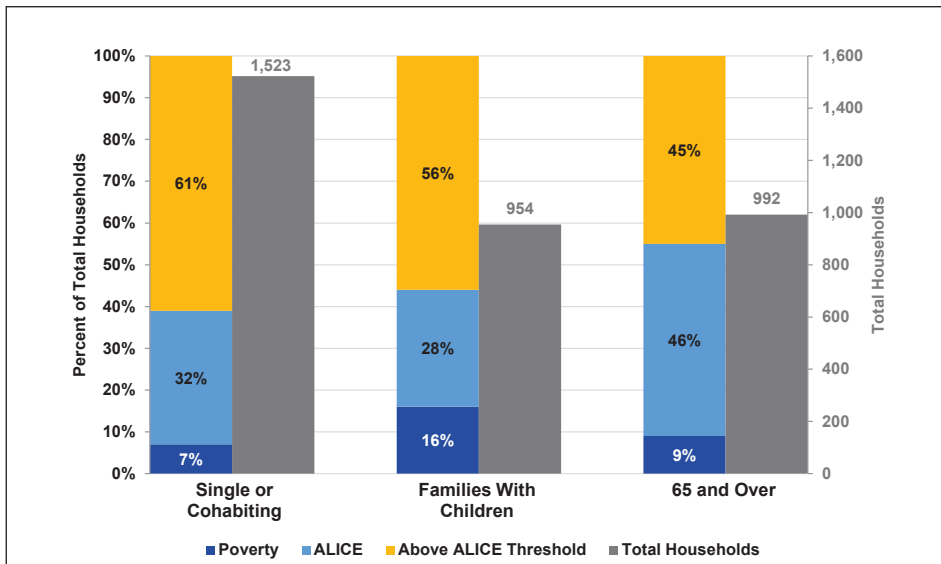

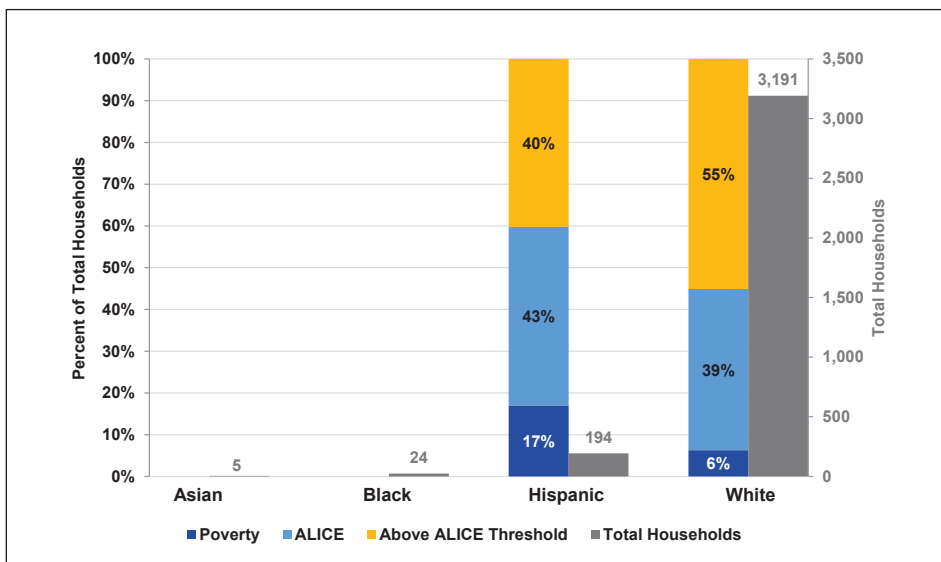
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Benton County, 2023

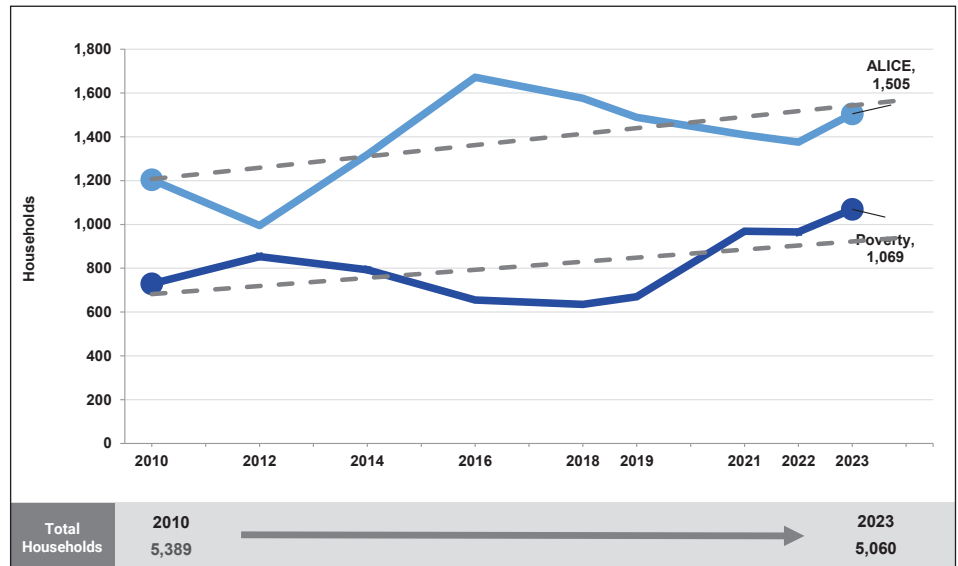

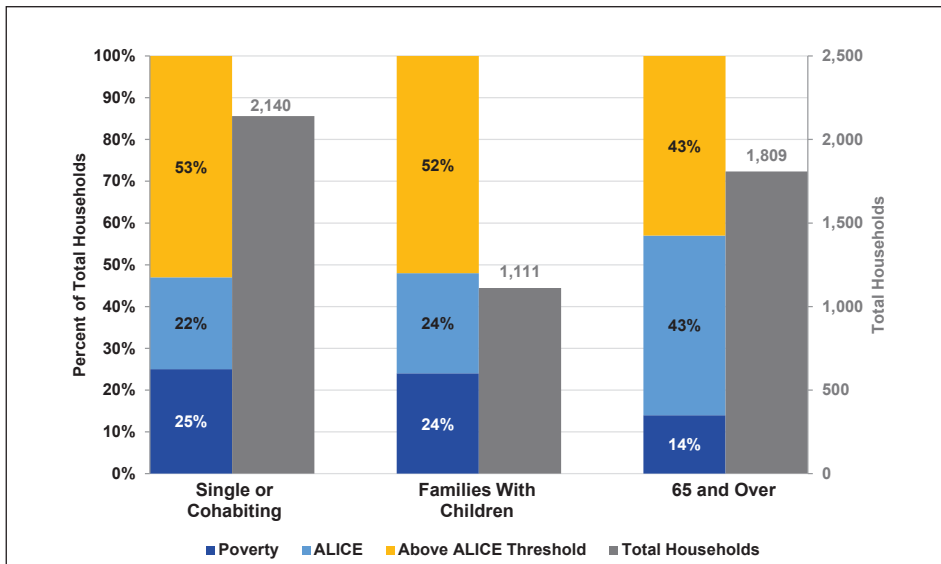

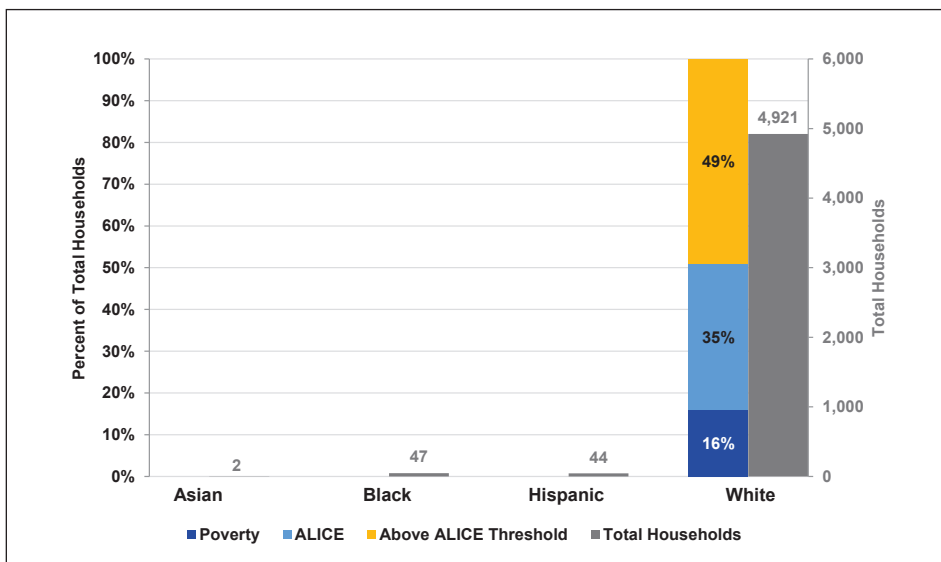
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Blackford County, 2023

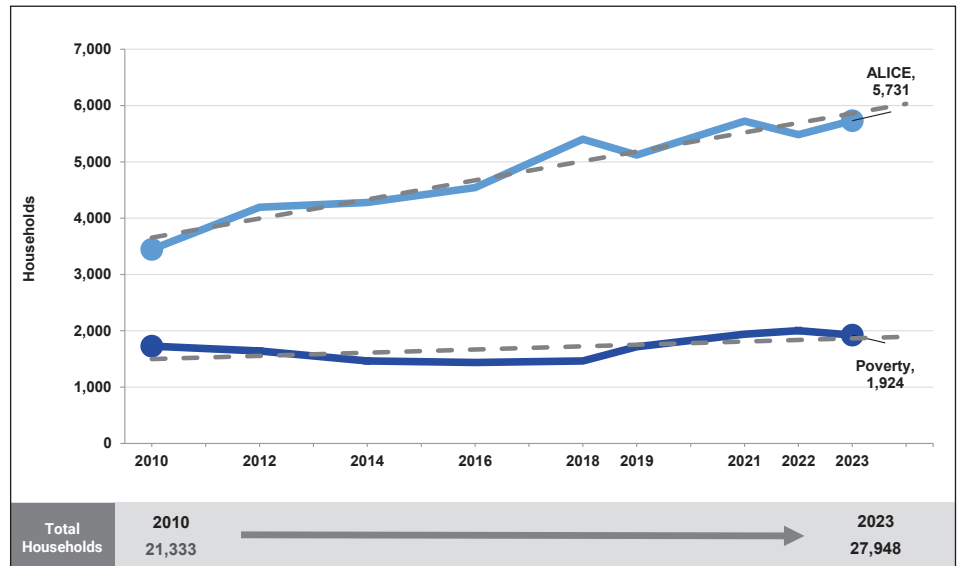

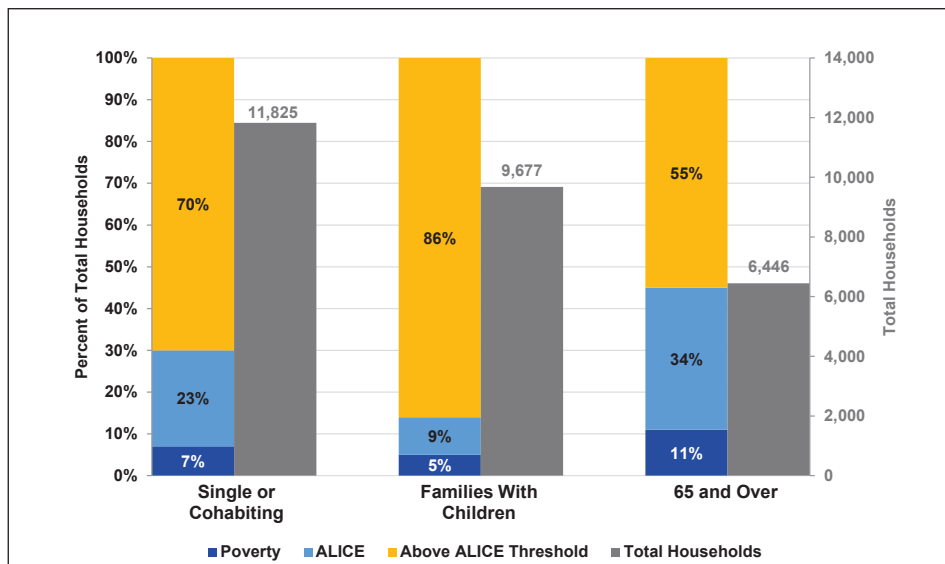

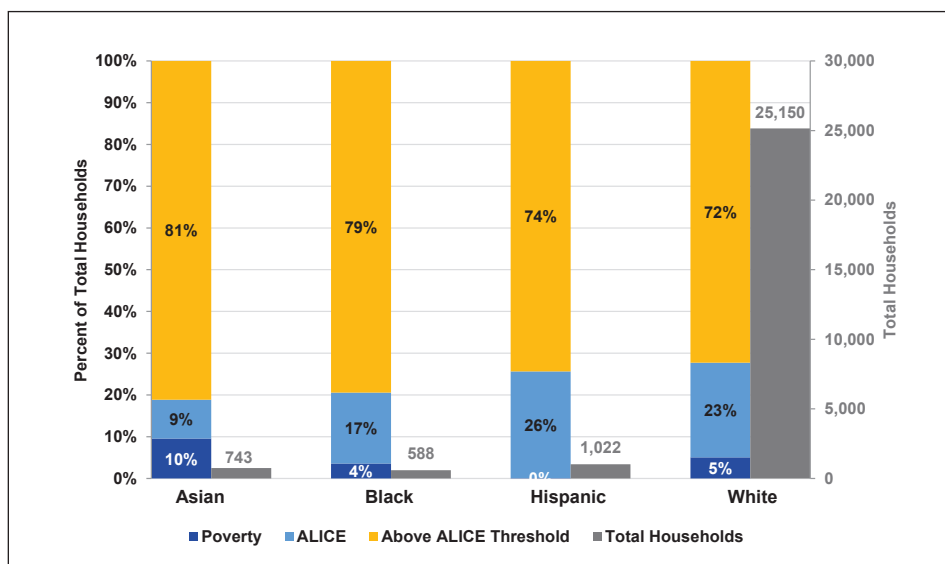
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Boone County, 2023

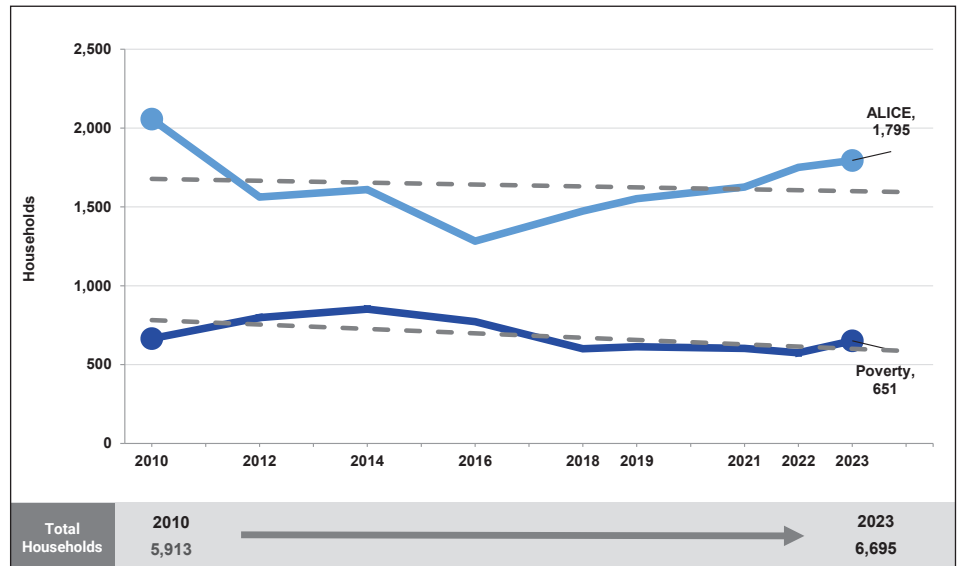

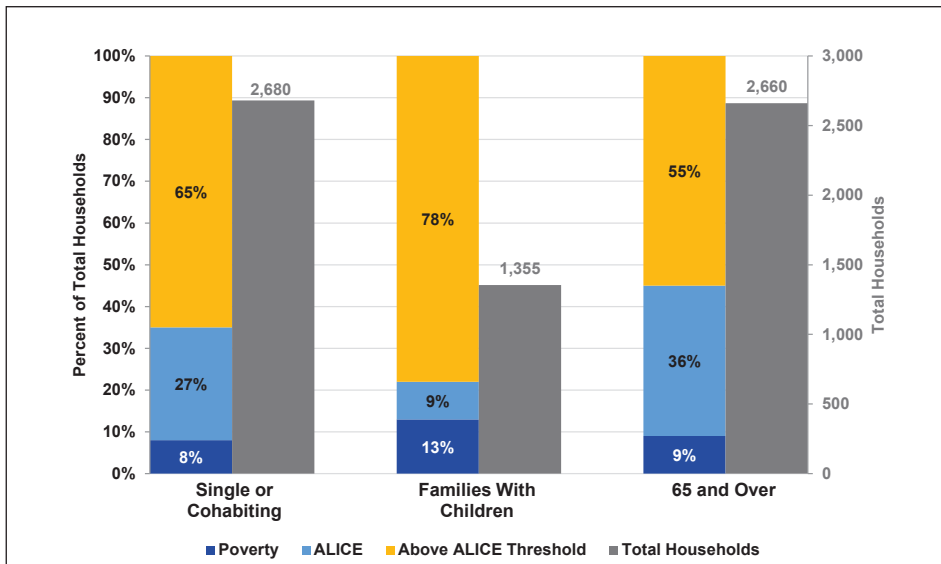

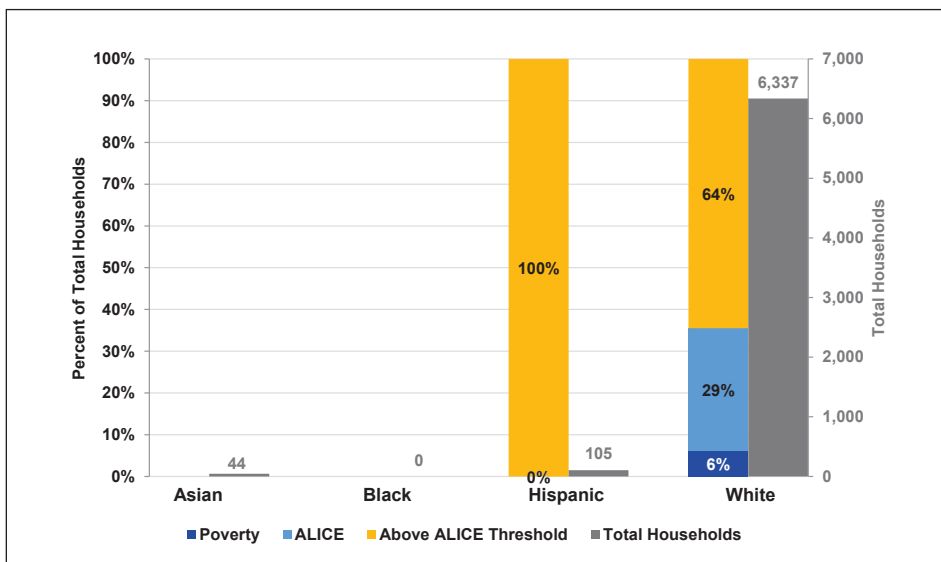
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Brown County, 2023

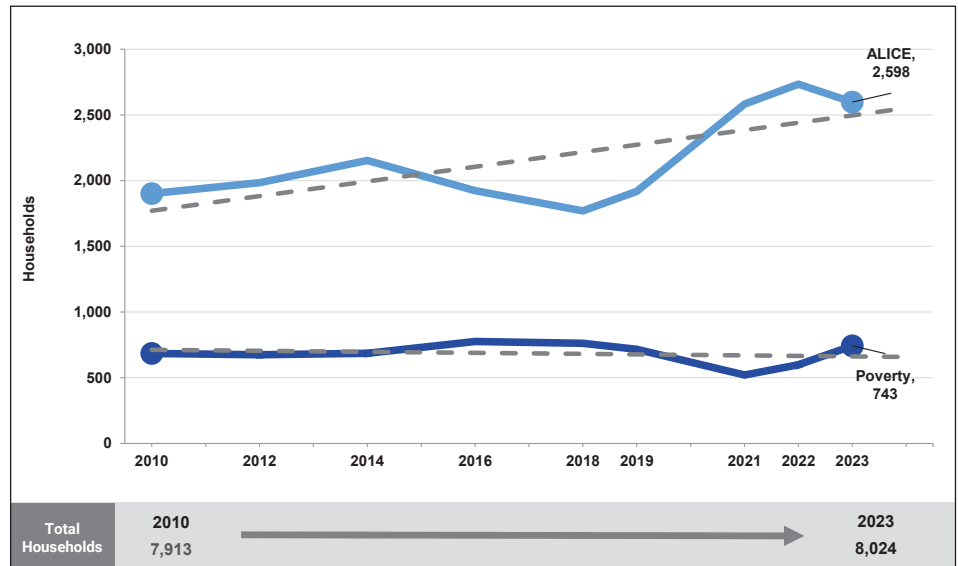

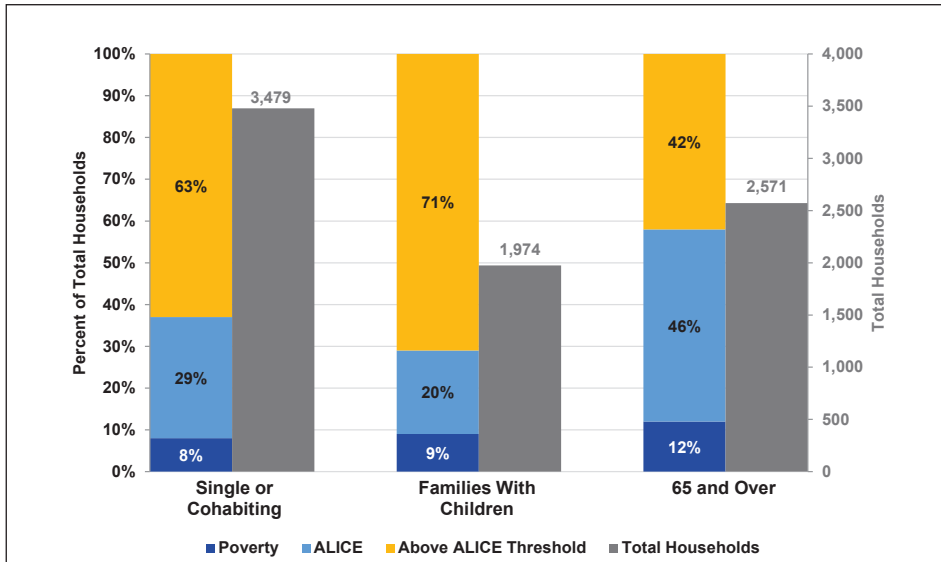

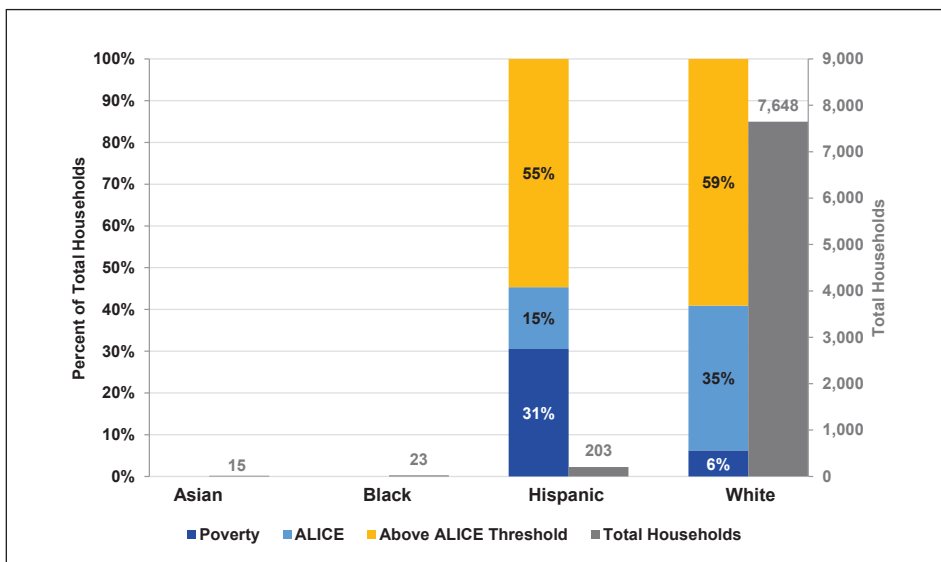
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Carroll County, 2023

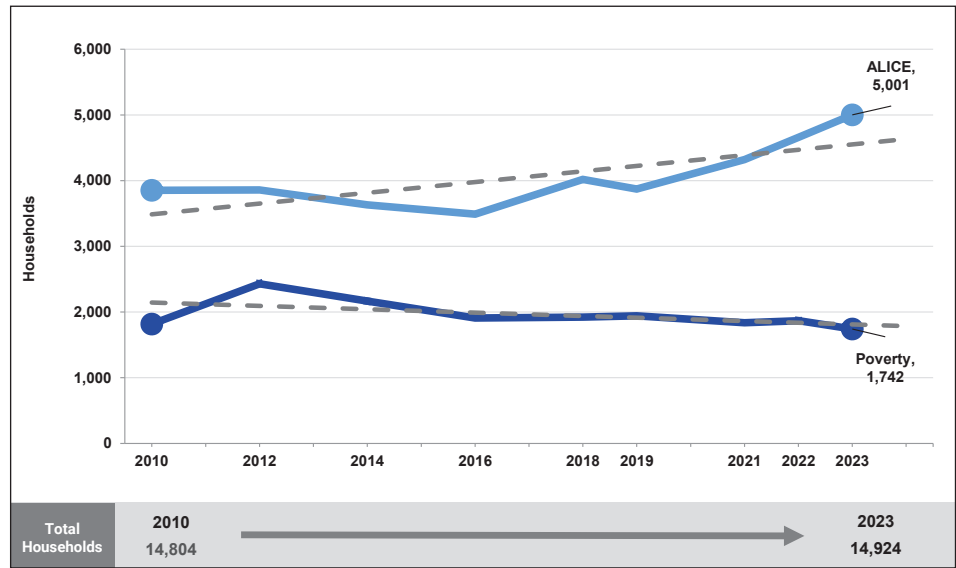

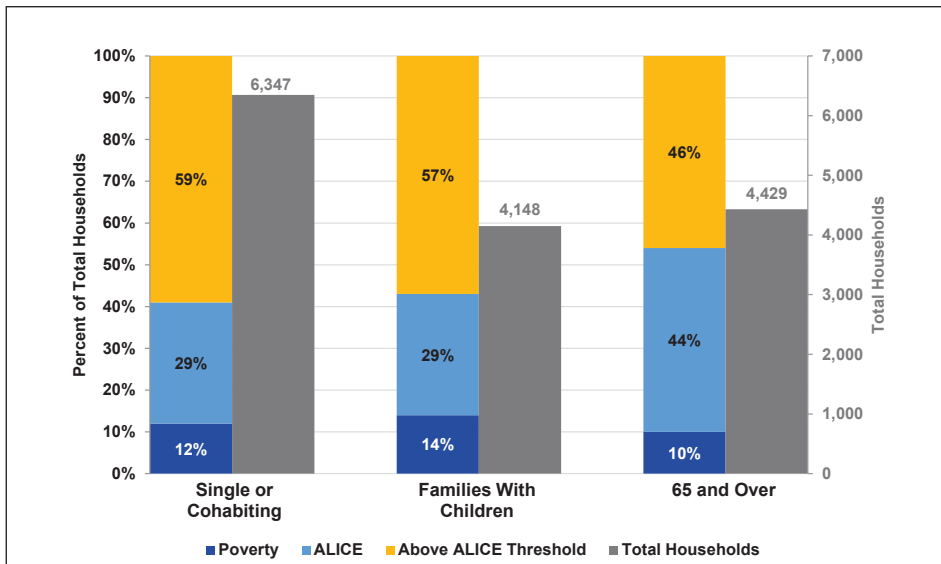

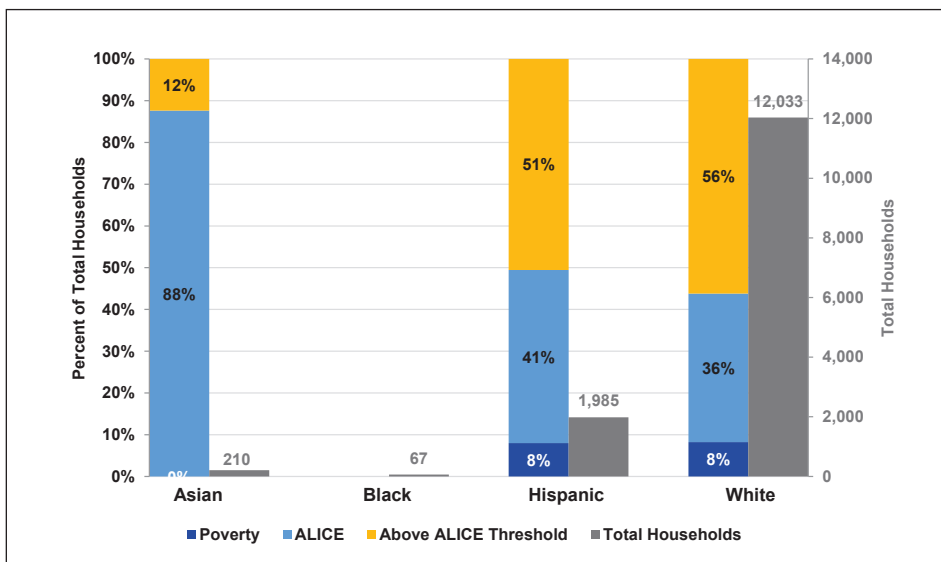
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Cass County, 2023

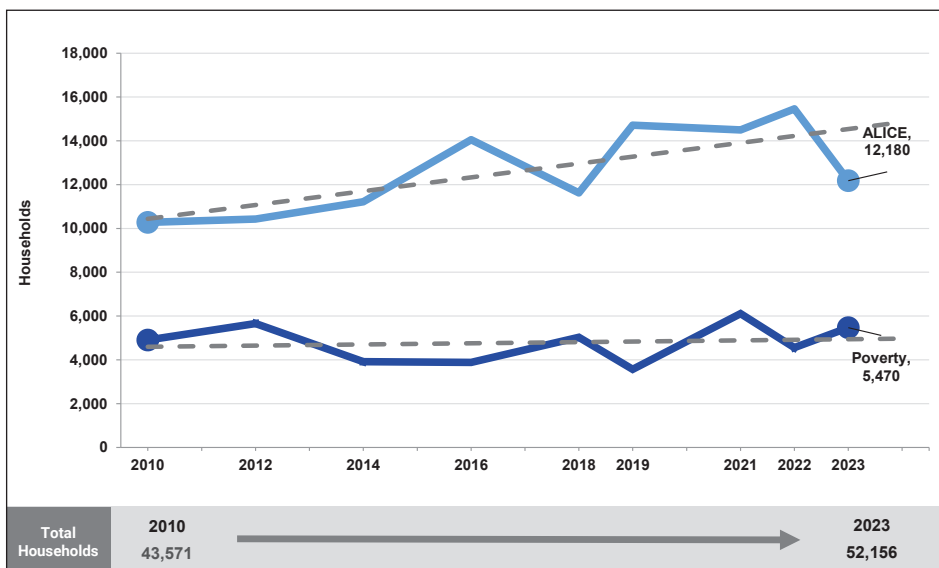

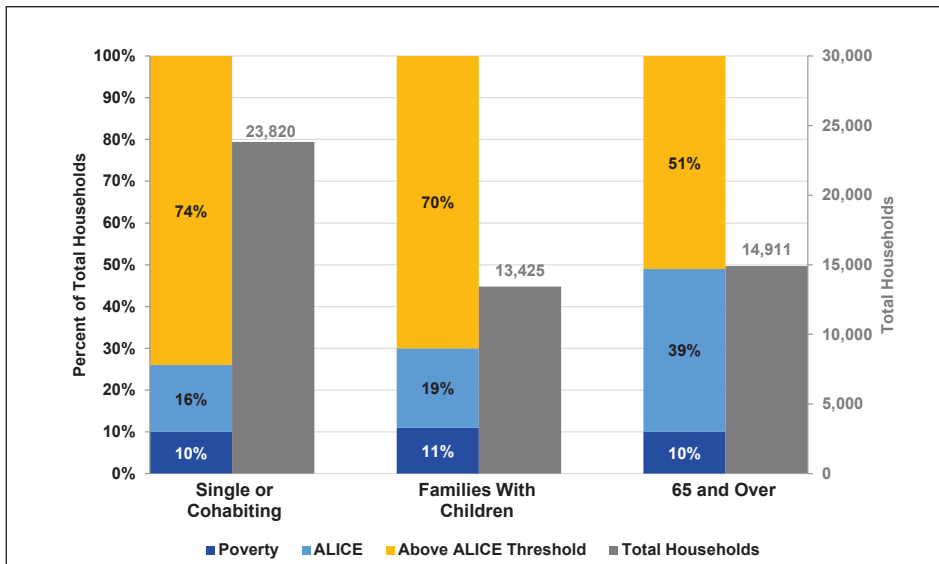

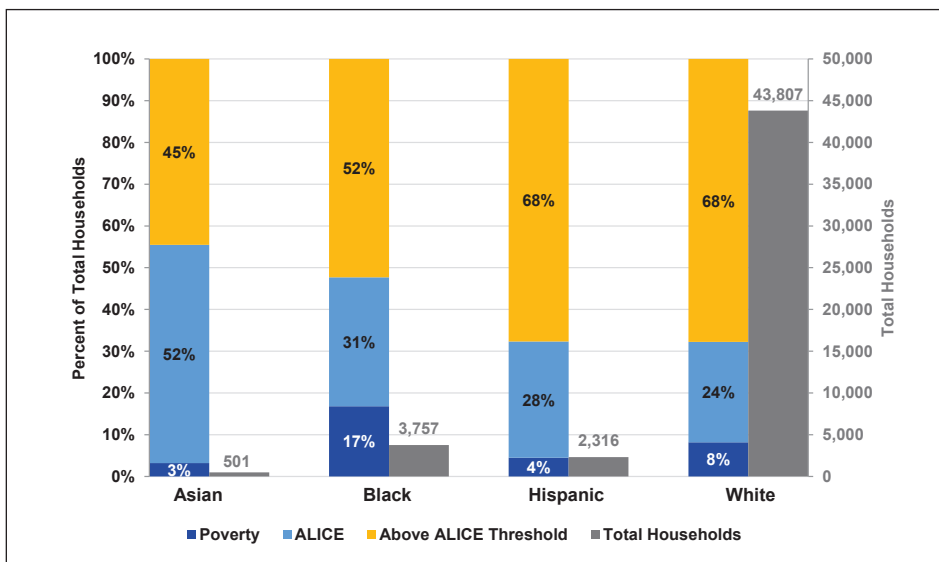
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Clark County, 2023

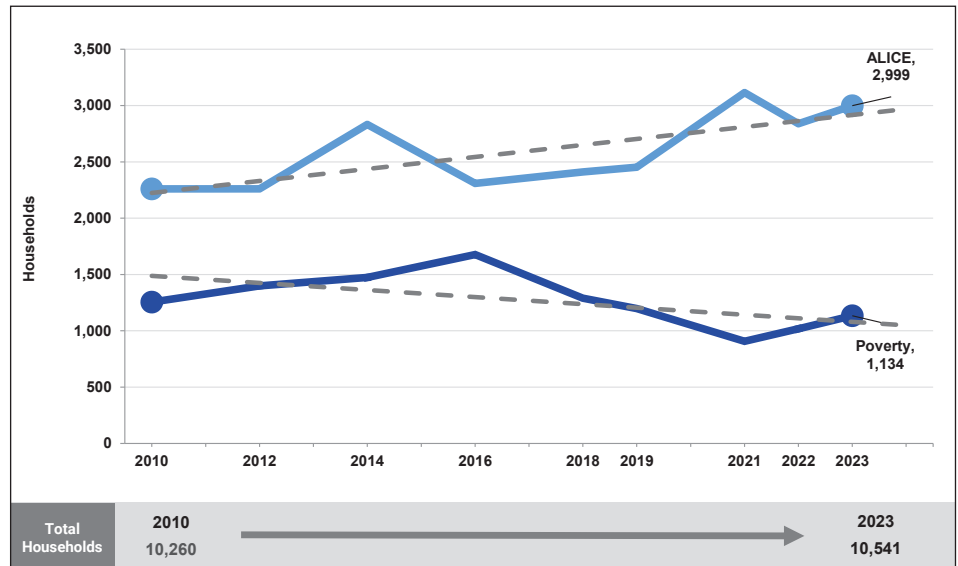

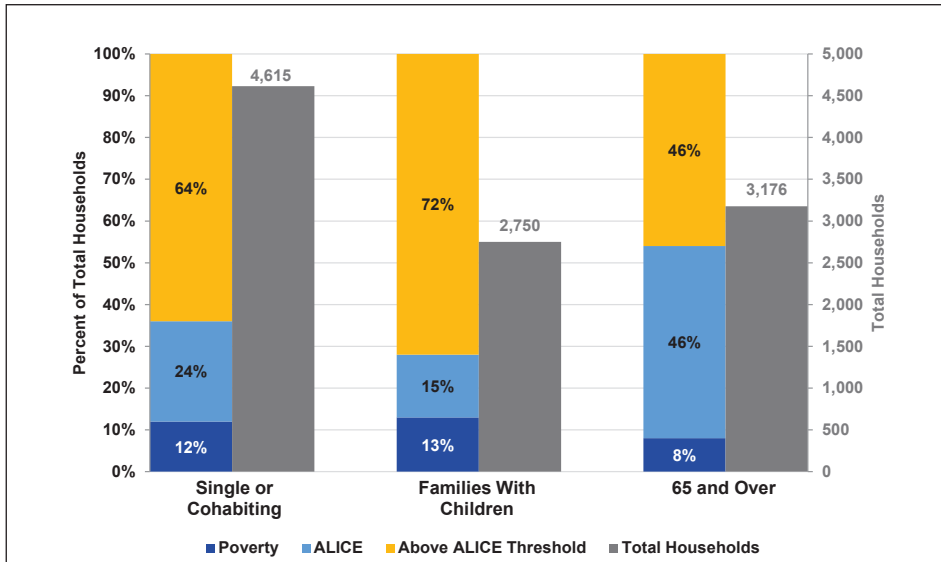

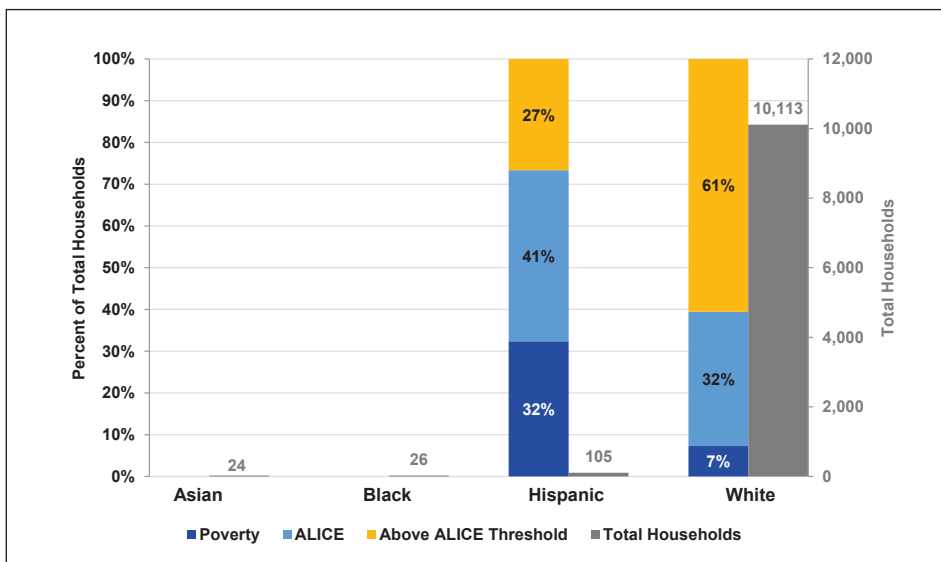
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Clay County, 2023

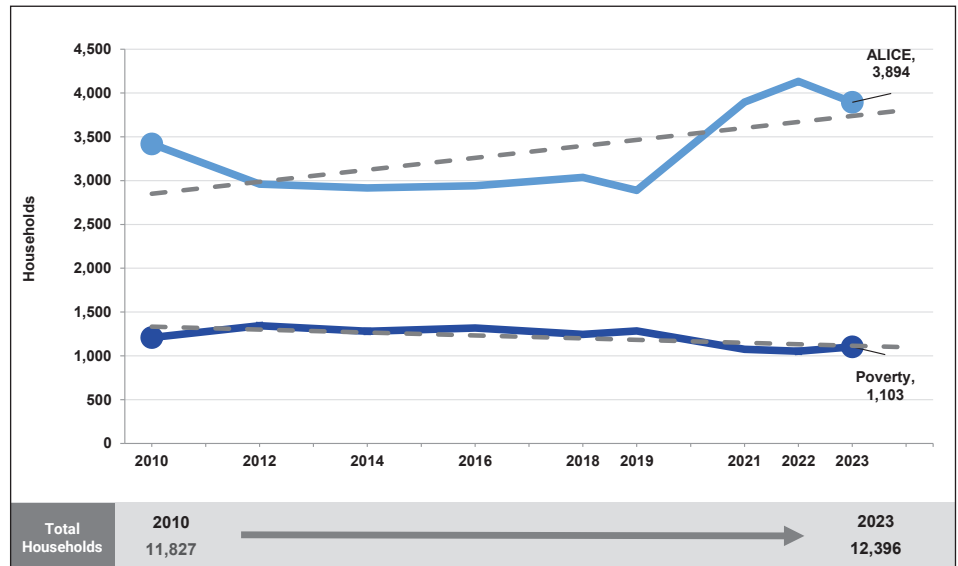

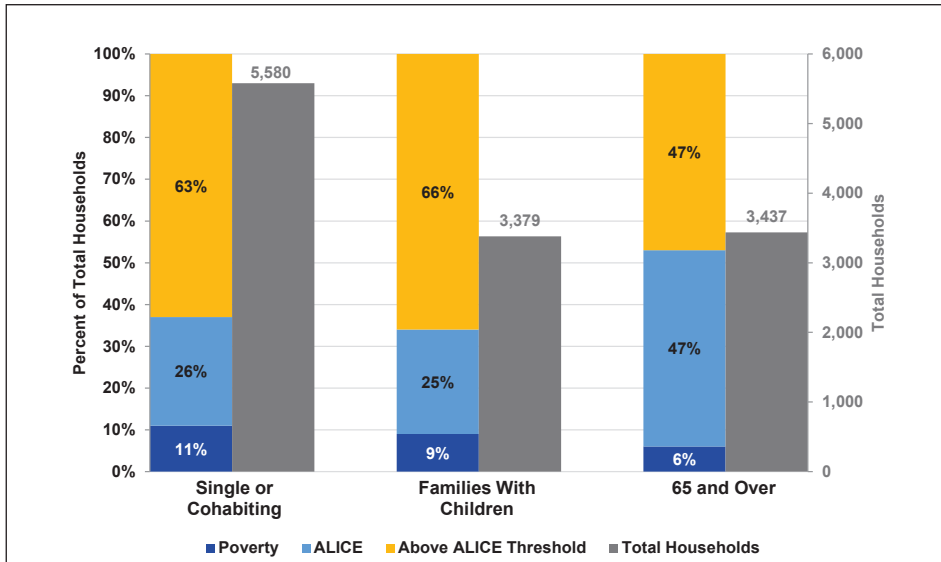

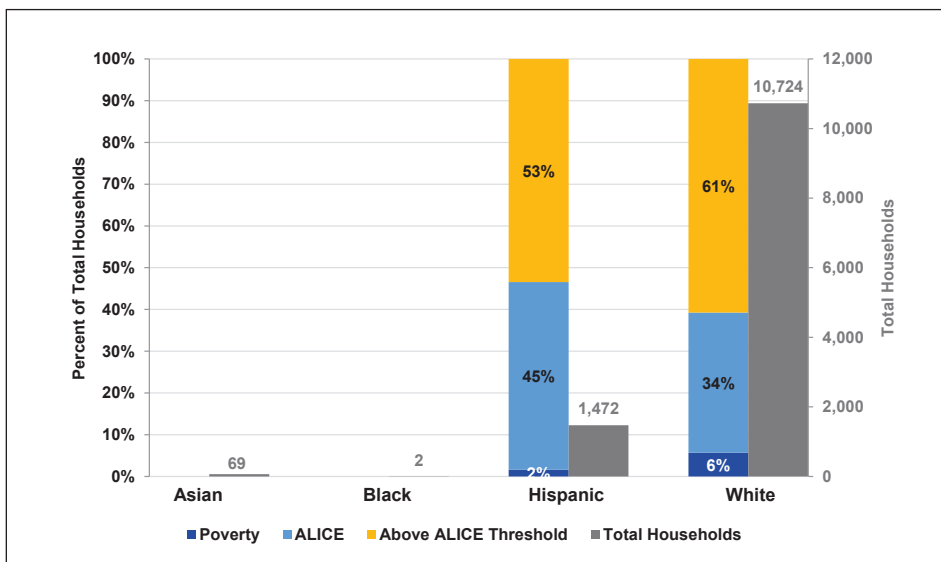
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Clinton County, 2023

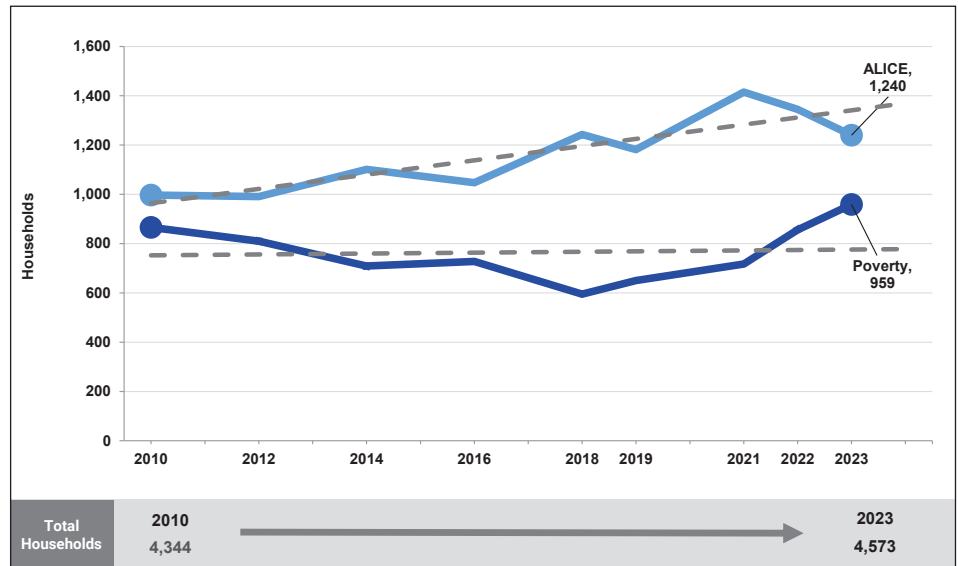

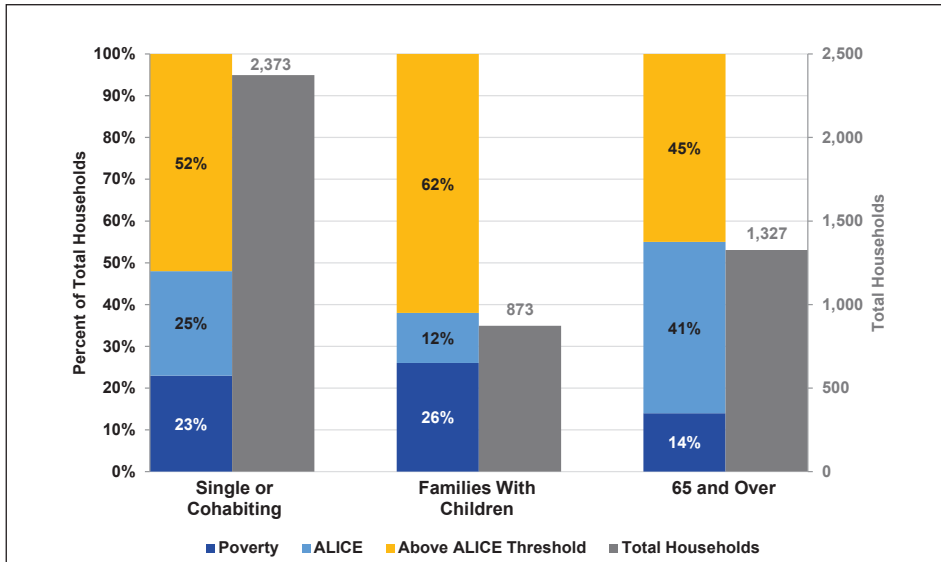

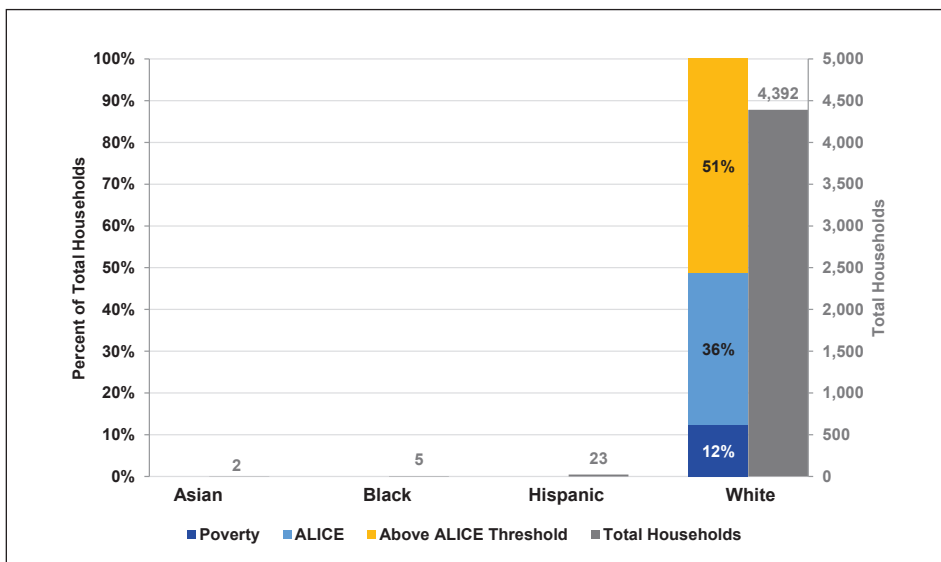
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Crawford County, 2023

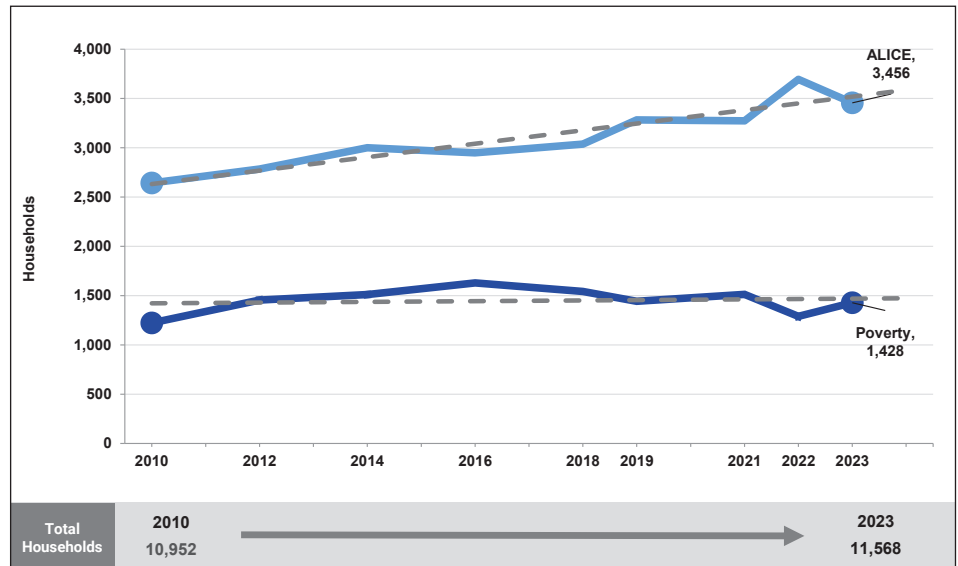

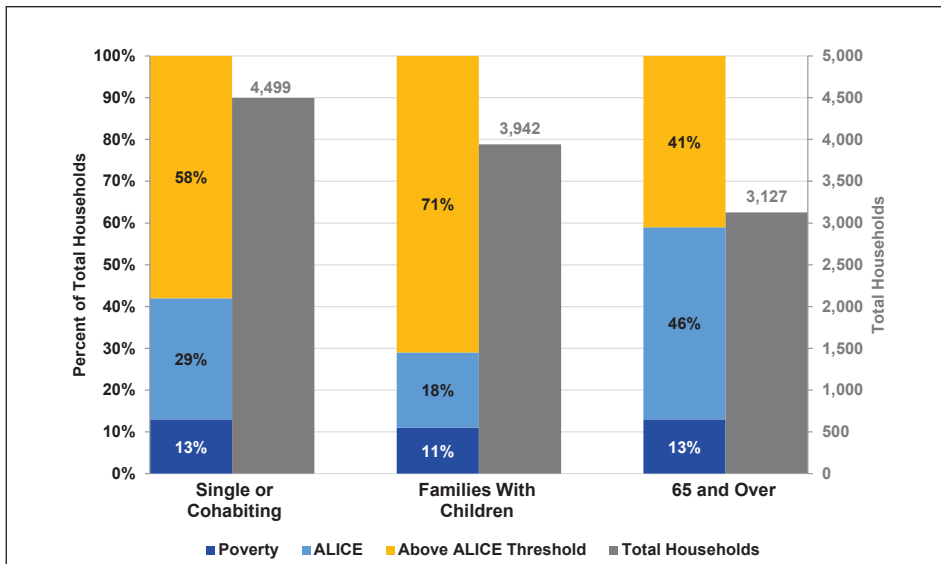

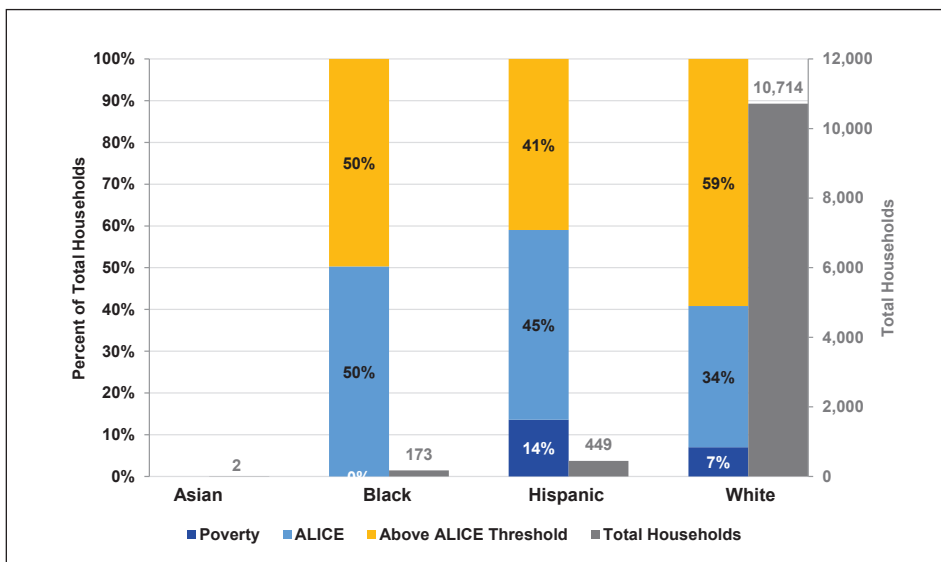
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Daviess County, 2023

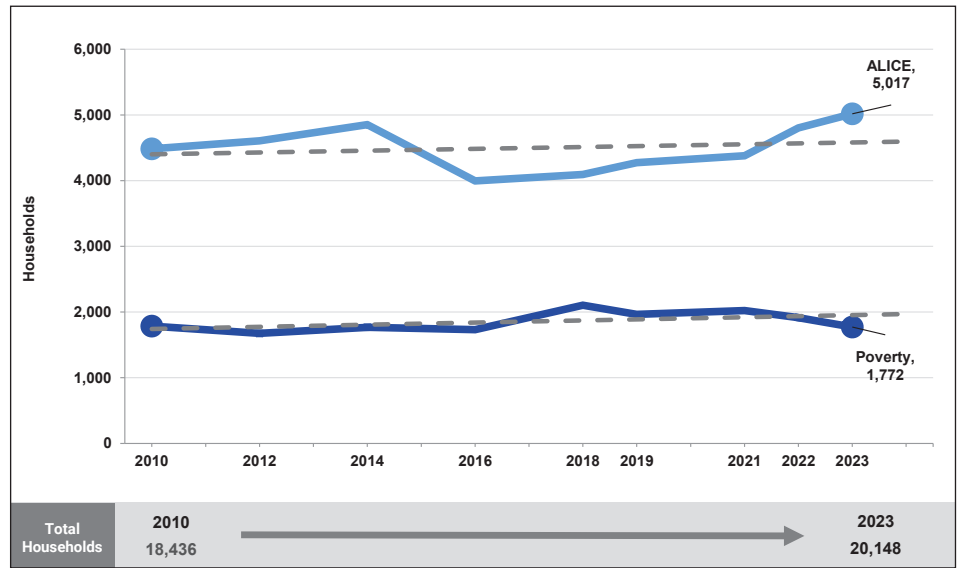

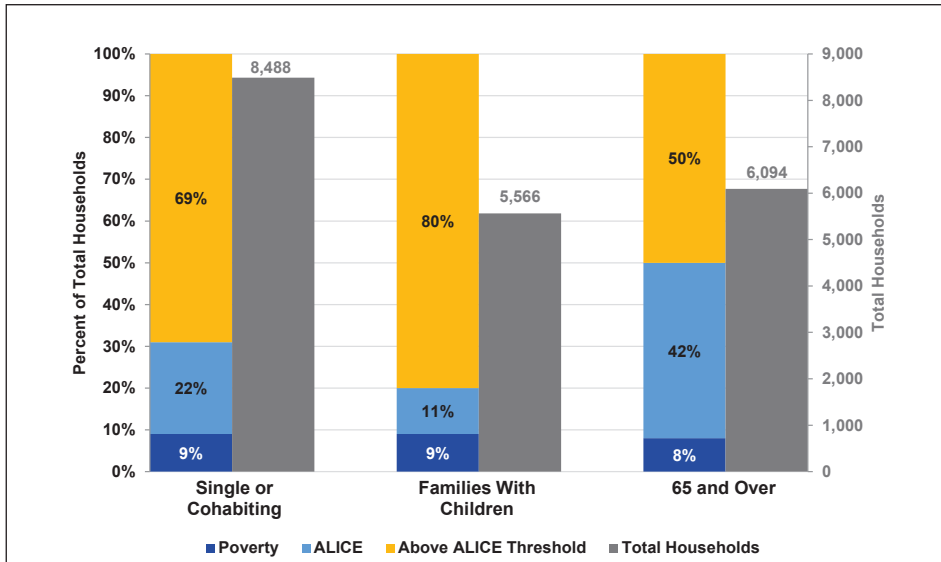

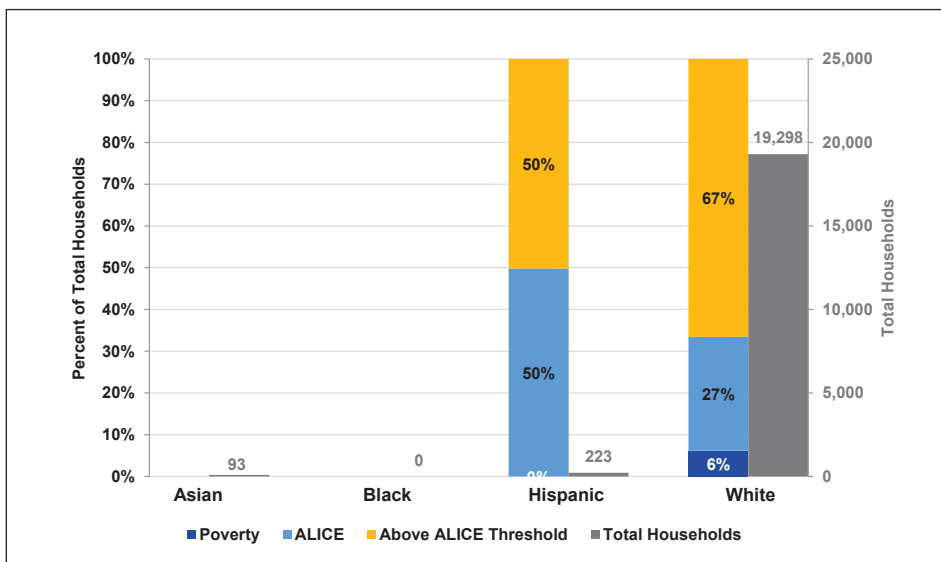
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Dearborn County, 2023

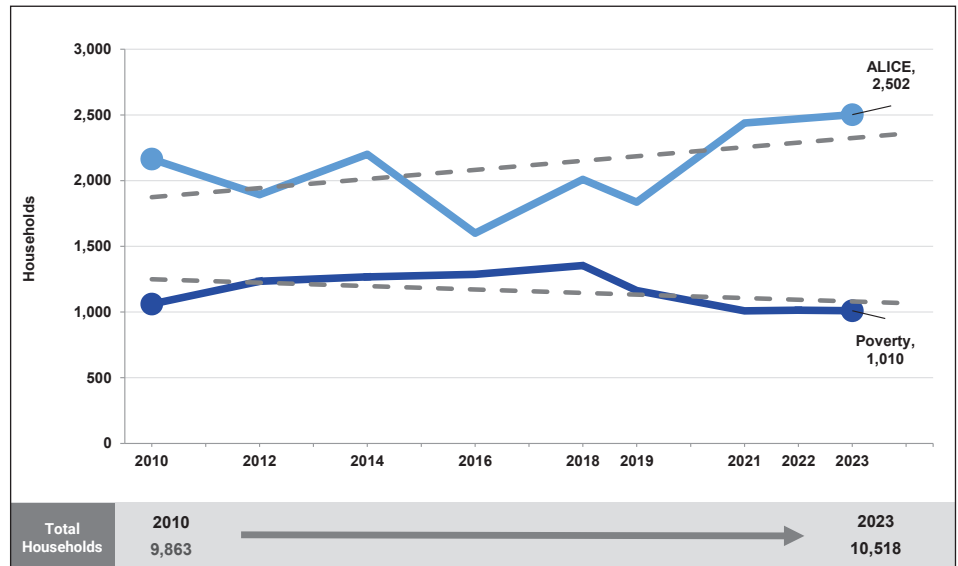

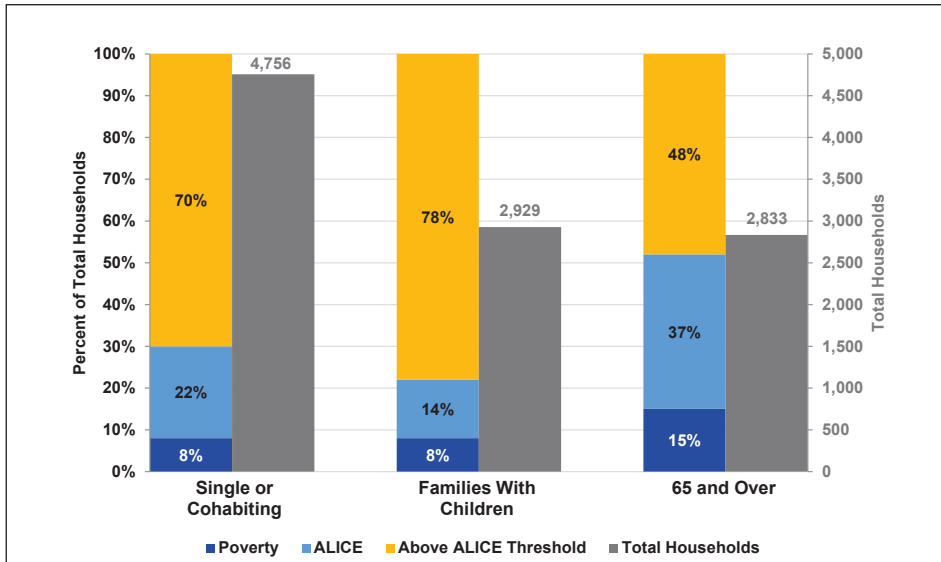

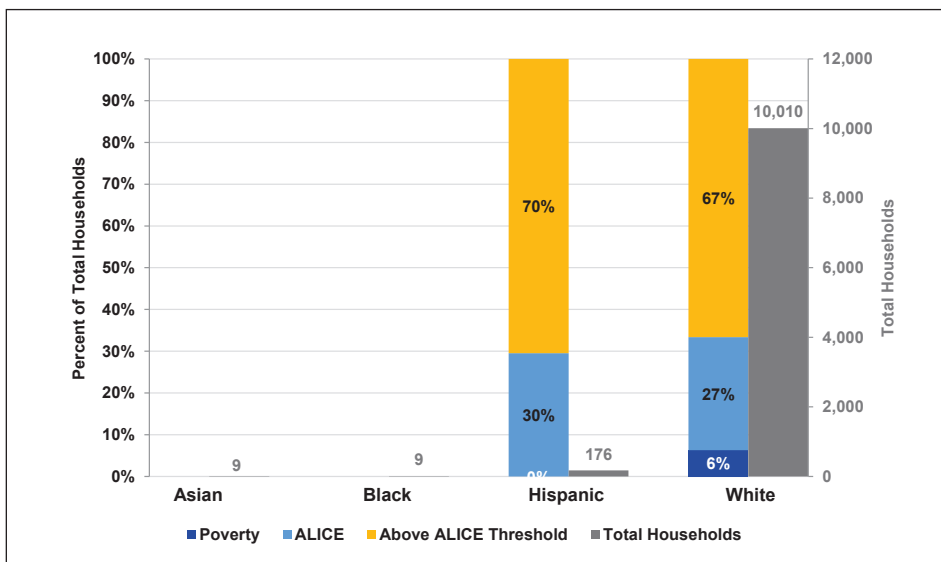
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Decatur County, 2023

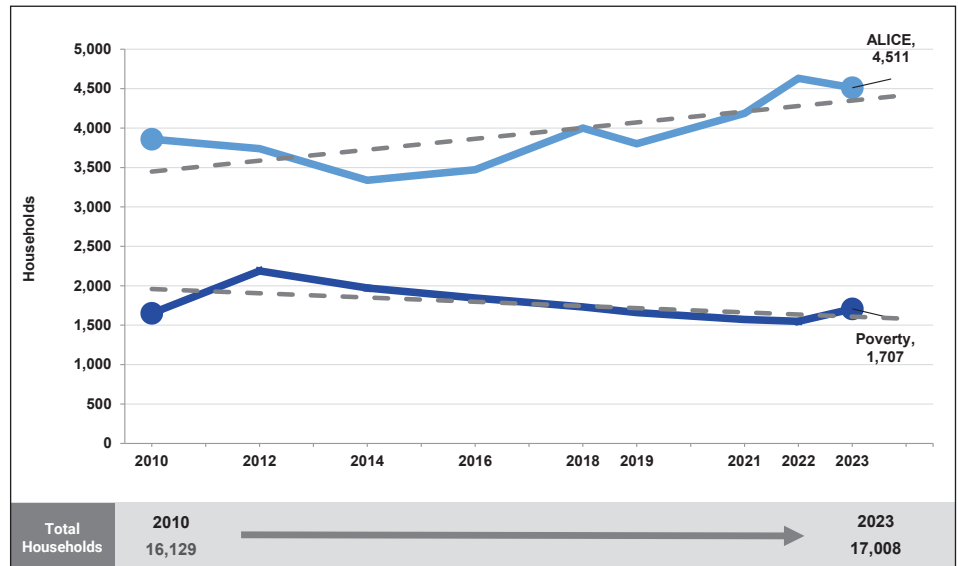

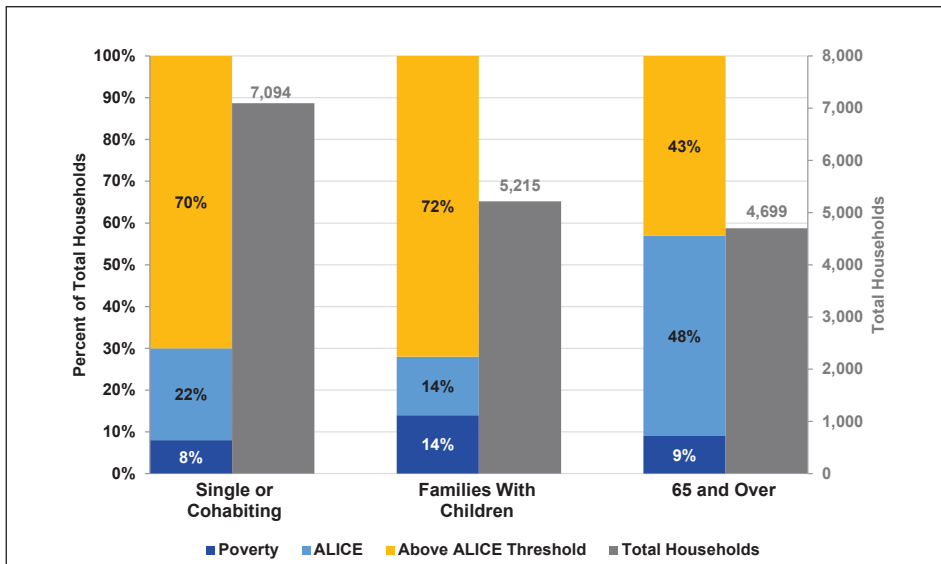

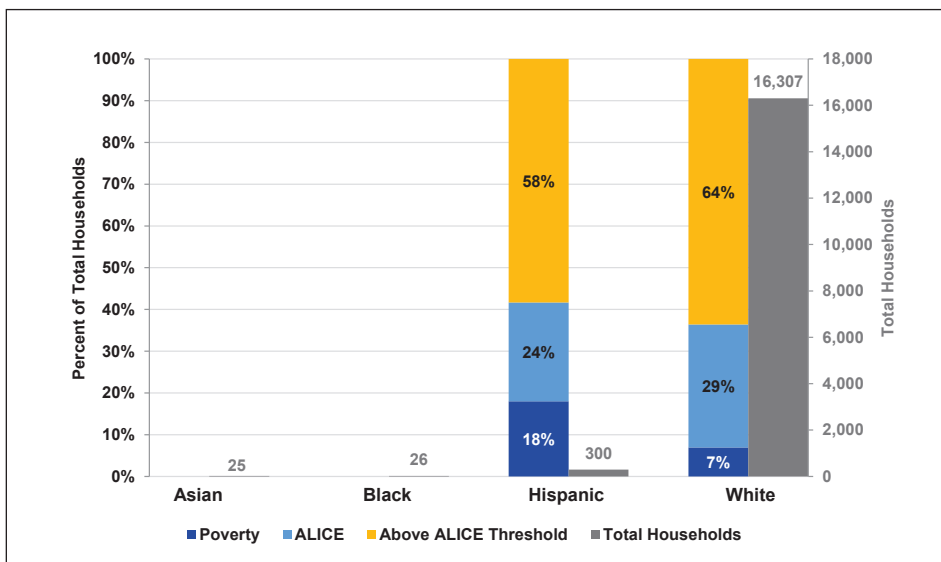
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, DeKalb County, 2023

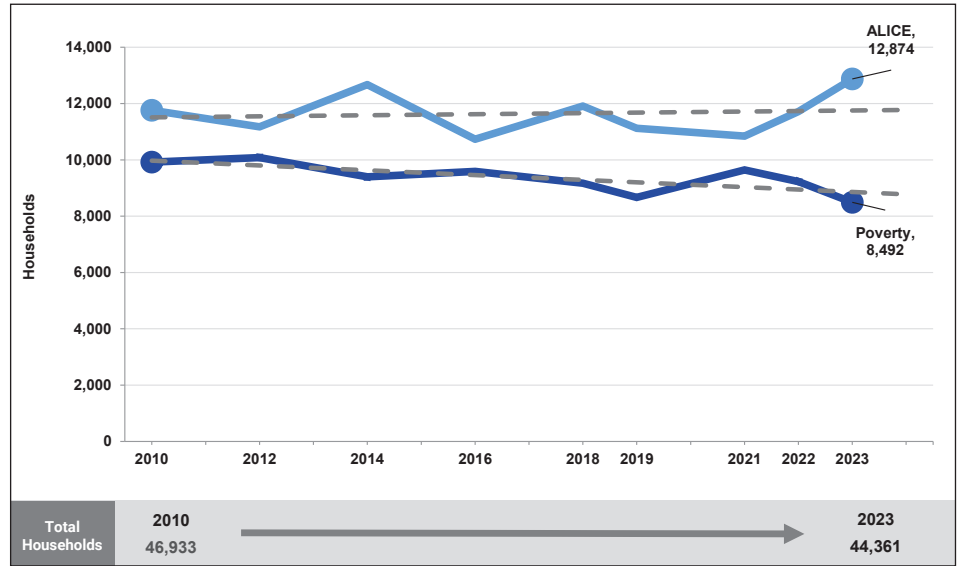

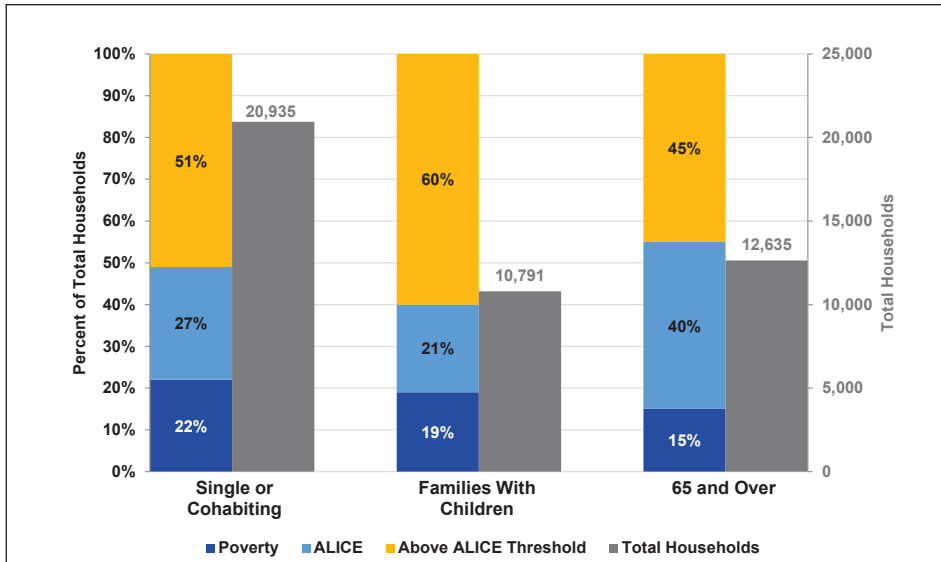

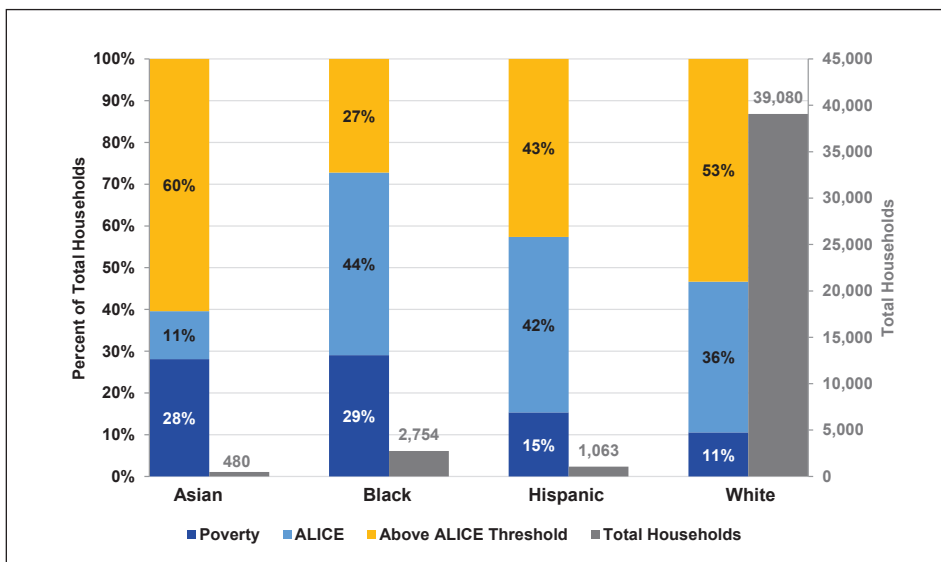
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Delaware County, 2023

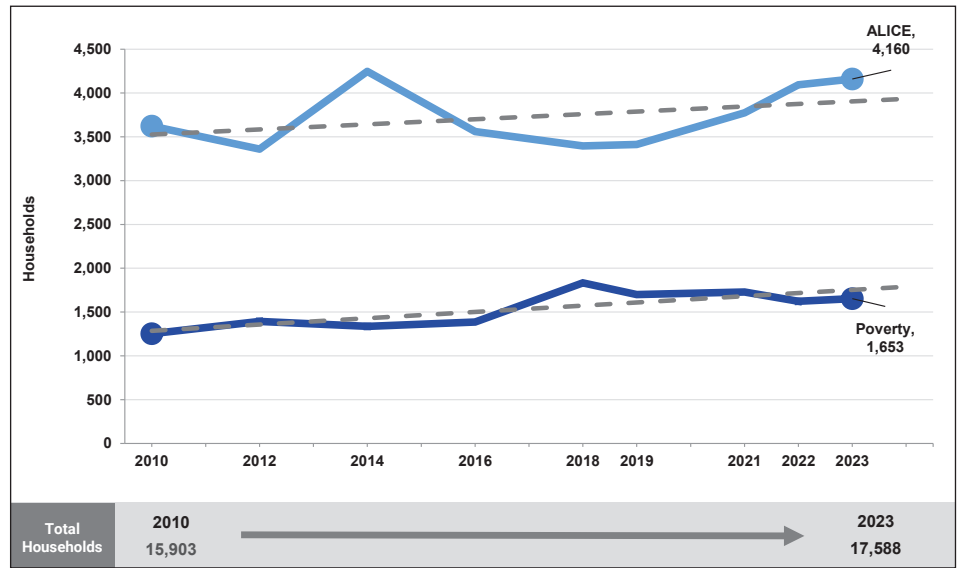

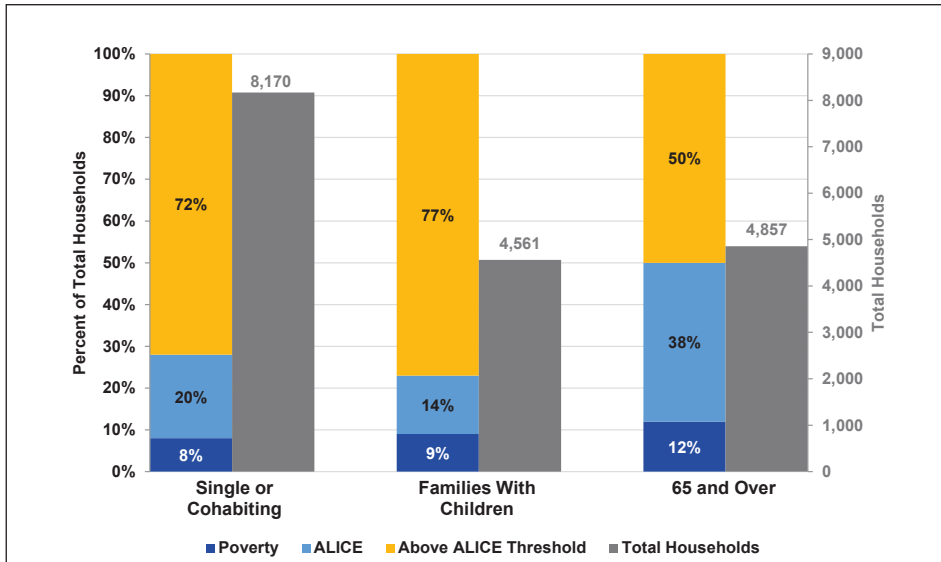

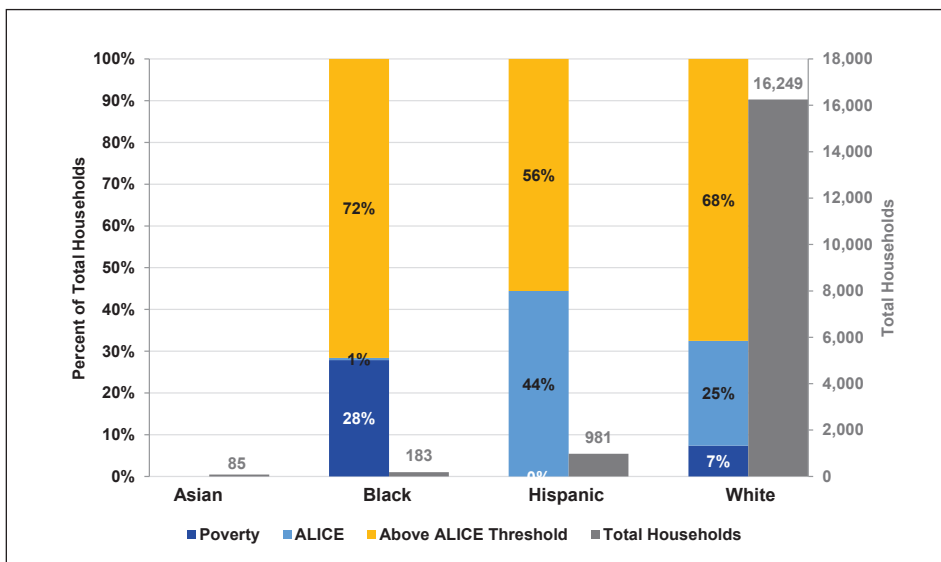
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Dubois County, 2023

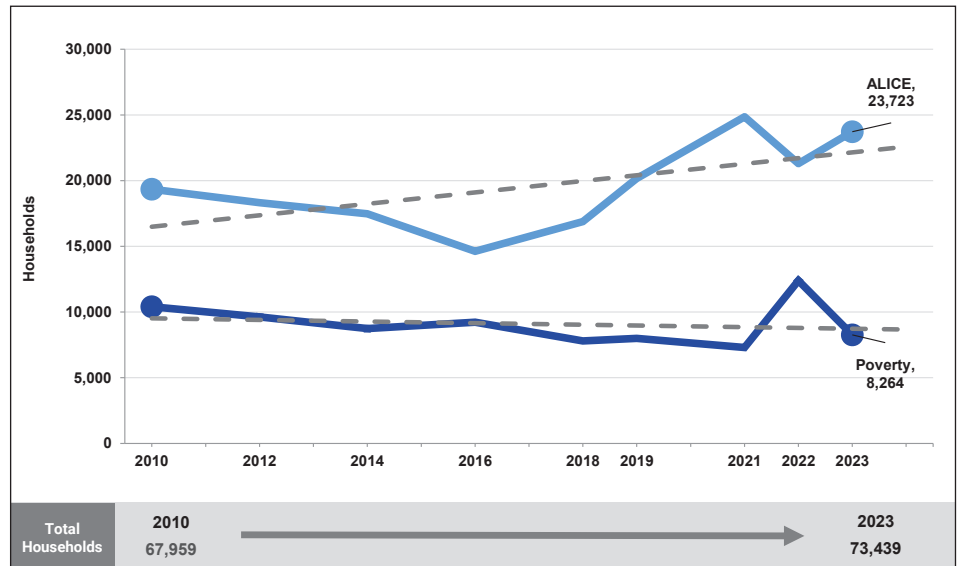

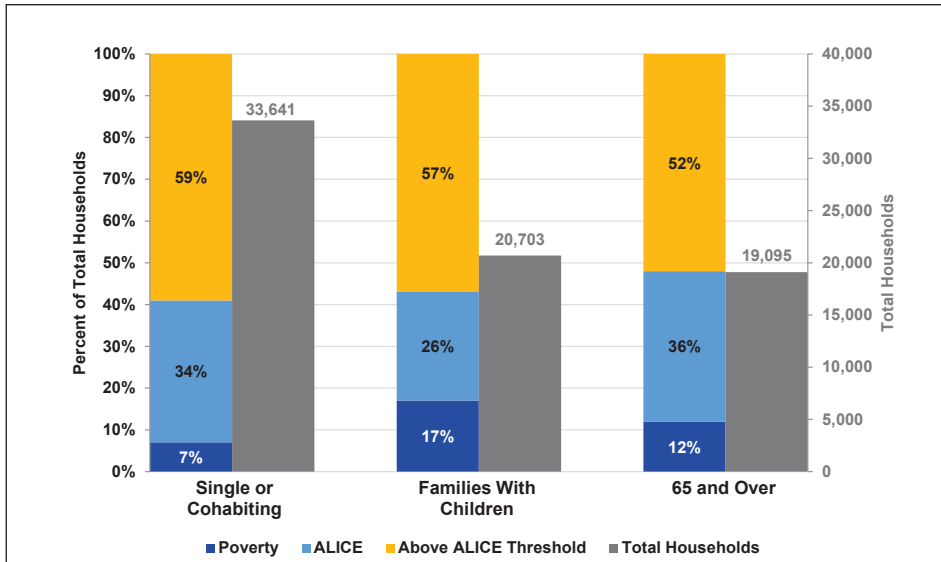

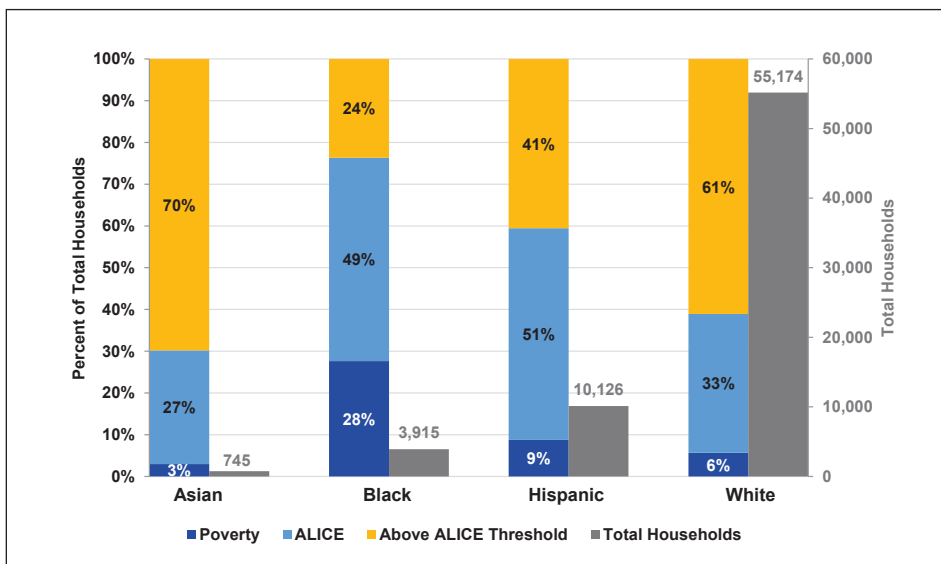
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Elkhart County, 2023

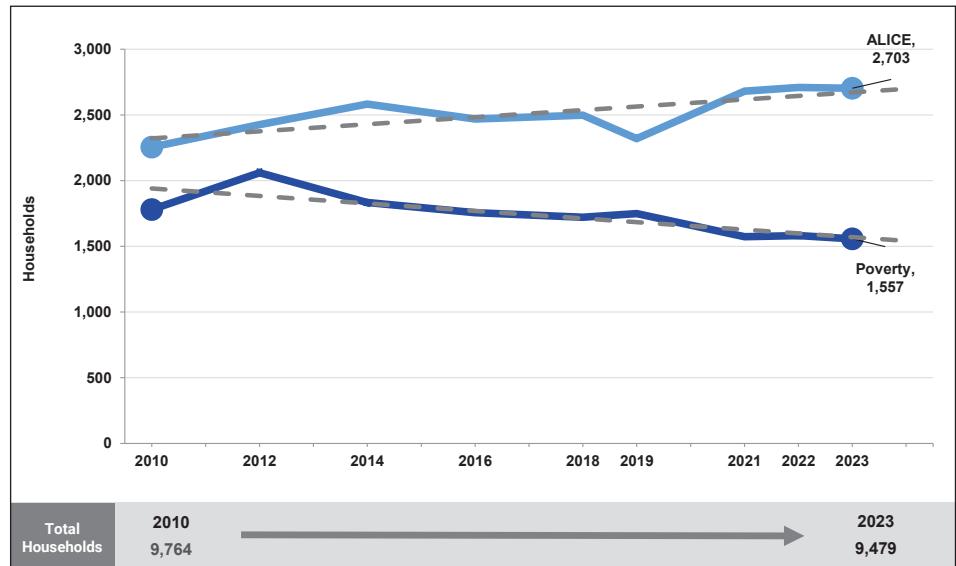

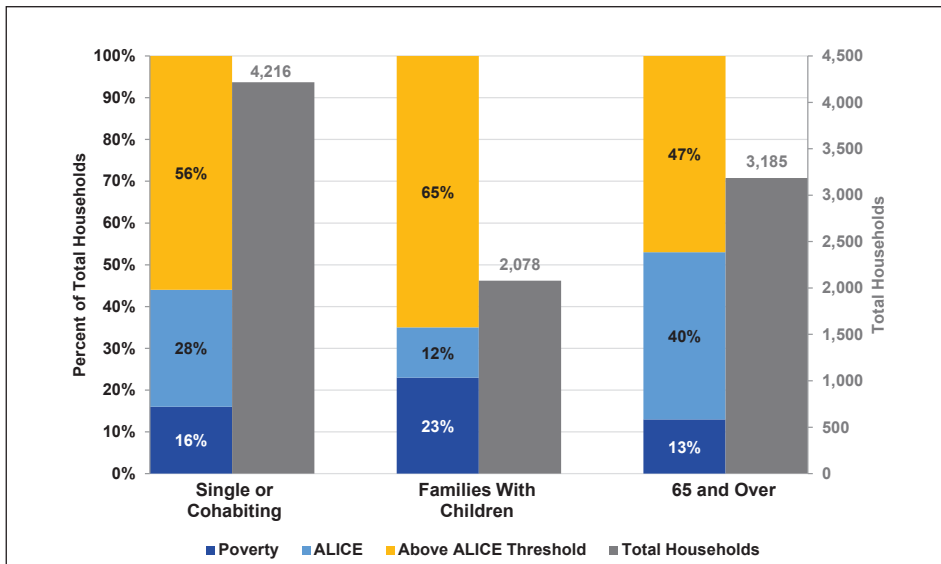

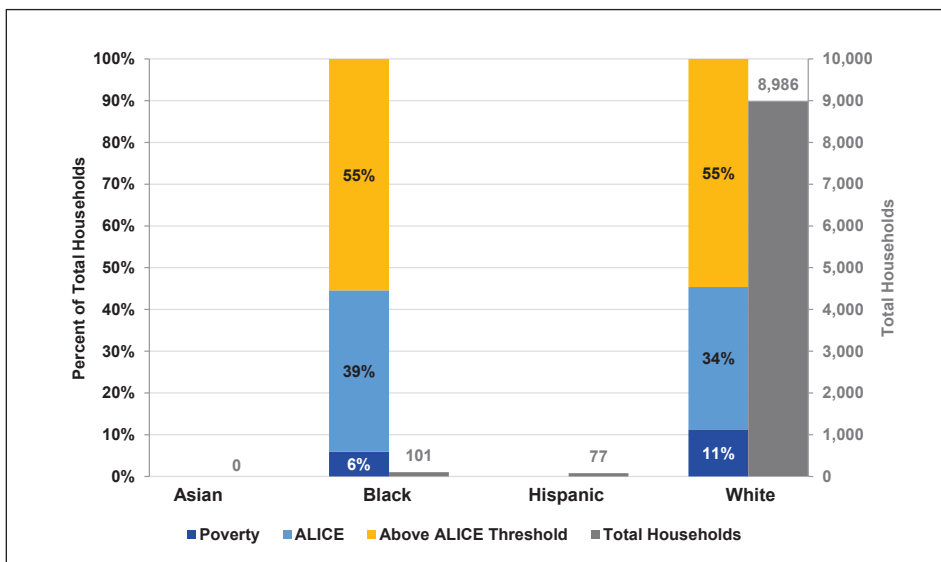
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Fayette County, 2023

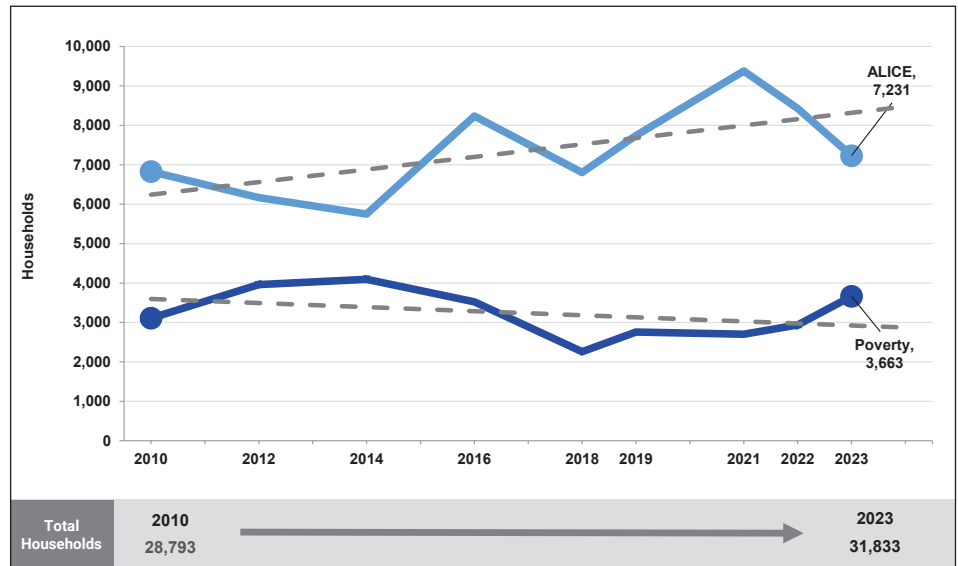

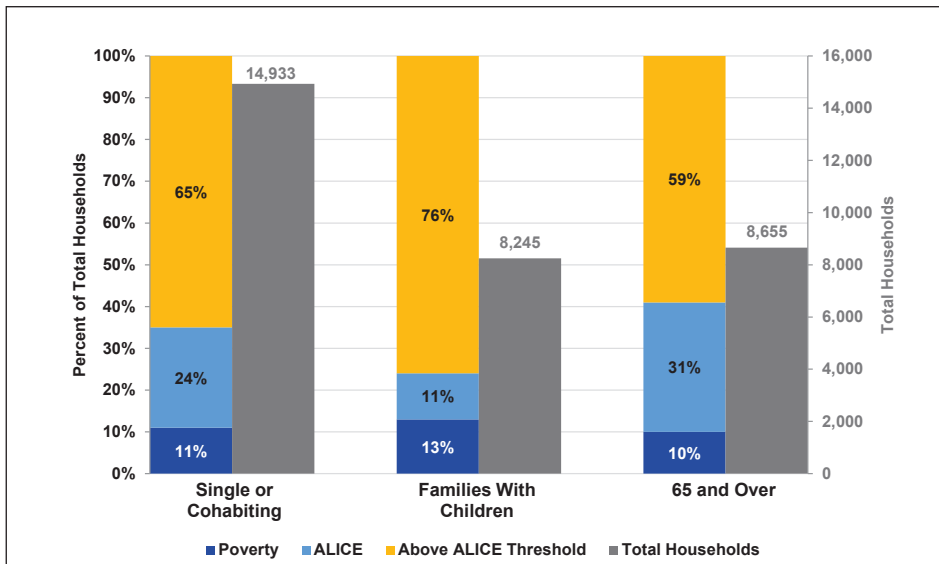

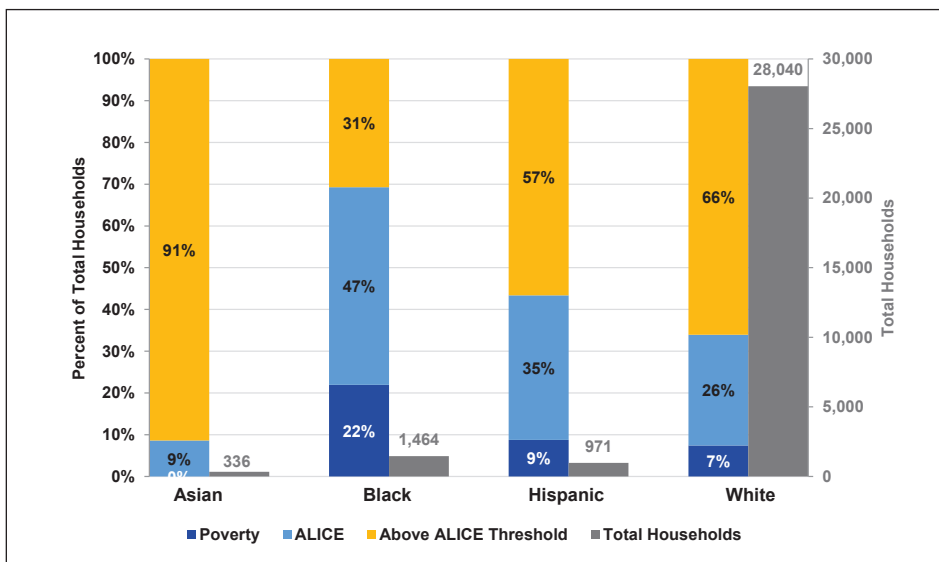
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Floyd County, 2023

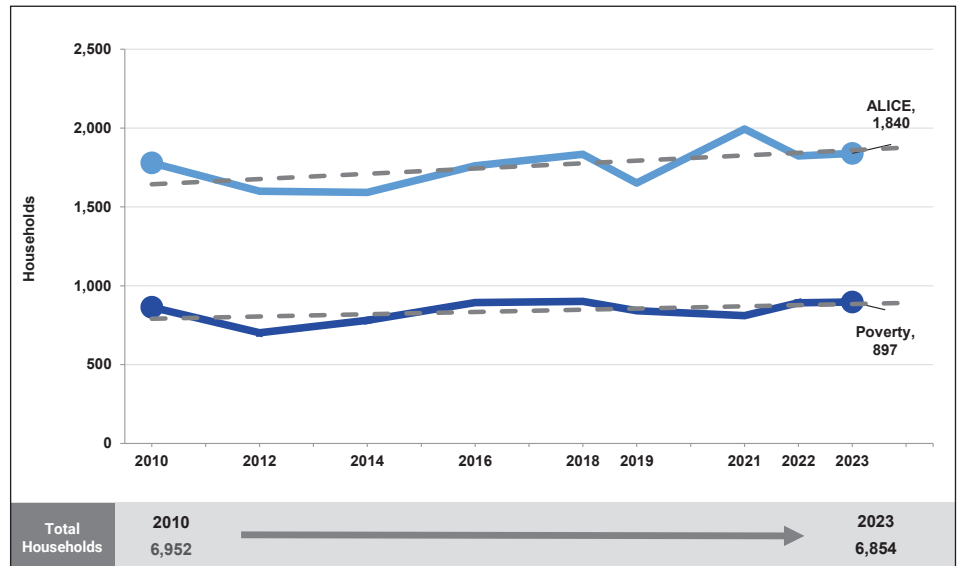

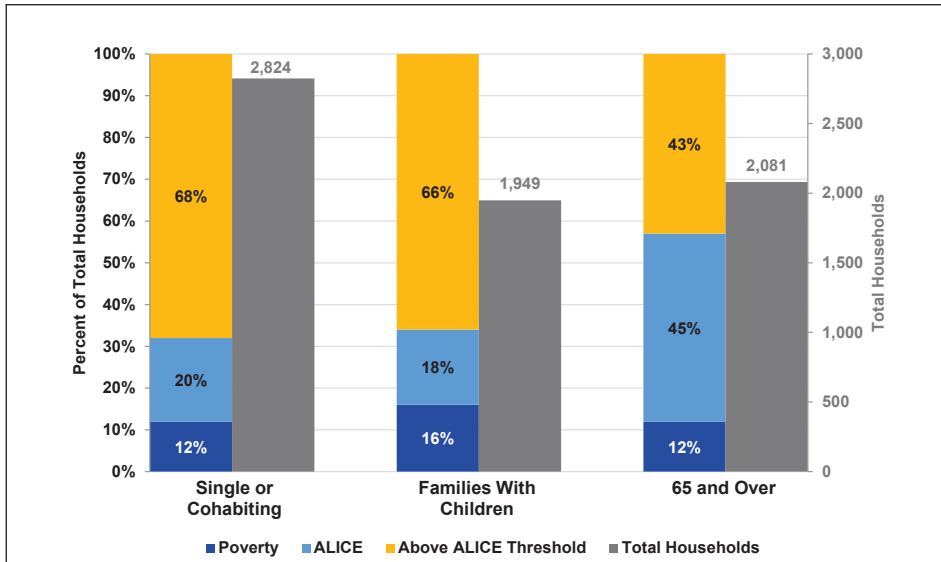

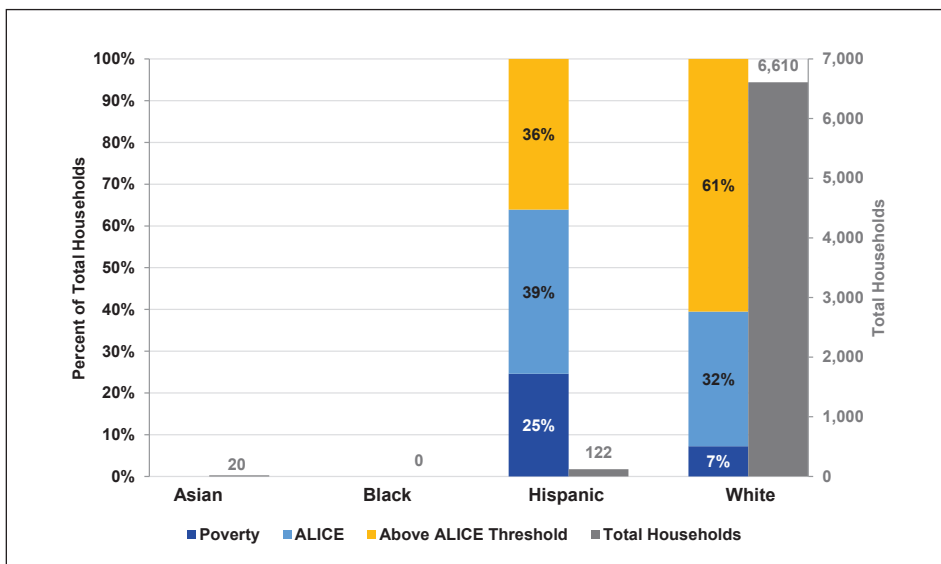
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Fountain County, 2023

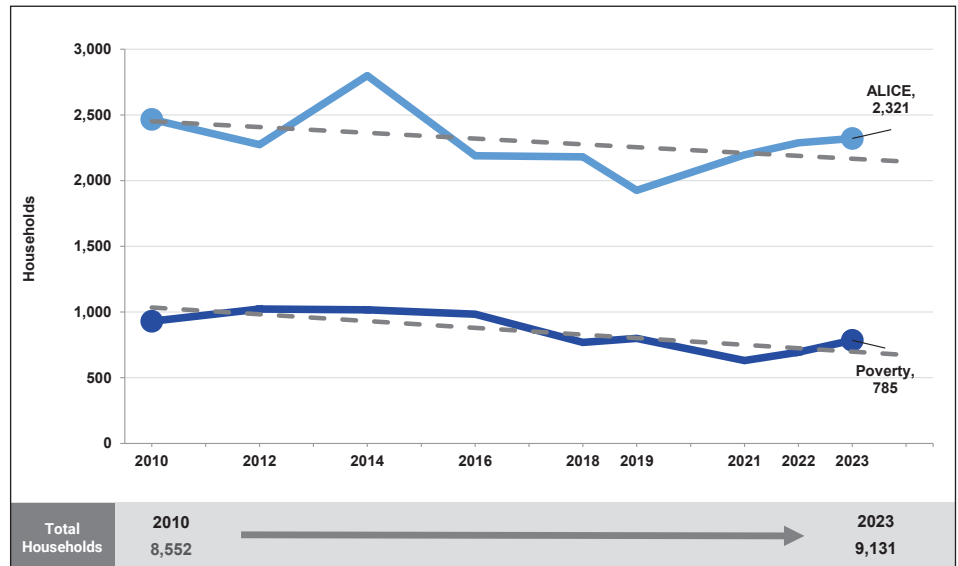

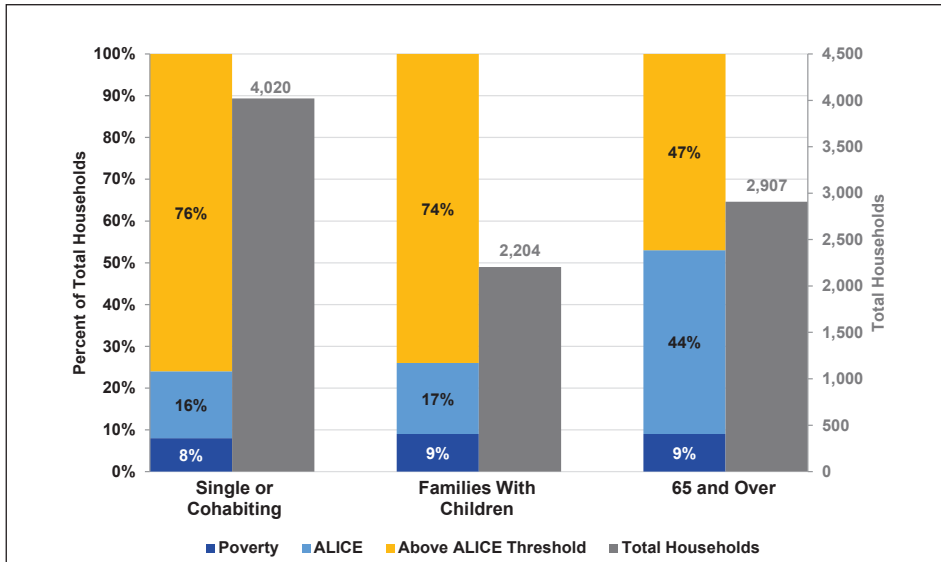

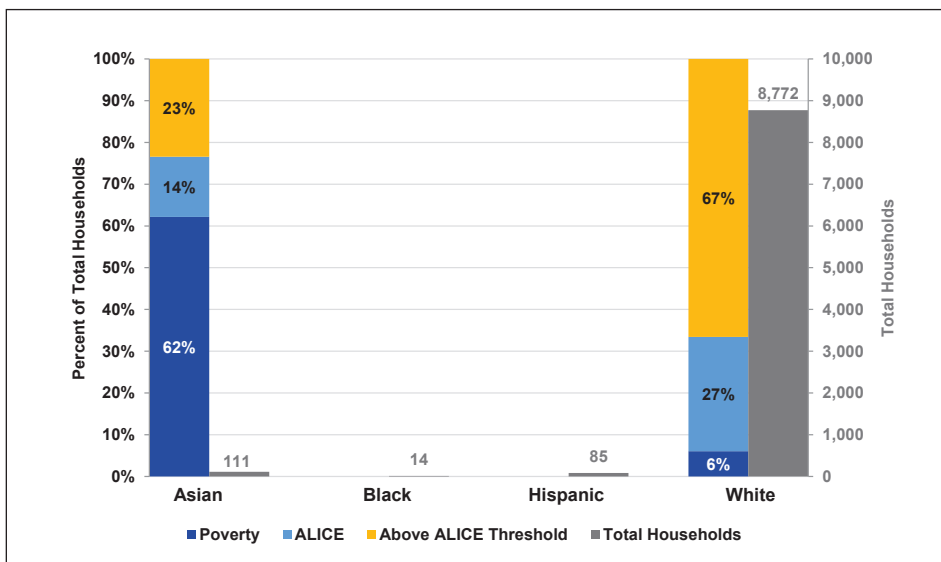
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Franklin County, 2023

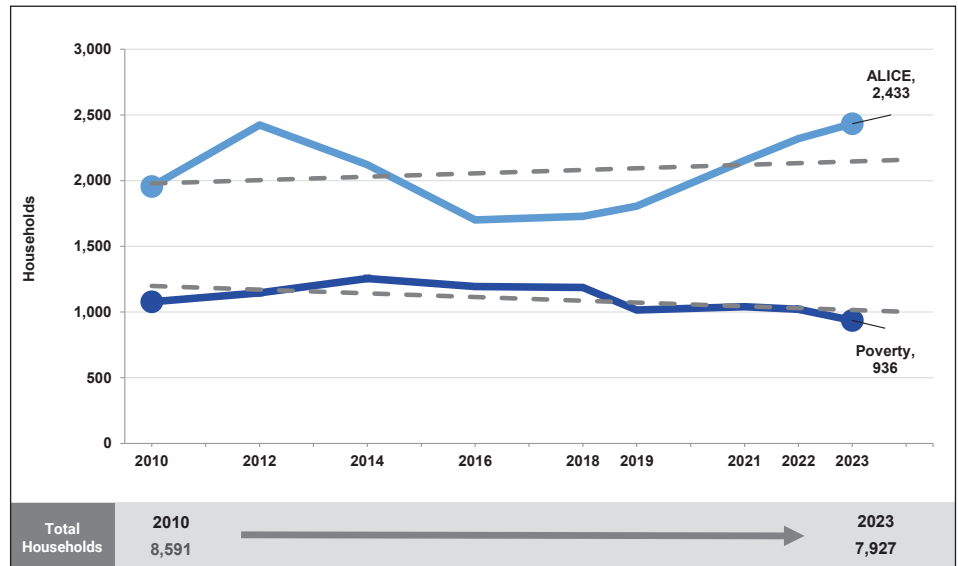

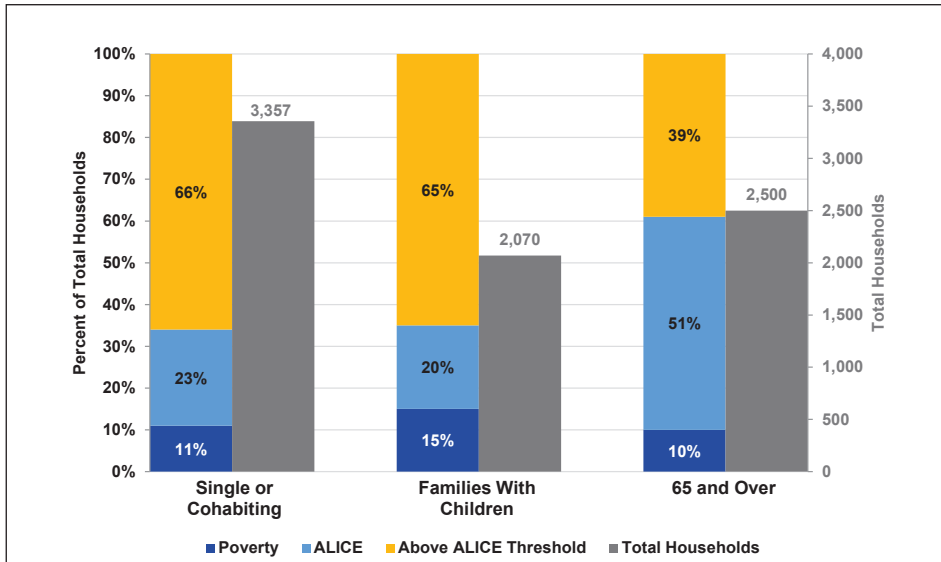

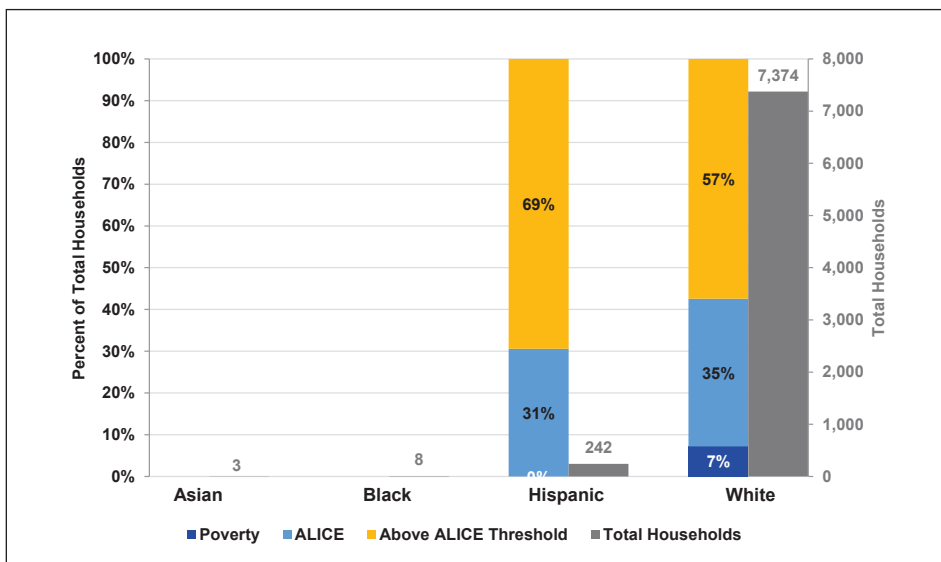
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Fulton County, 2023

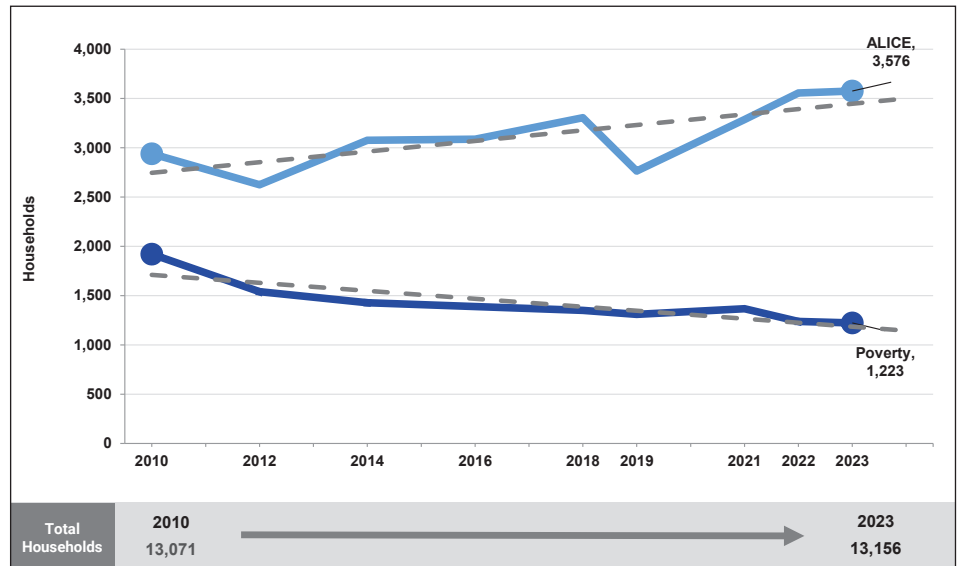

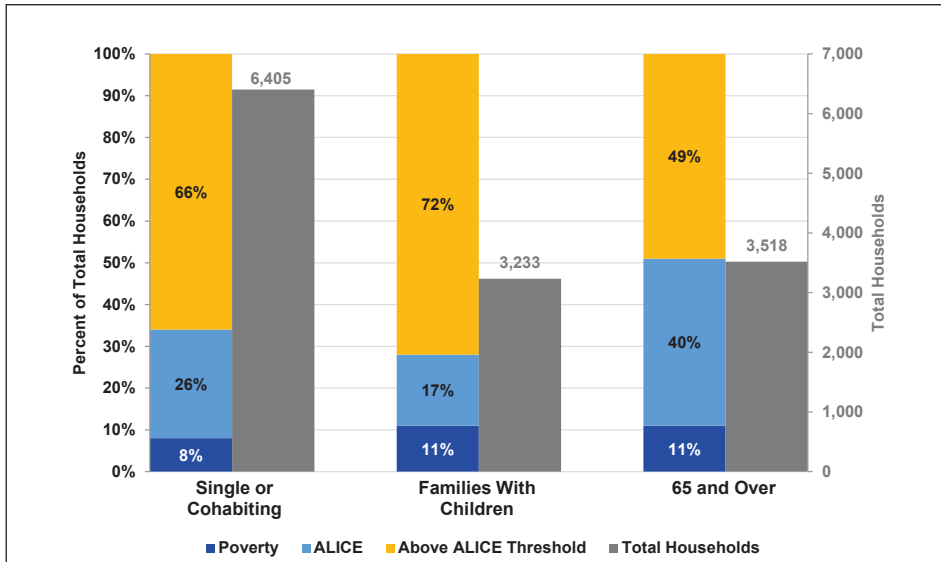

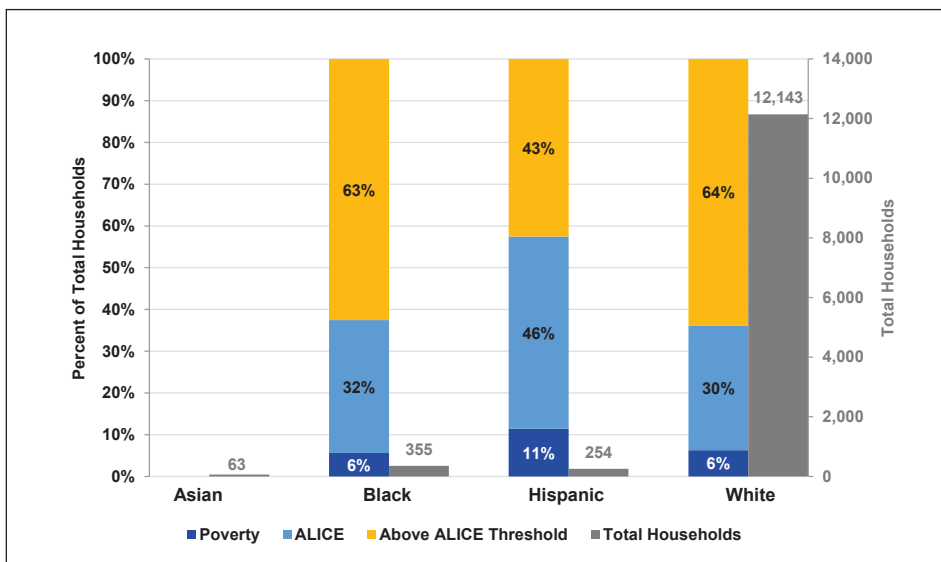
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Gibson County, 2023

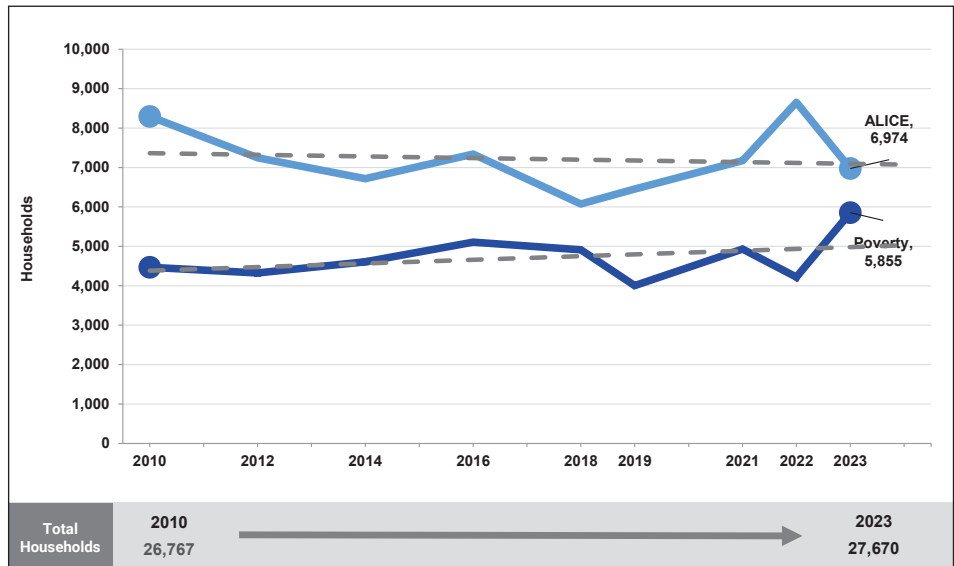

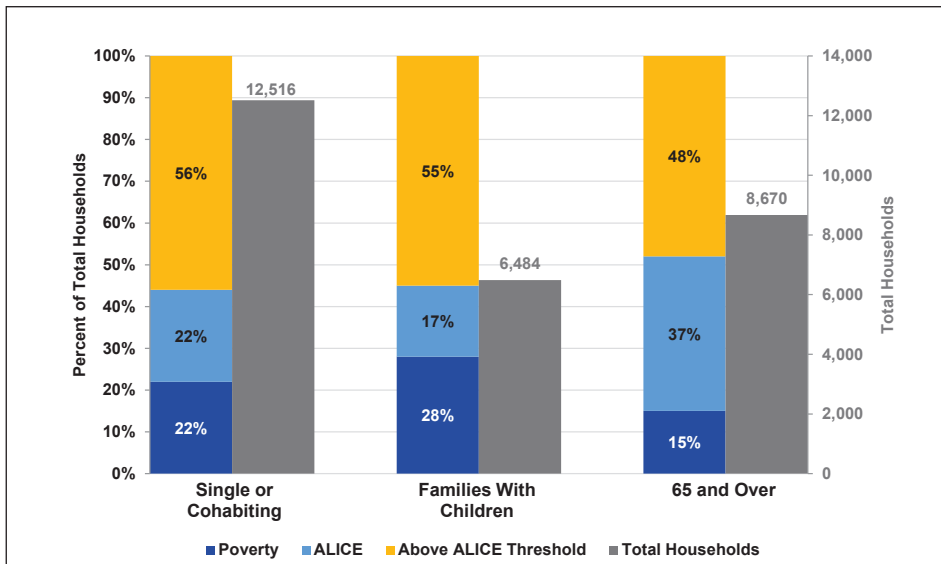

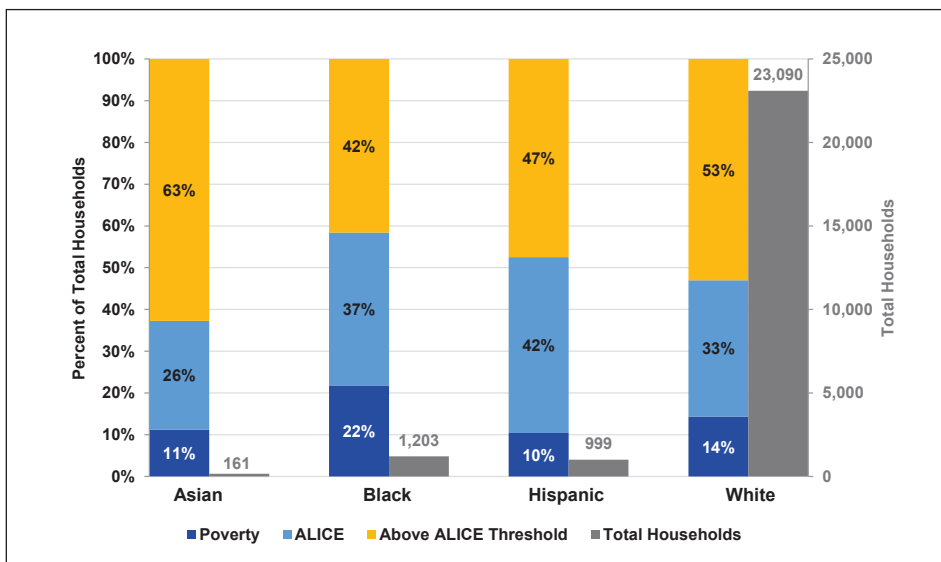
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Grant County, 2023

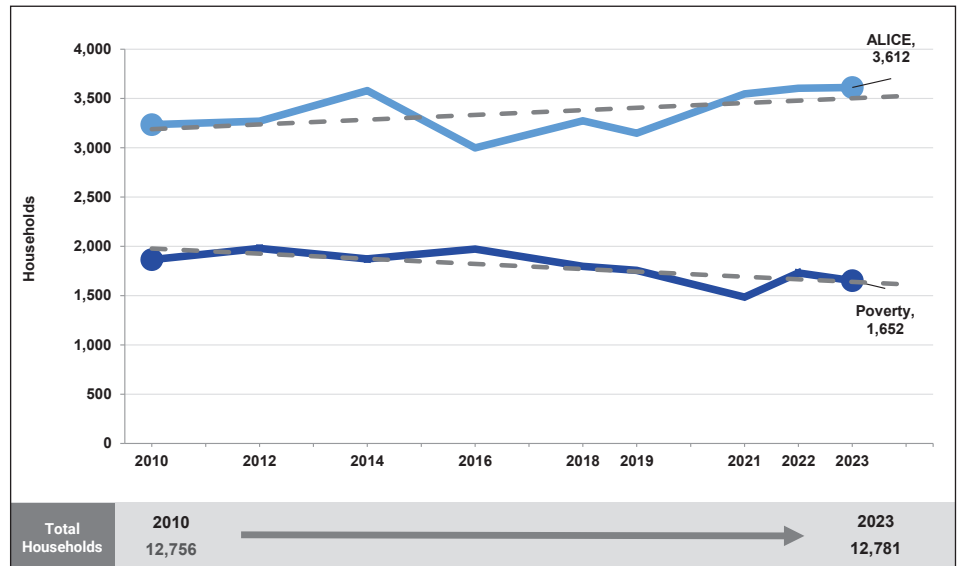

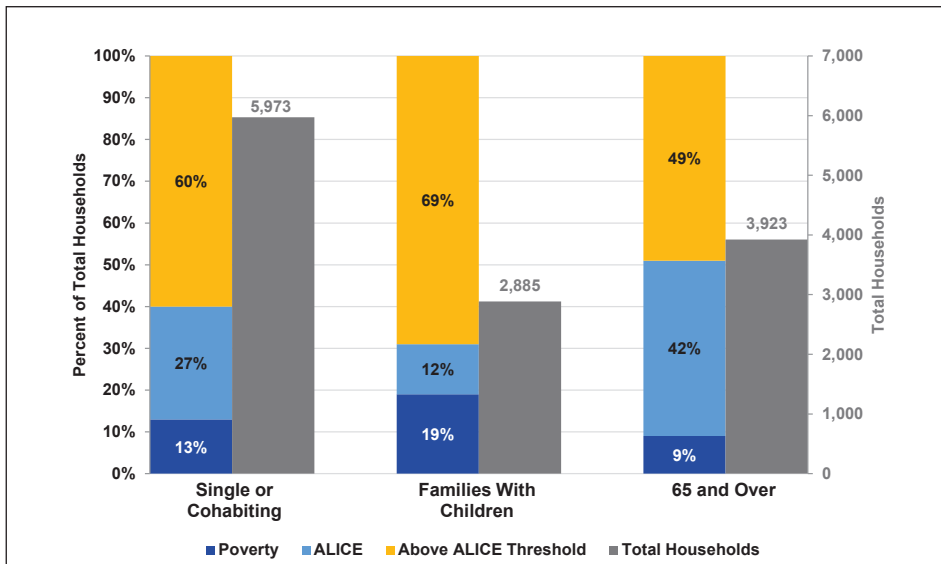

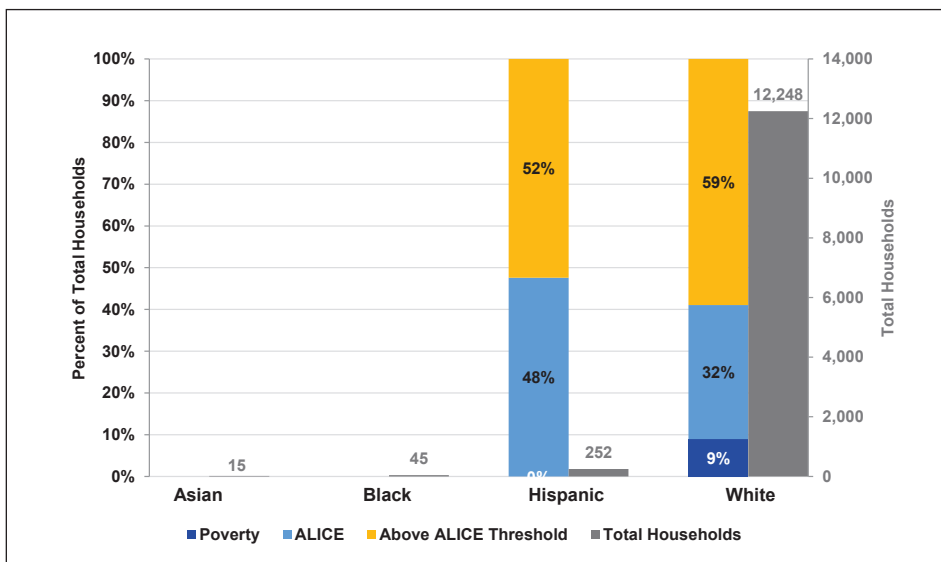
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Greene County, 2023

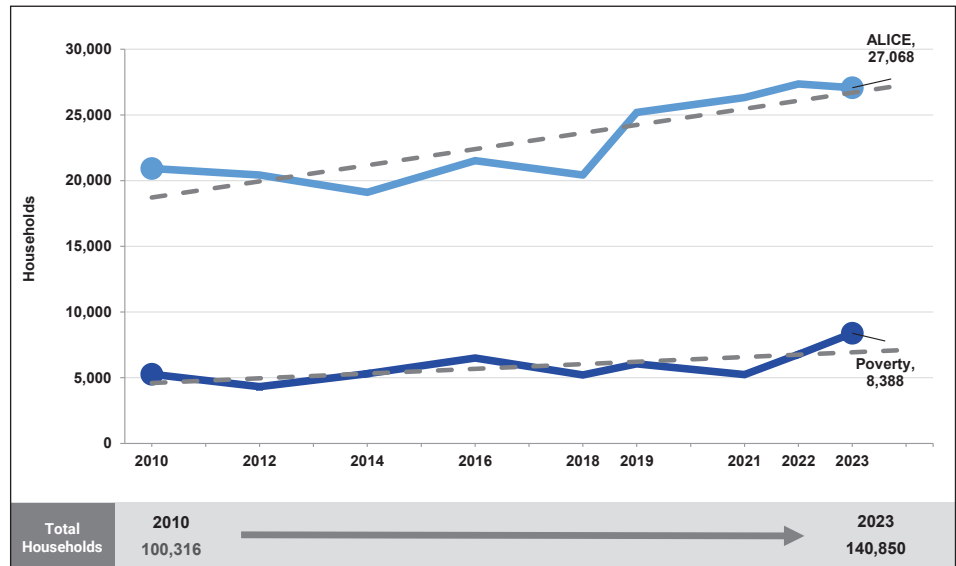

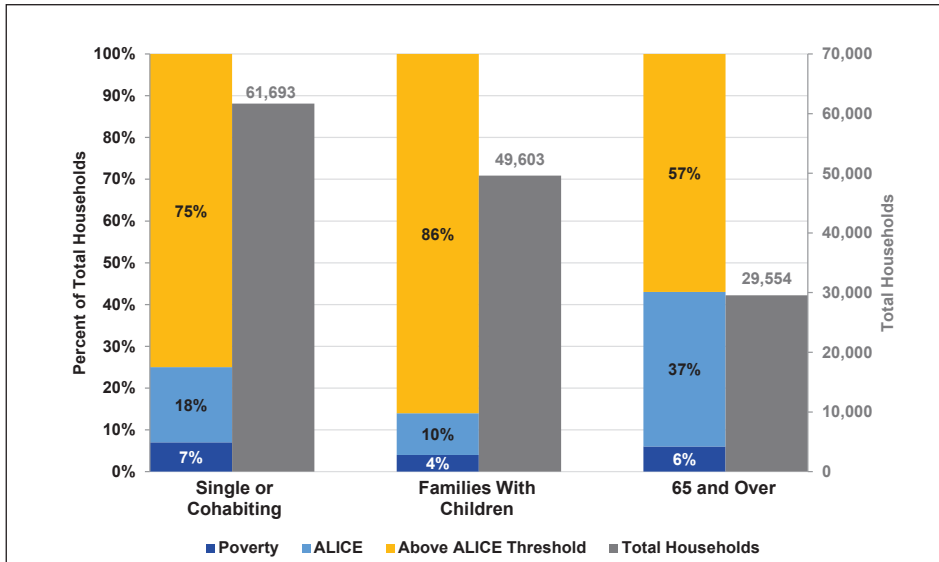

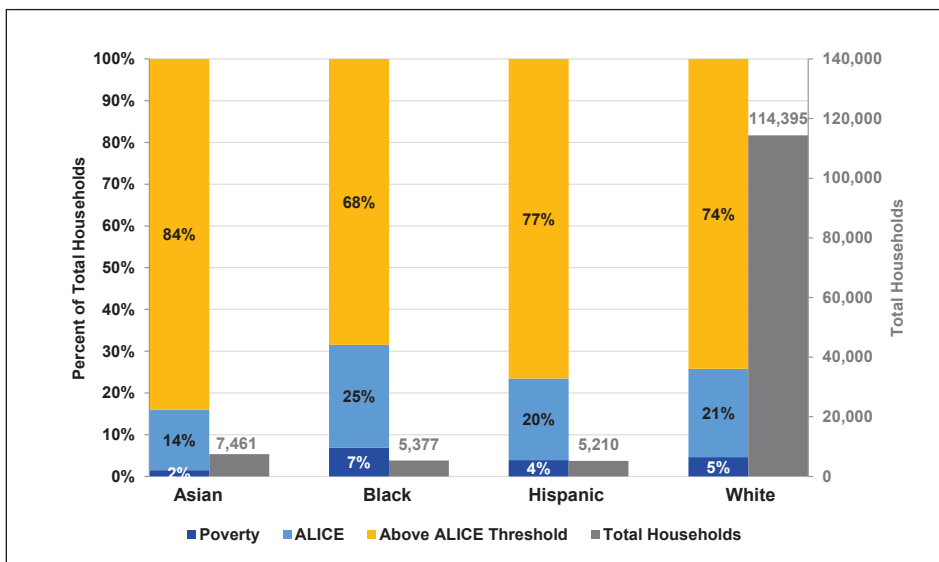
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Hamilton County, 2023

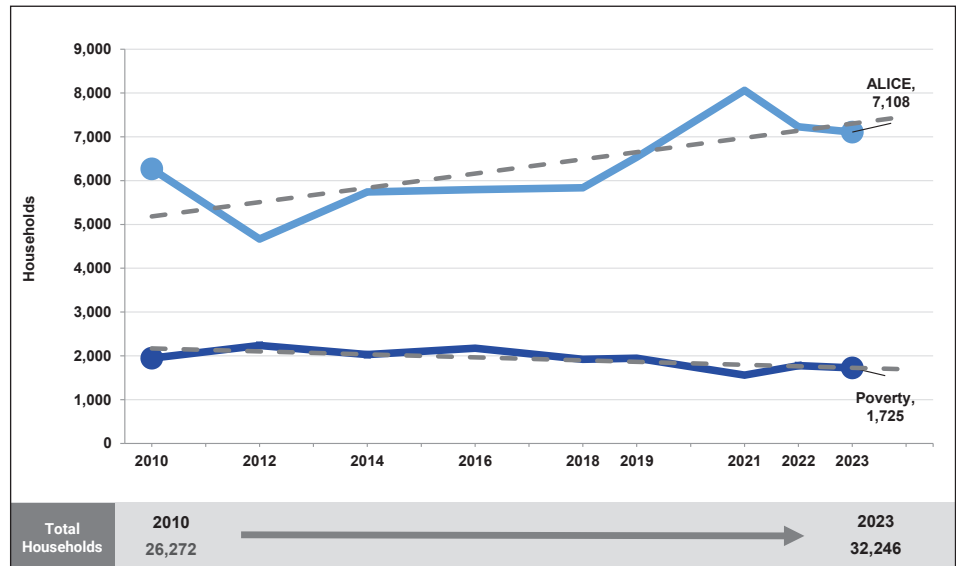

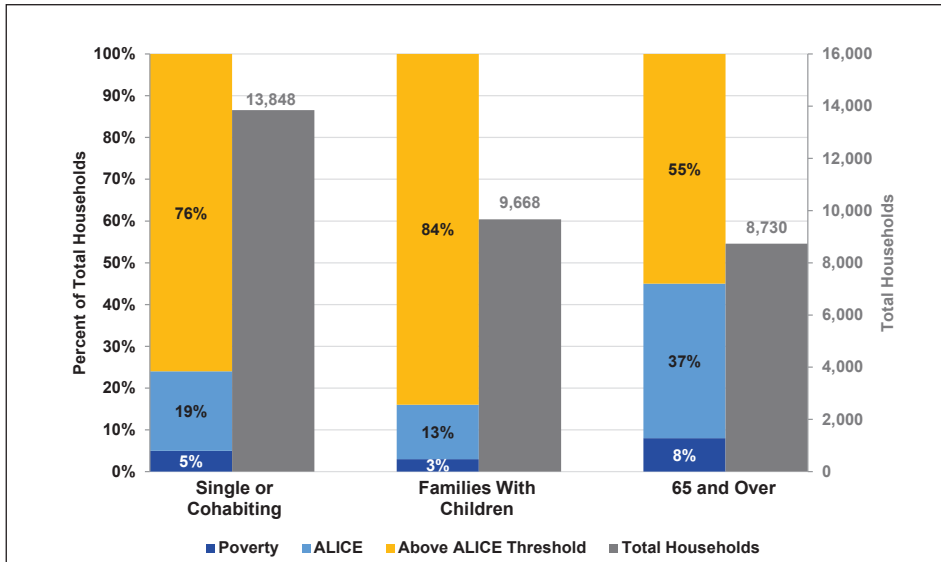

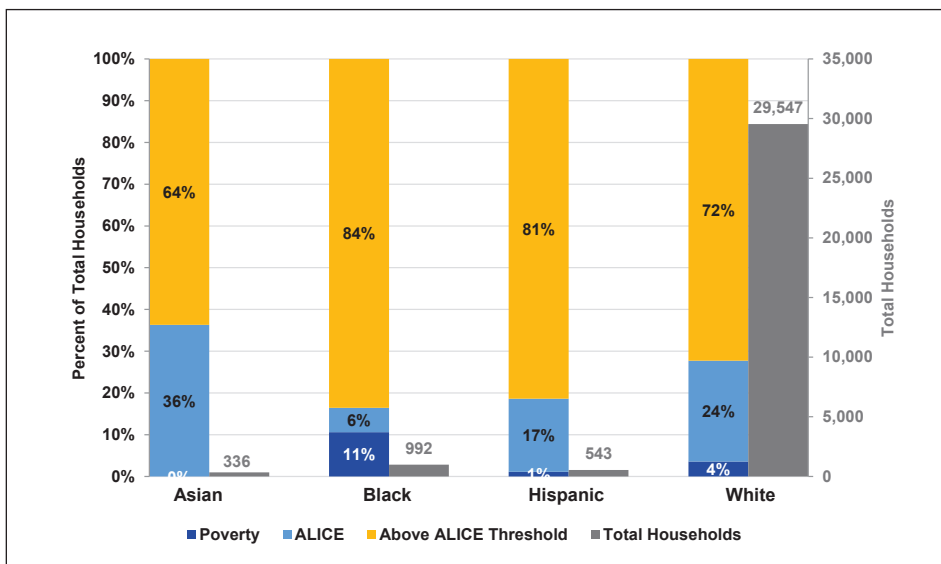
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Hancock County, 2023

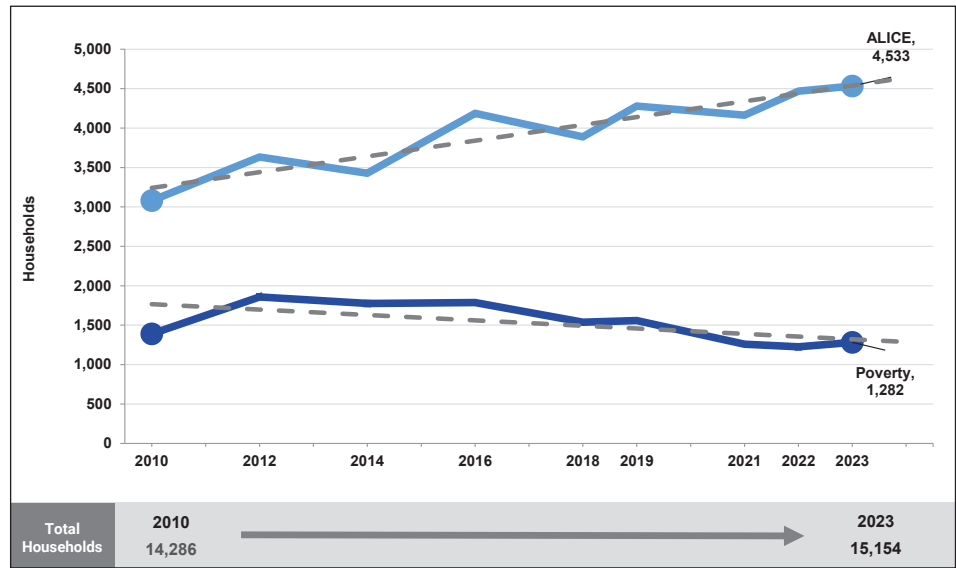

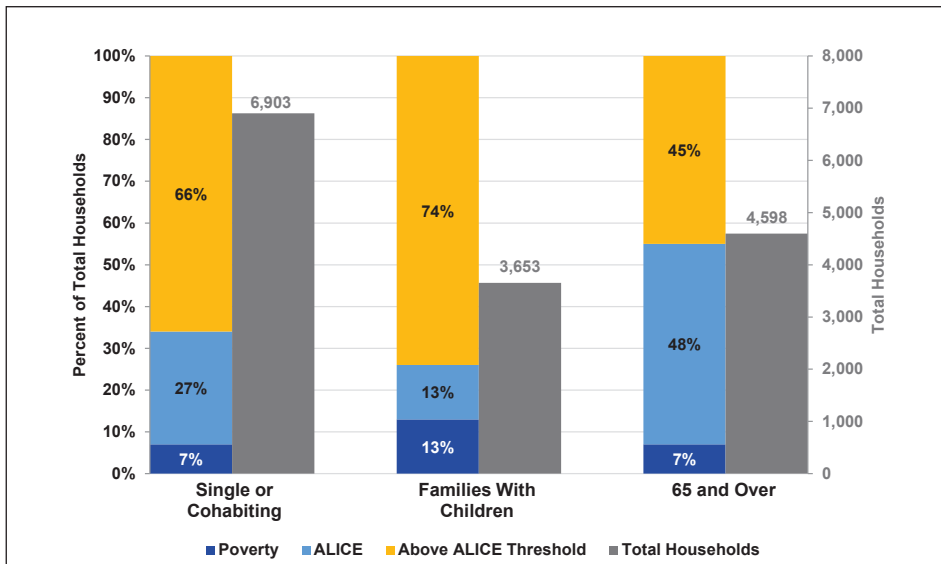

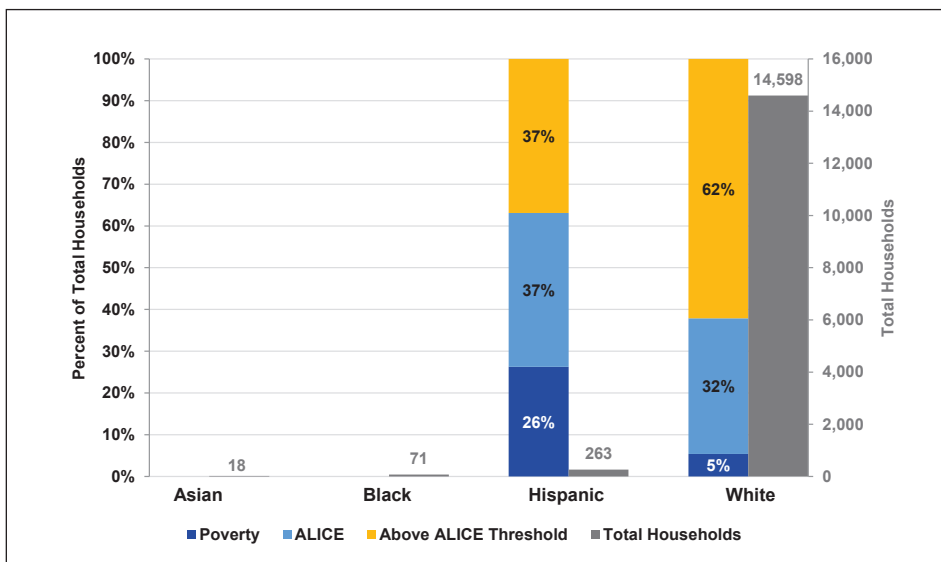
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Harrison County, 2023

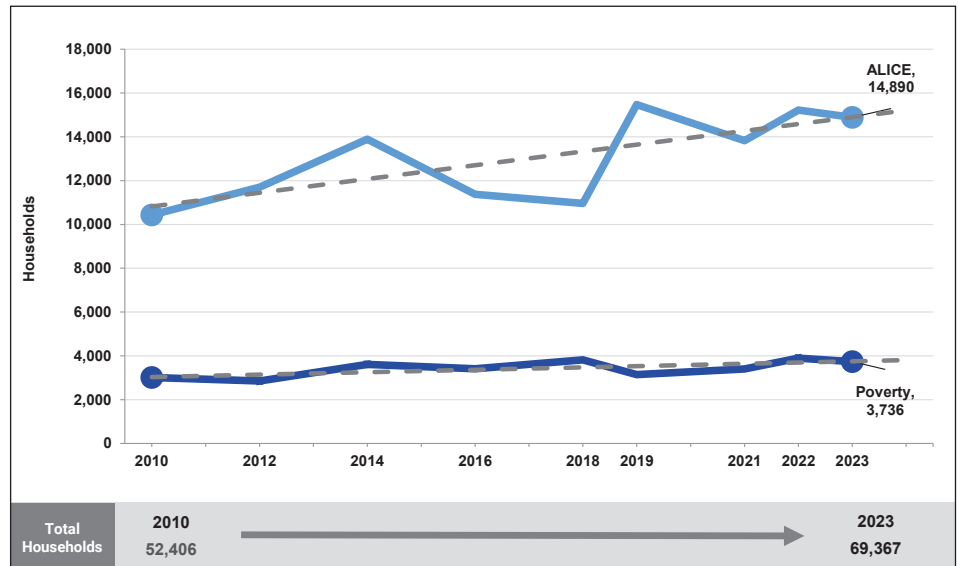

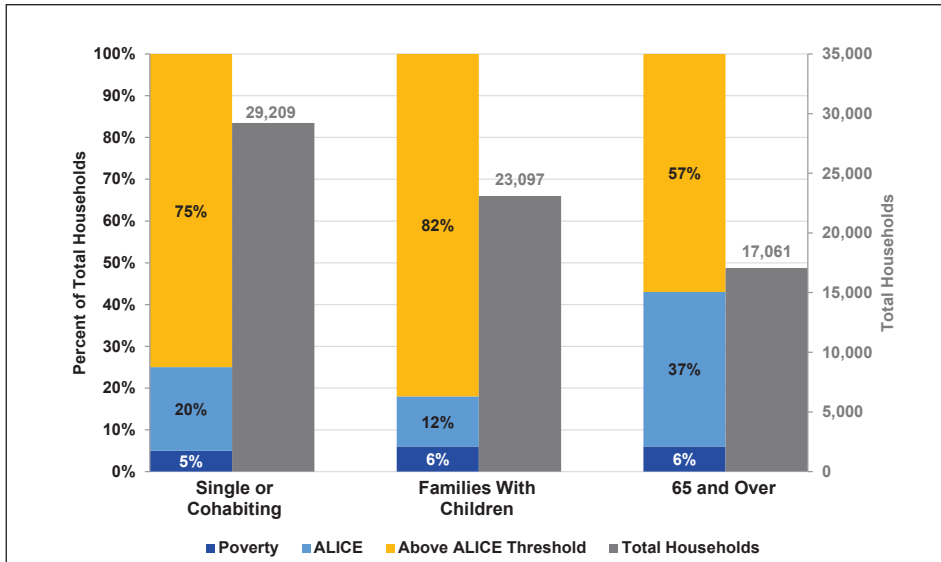

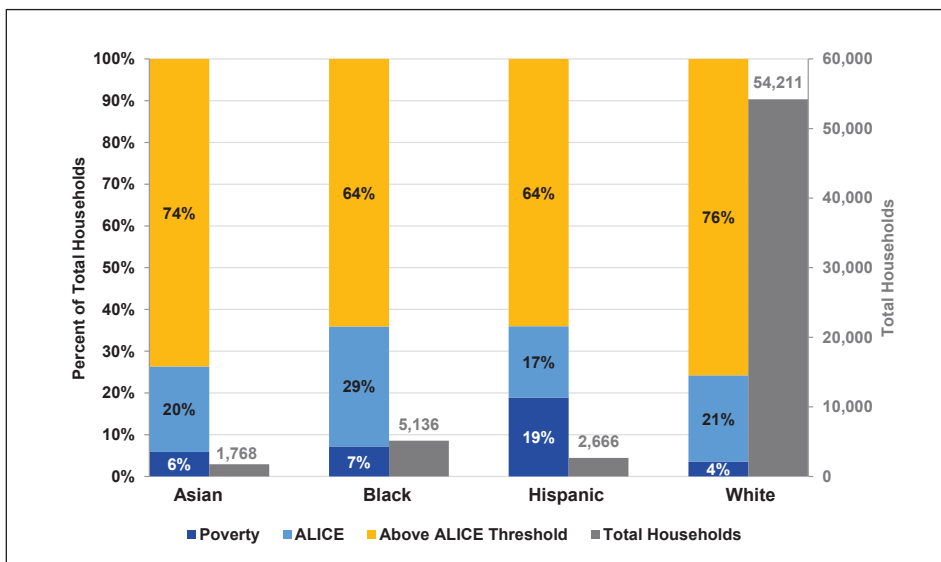
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Hendricks County, 2023

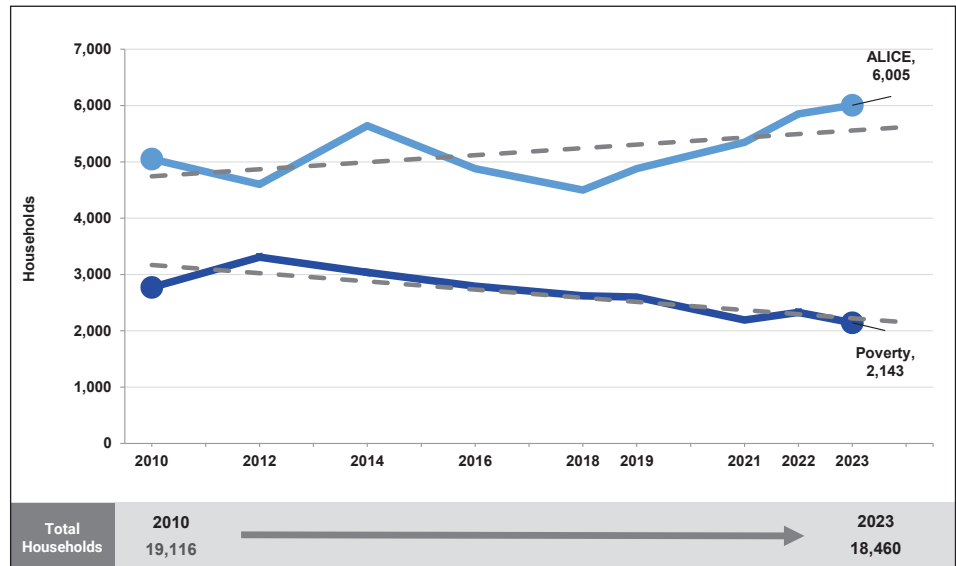

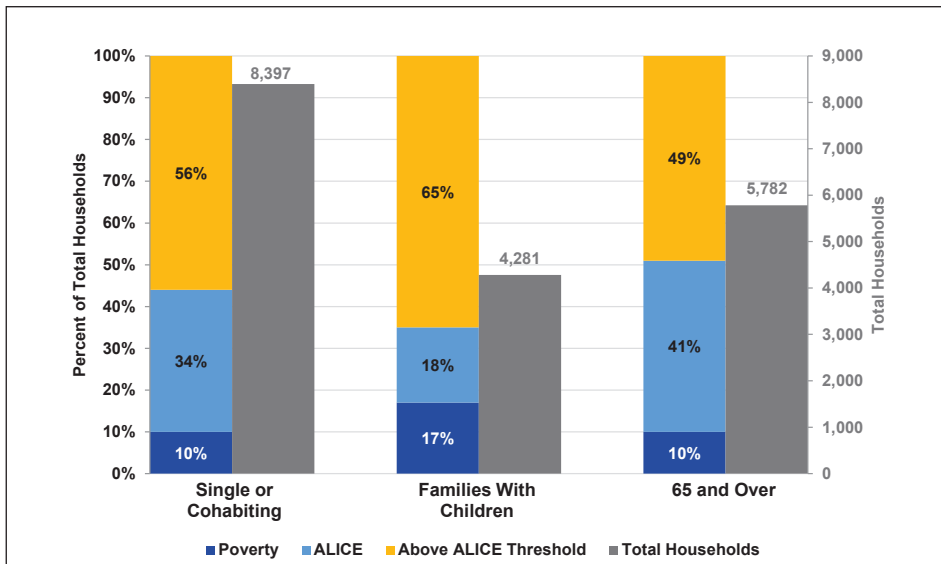

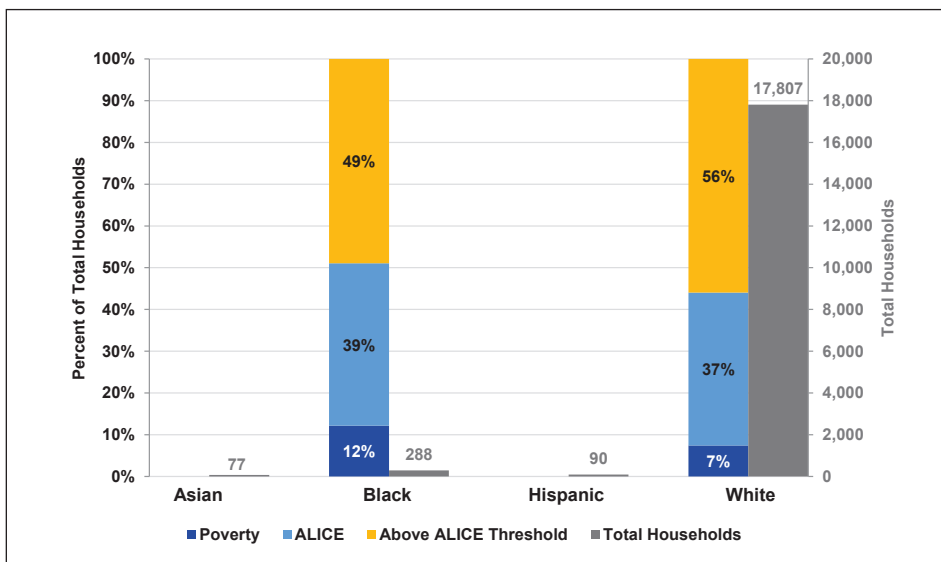
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Henry County, 2023

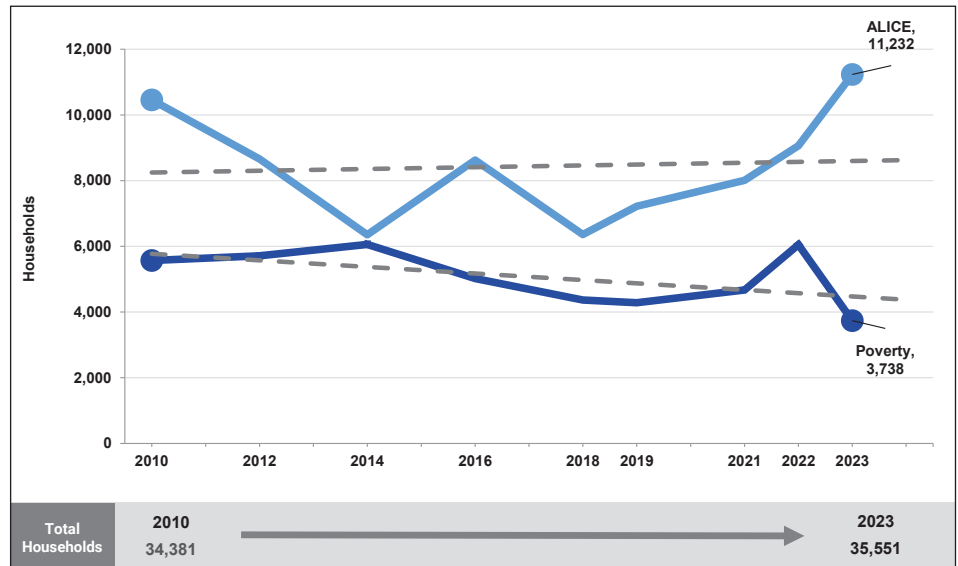

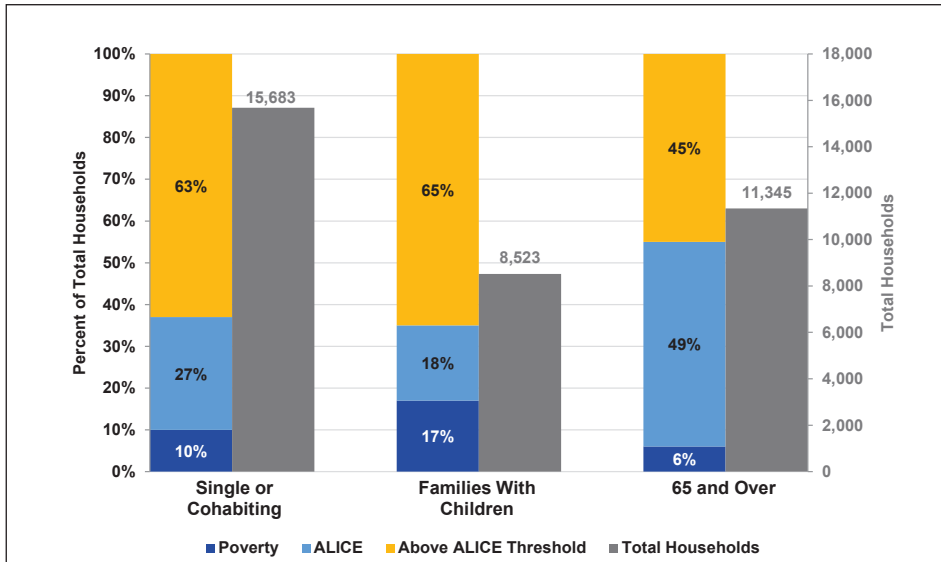

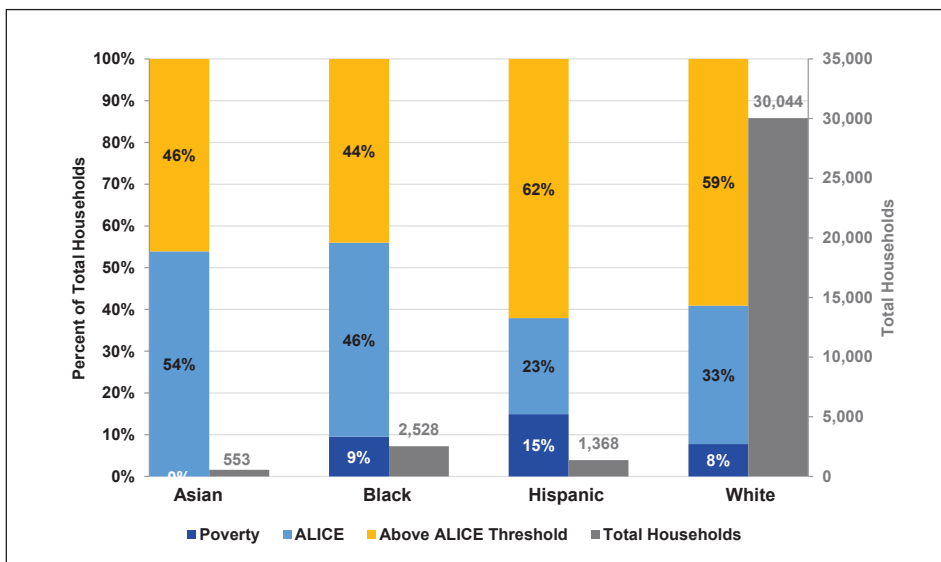
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Howard County, 2023

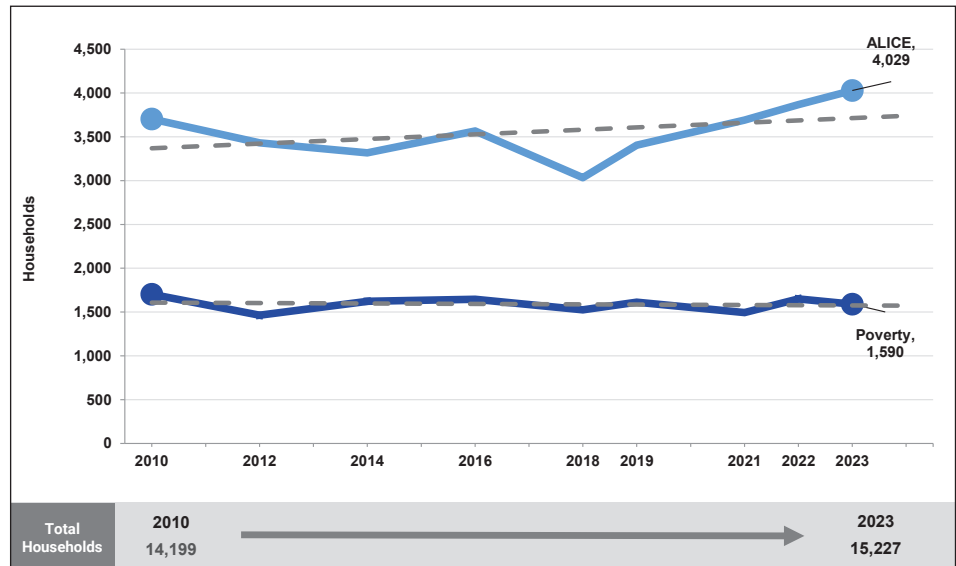

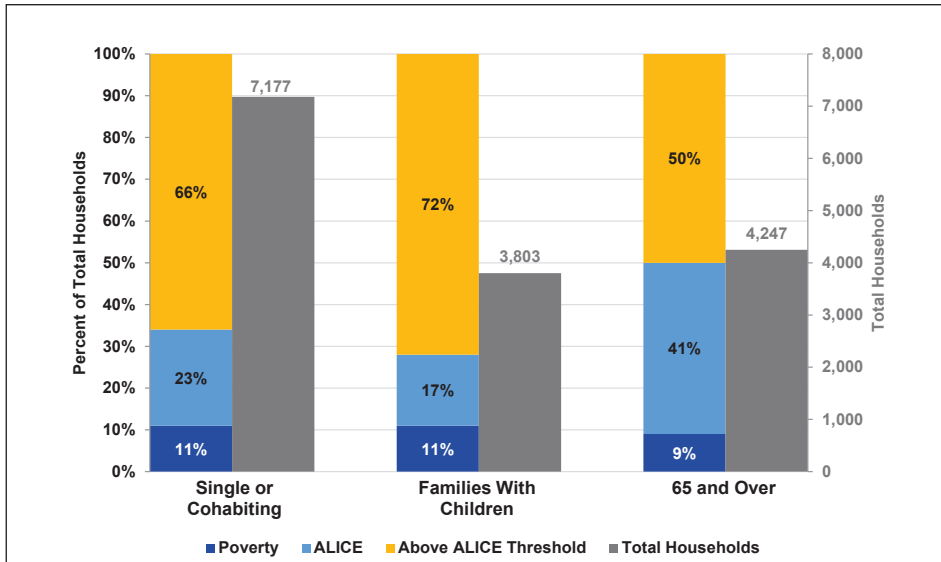

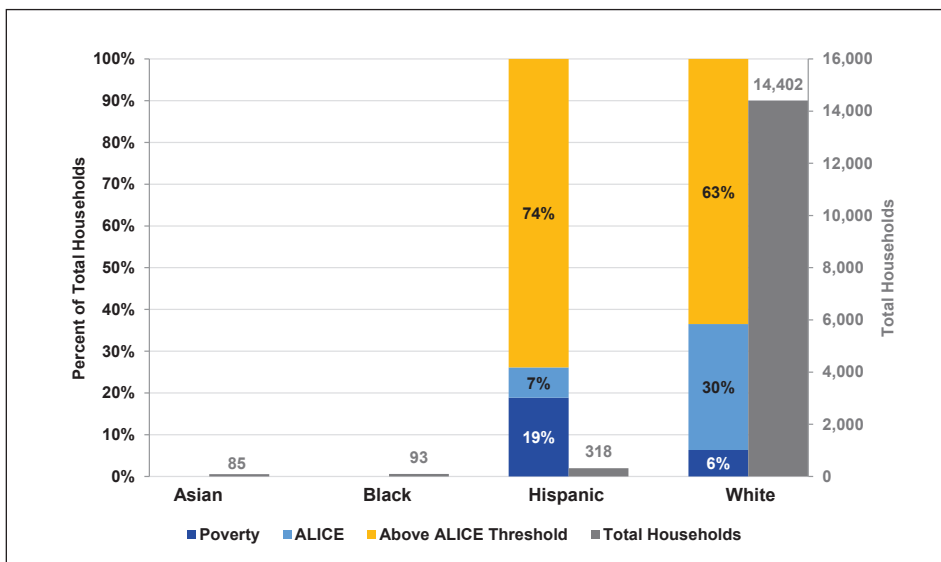
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Huntington County, 2023

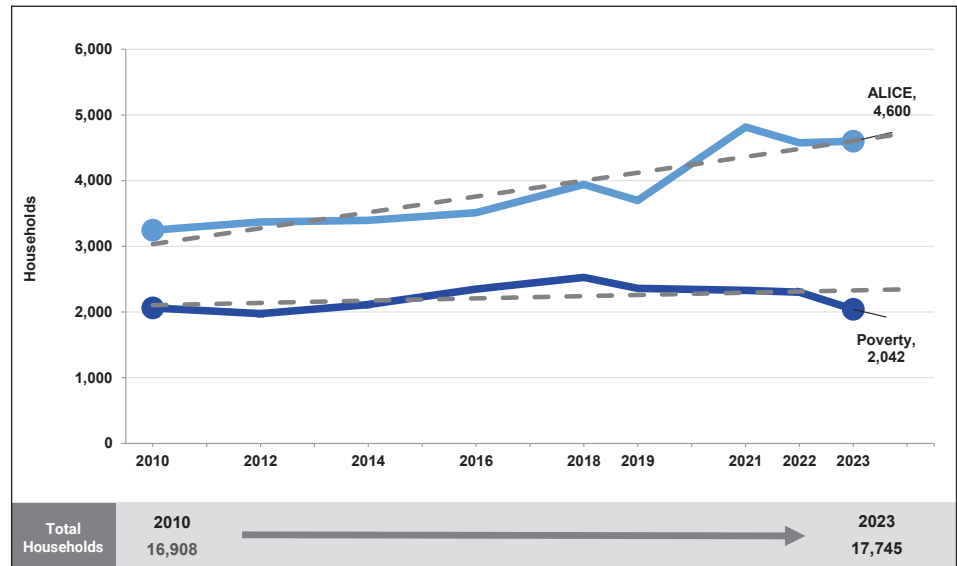

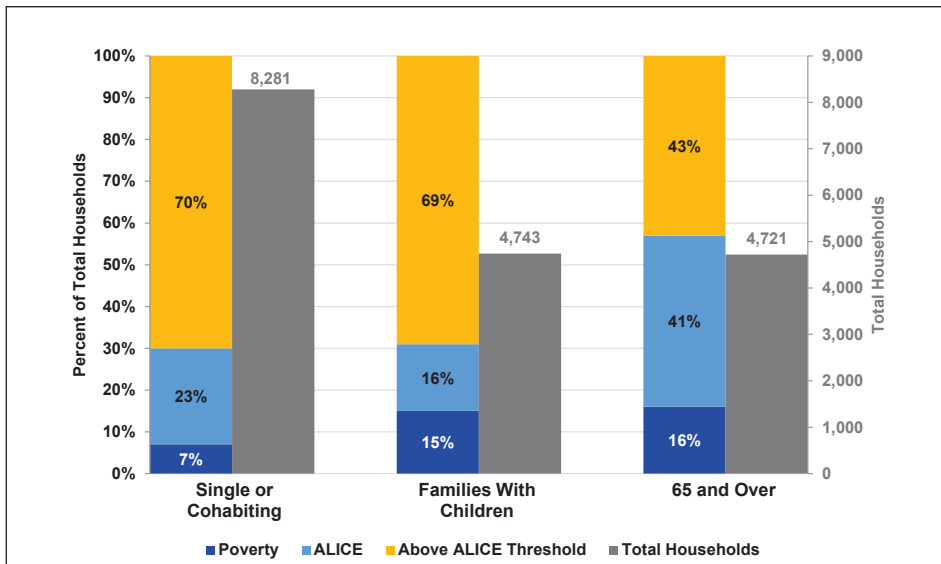

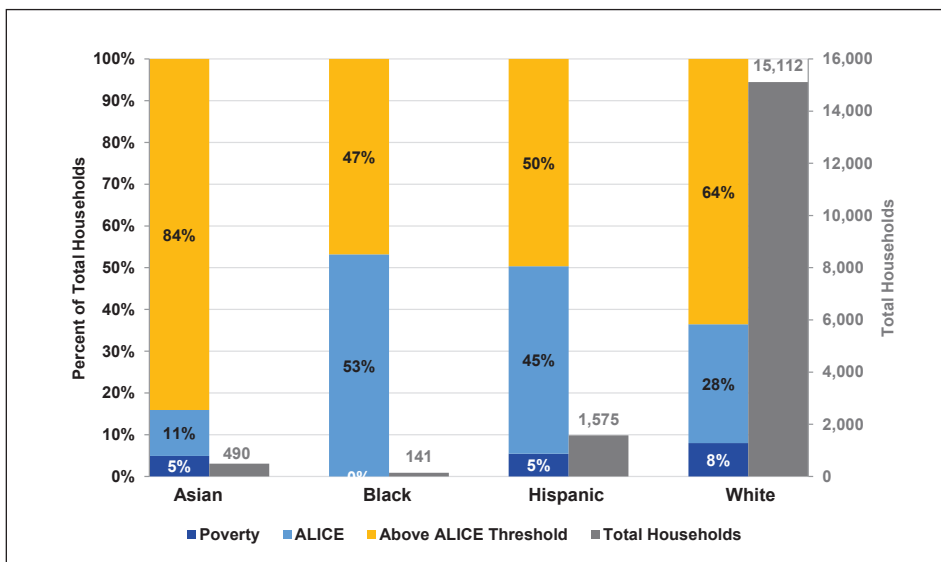
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Jackson County, 2023

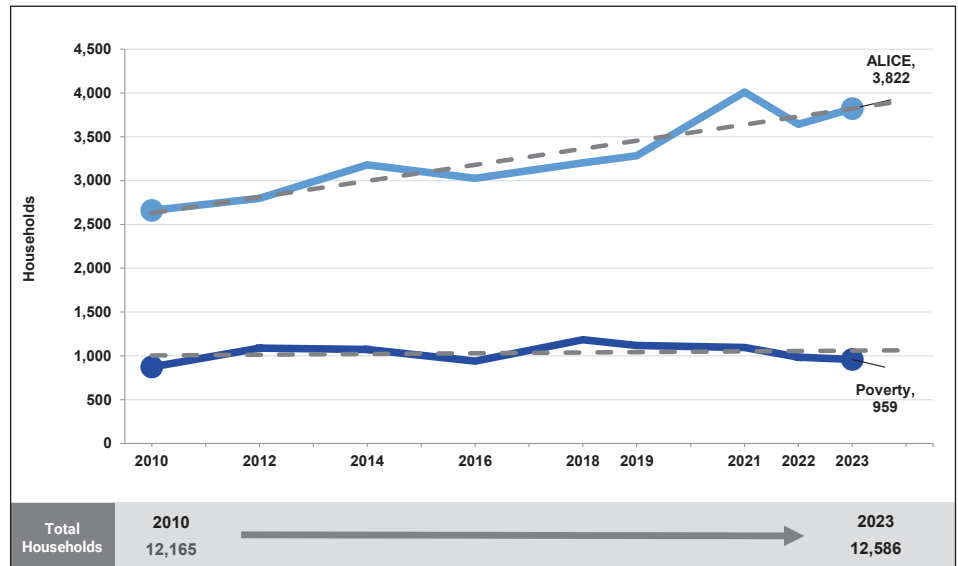

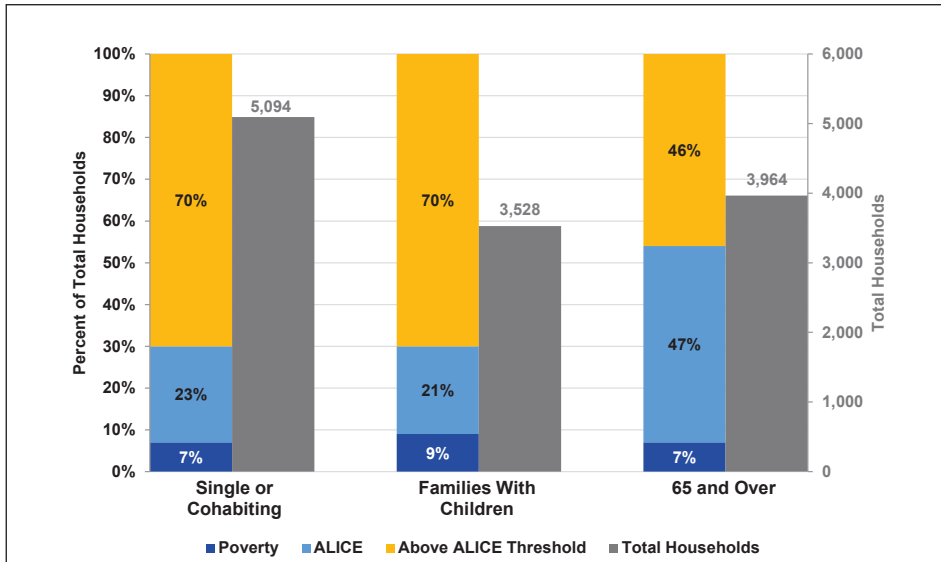

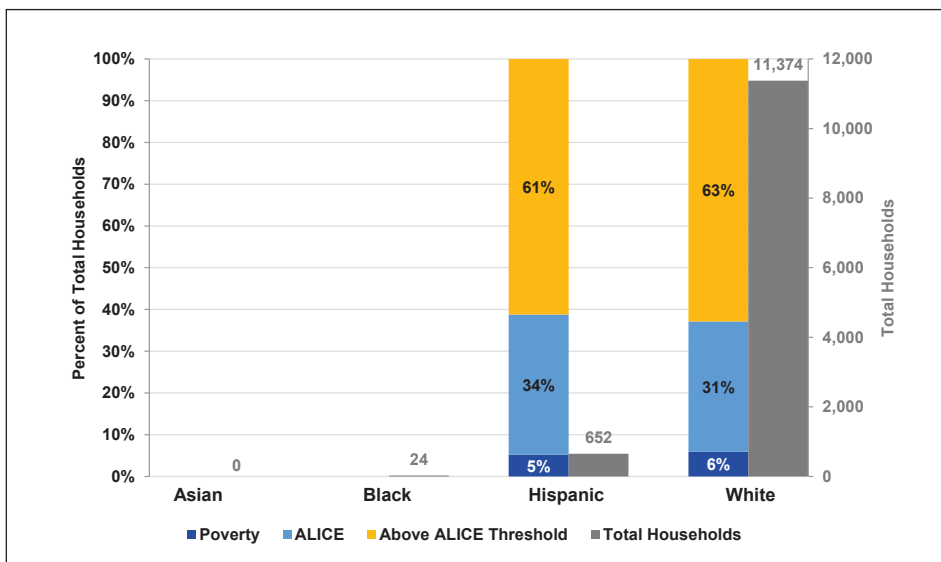
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Jasper County, 2023

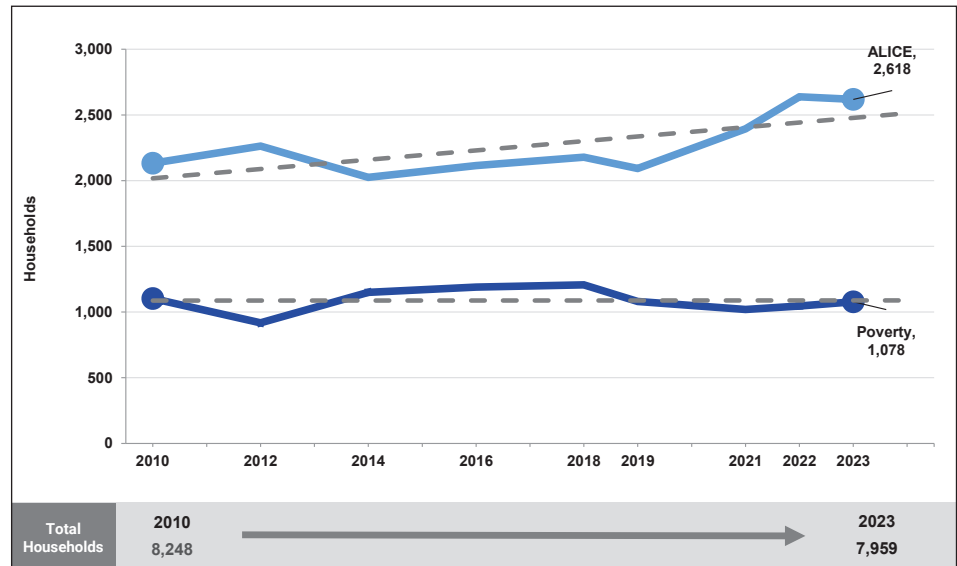

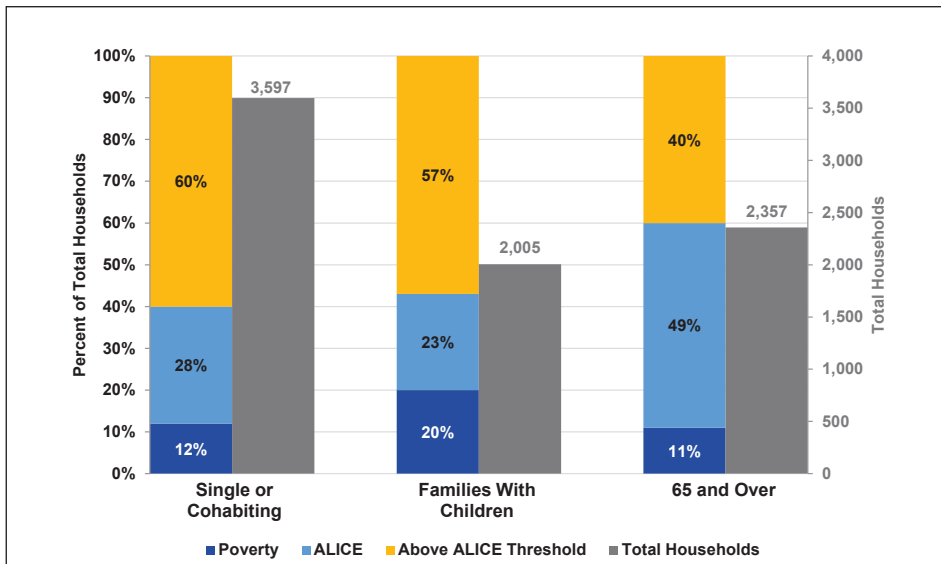

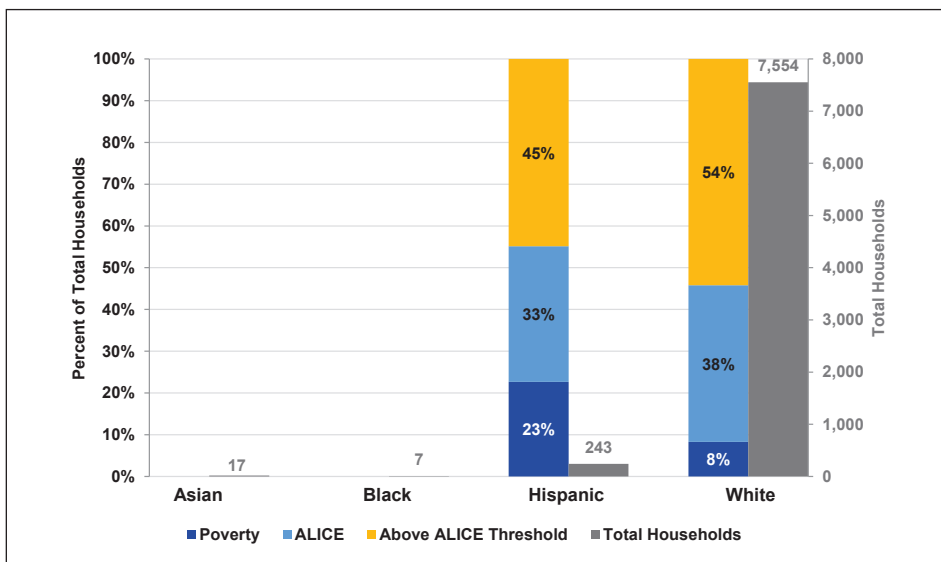
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Jay County, 2023

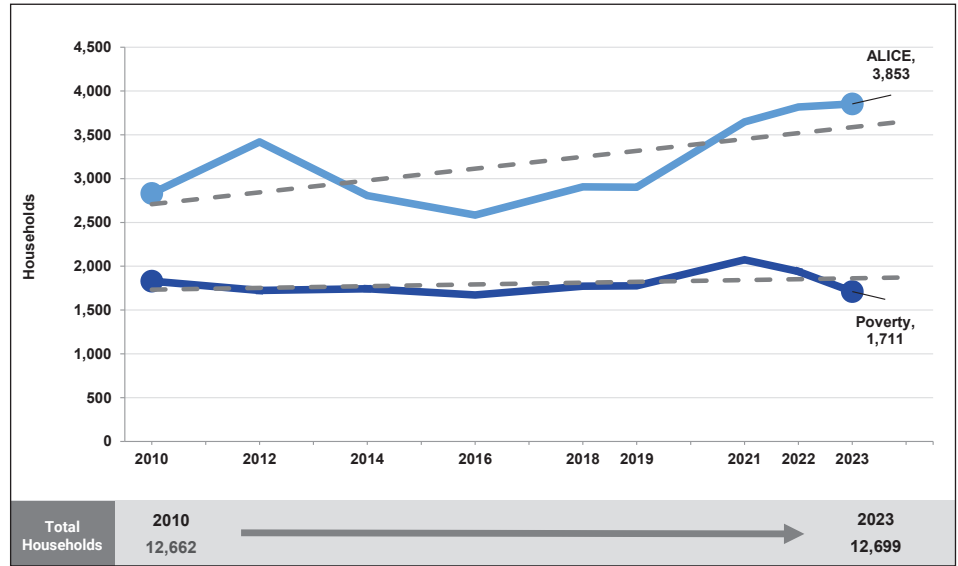

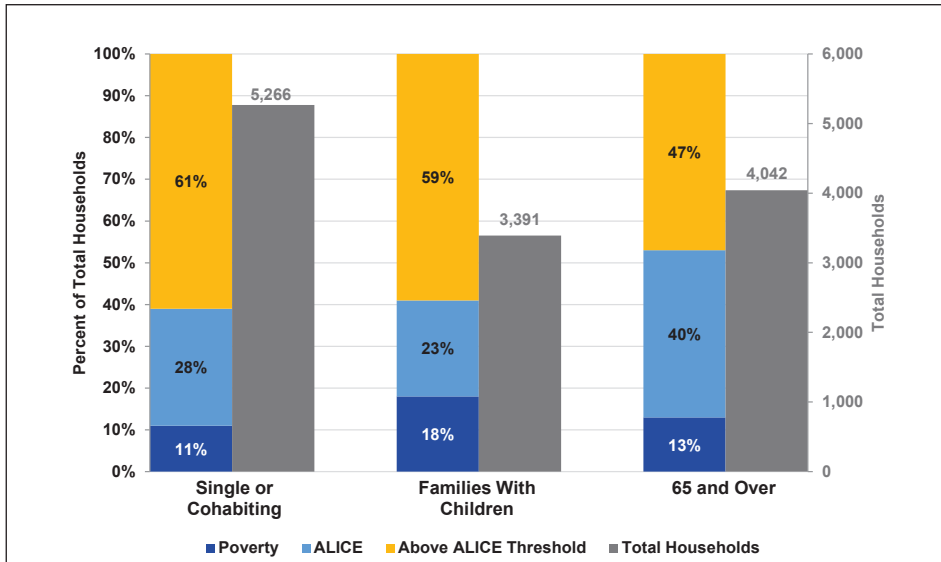

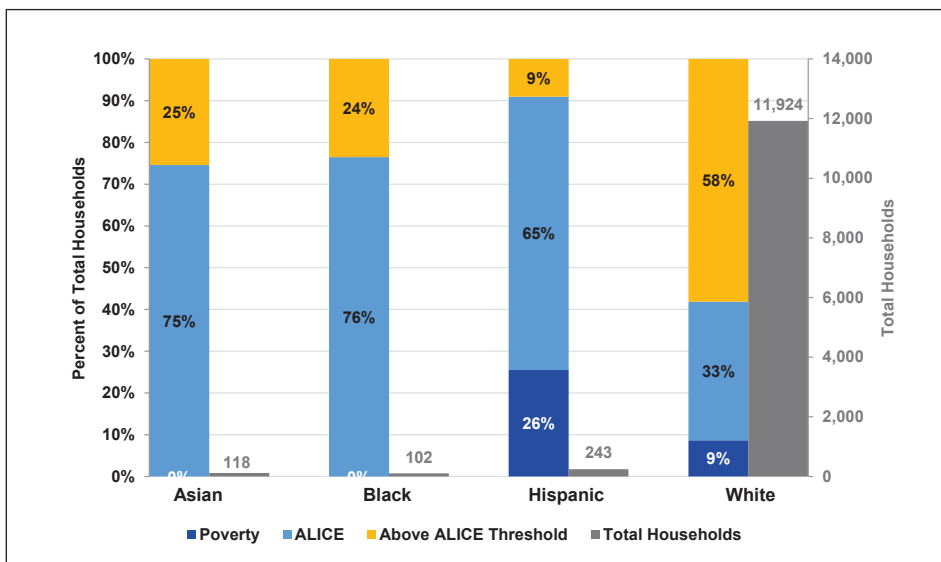
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Jefferson County, 2023

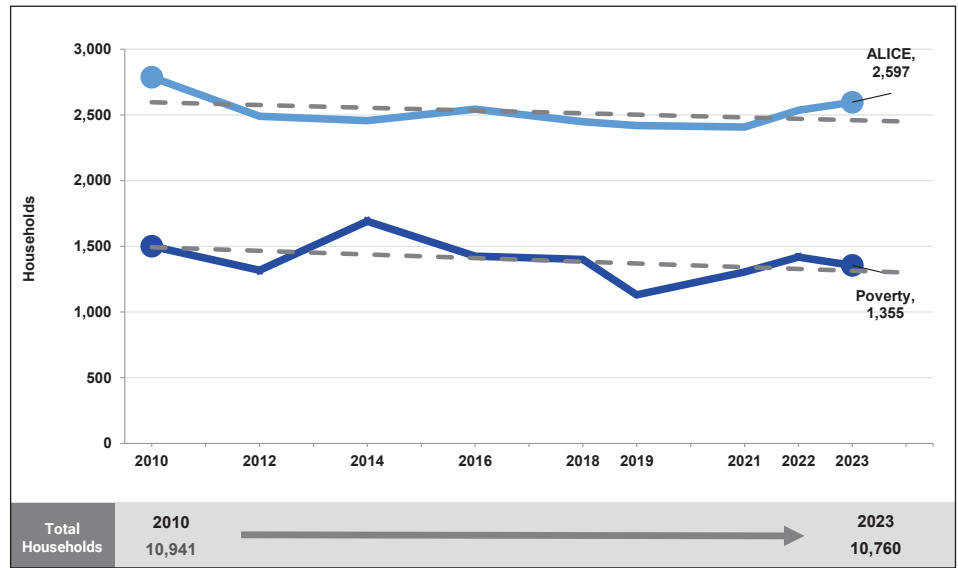

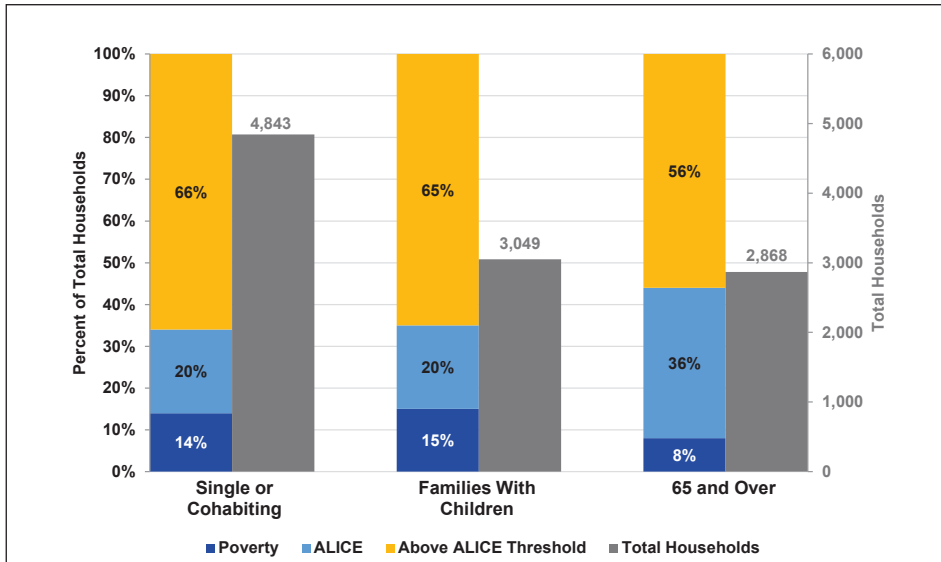

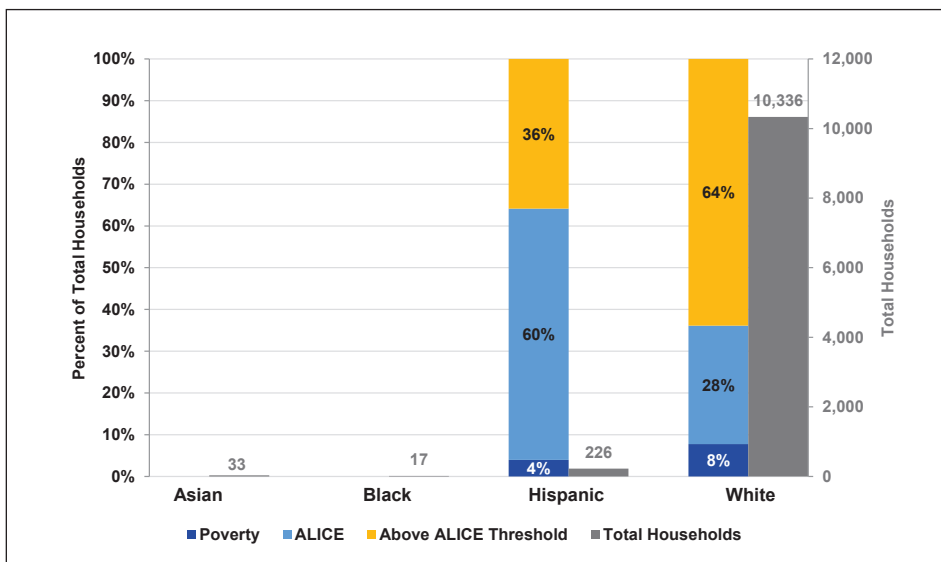
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Jennings County, 2023

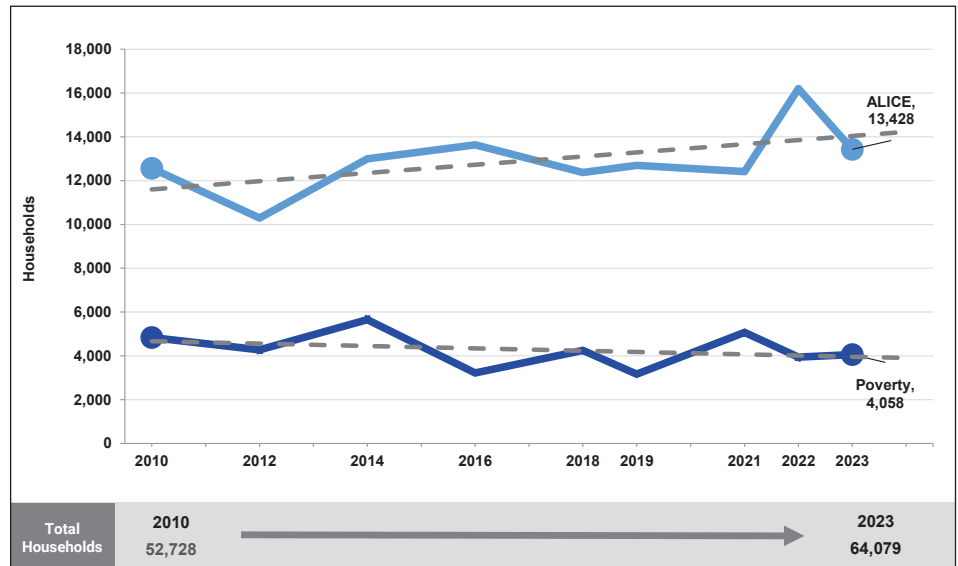

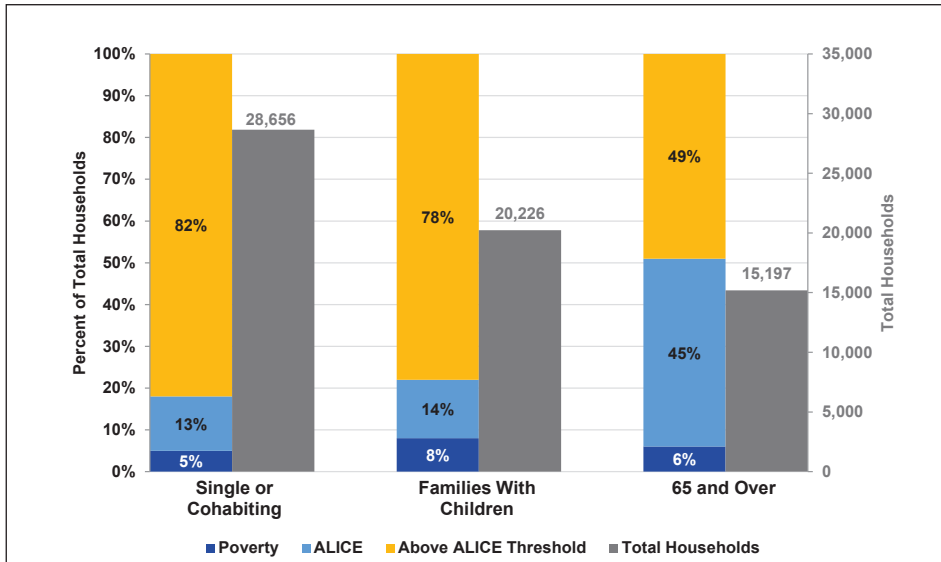

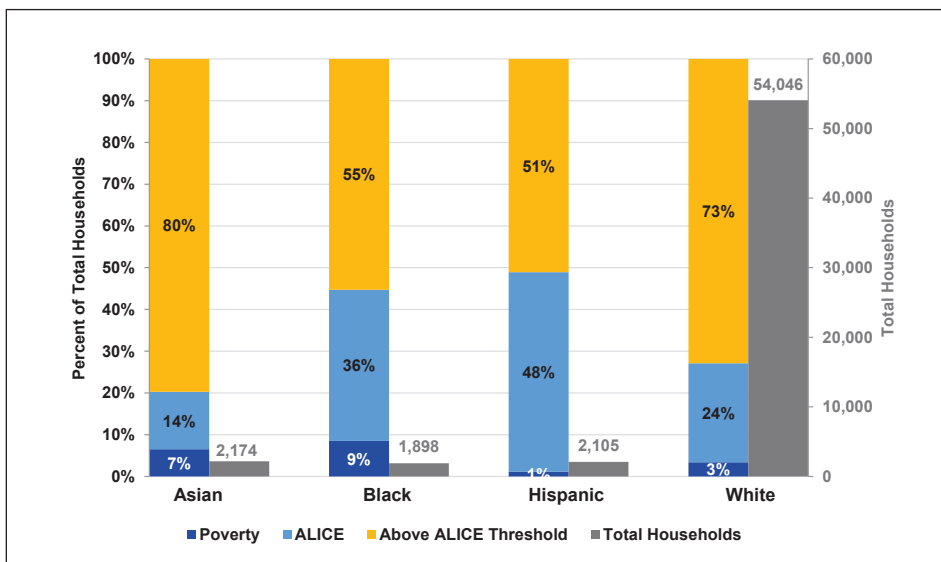
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Johnson County, 2023

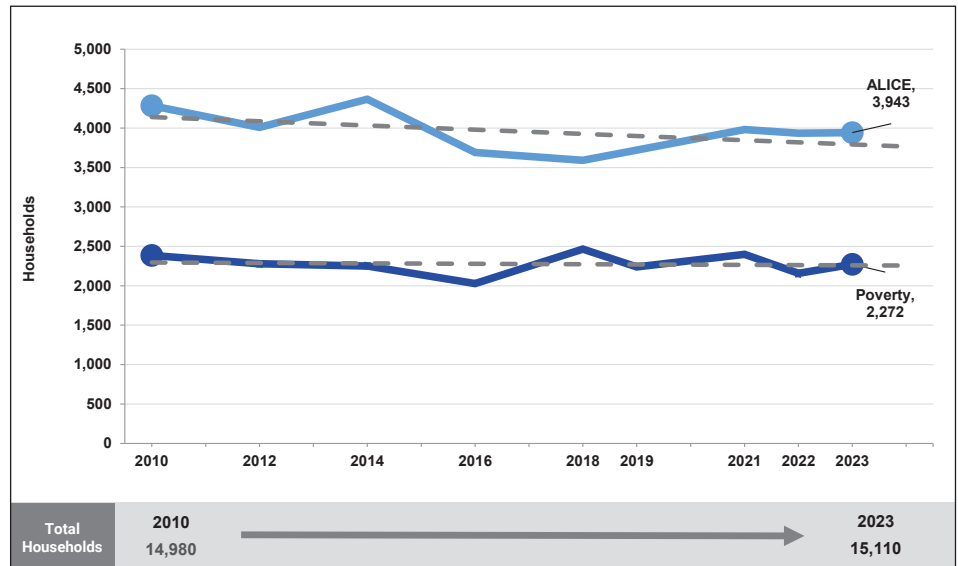

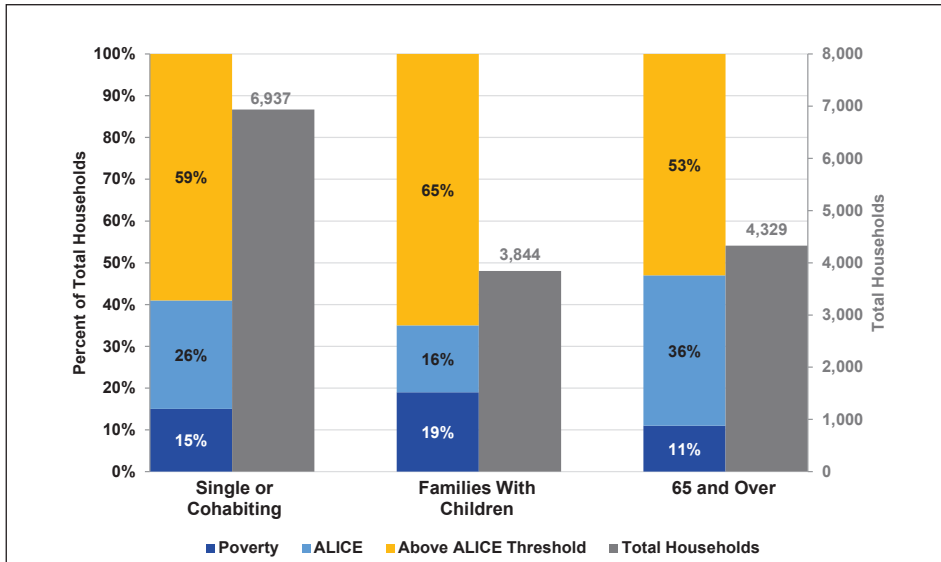

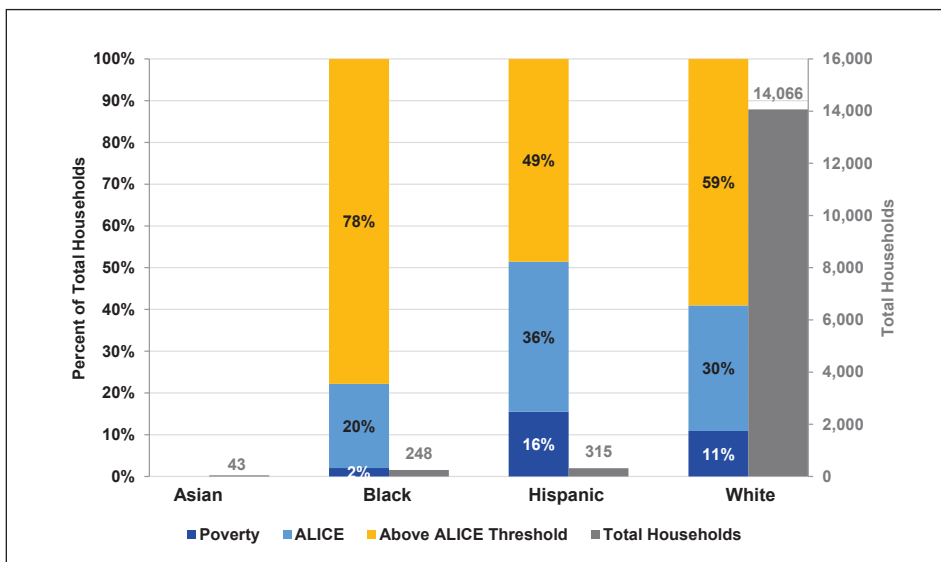
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Knox County, 2023

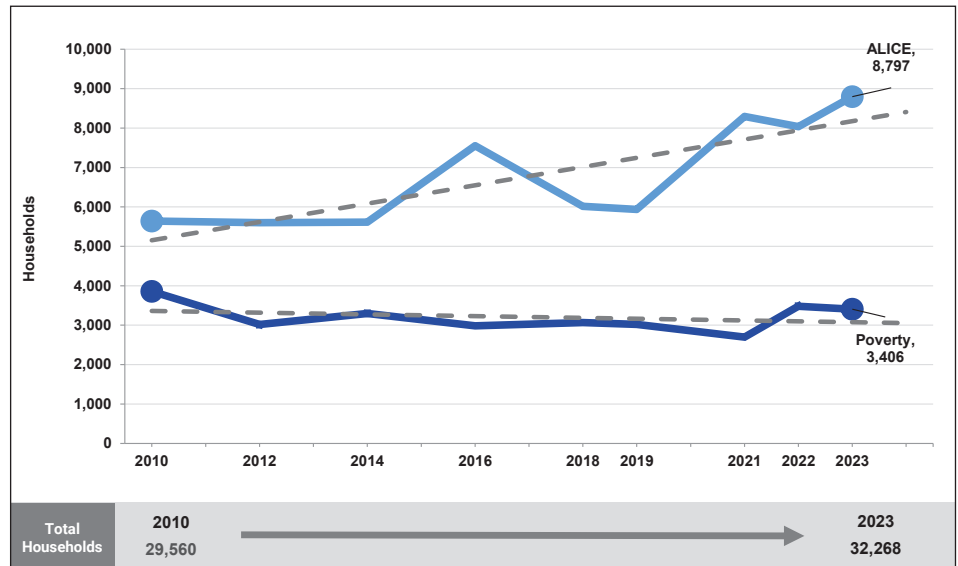

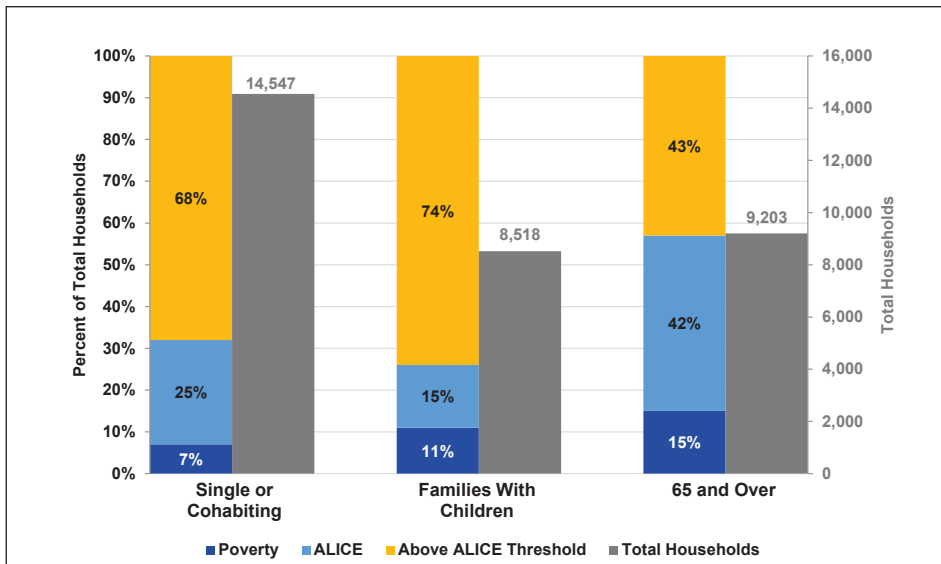

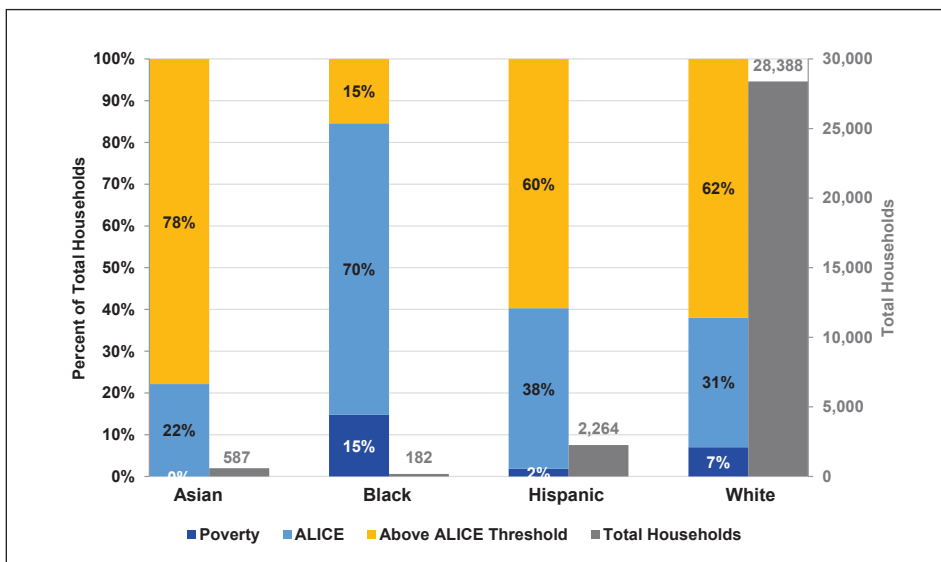
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Kosciusko County, 2023

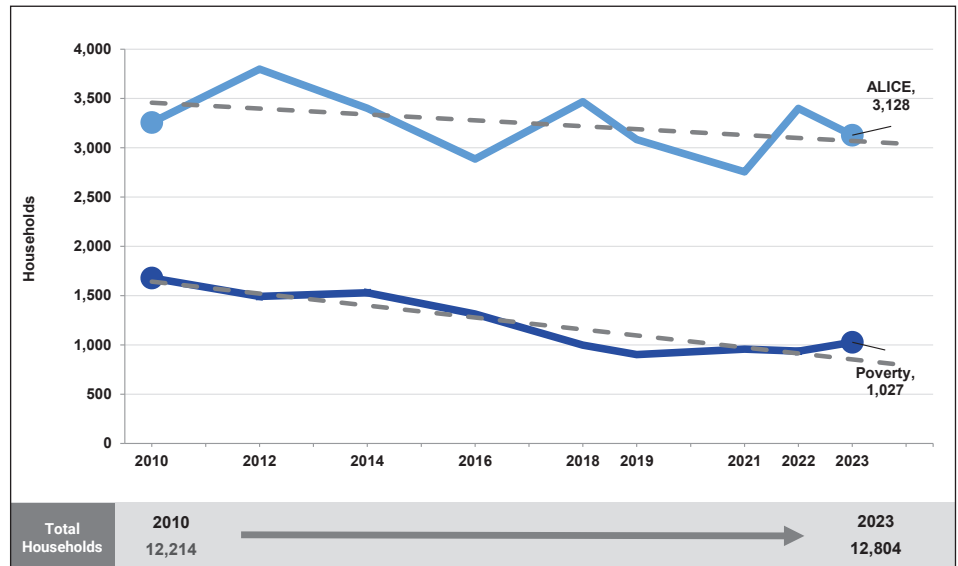

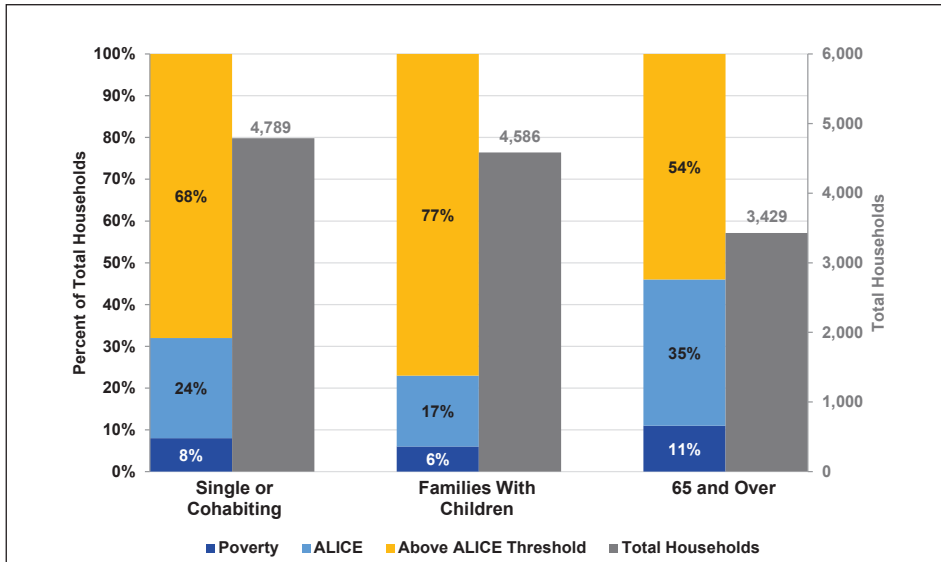

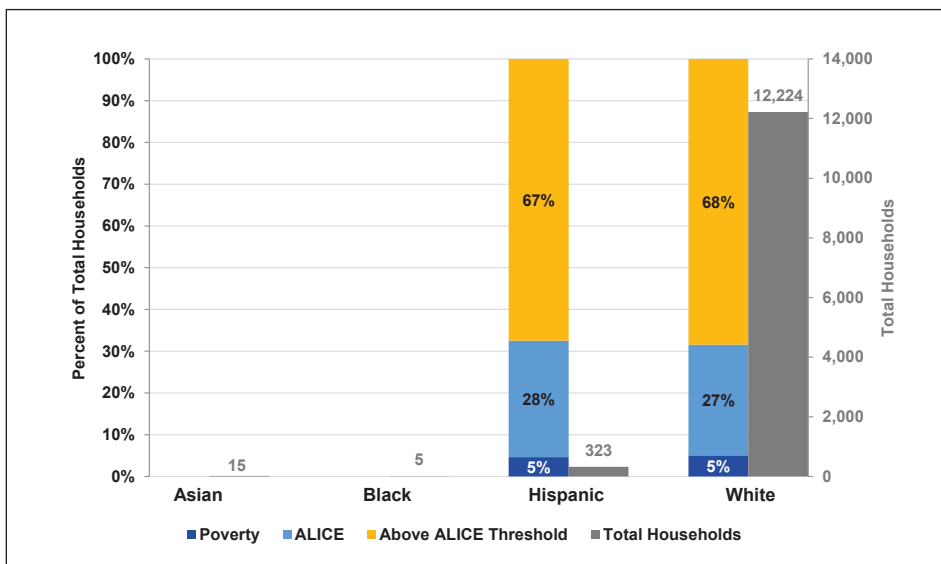
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, LaGrange County, 2023

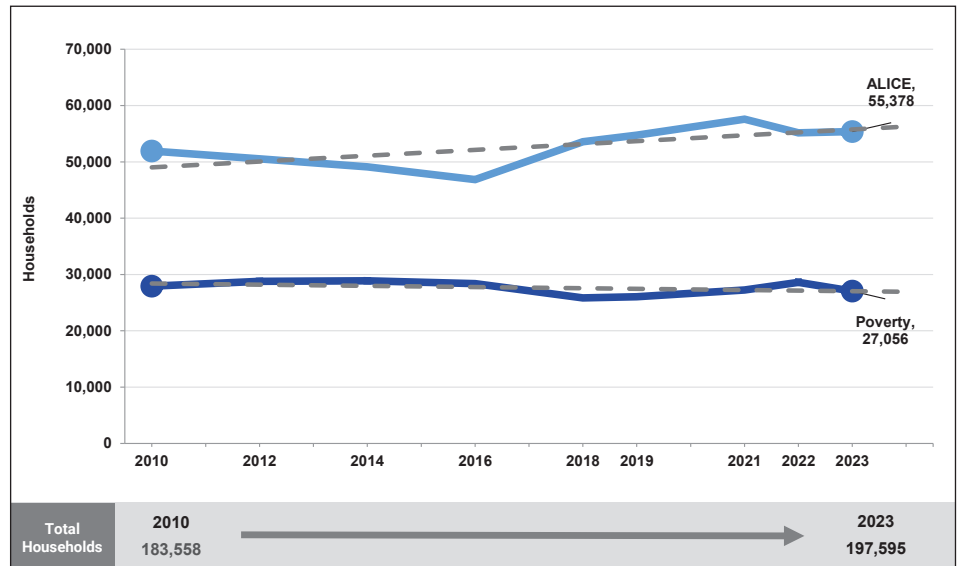

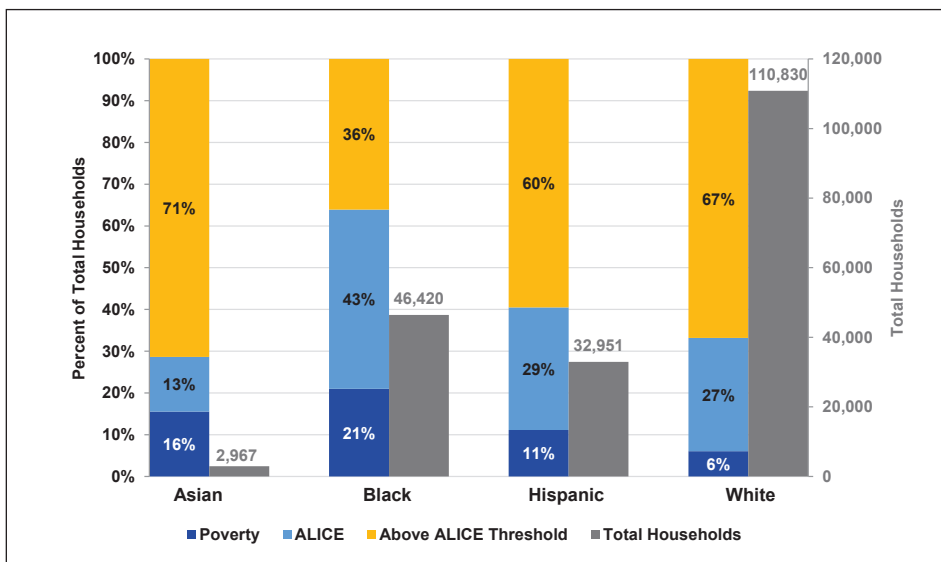

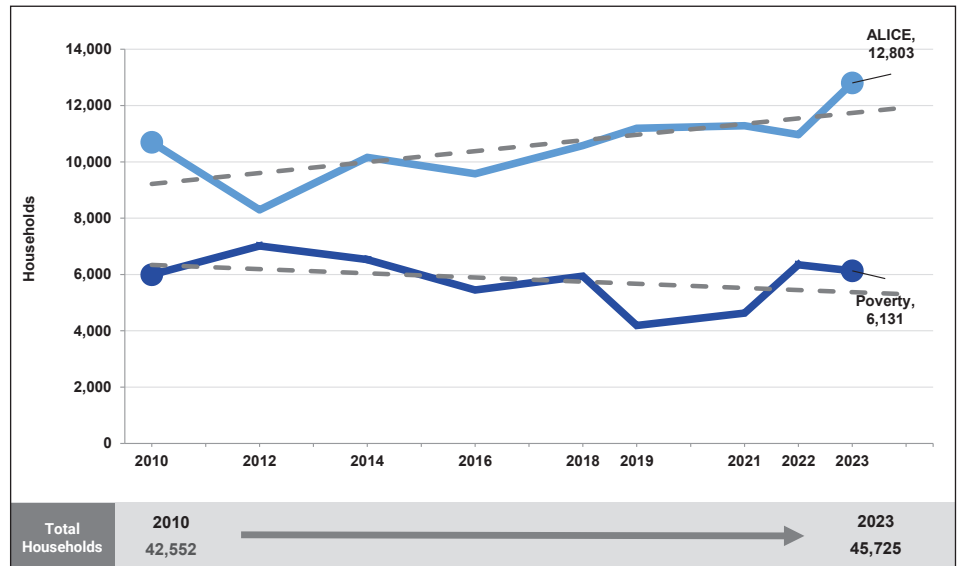

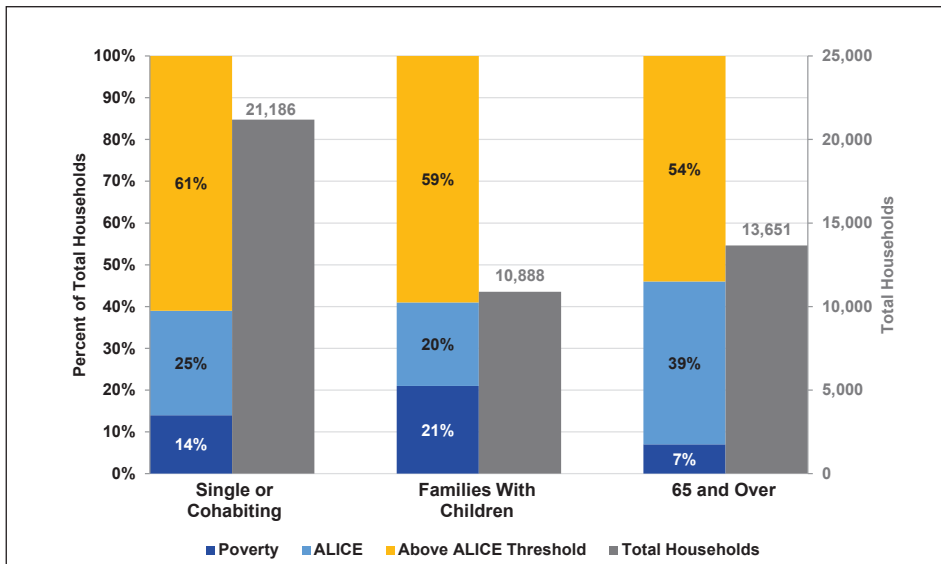

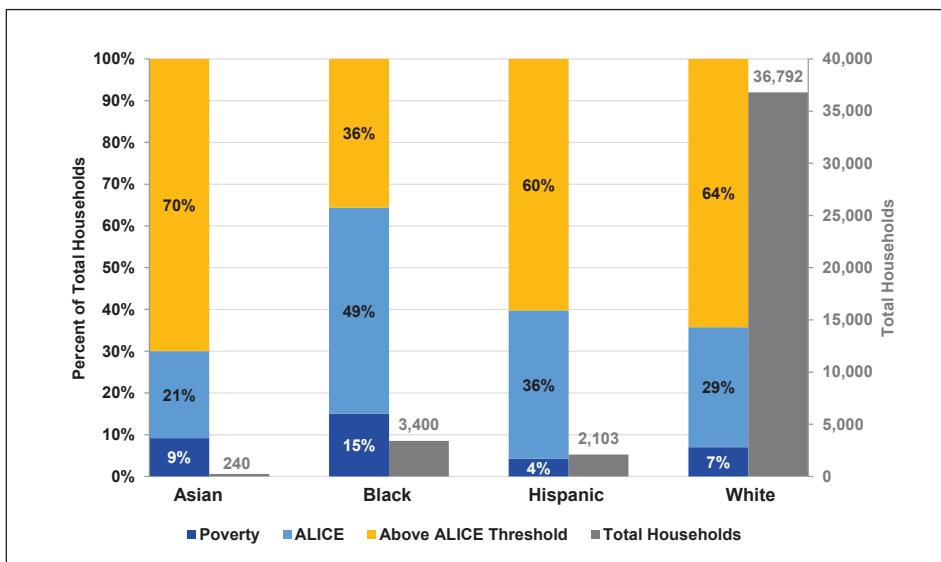
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, LaPorte County, 2023

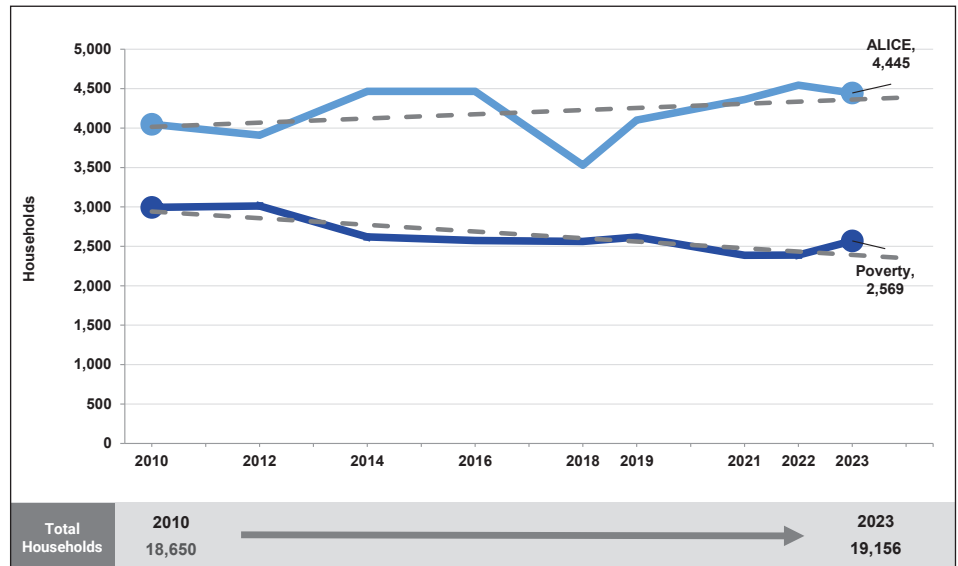

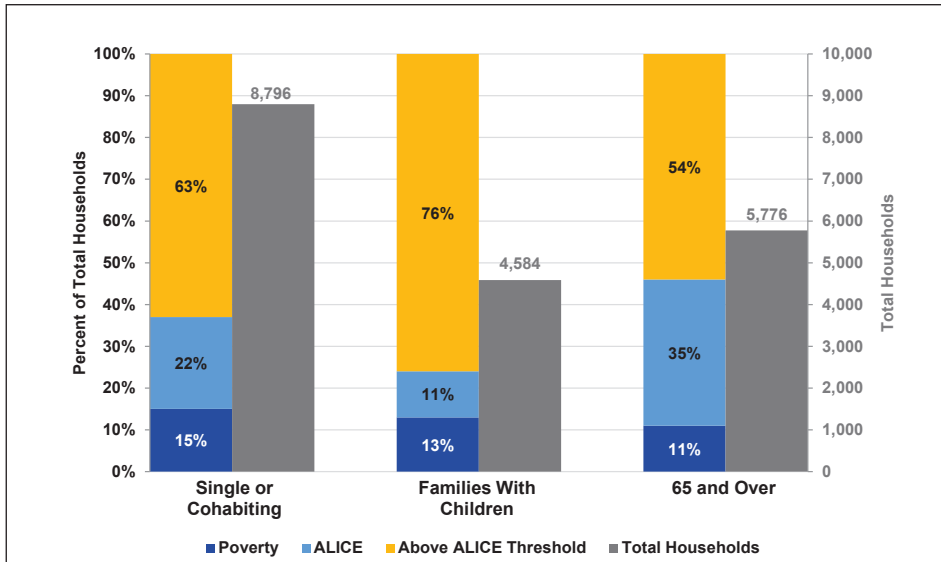

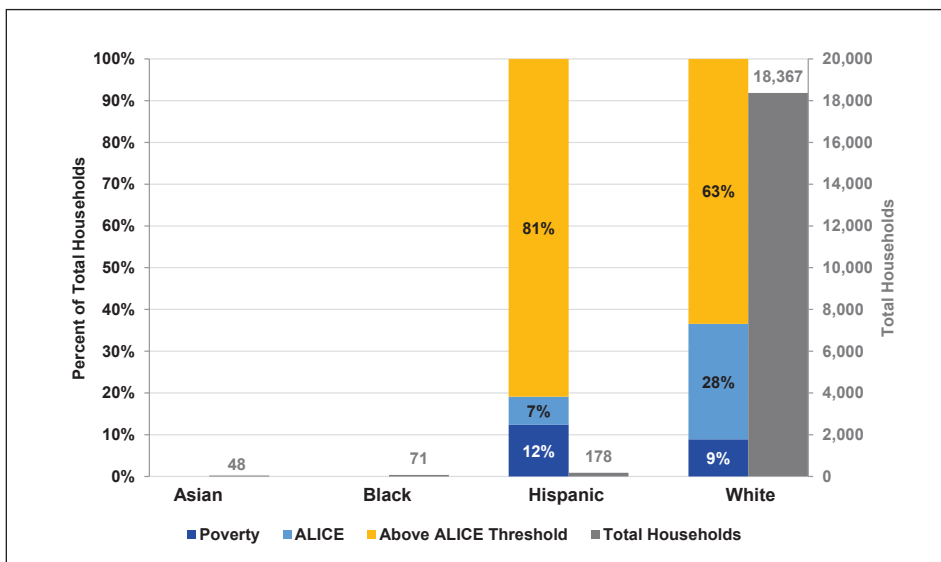
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Lawrence County, 2023

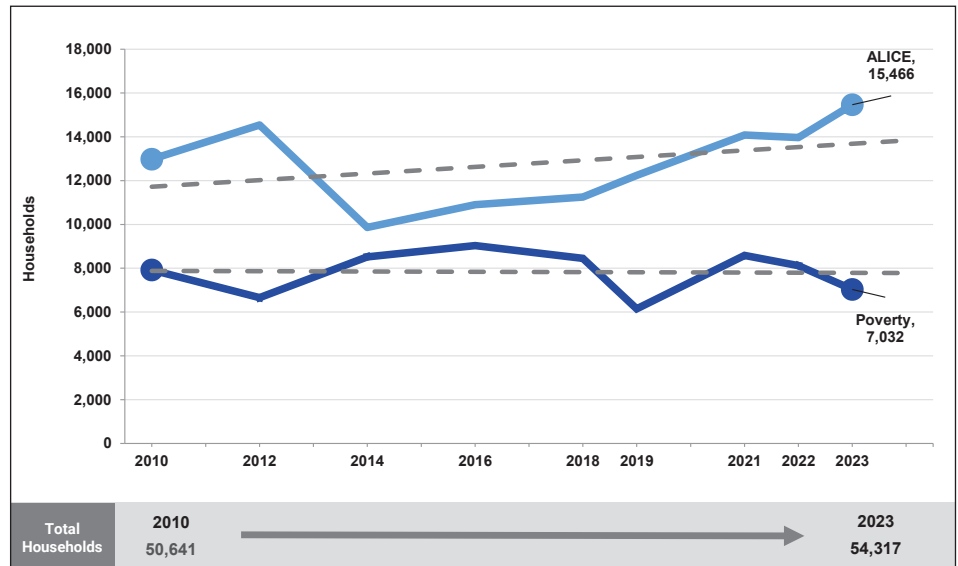

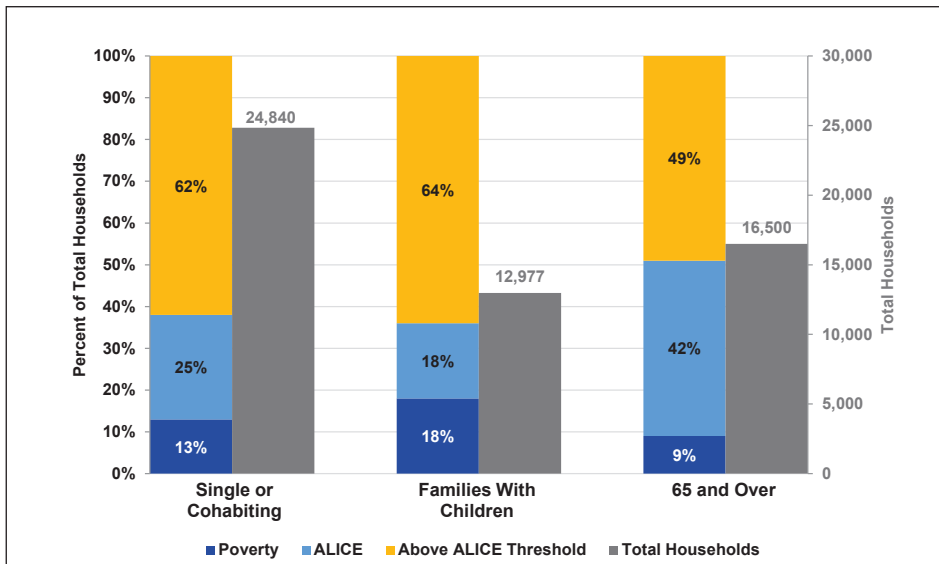

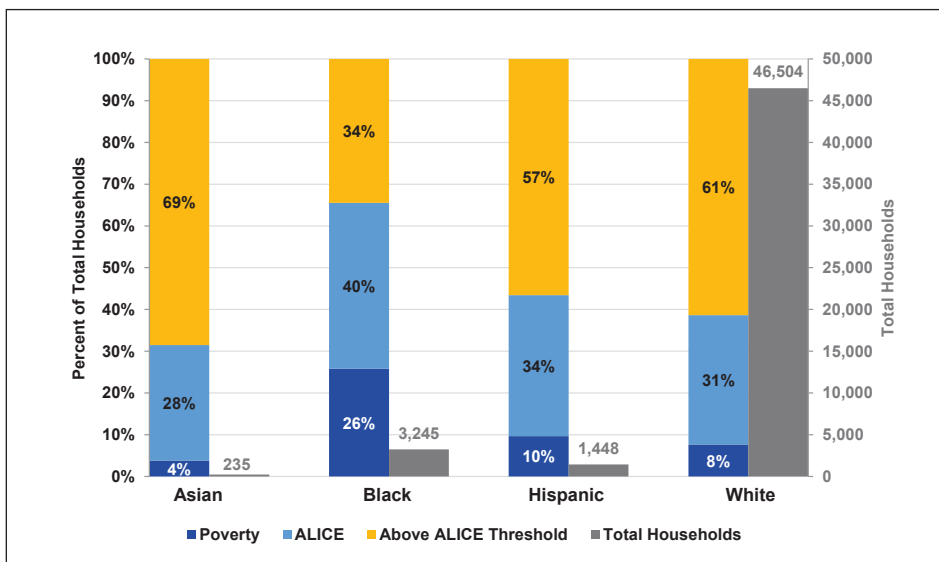
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Madison County, 2023

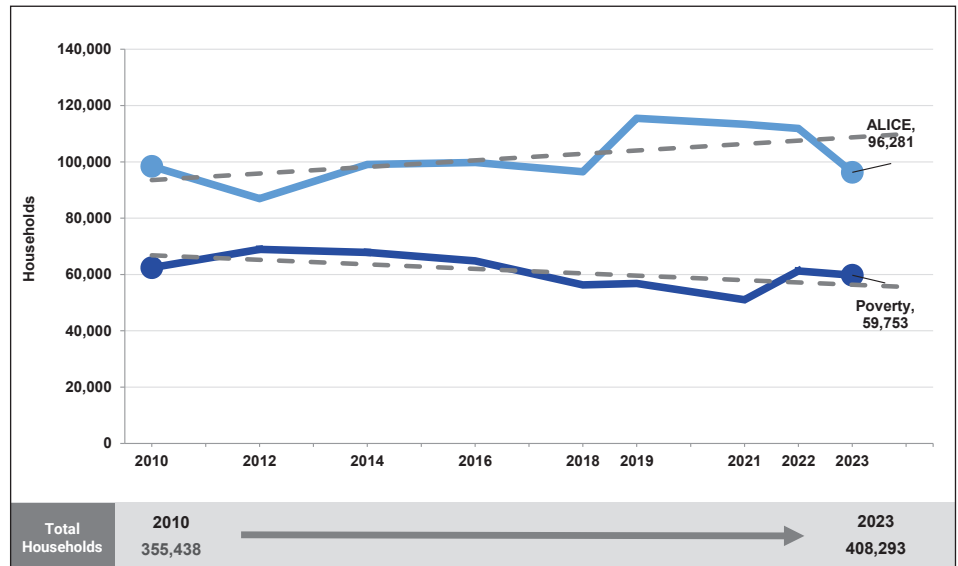

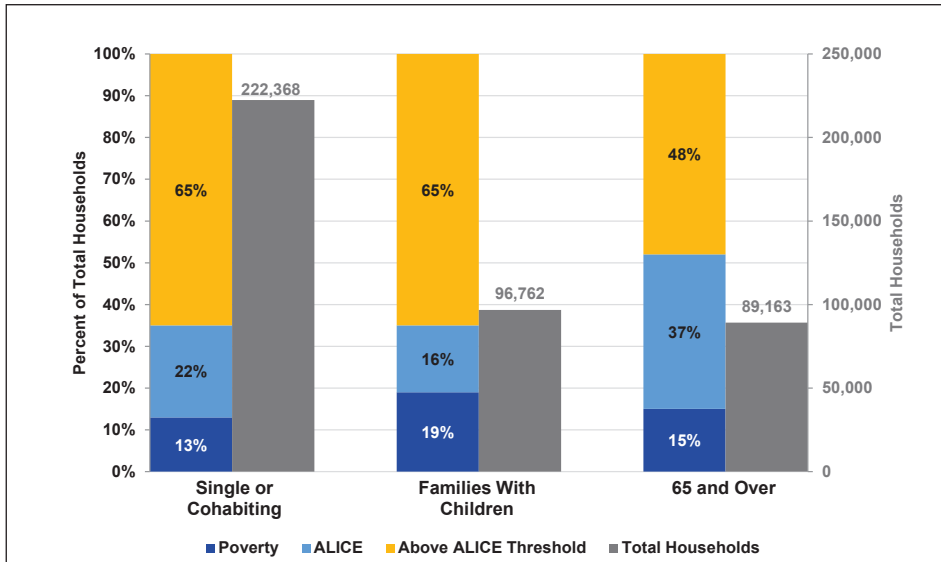

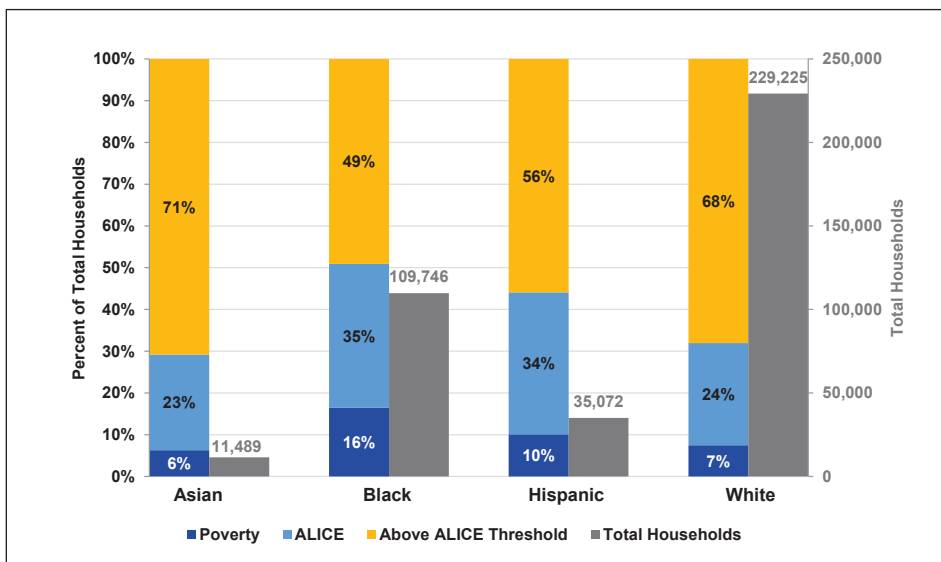
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Marion County, 2023

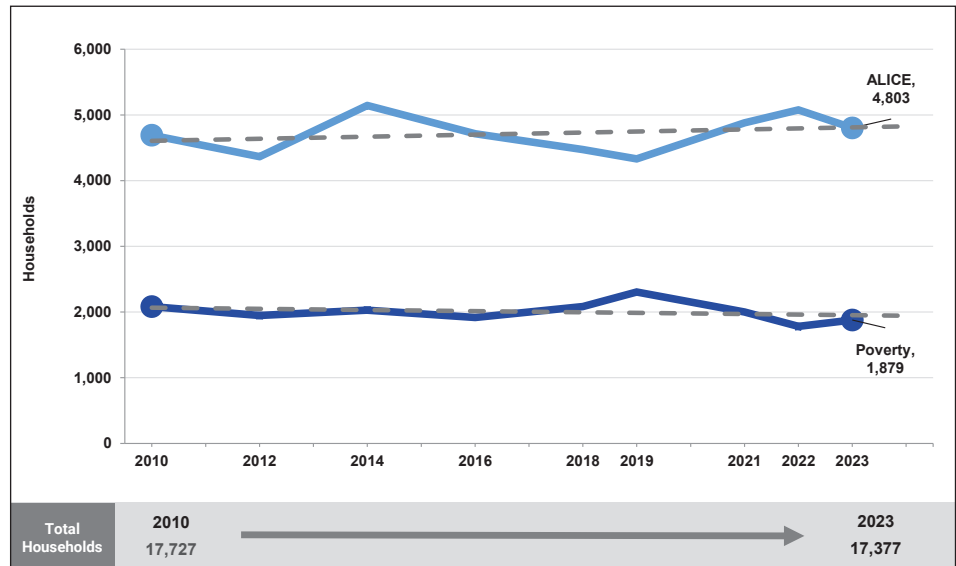

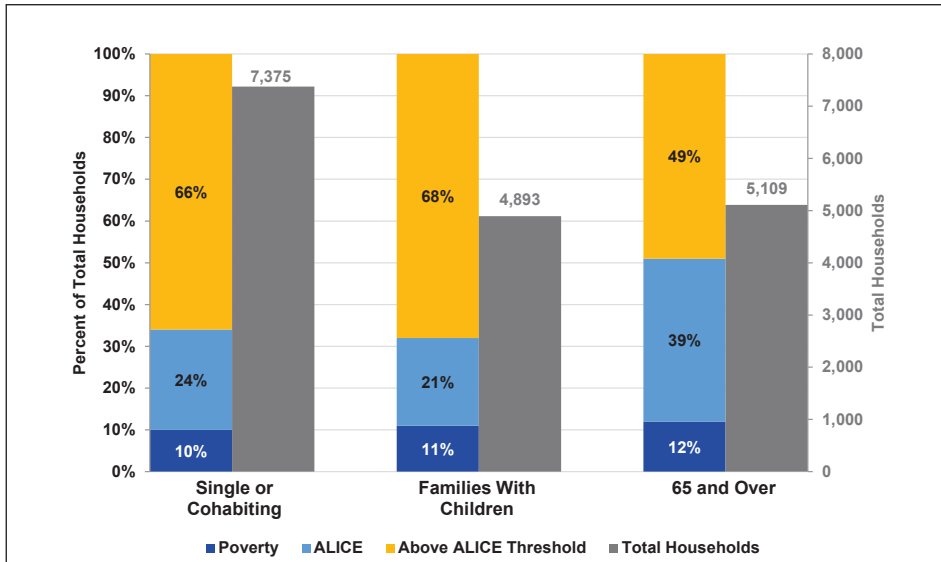

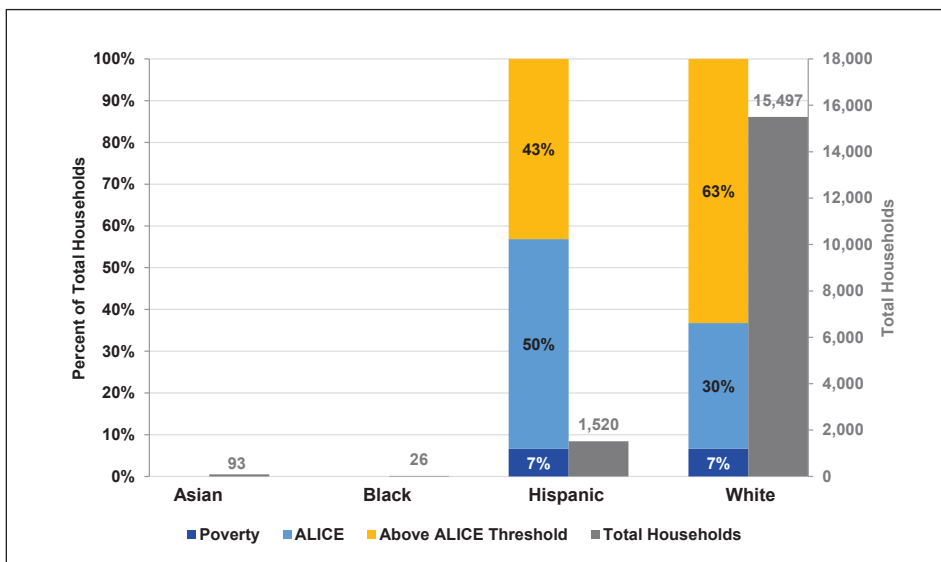
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Marshall County, 2023

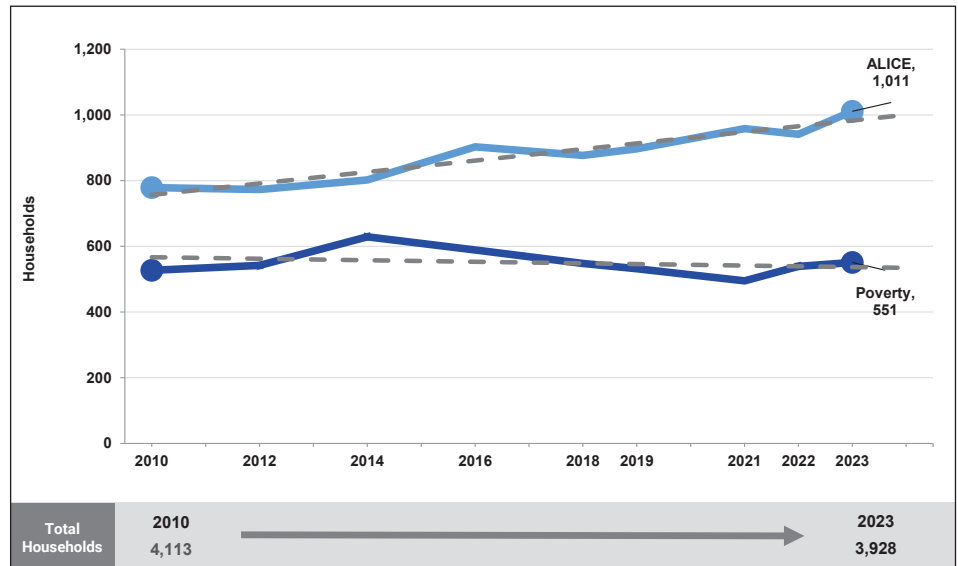

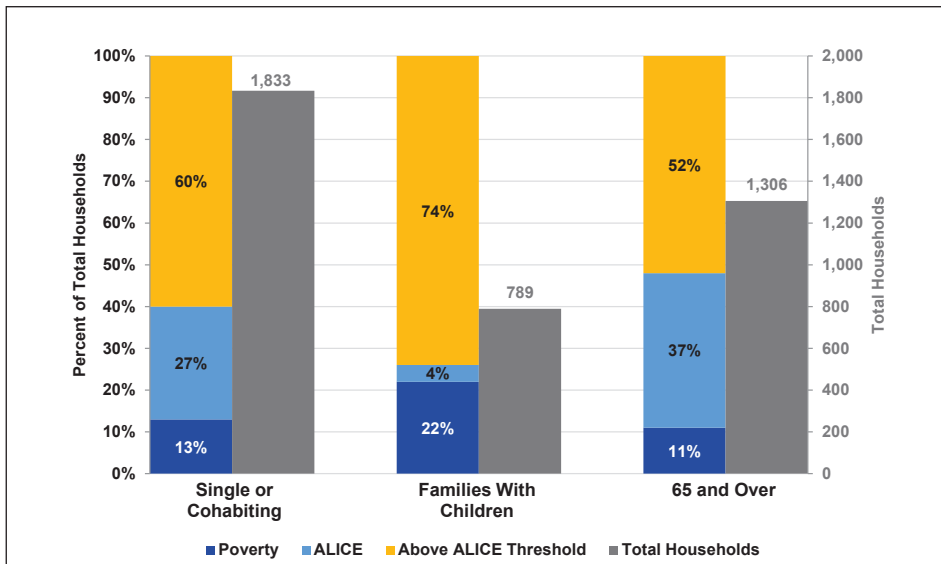

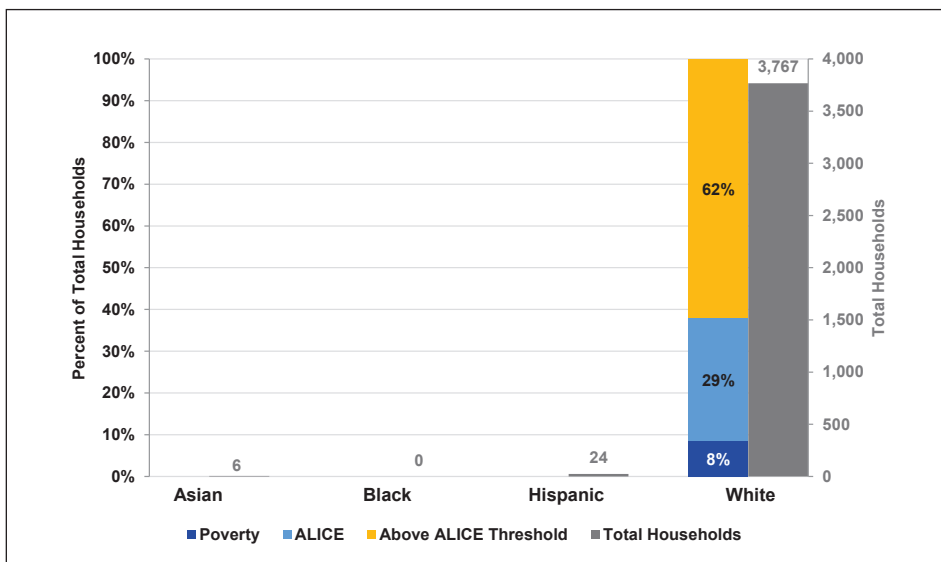
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Martin County, 2023

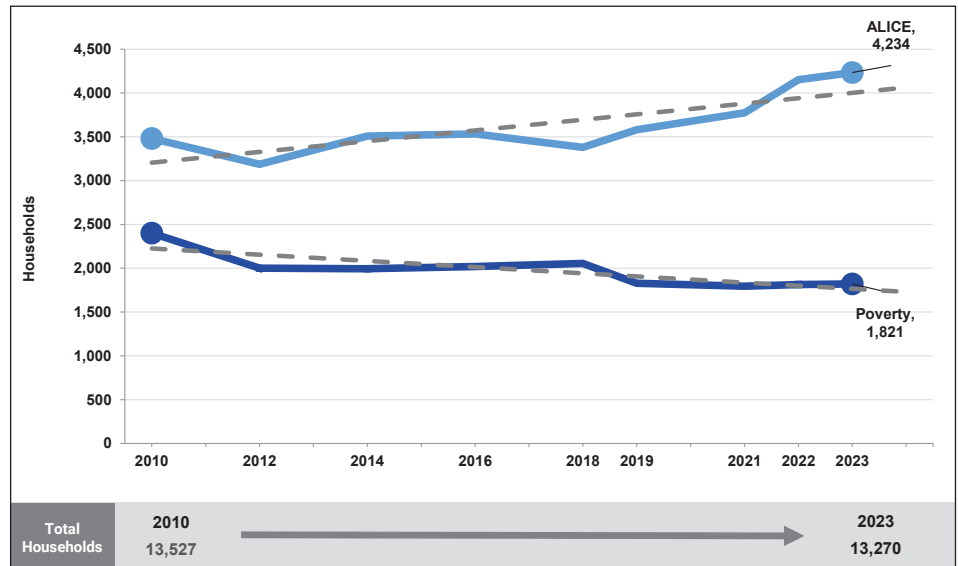

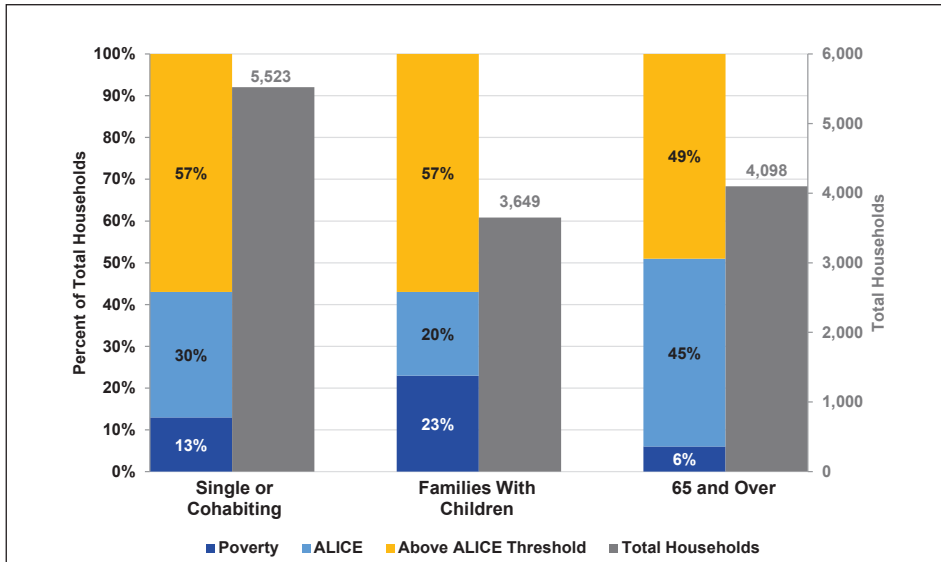

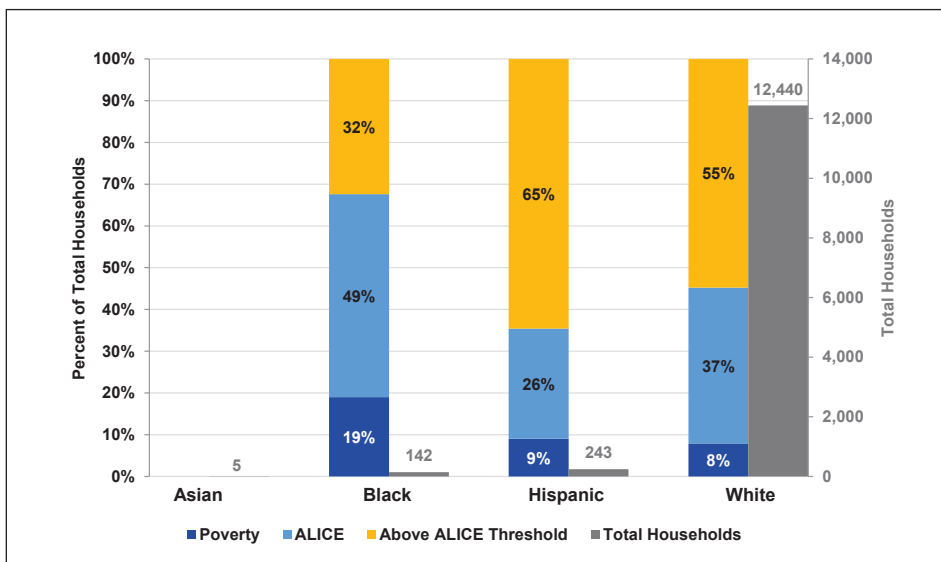
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Miami County, 2023

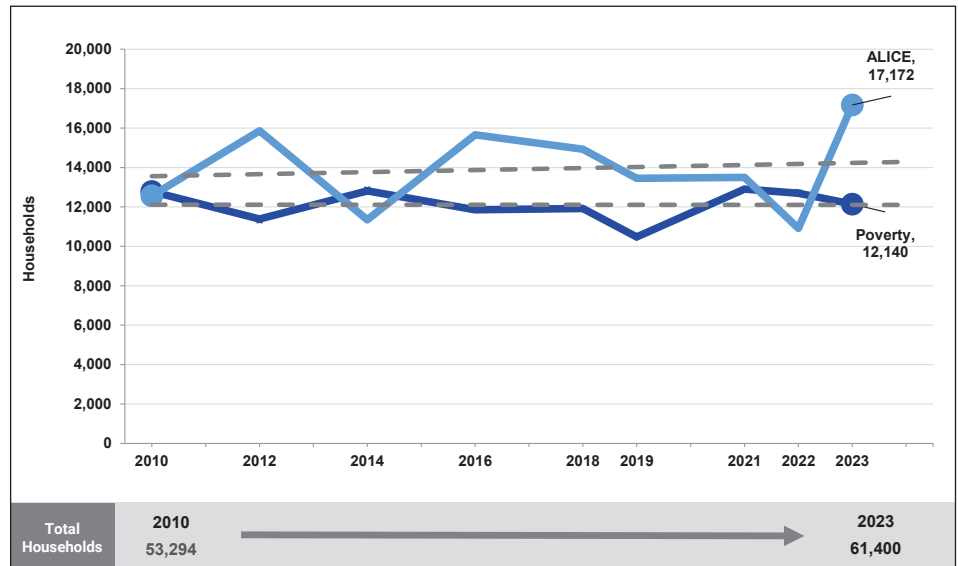

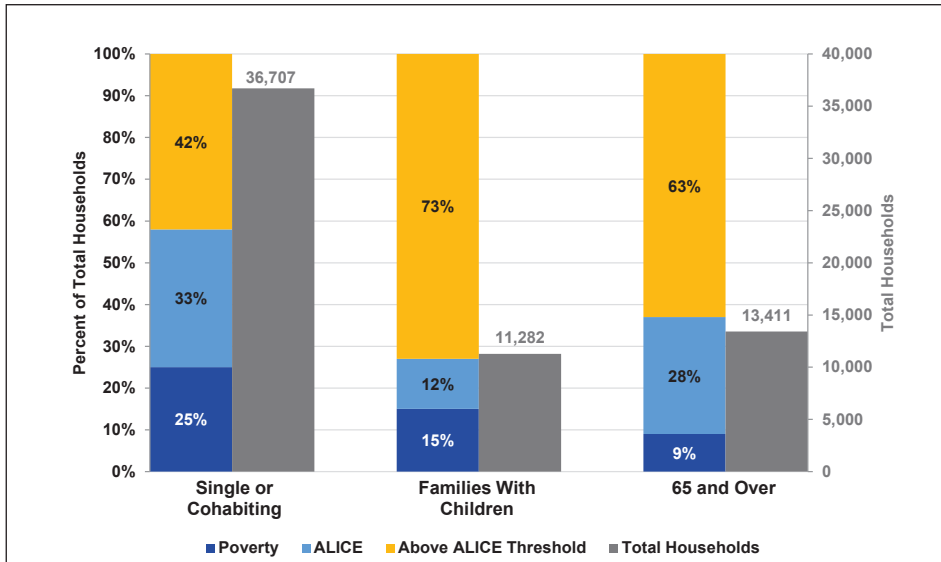

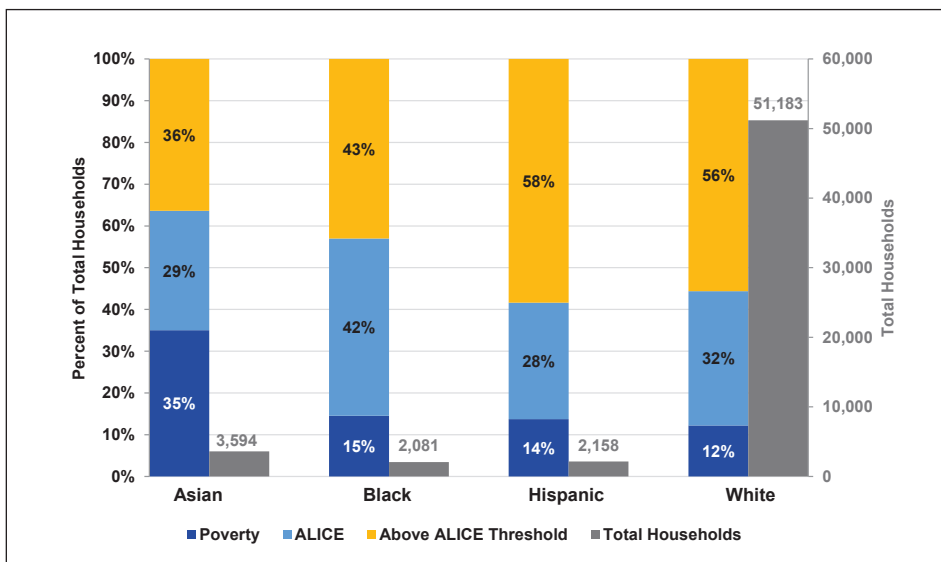
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Monroe County, 2023

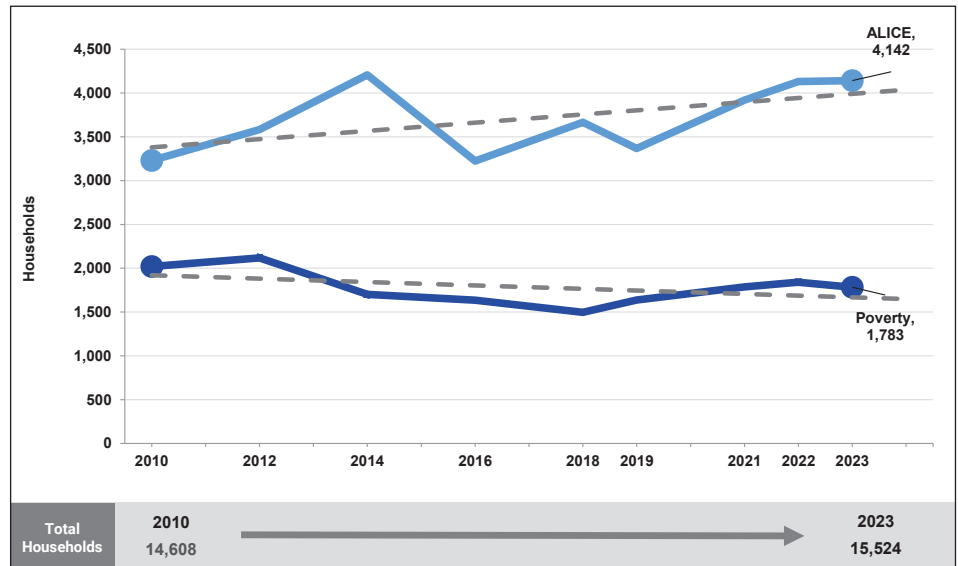

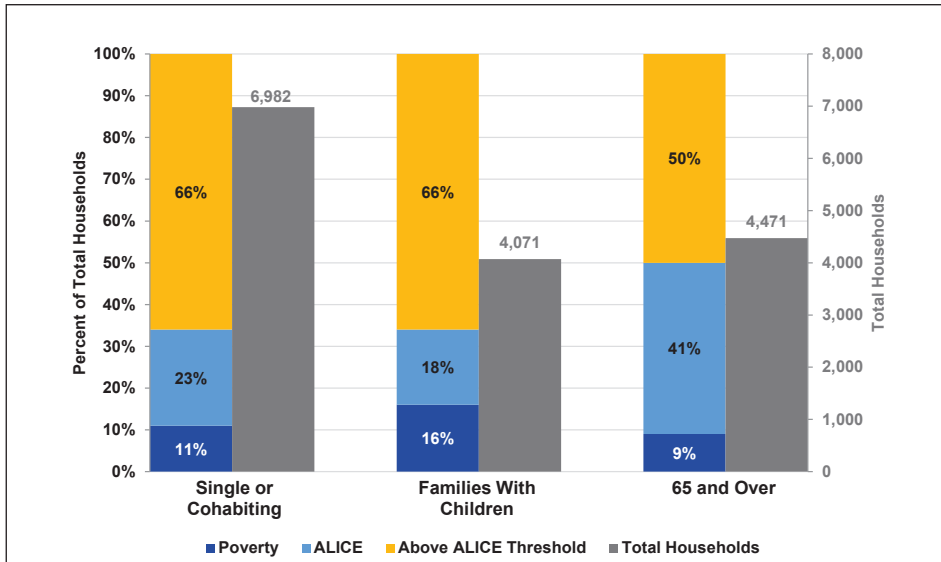

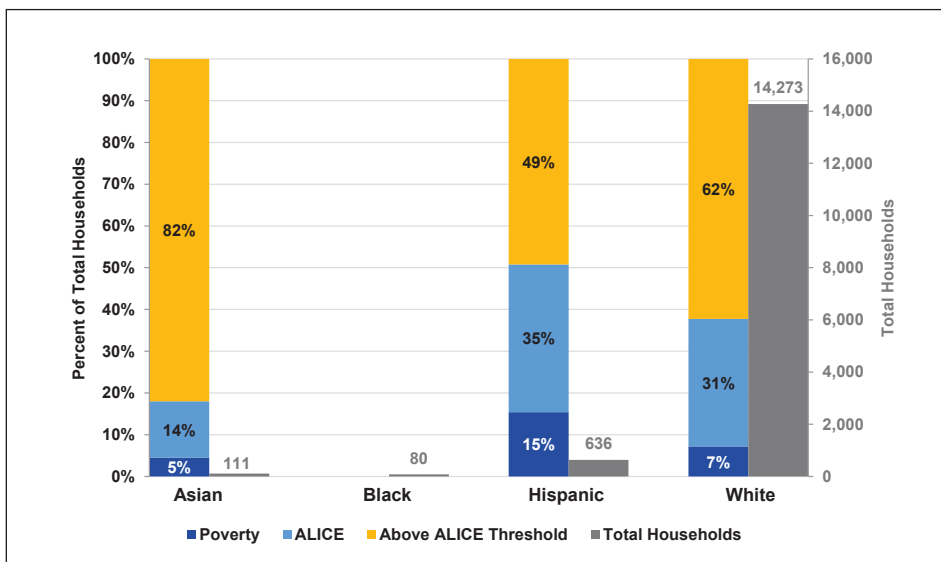
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Montgomery County, 2023

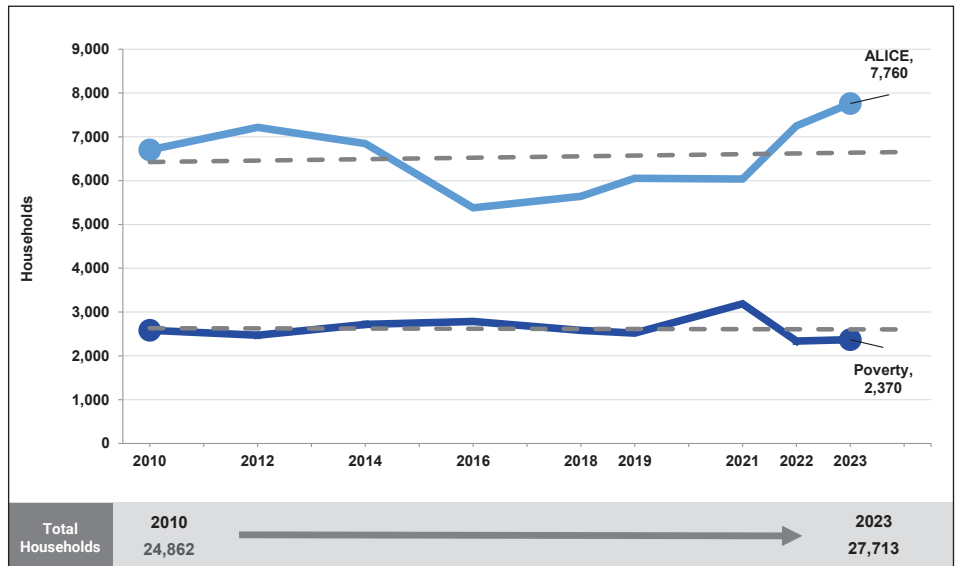

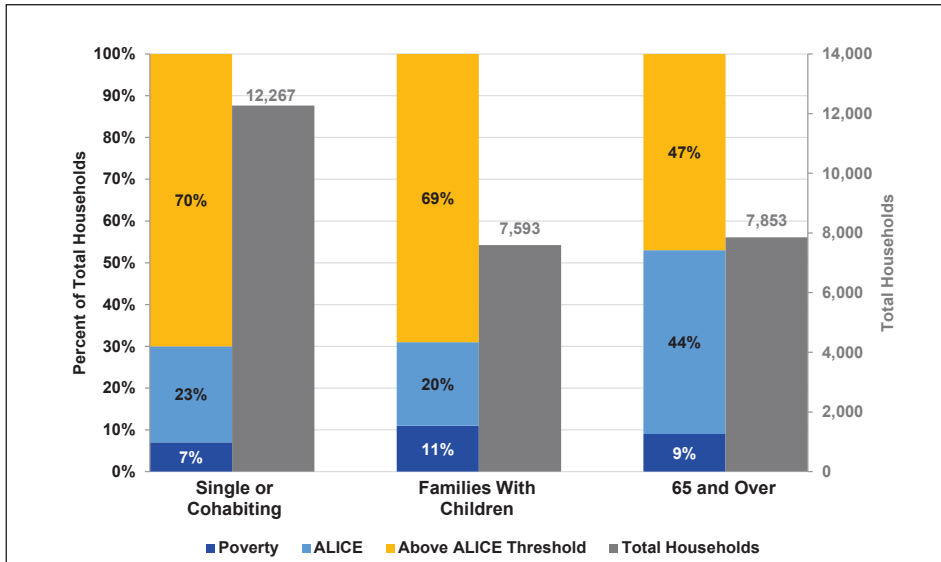

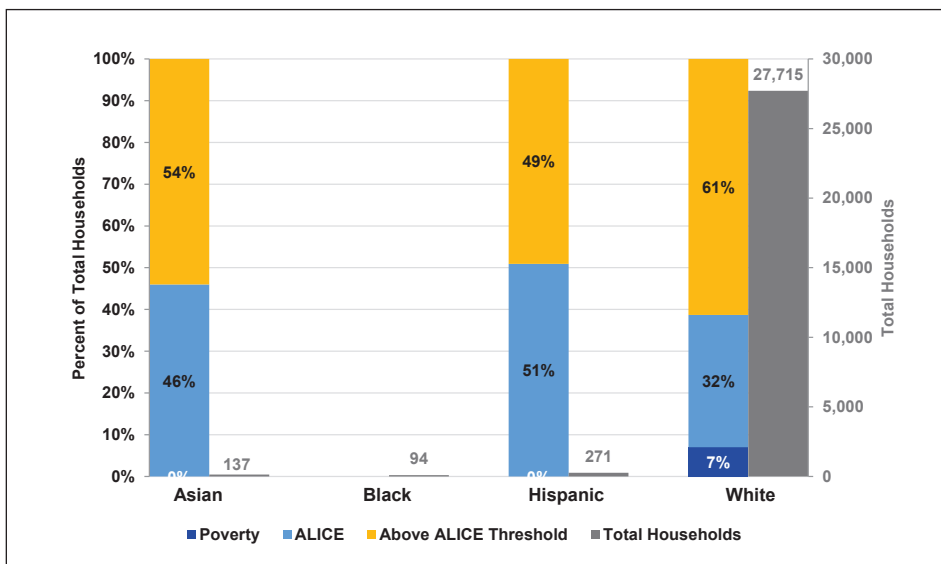
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Morgan County, 2023

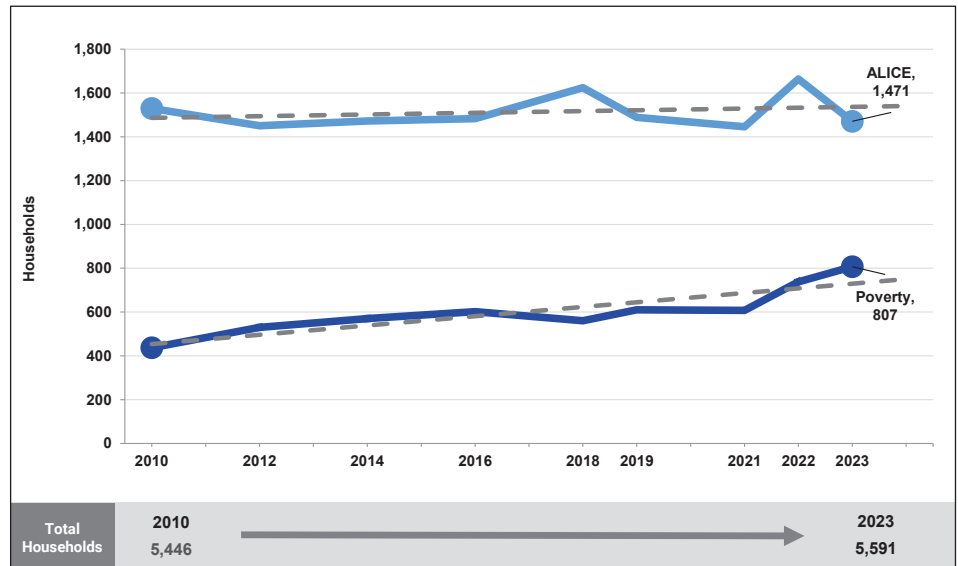

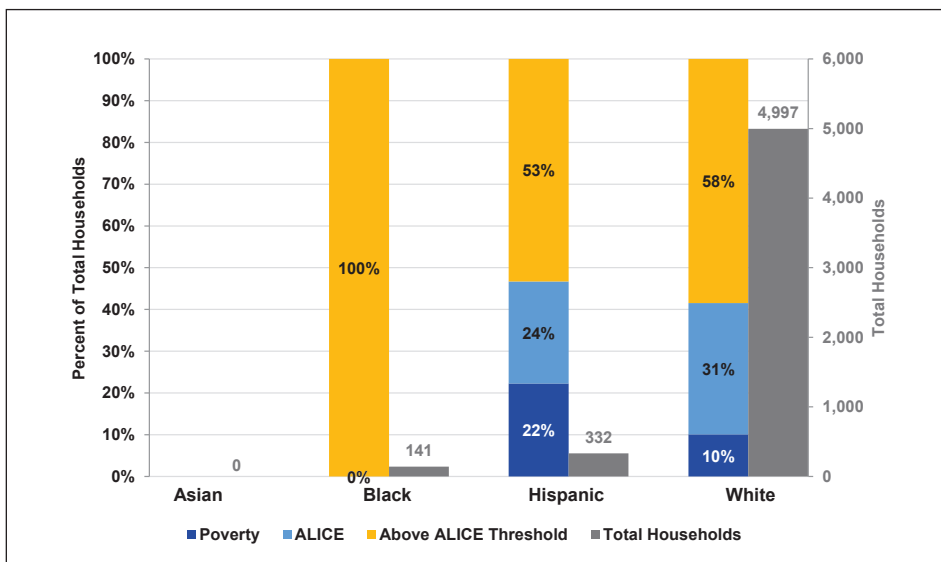

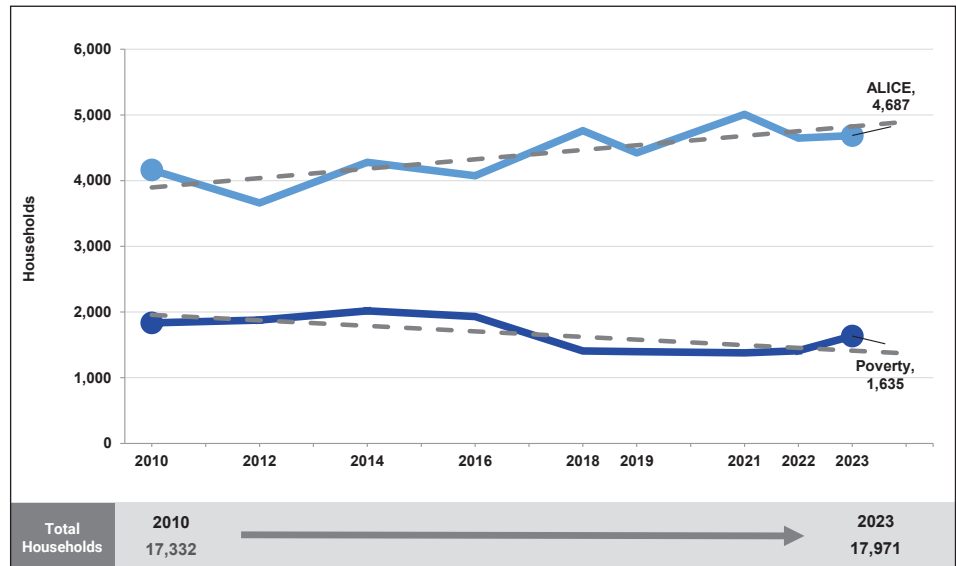

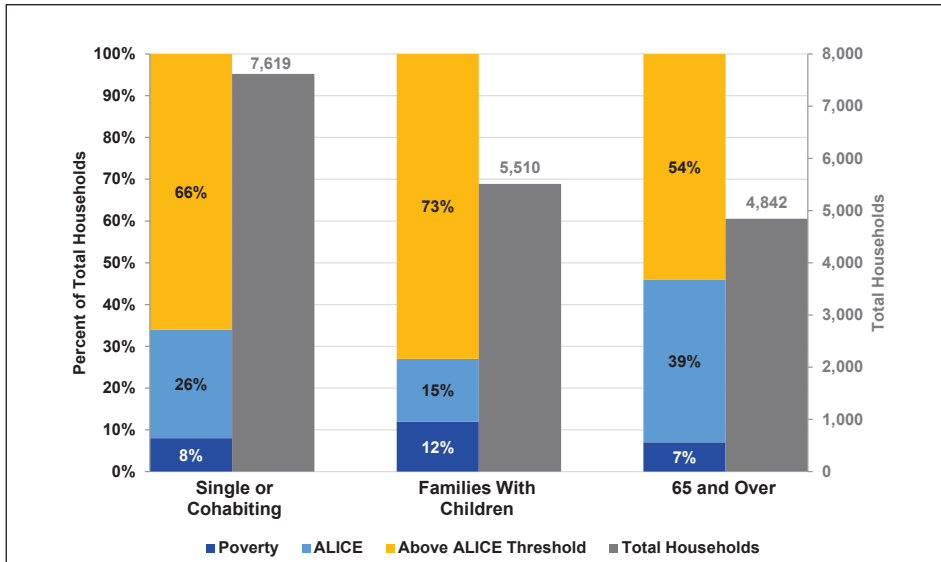

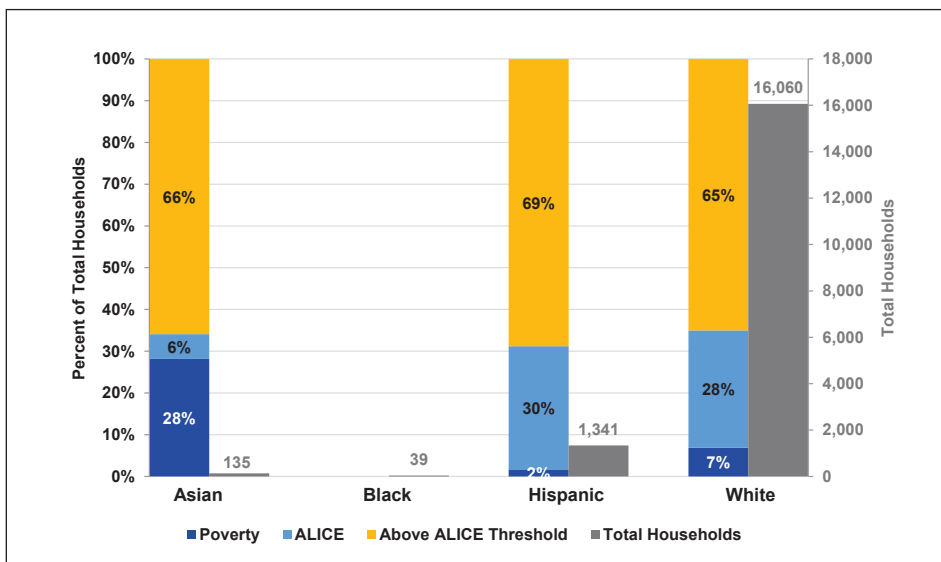
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Noble County, 2023

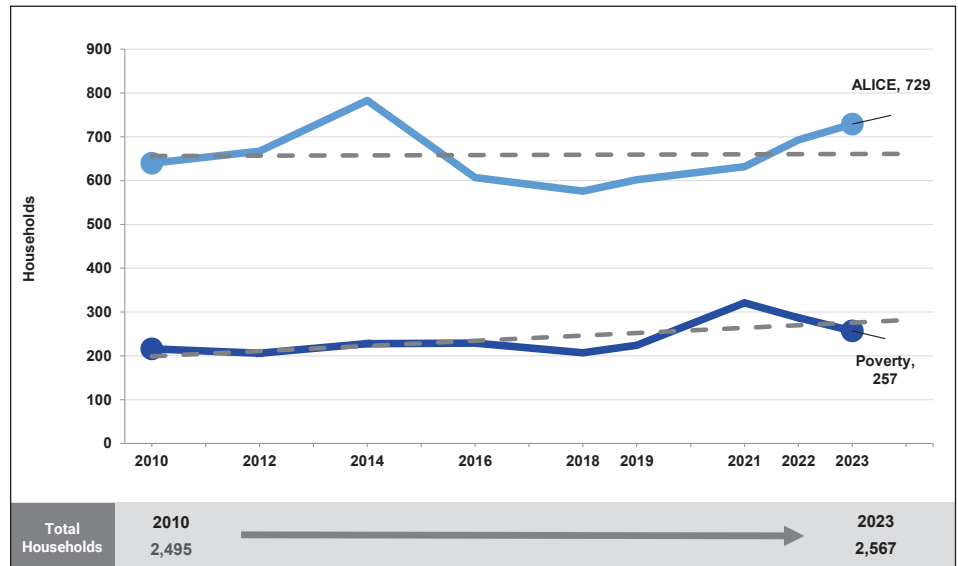

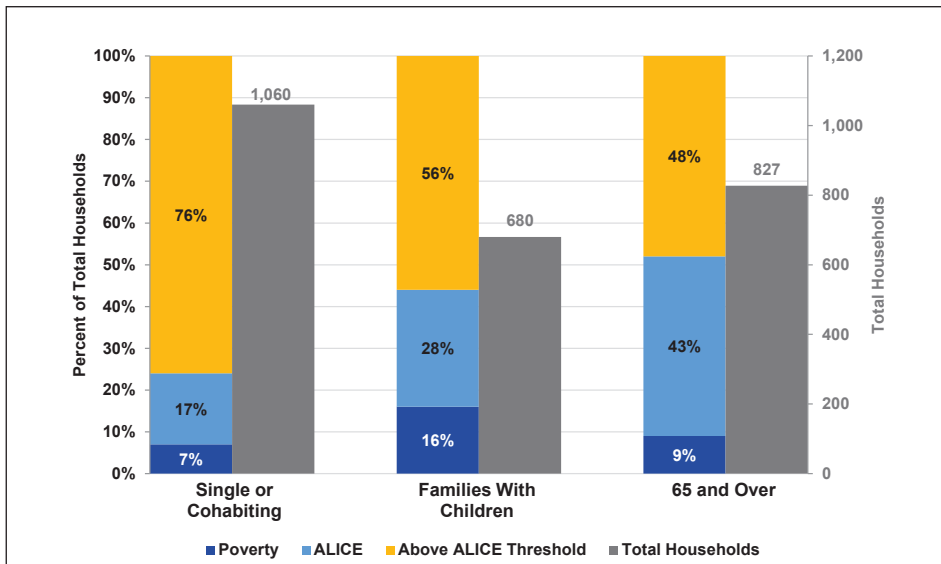

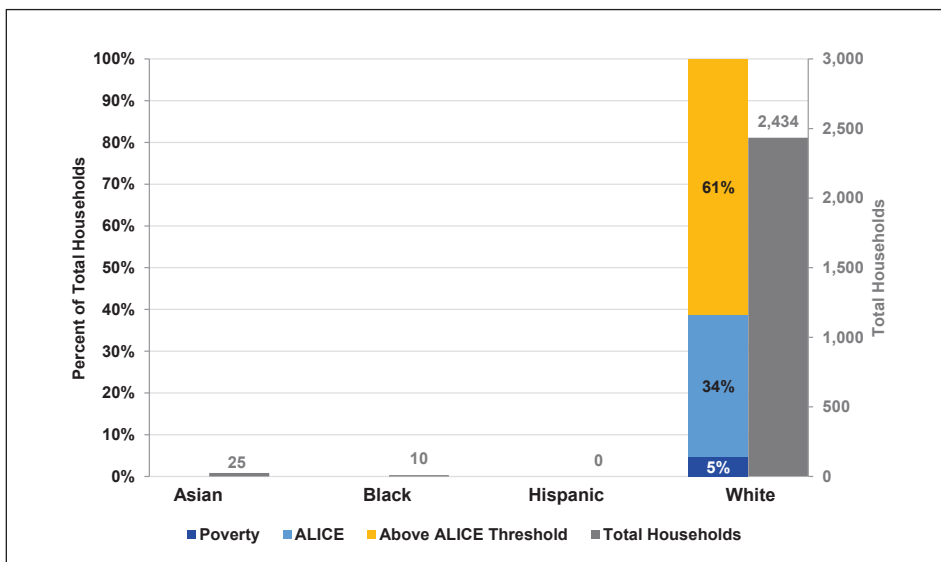

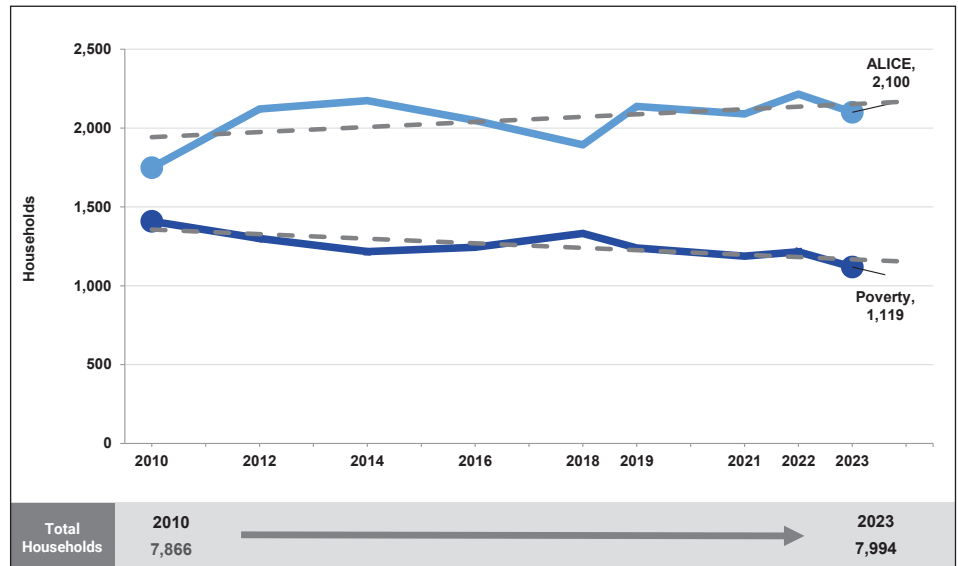

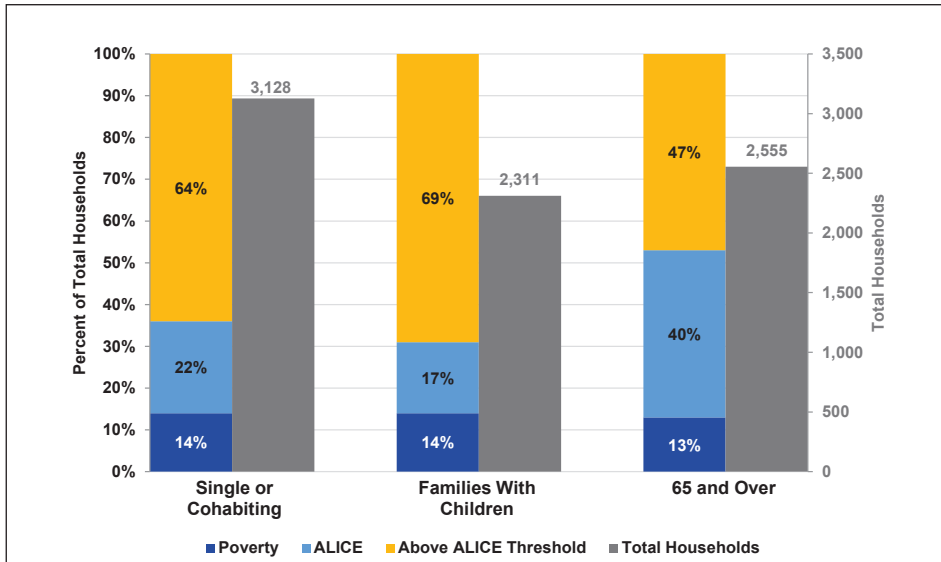

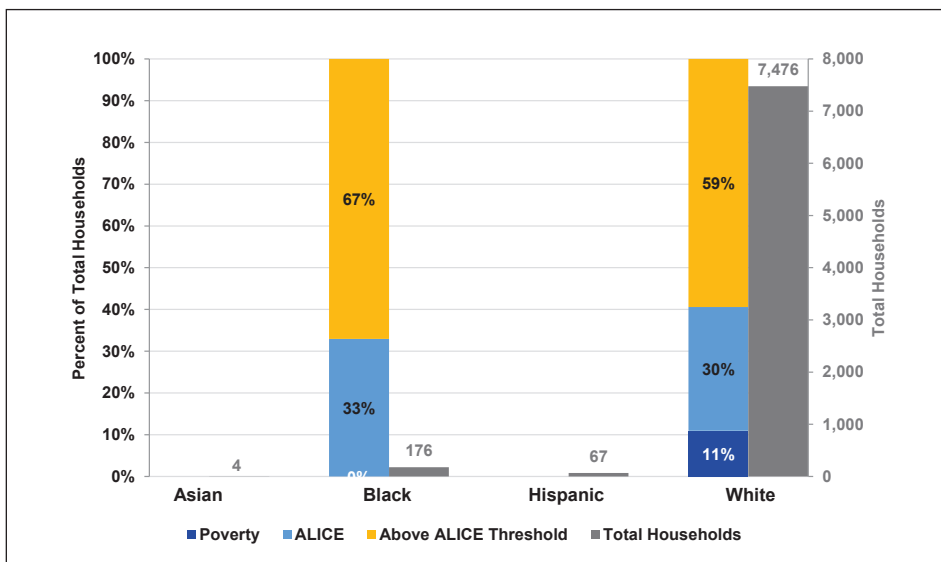
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Orange County, 2023

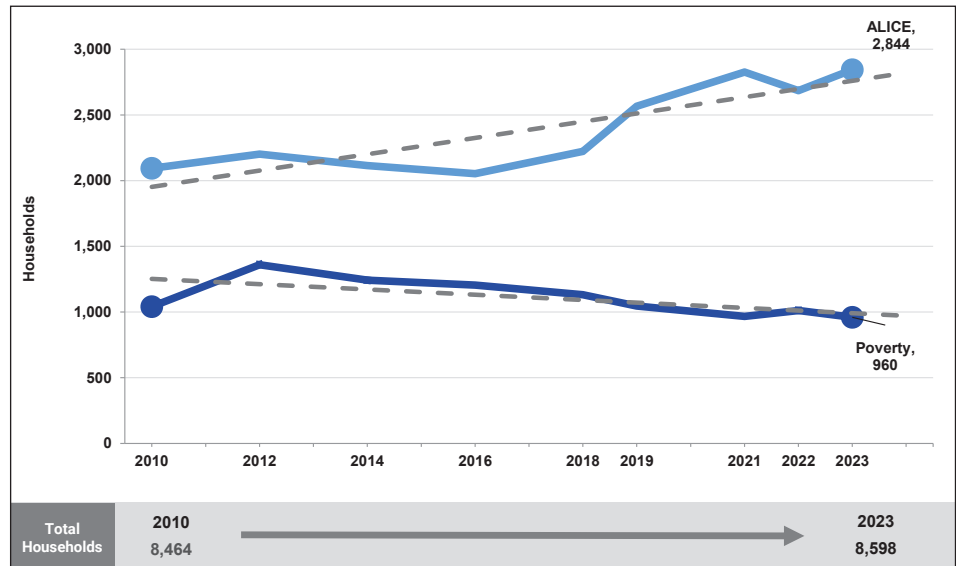

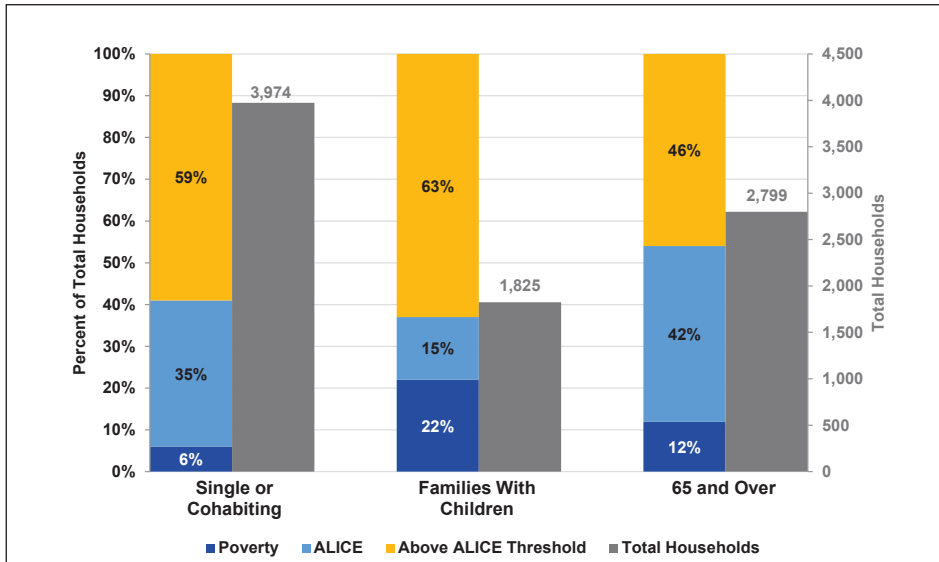

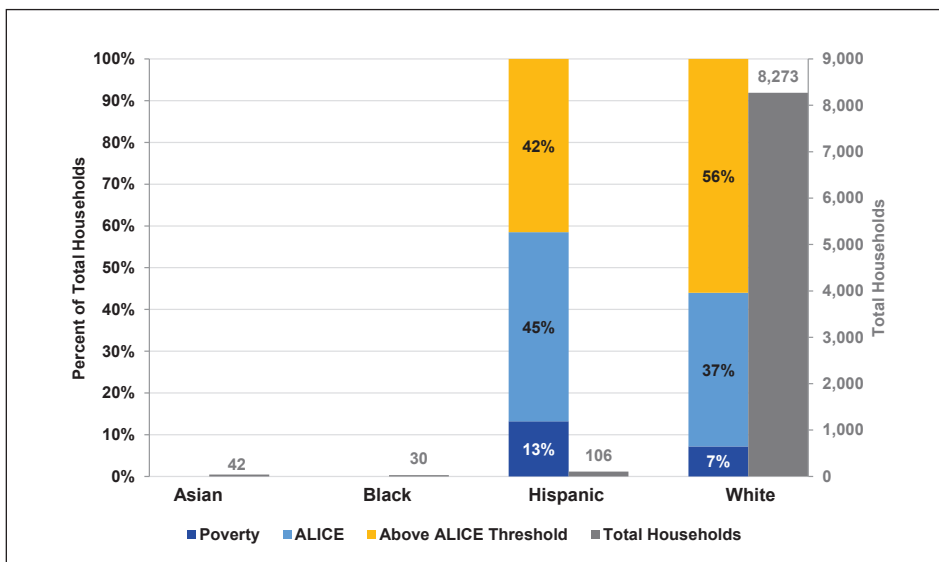
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Owen County, 2023

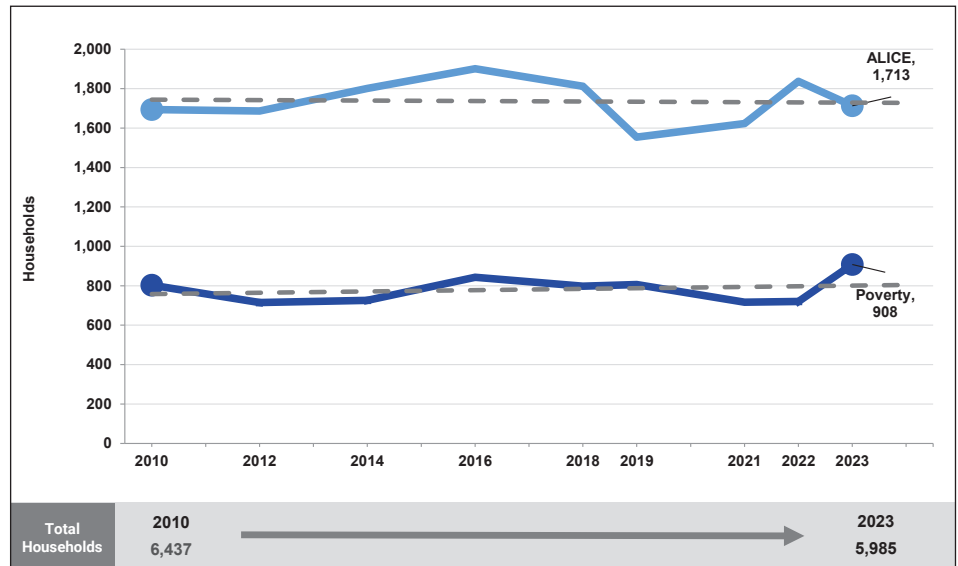

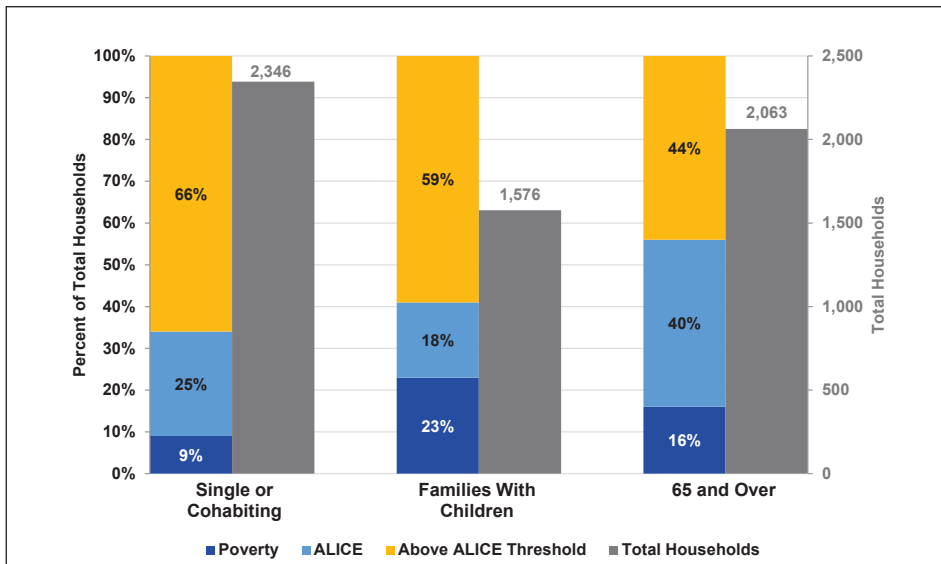

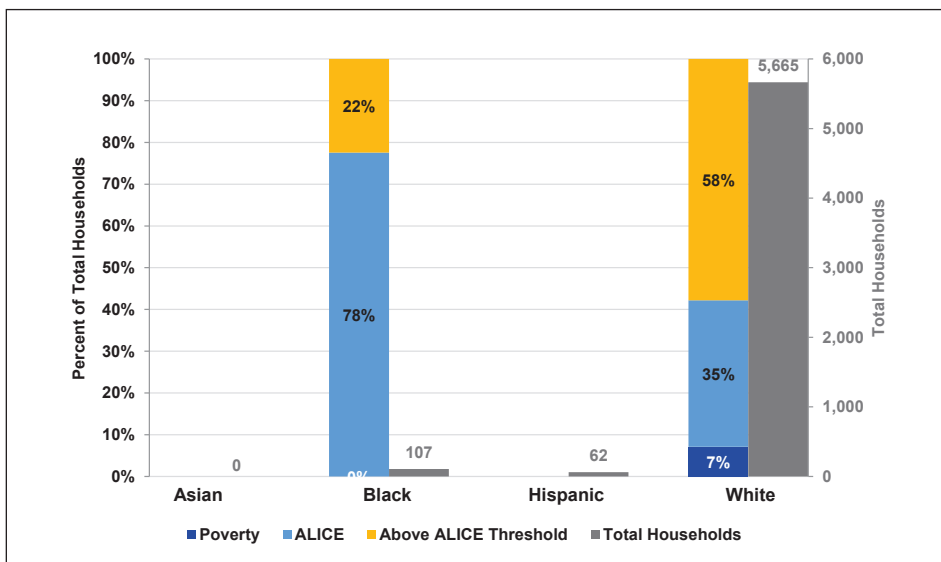
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Parke County, 2023

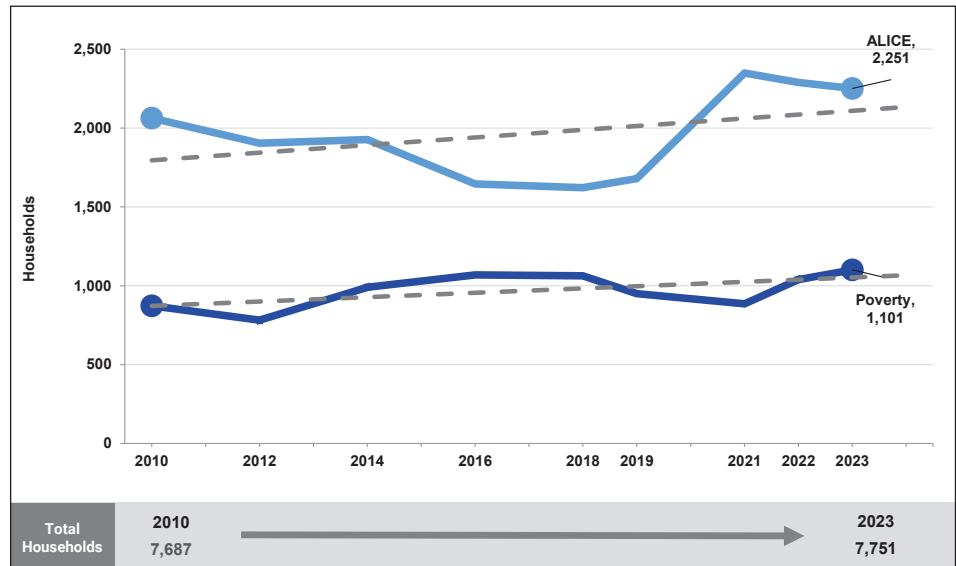

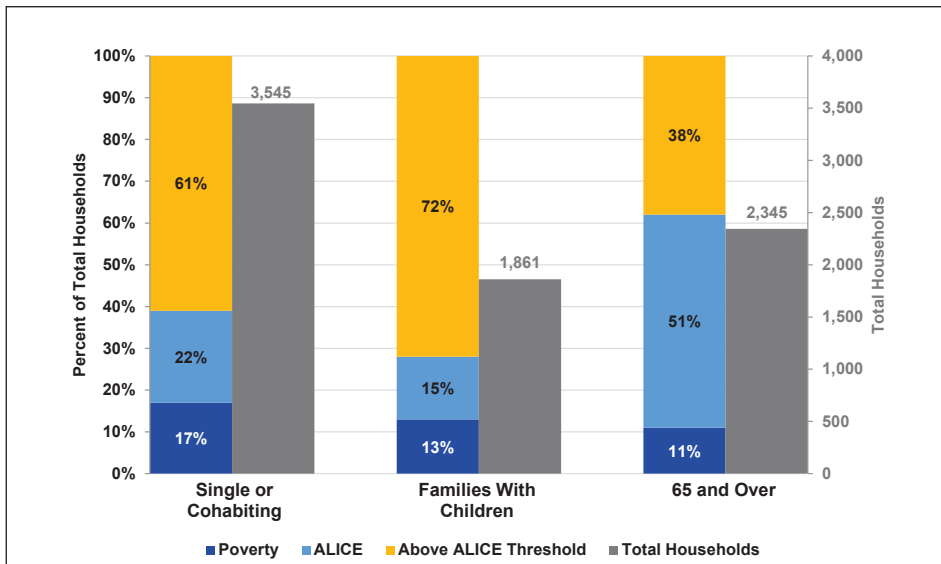

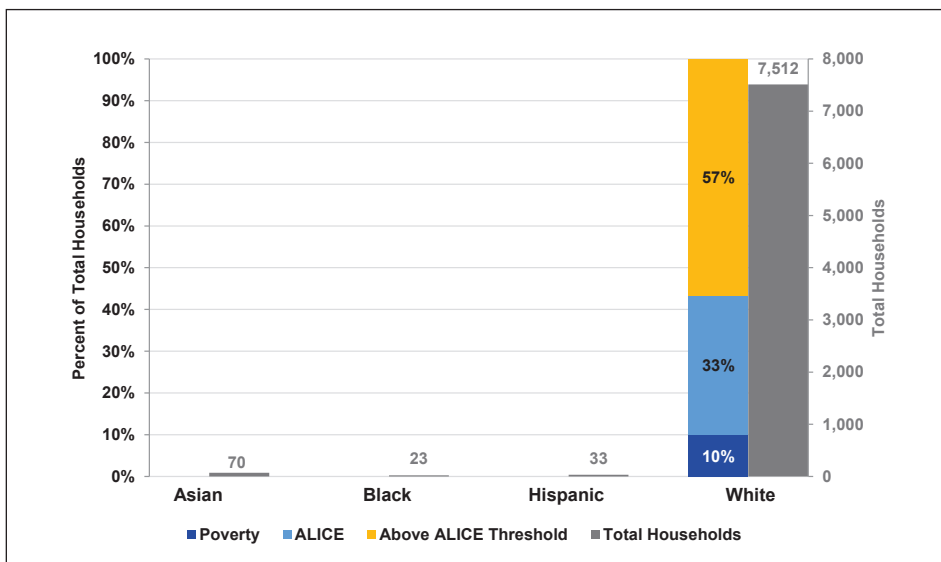
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Perry County, 2023

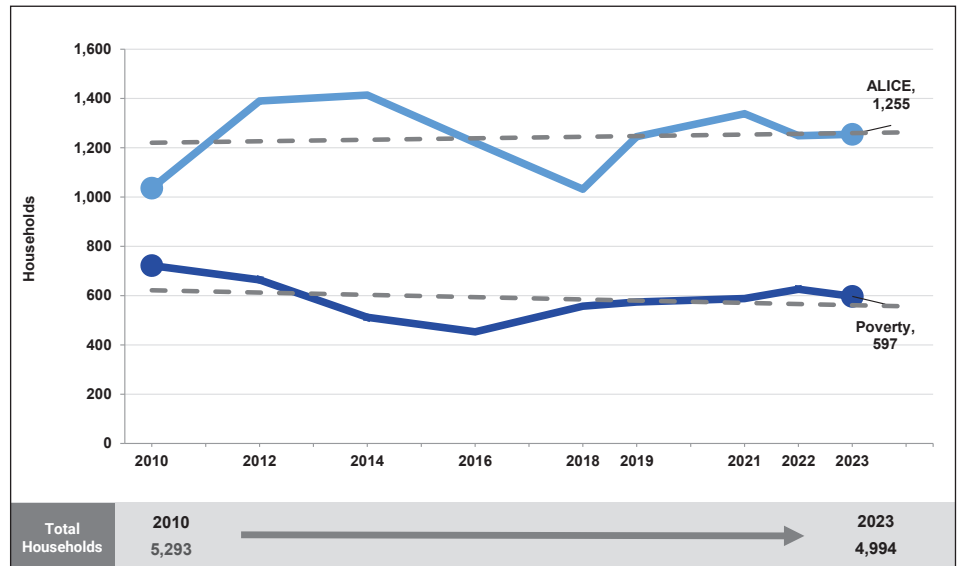

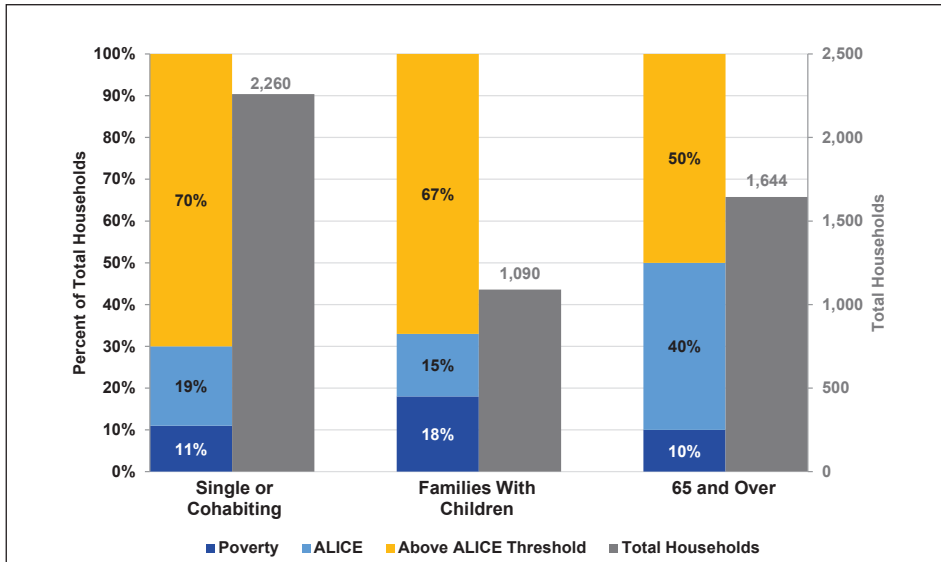

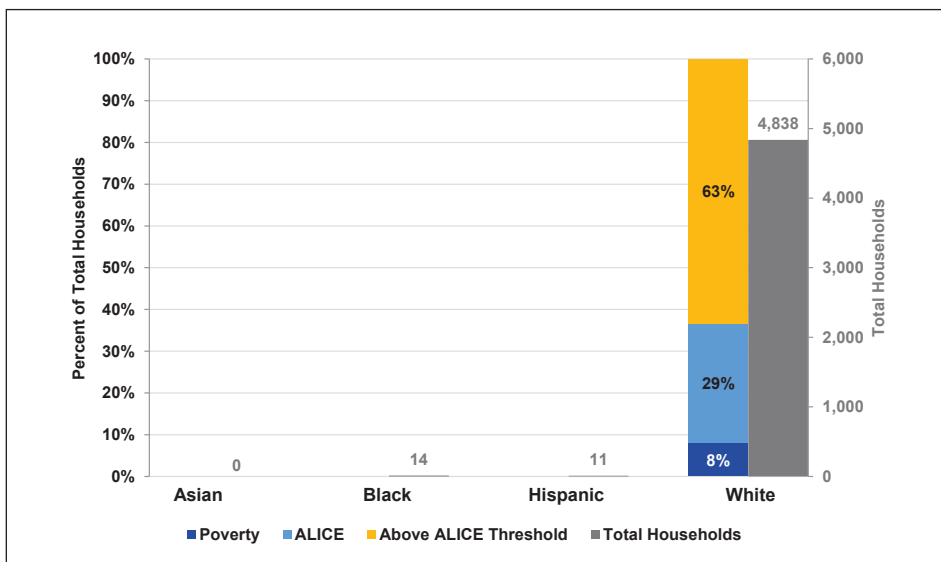
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Pike County, 2023

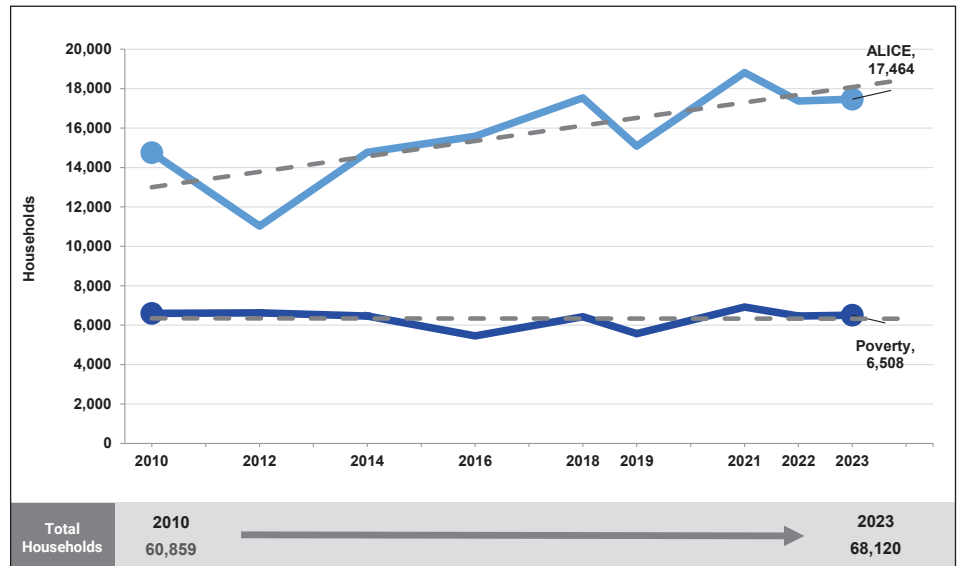

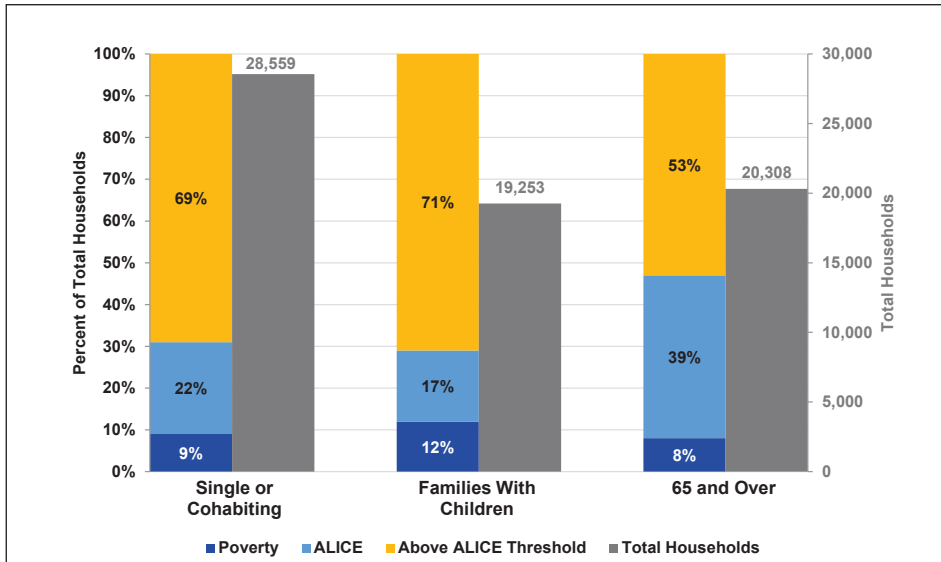

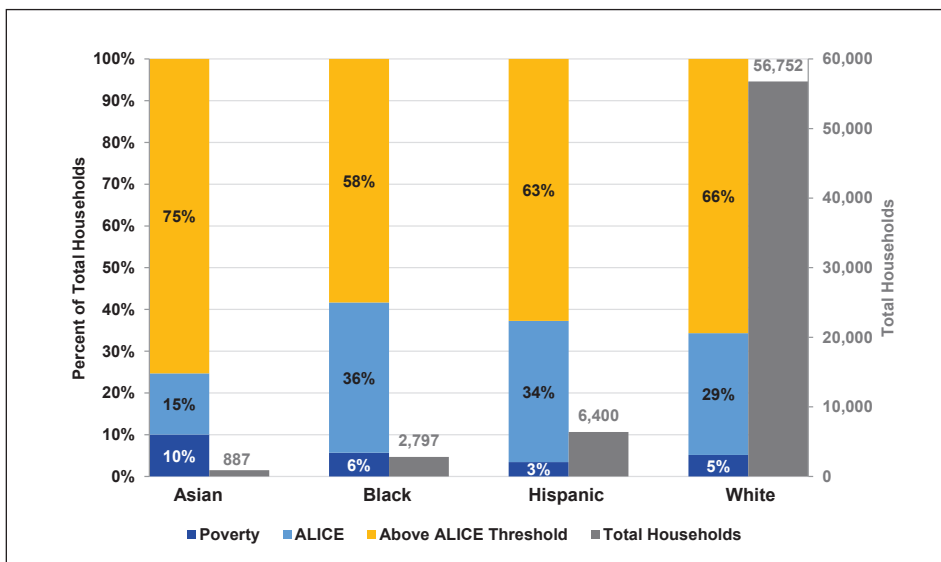
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Porter County, 2023

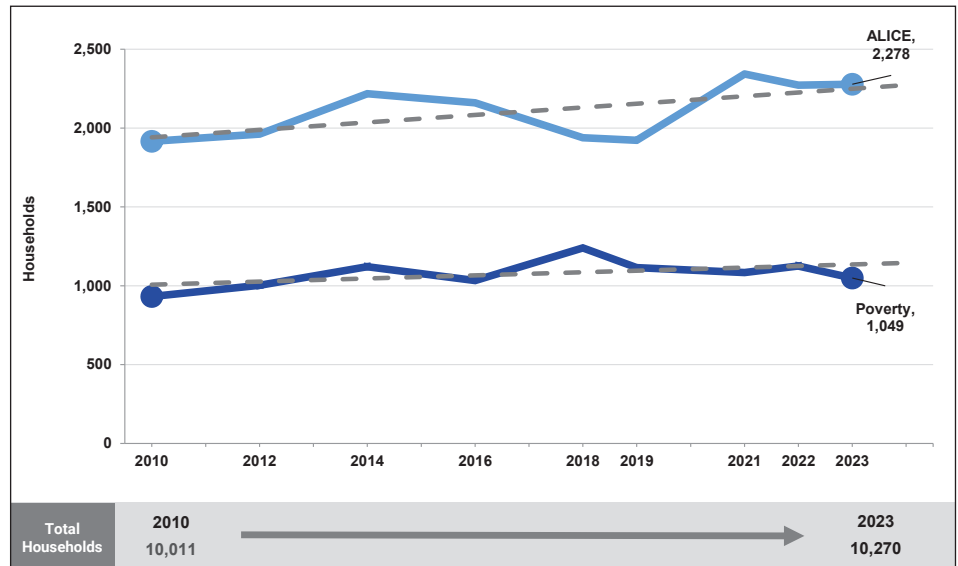

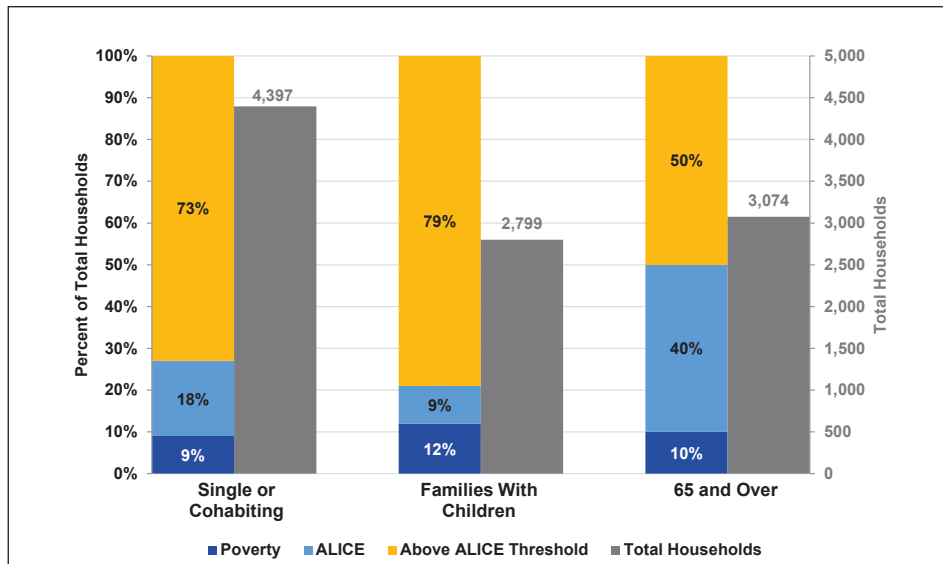

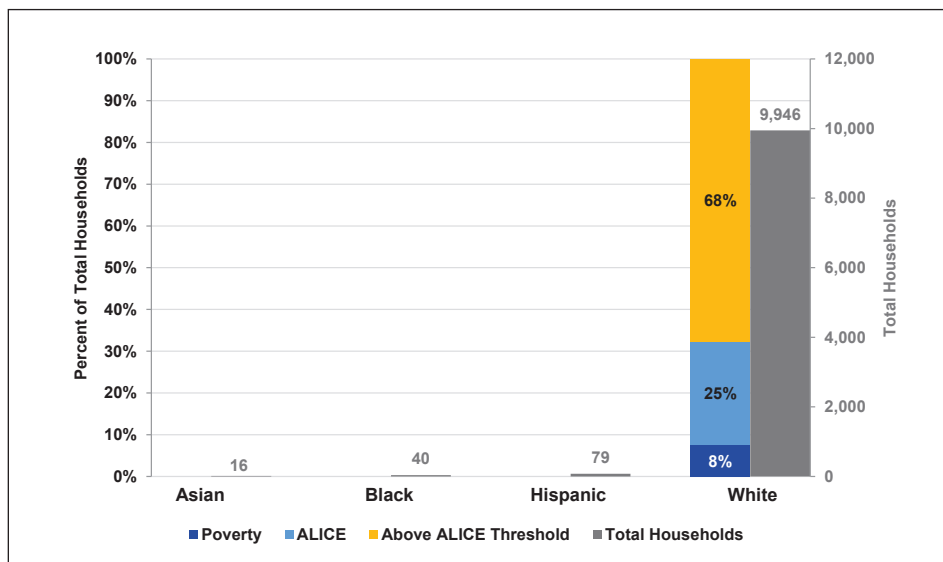
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Posey County, 2023

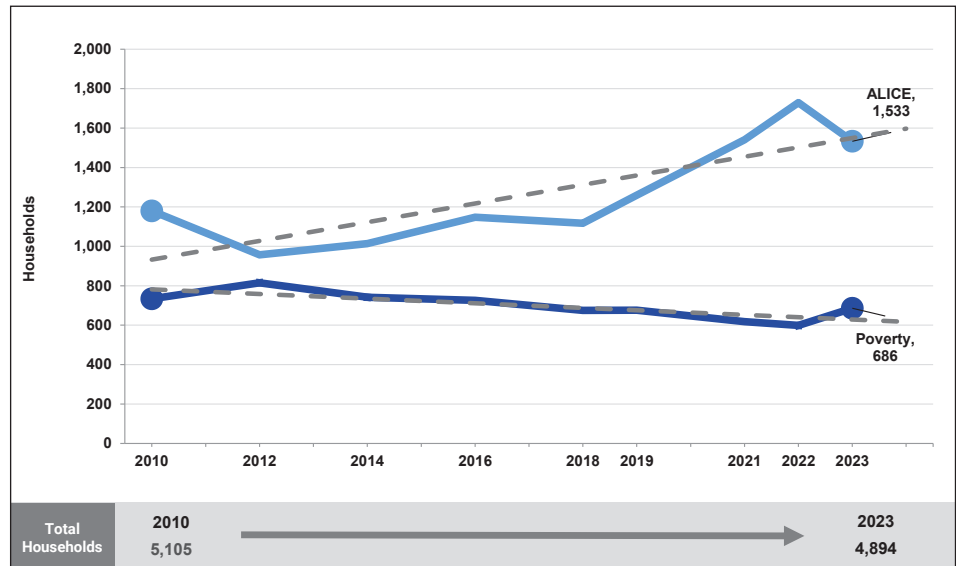

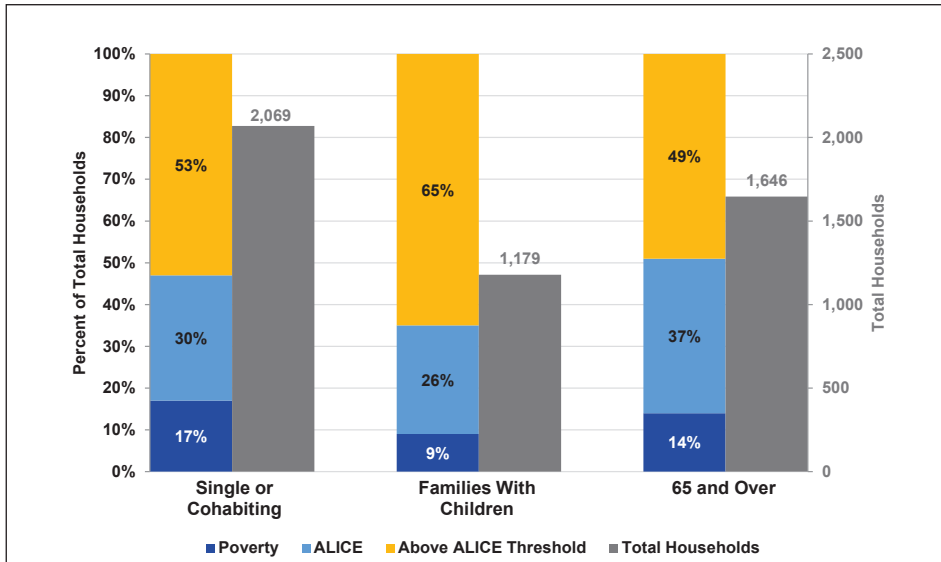

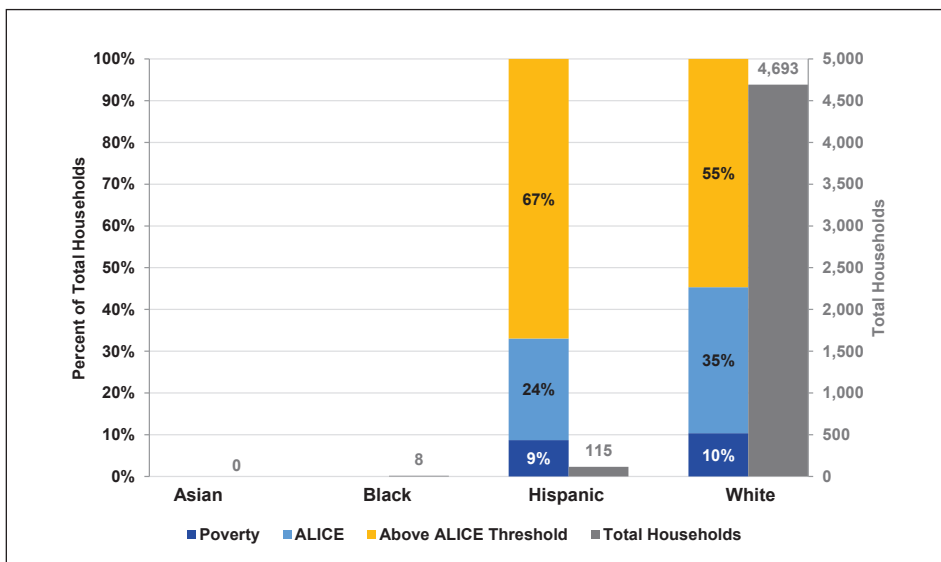
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Pulaski County, 2023

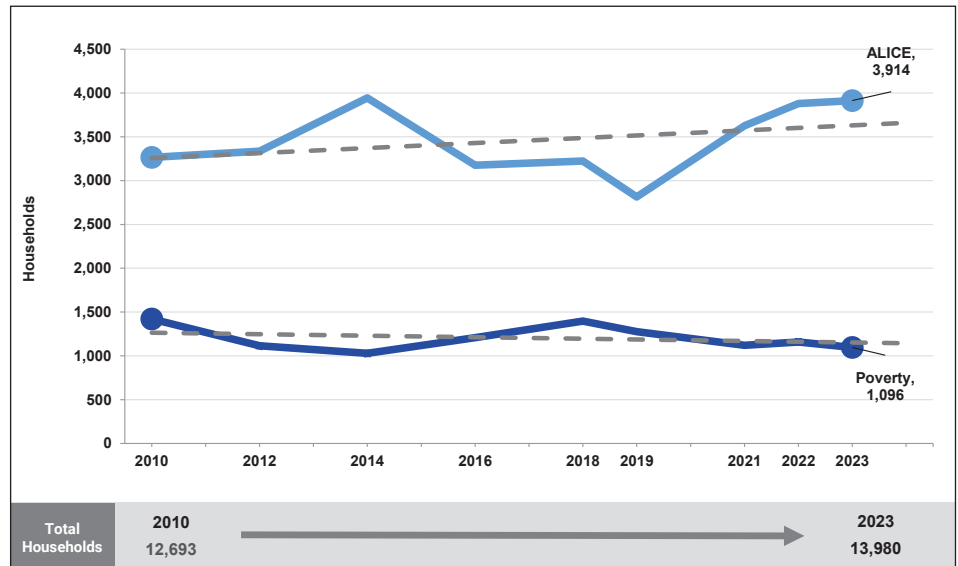

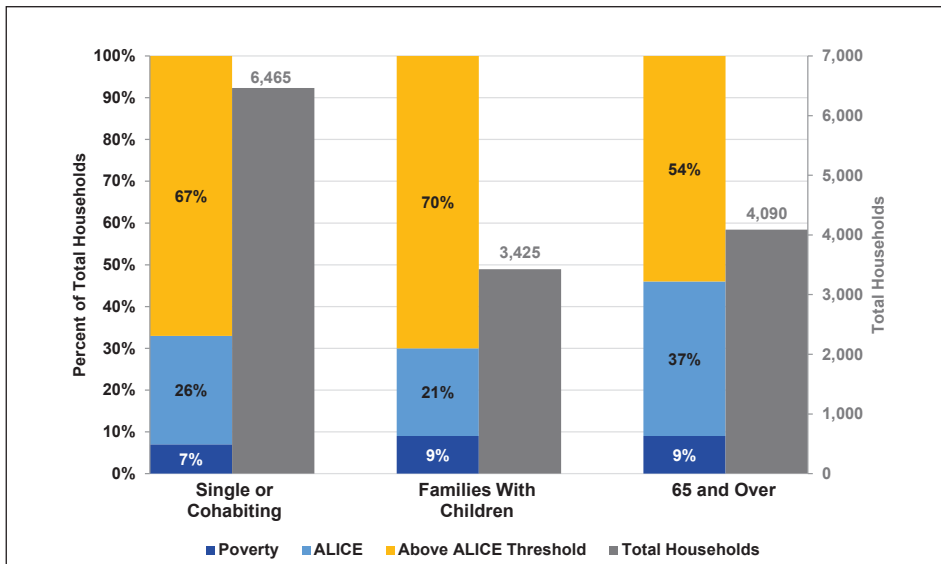

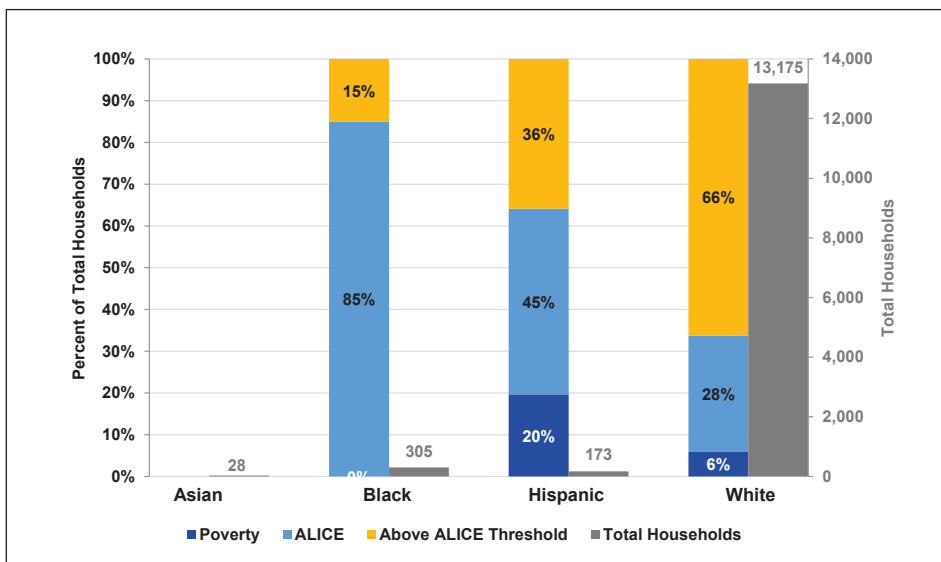
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Putnam County, 2023

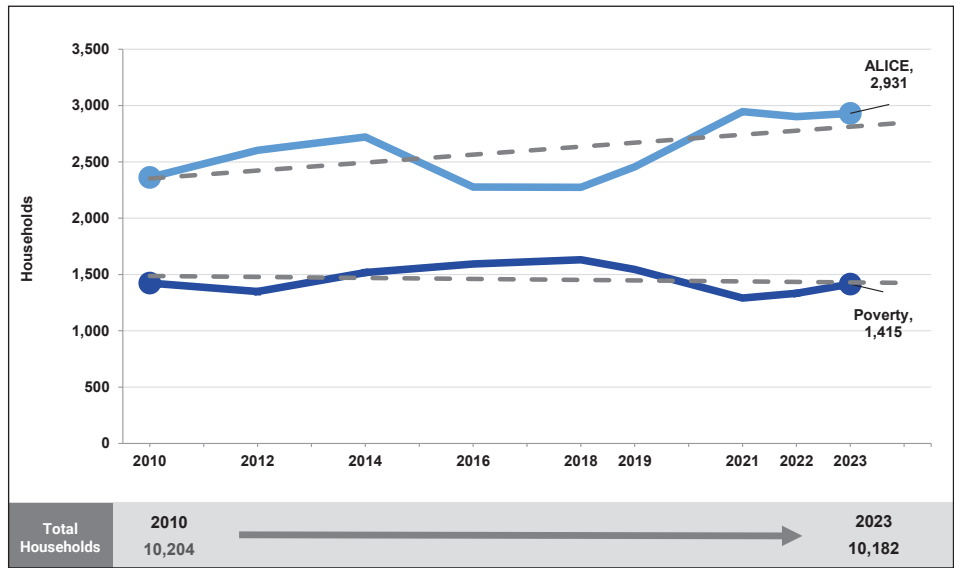

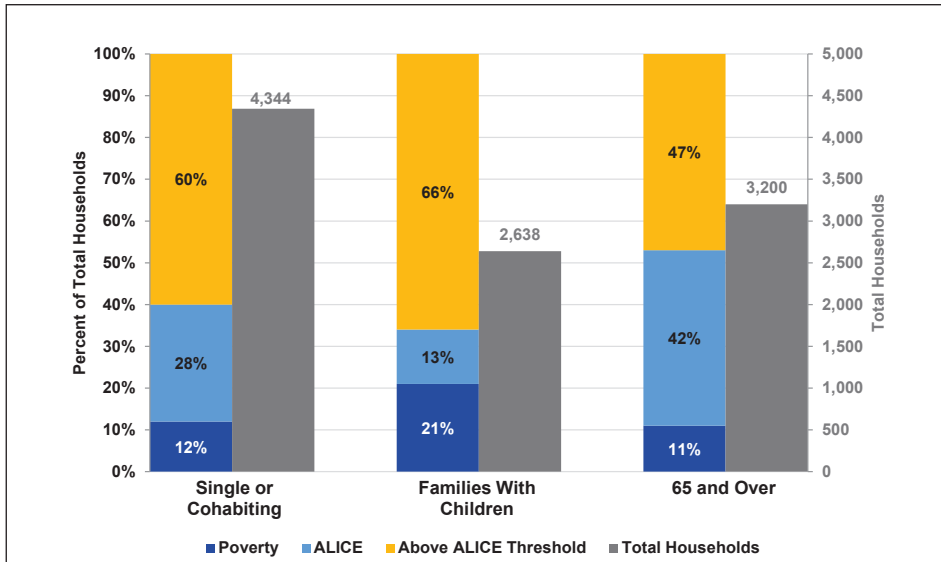

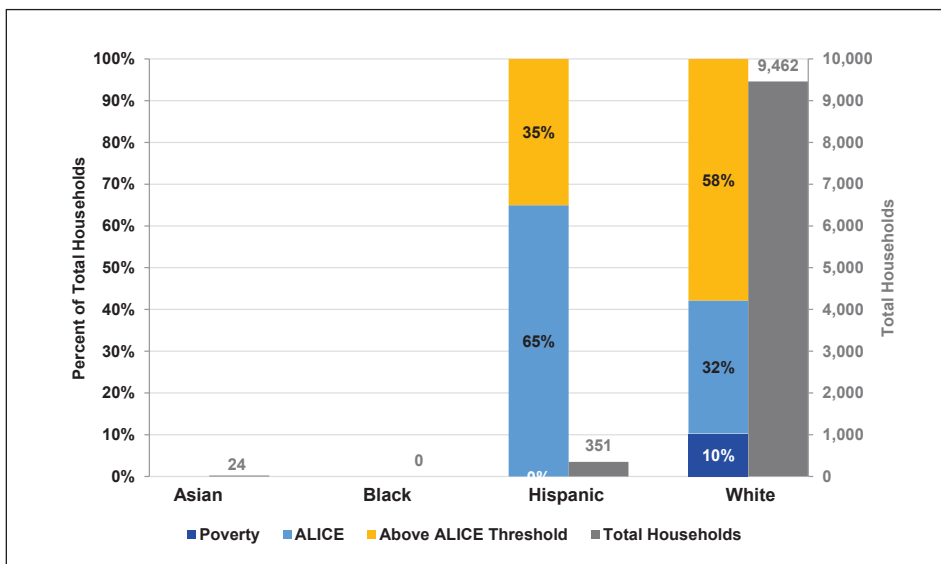
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Randolph County, 2023

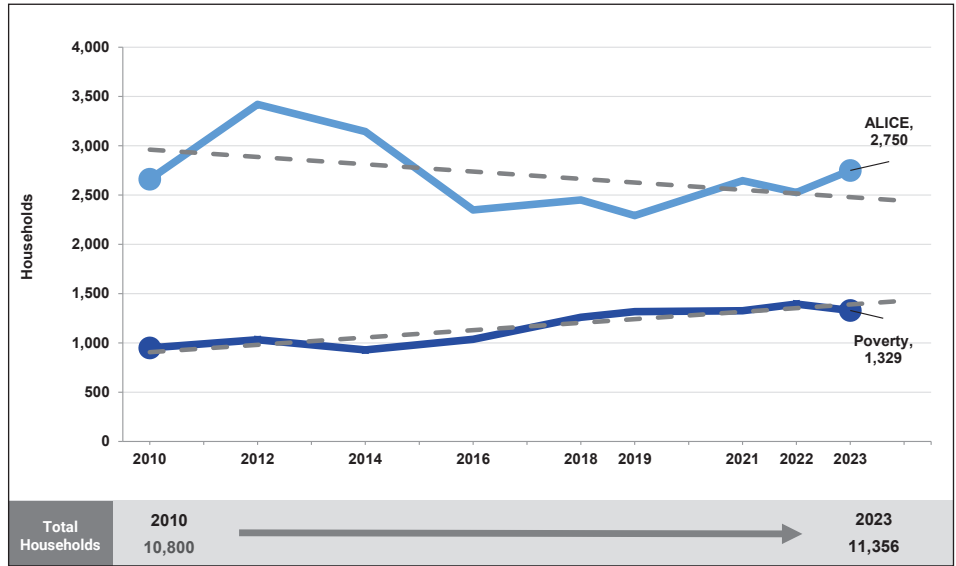

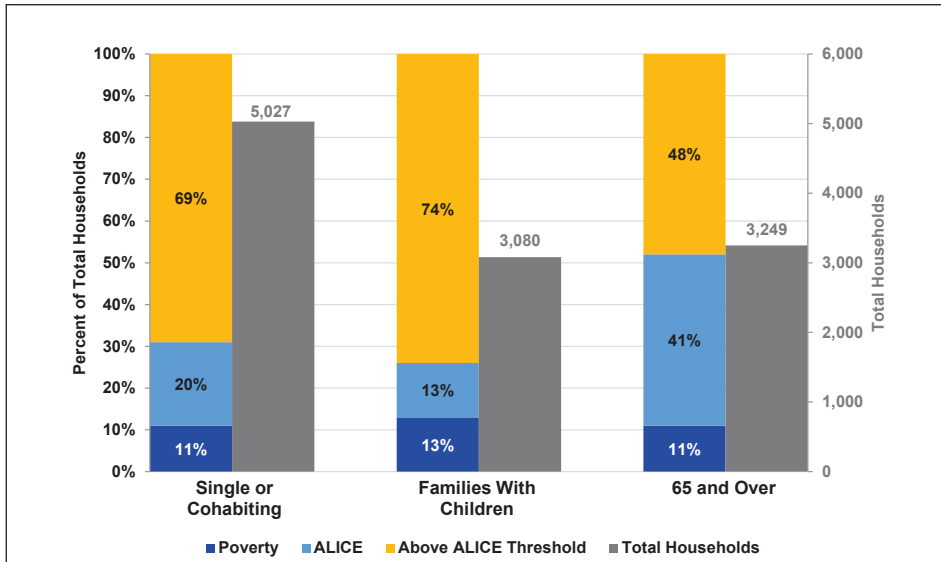

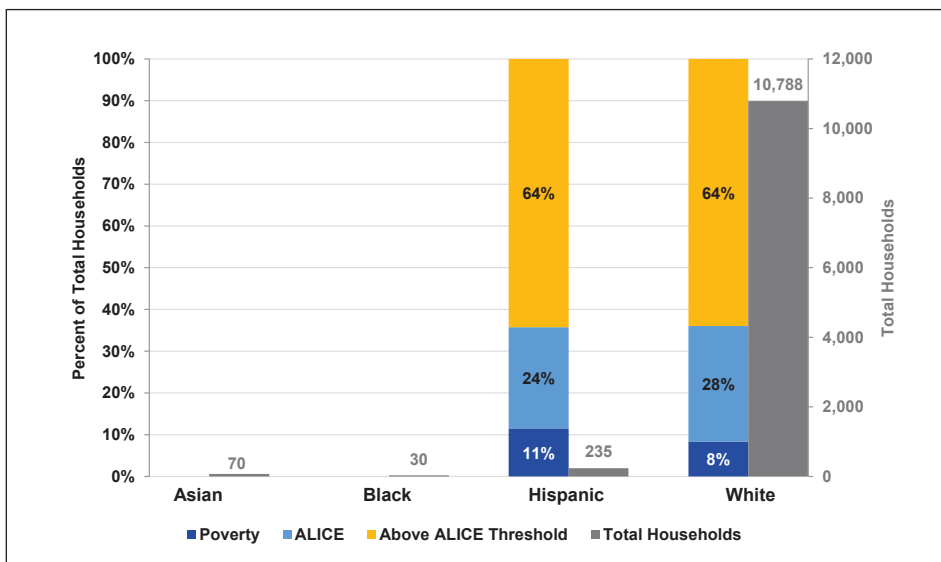
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Ripley County, 2023

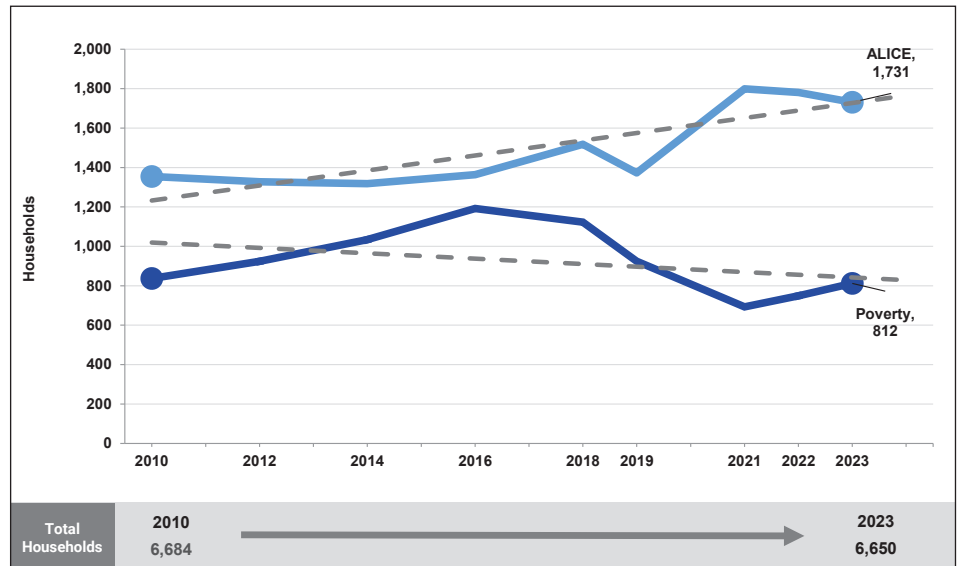

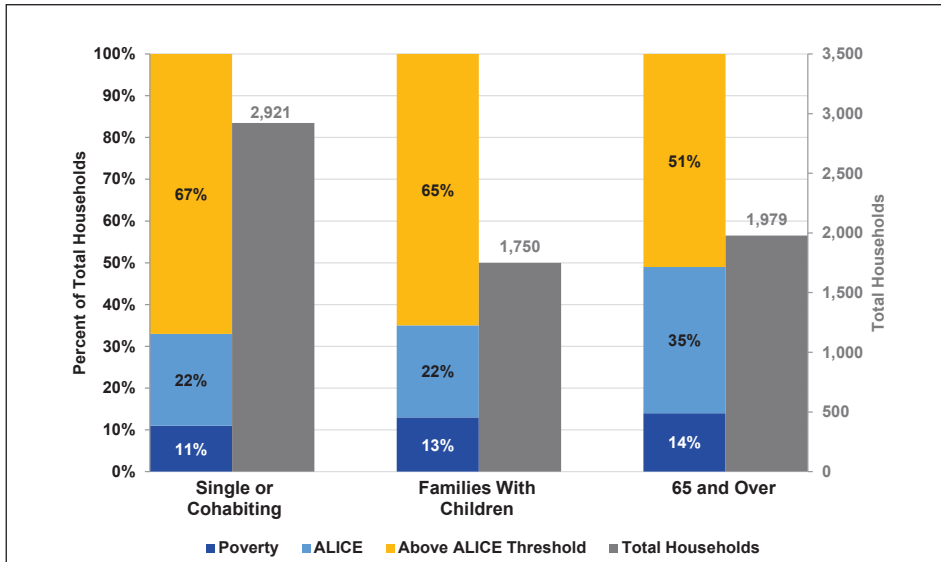

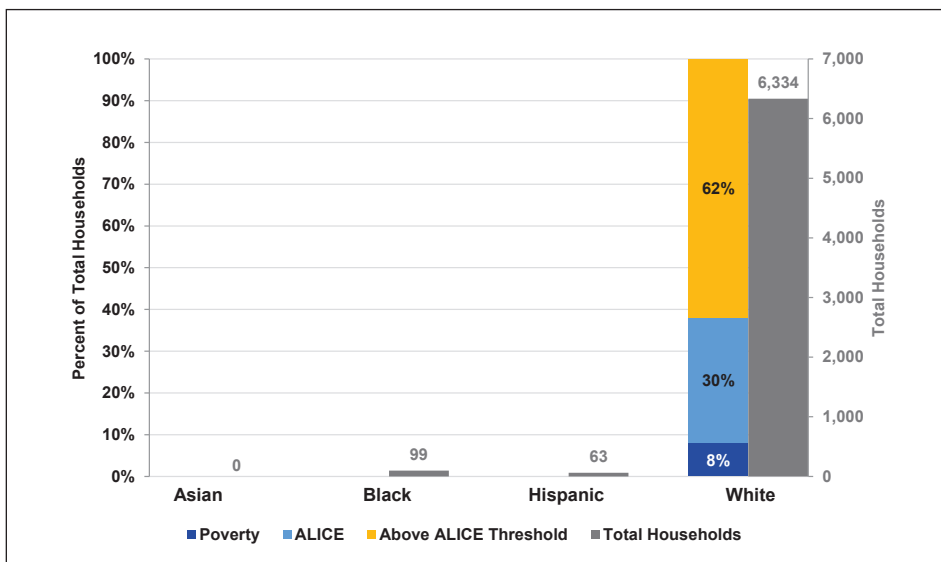
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Rush County, 2023

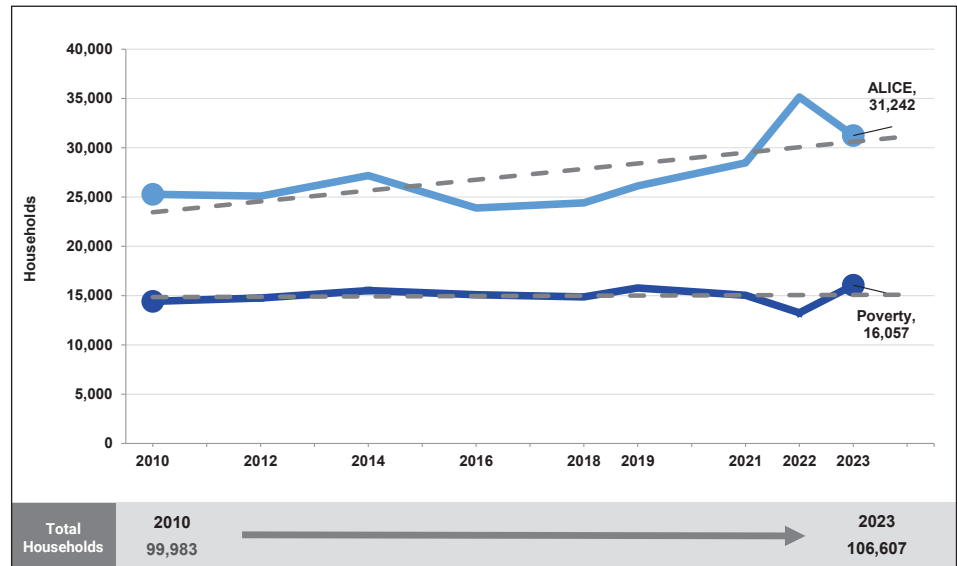

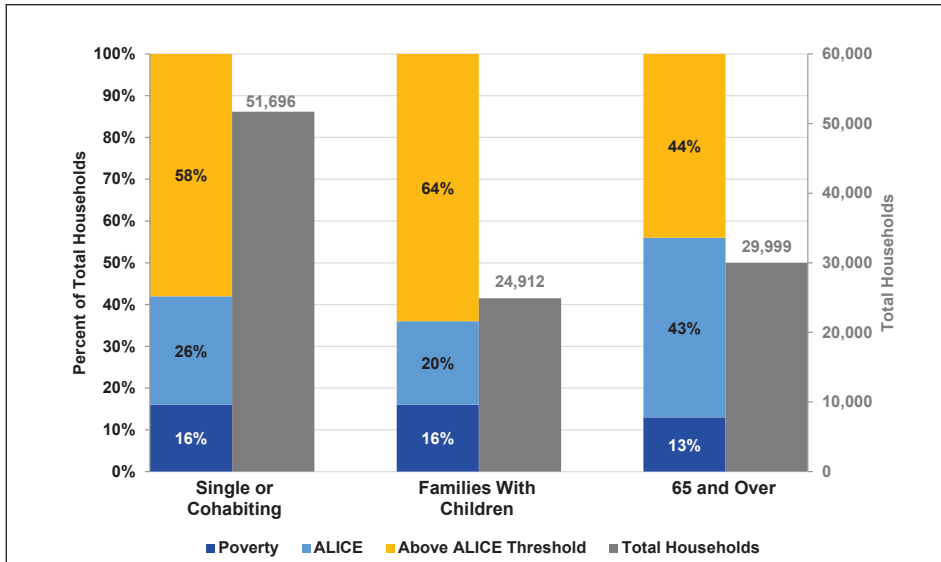

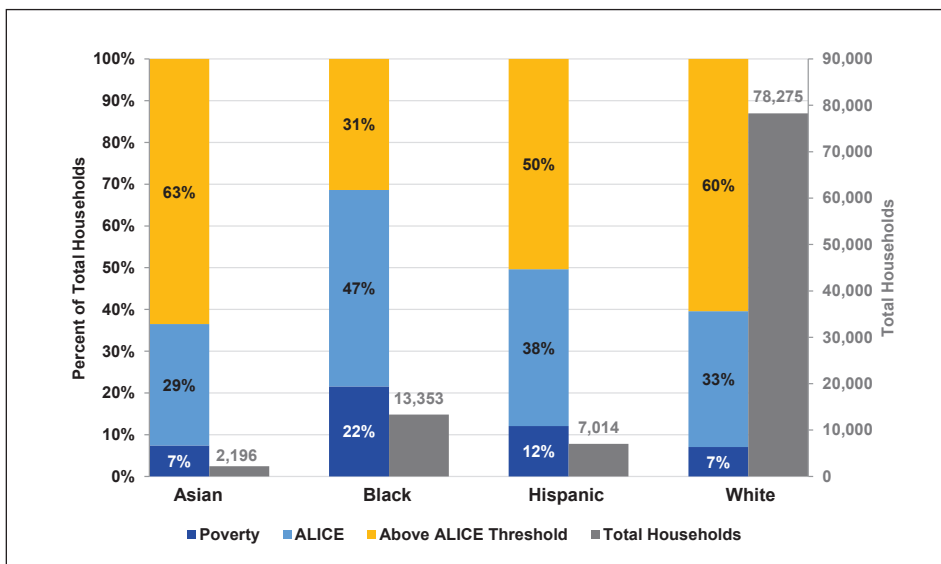
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, St. Joseph County, 2023

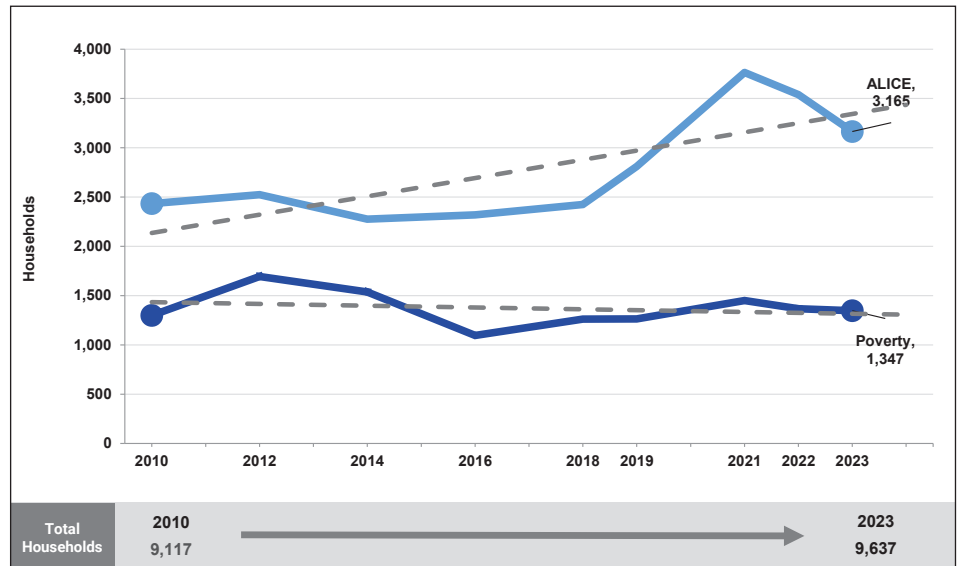

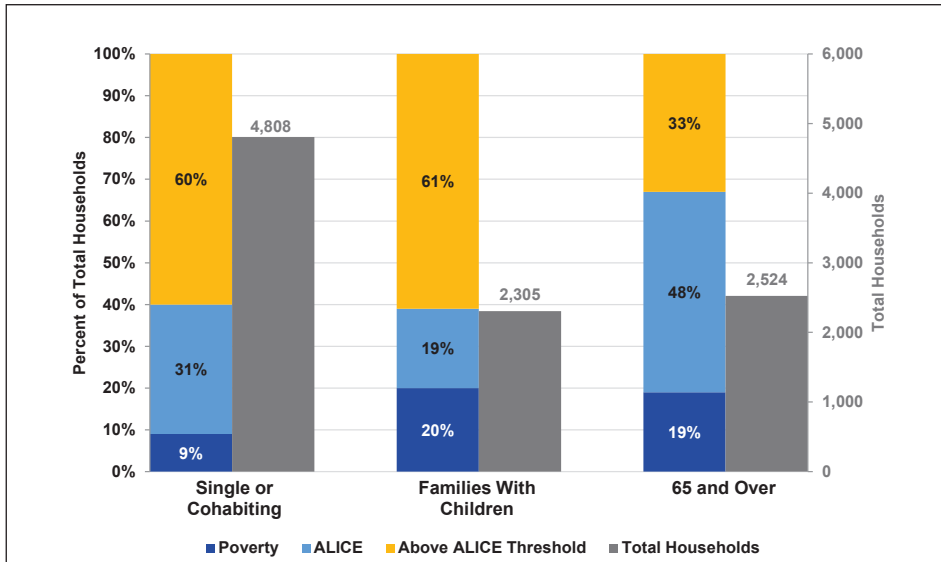

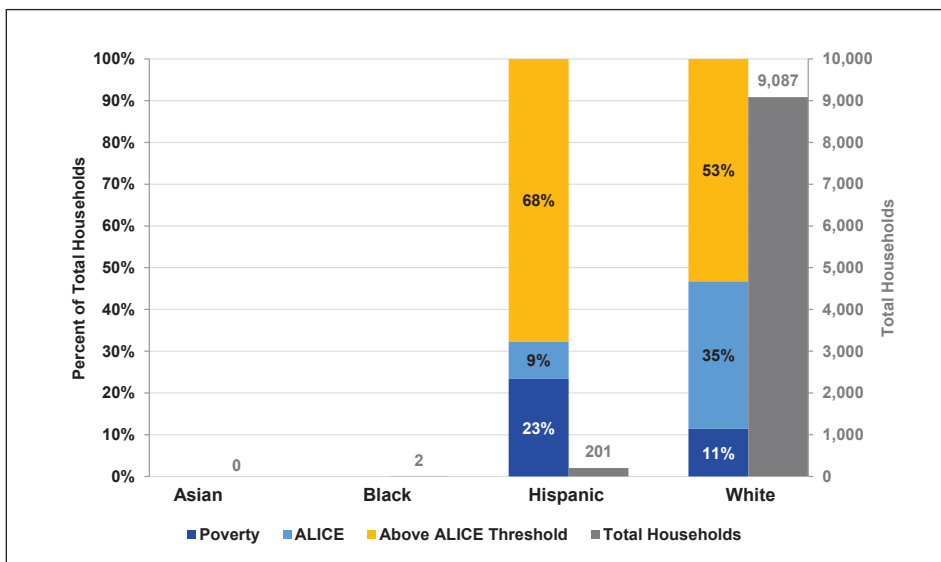
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Scott County, 2023

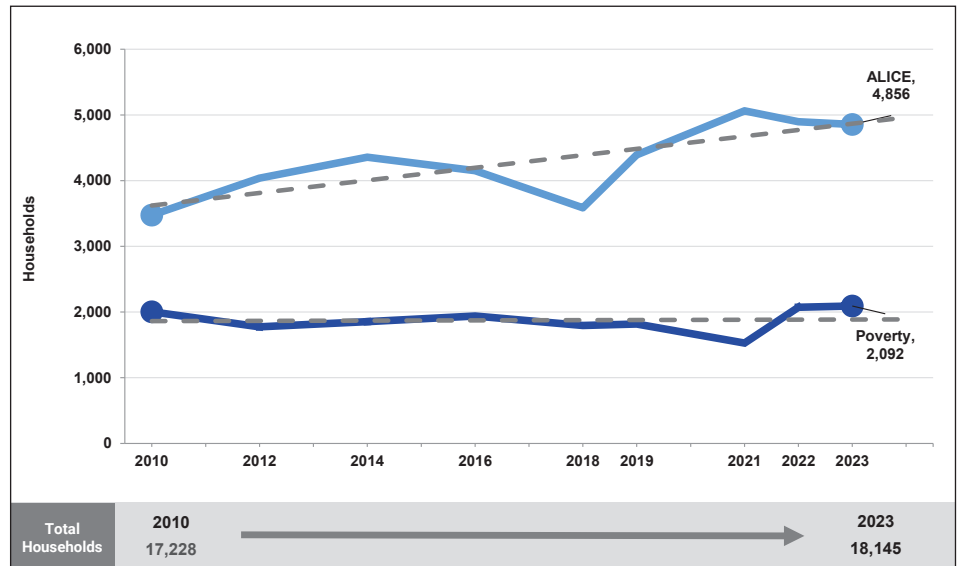

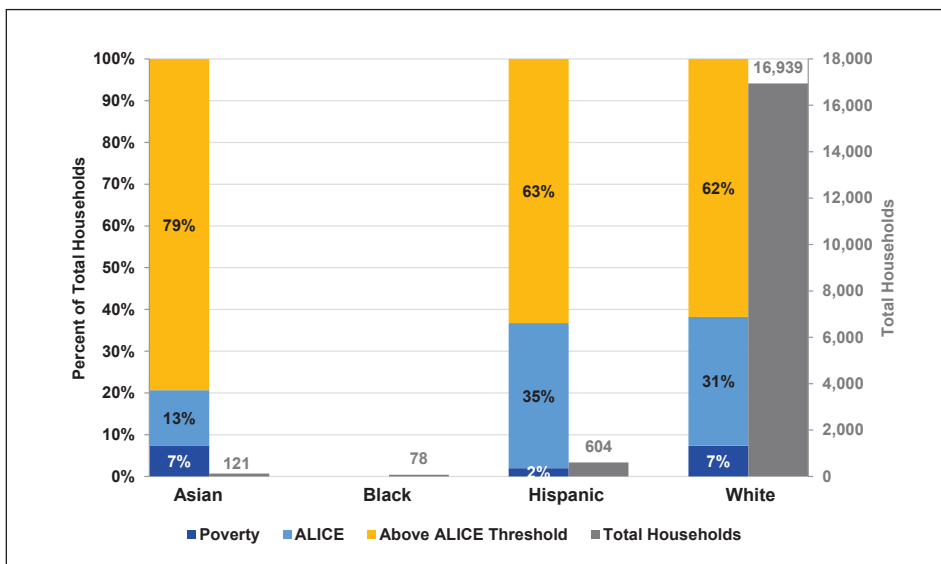

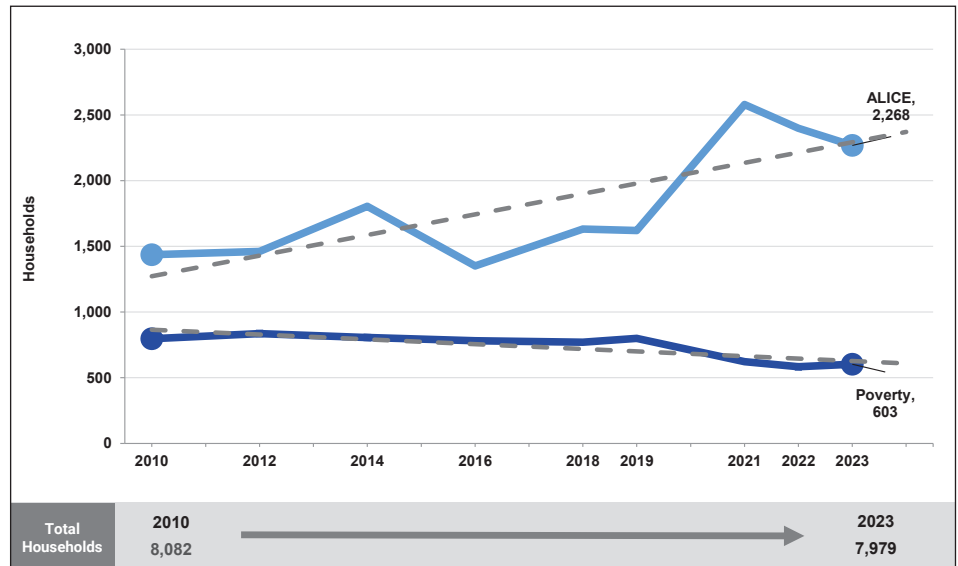

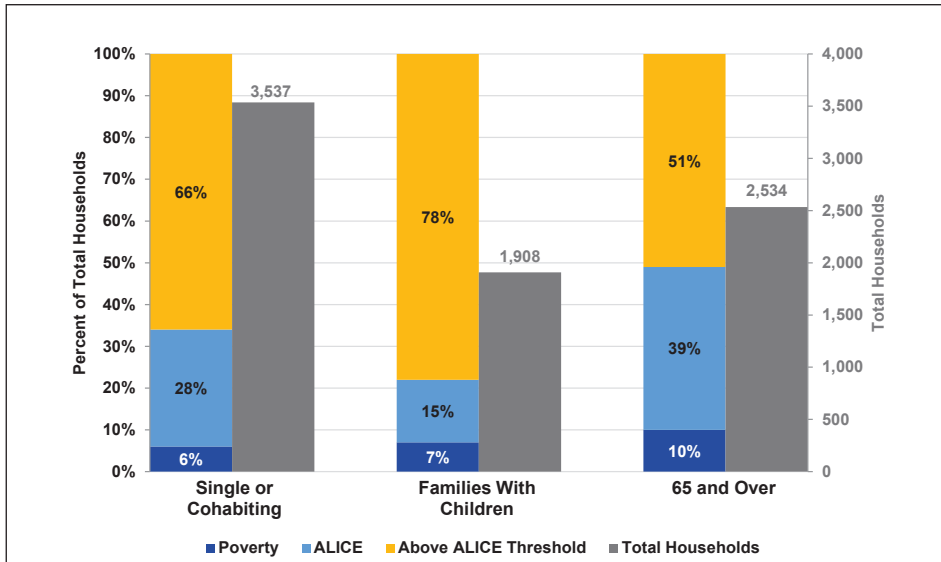

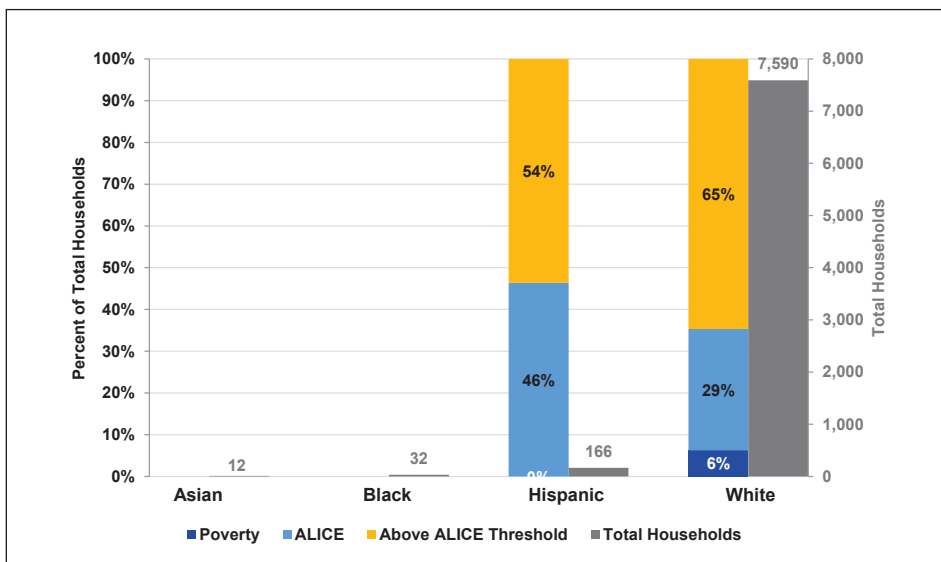
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Spencer County, 2023

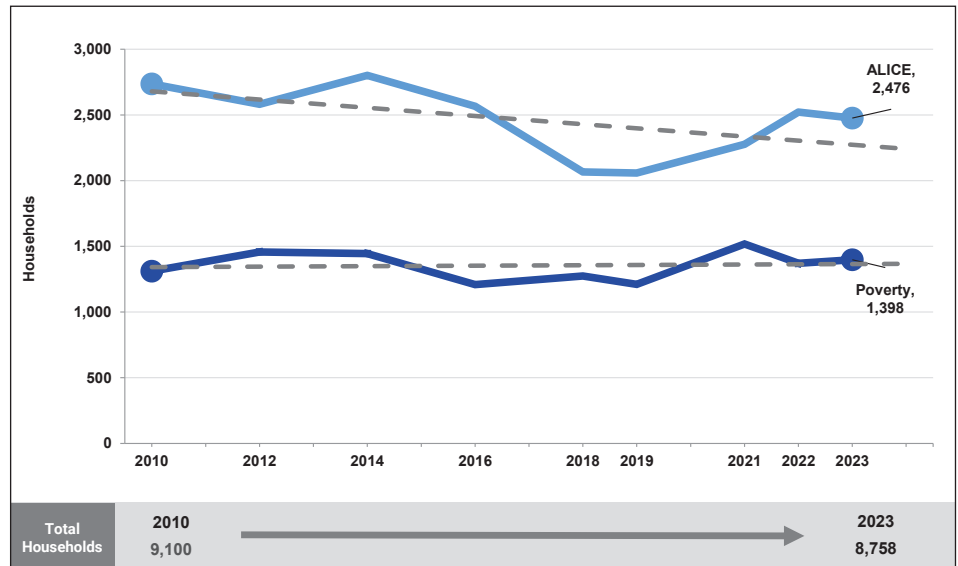

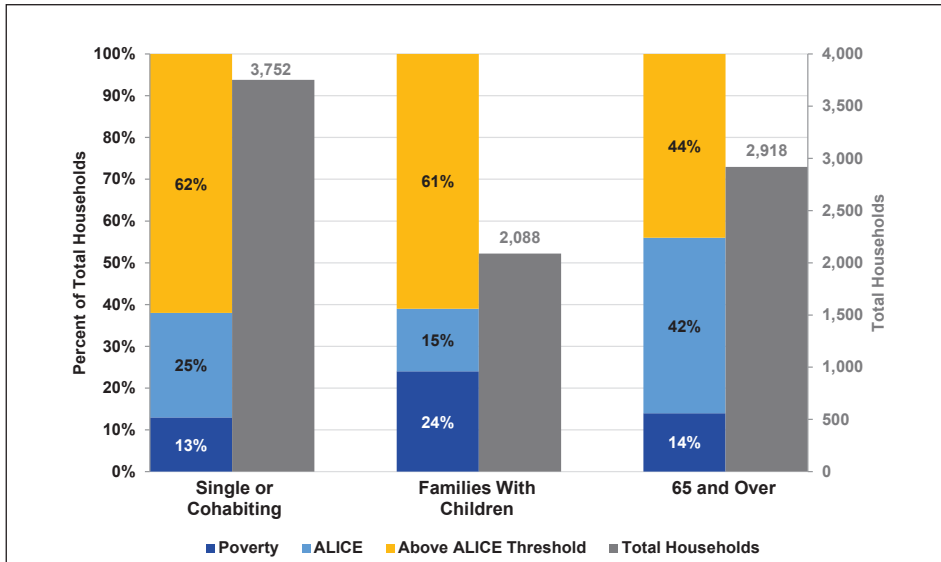

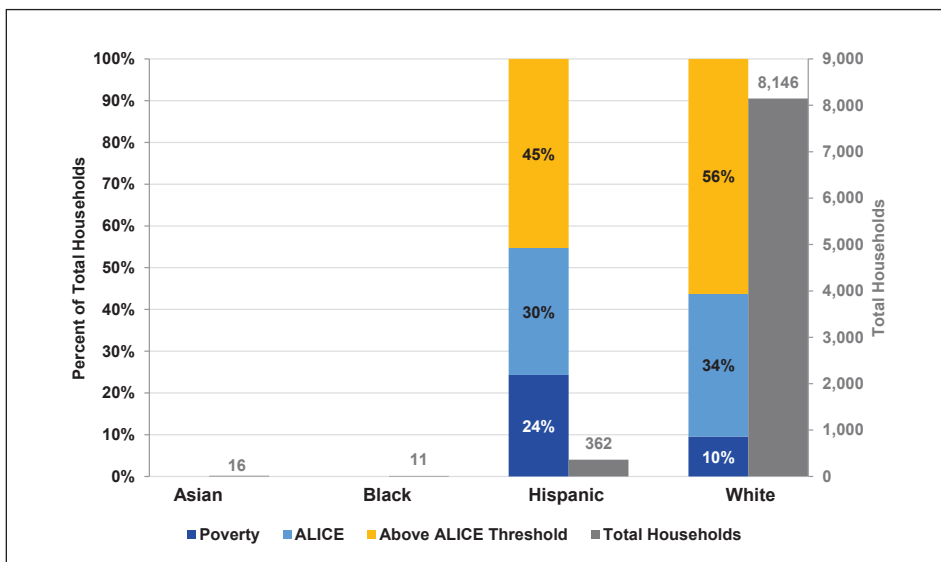
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Starke County, 2023

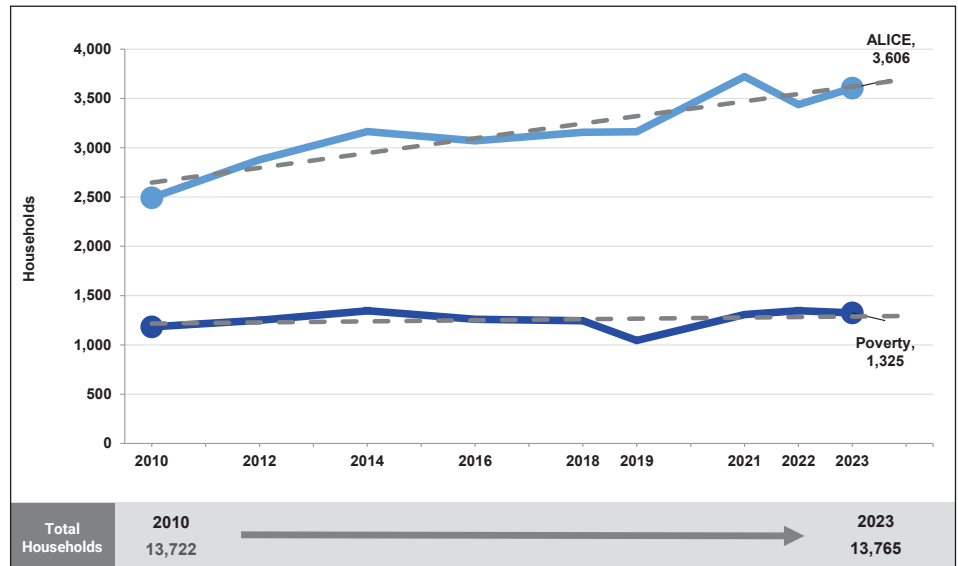

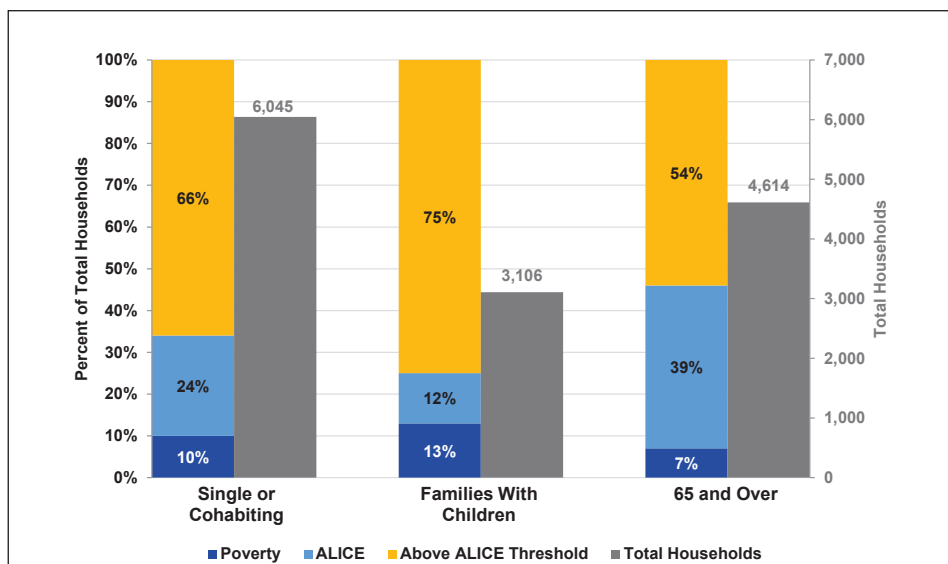

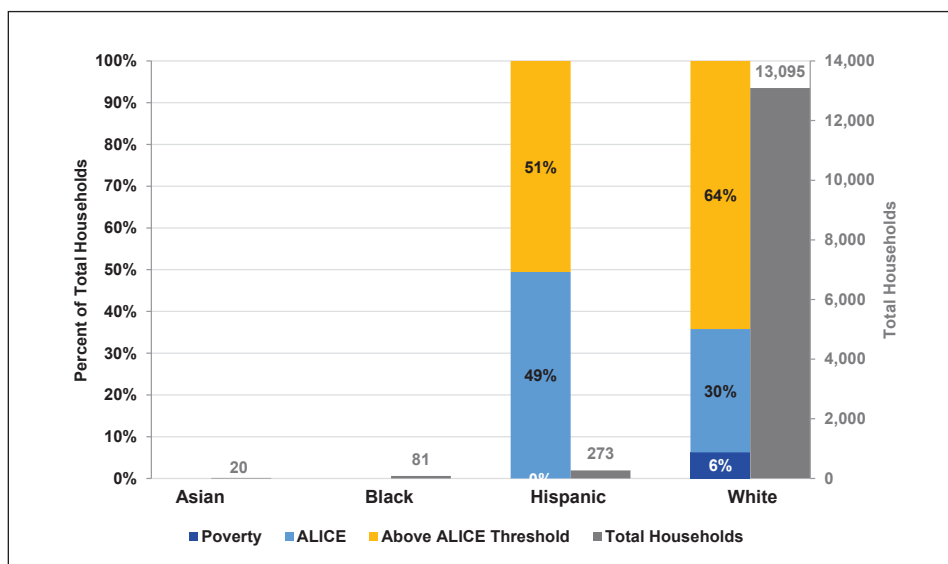
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Steuben County, 2023

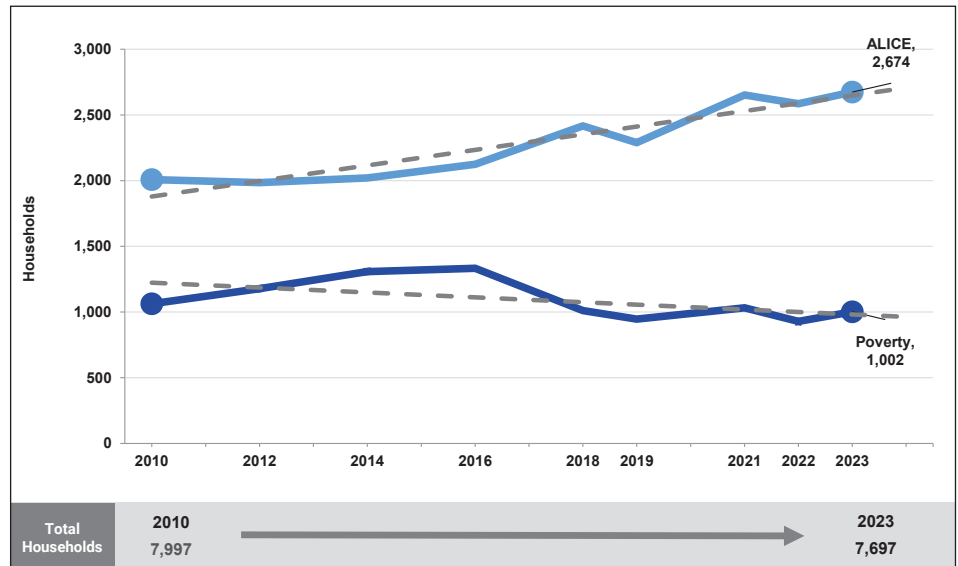

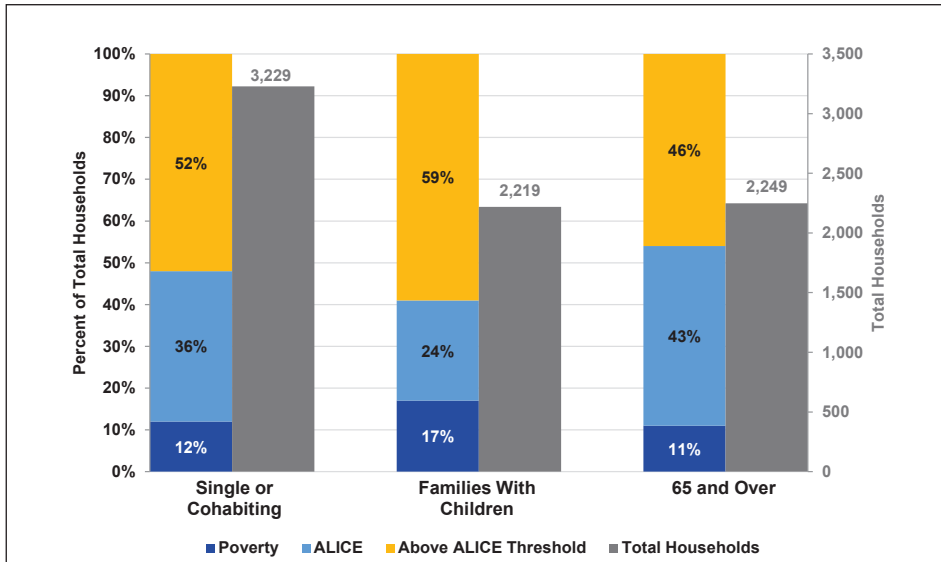

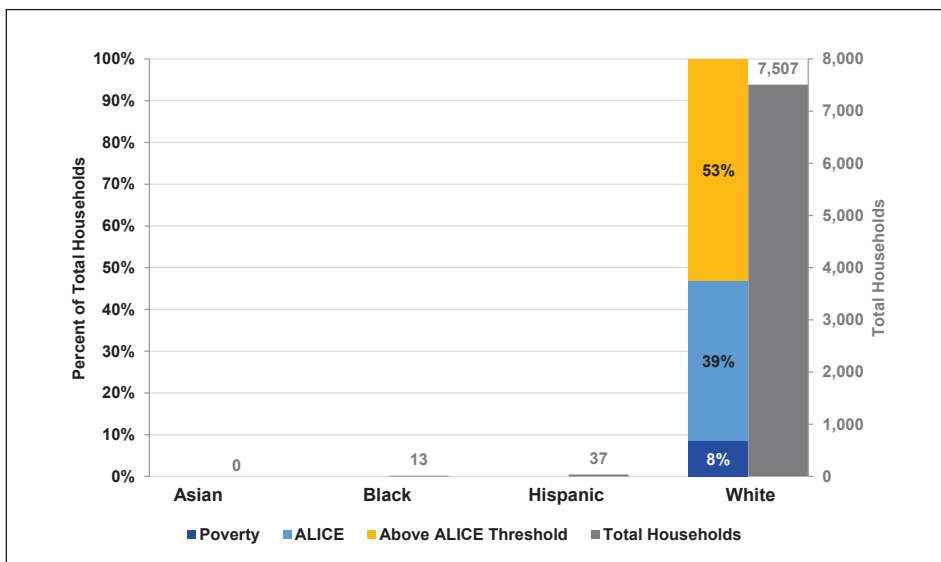
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Sullivan County, 2023

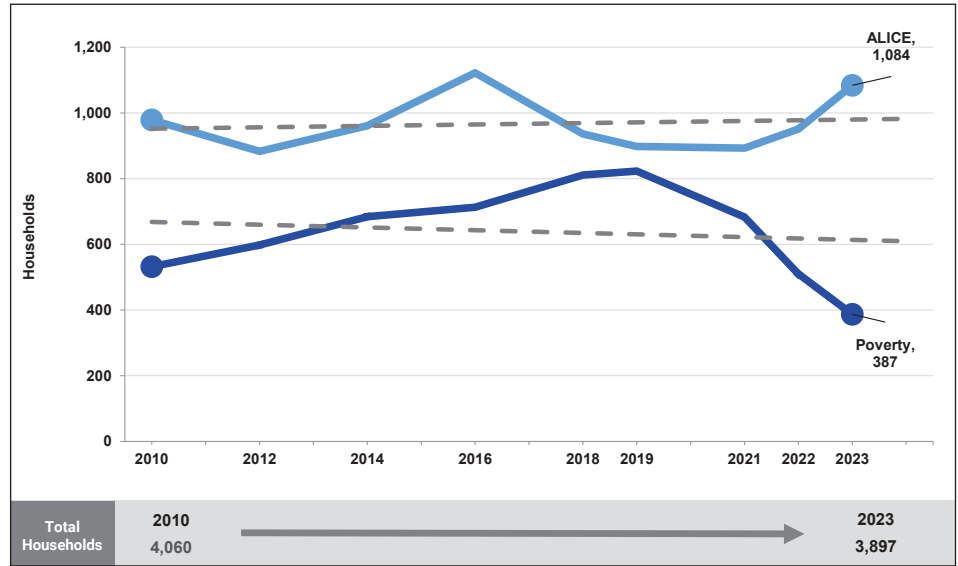

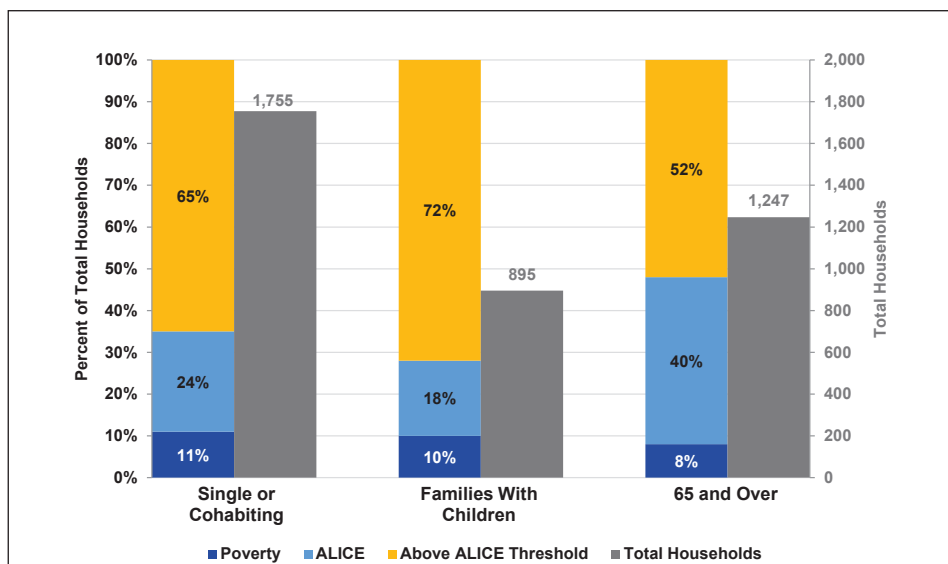

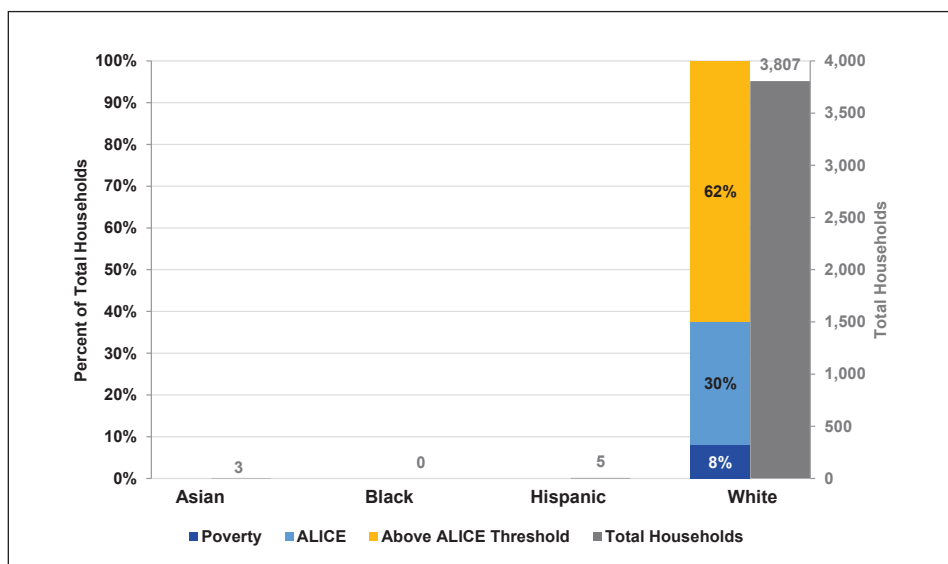
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Switzerland County, 2023

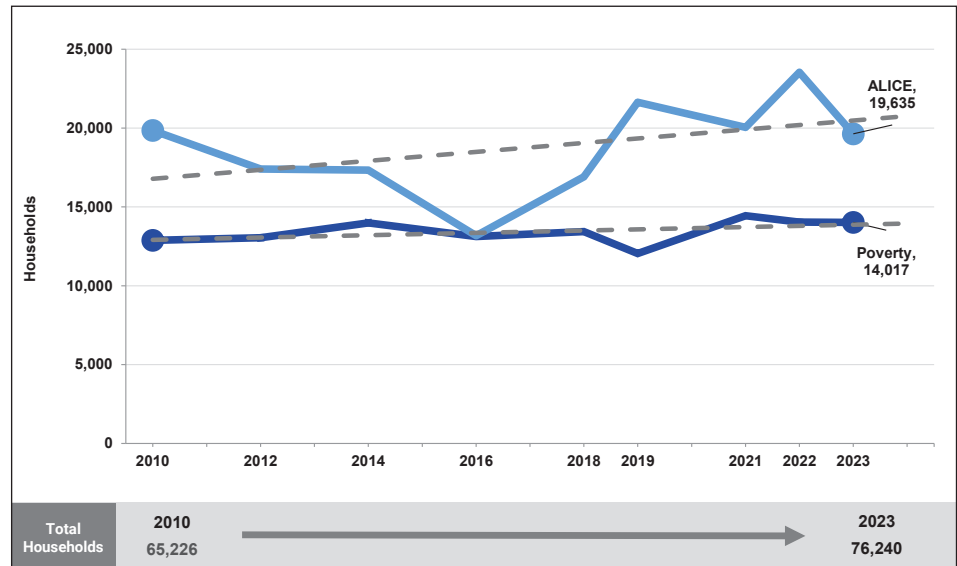

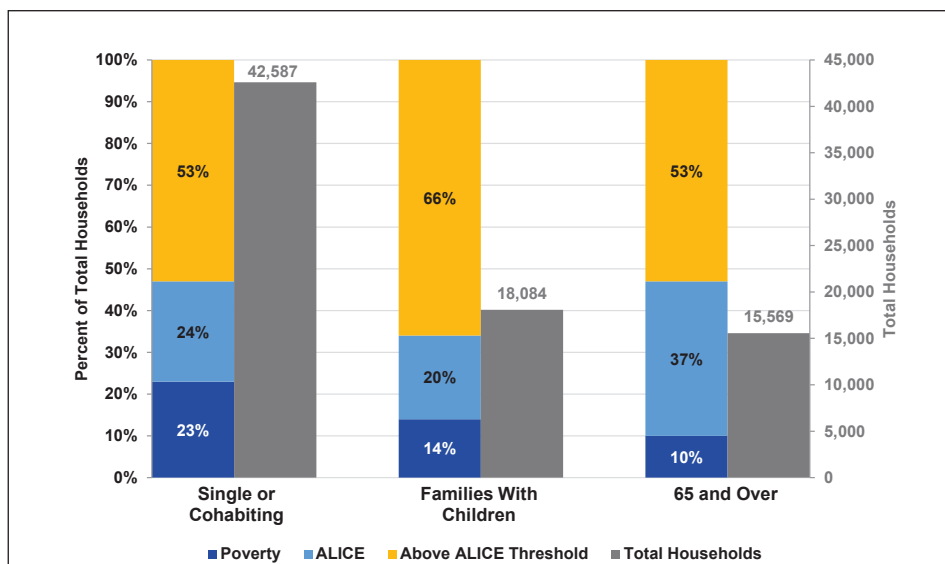

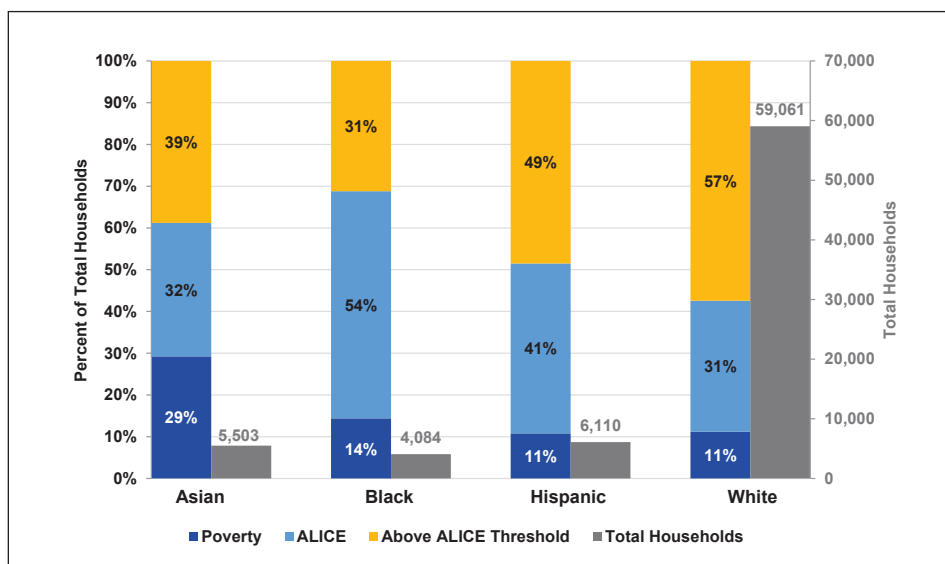
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Tippecanoe County, 2023

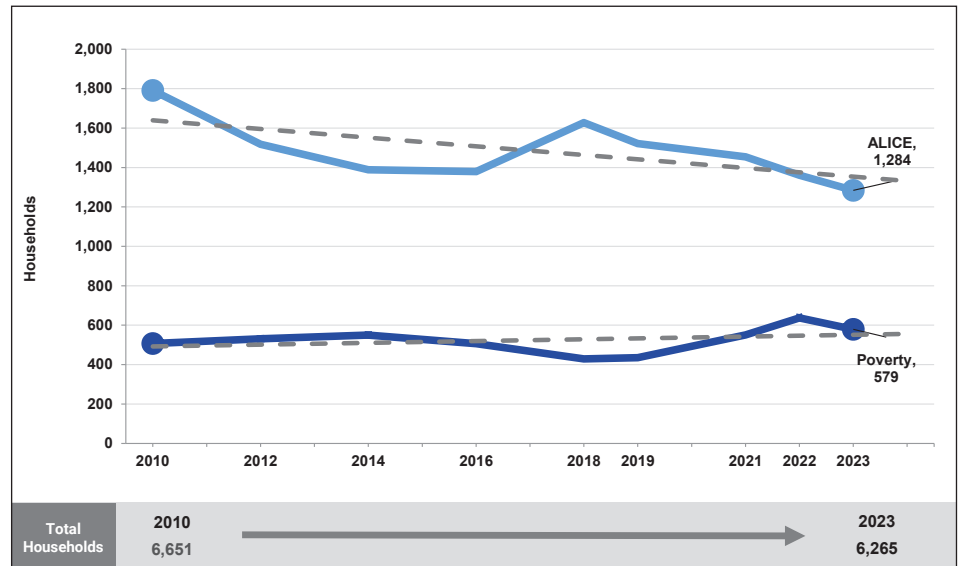

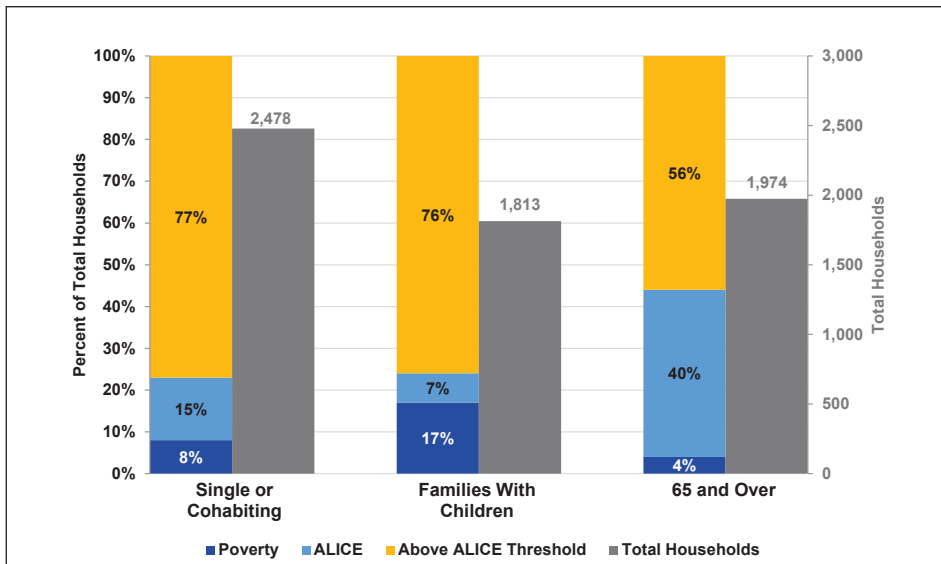

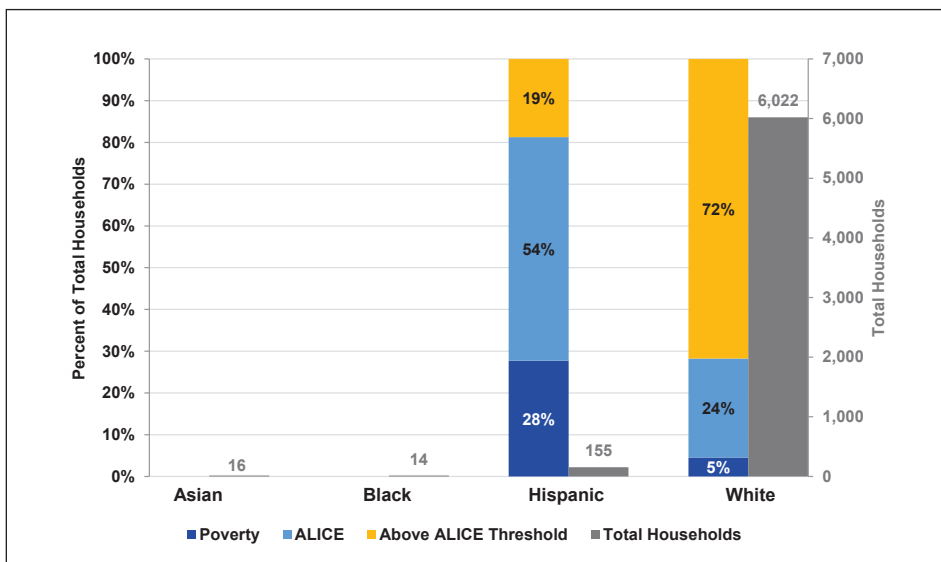
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Tipton County, 2023

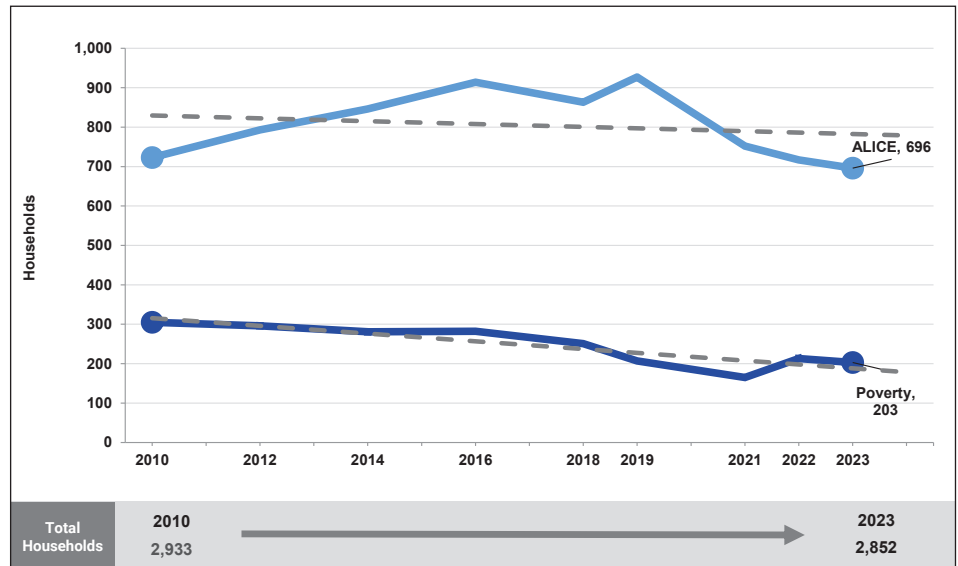

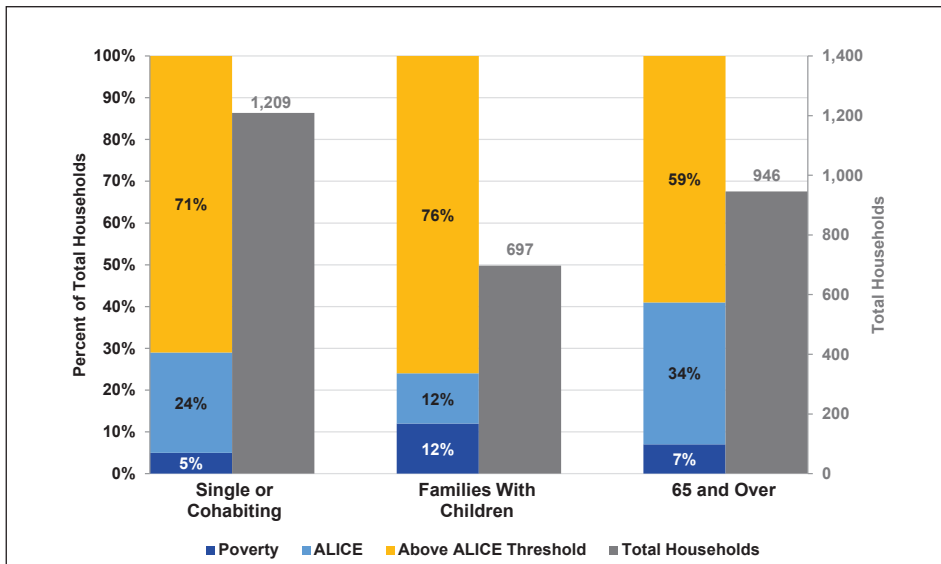

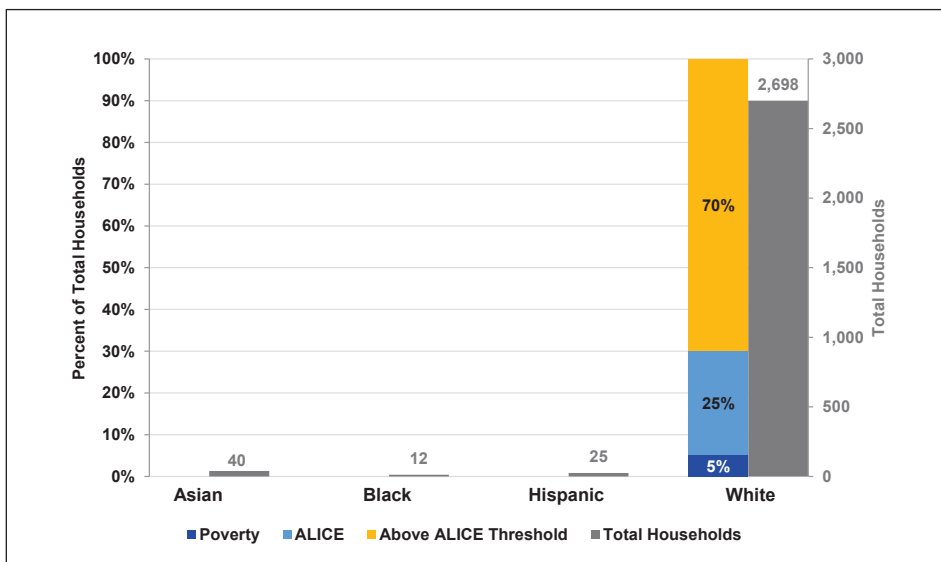
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Union County, 2023

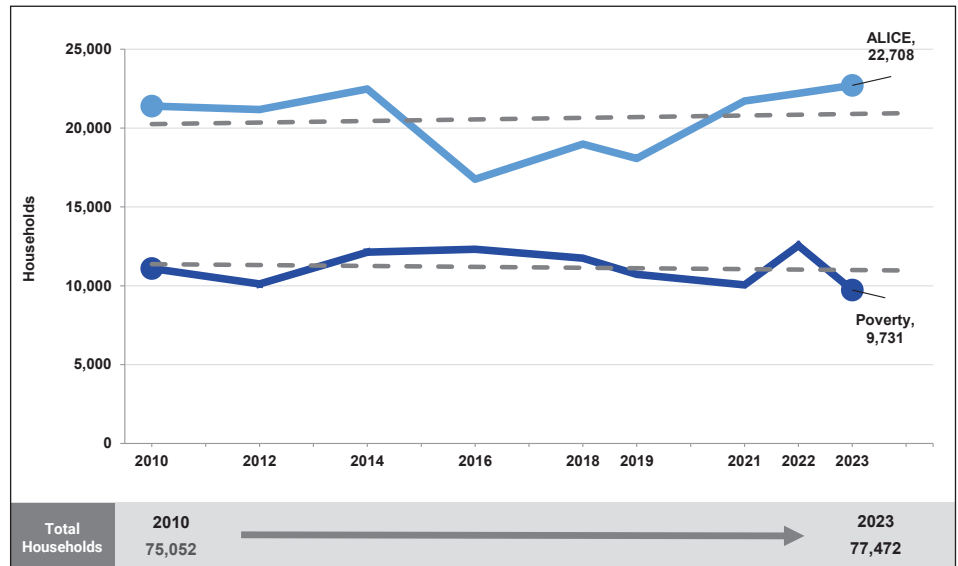

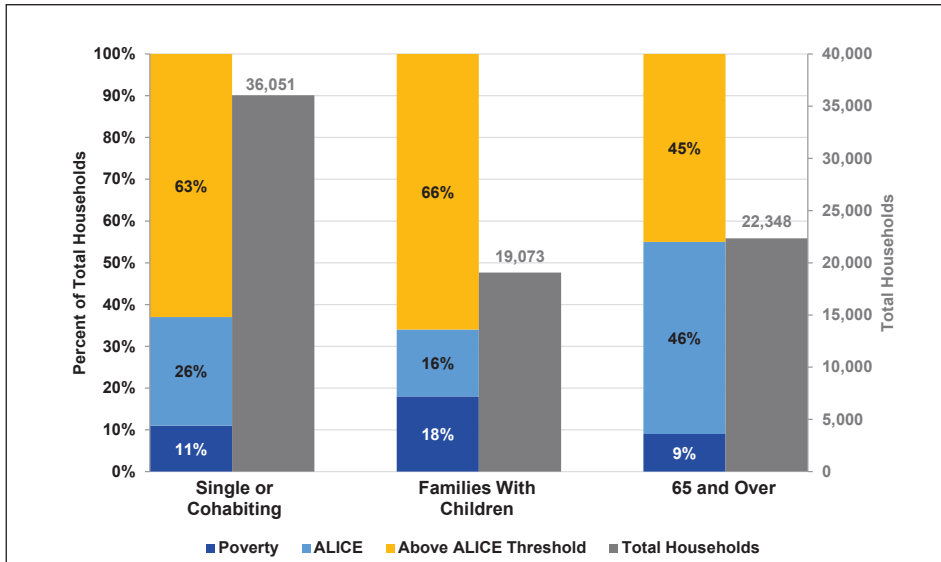

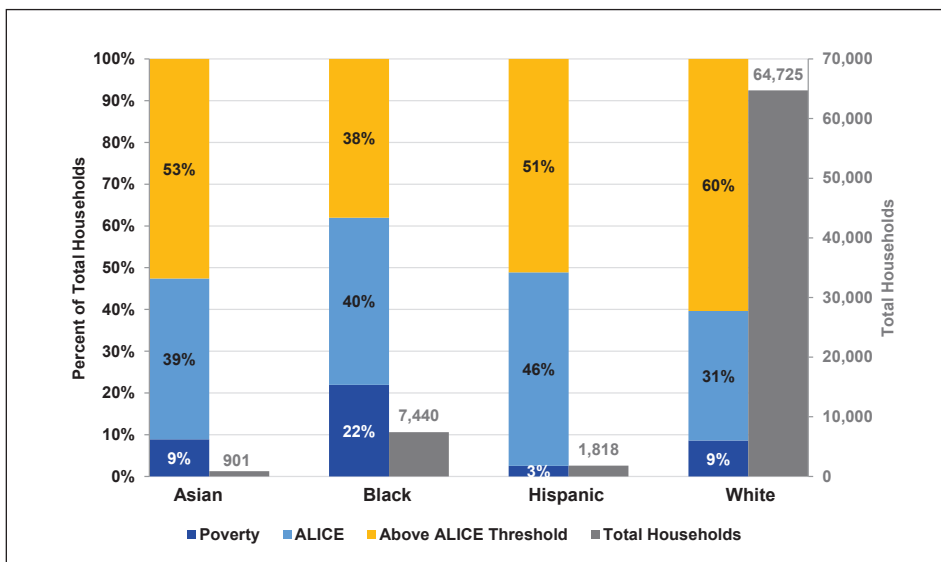

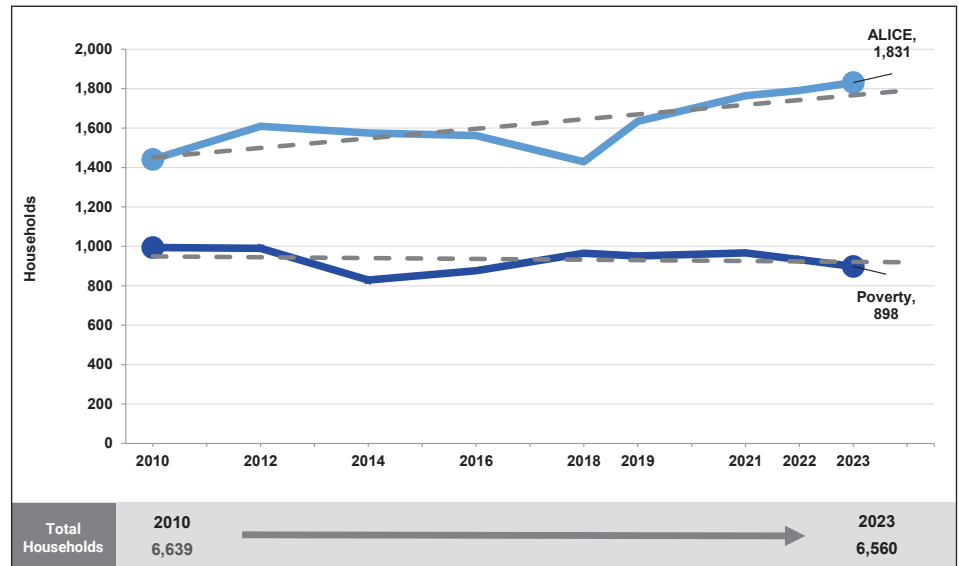

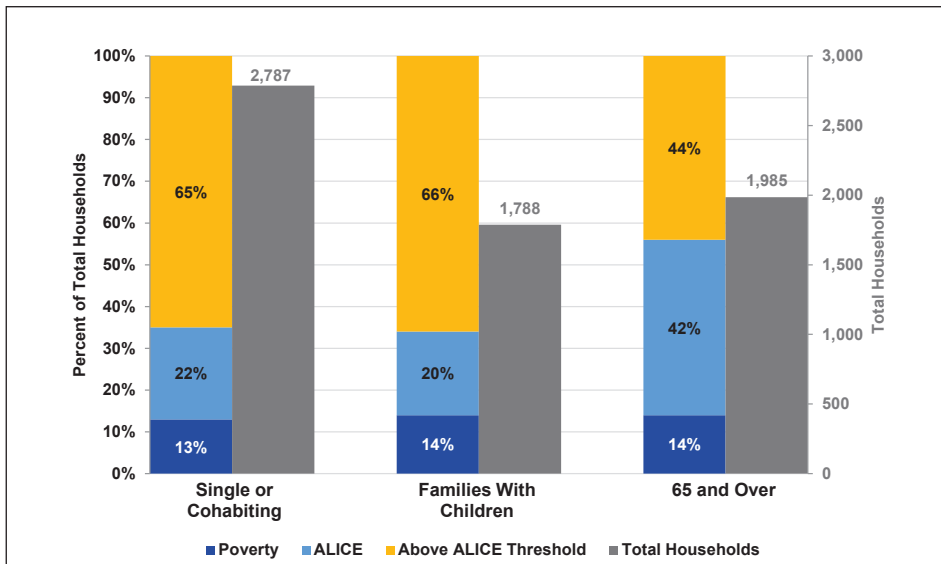

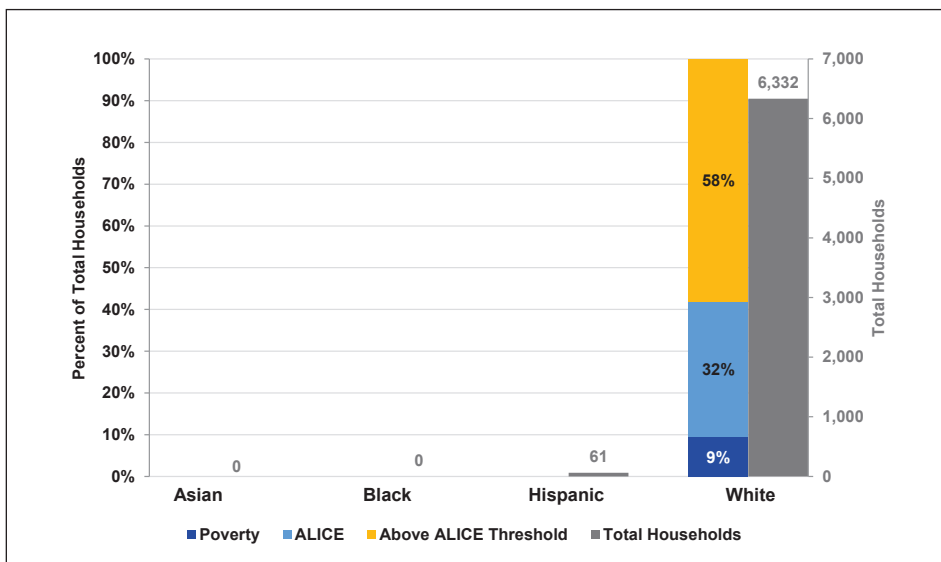
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Vermillion County, 2023

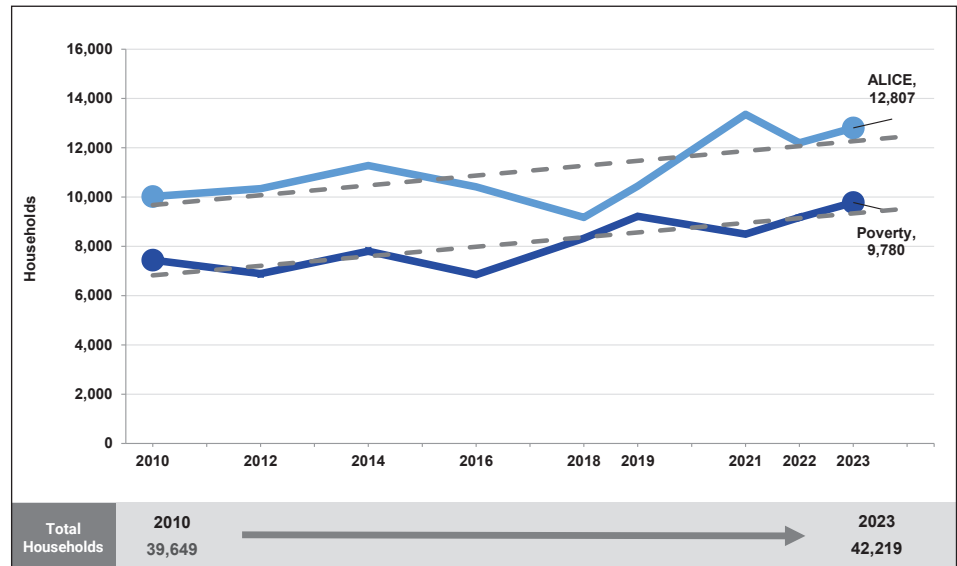

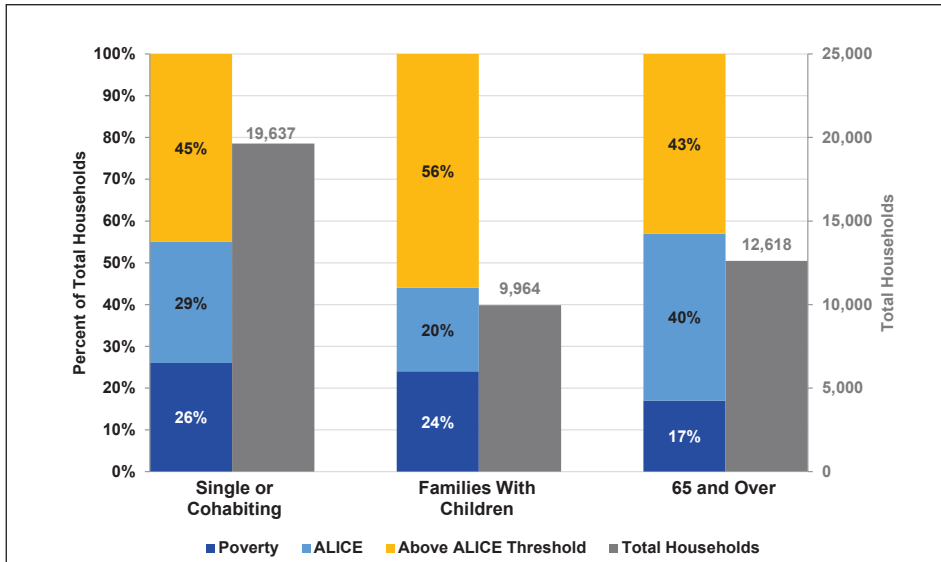

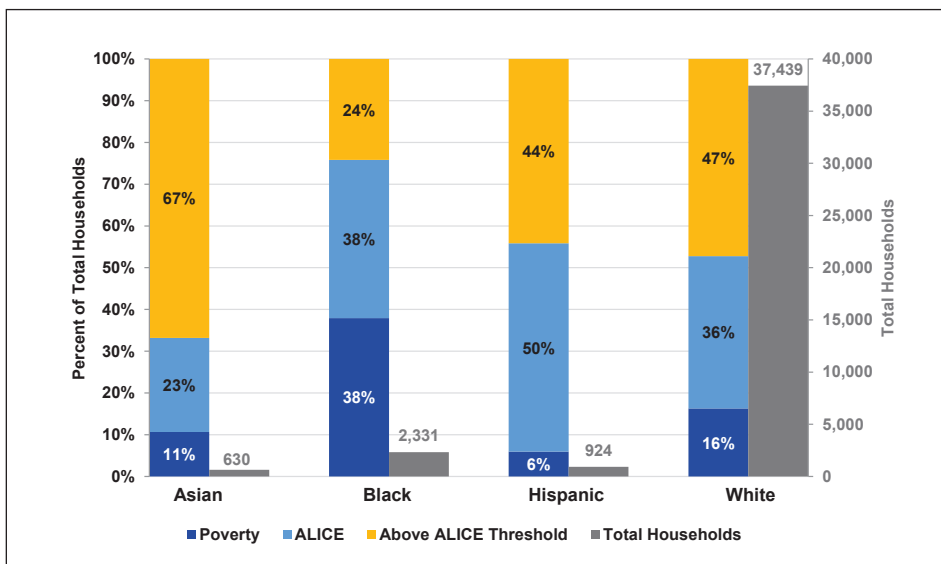
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Vigo County, 2023

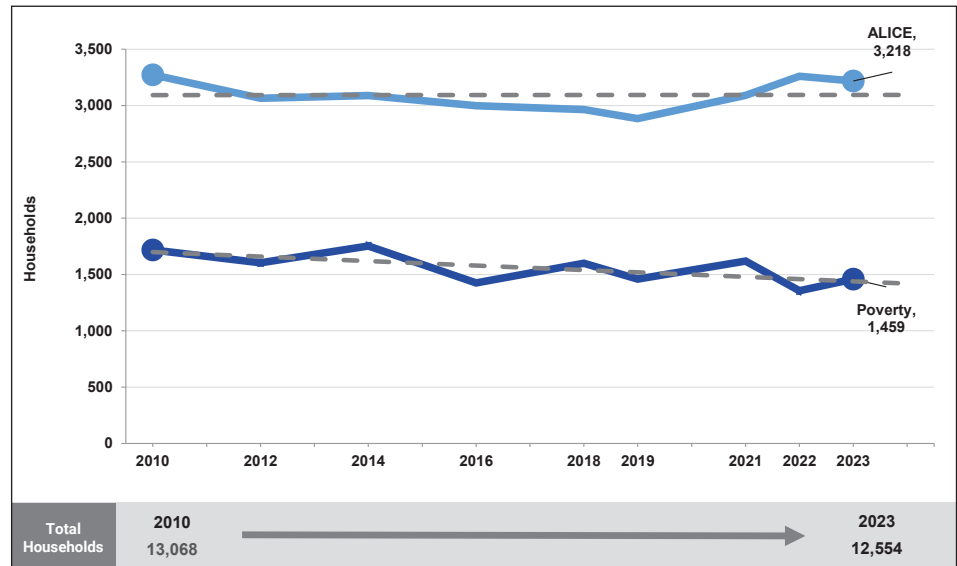

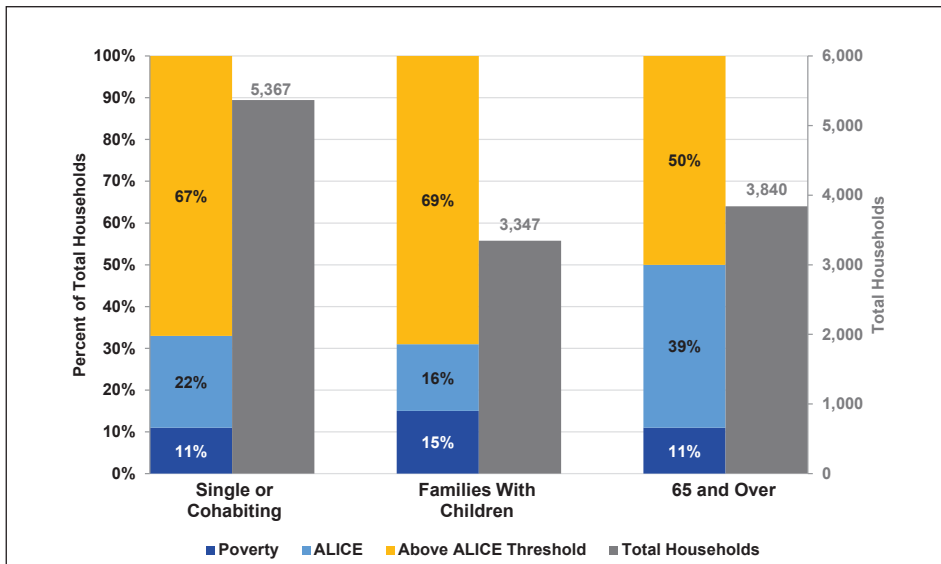

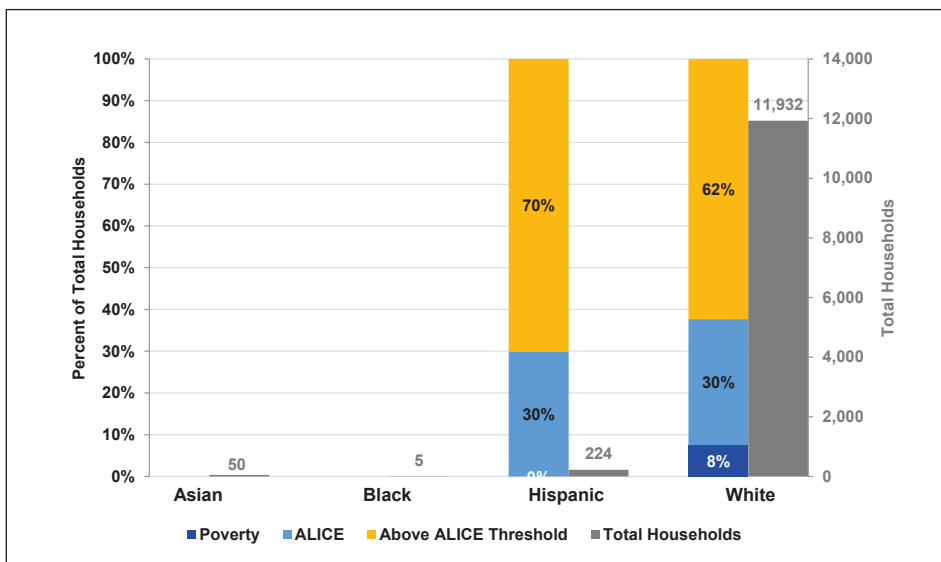
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Wabash County, 2023

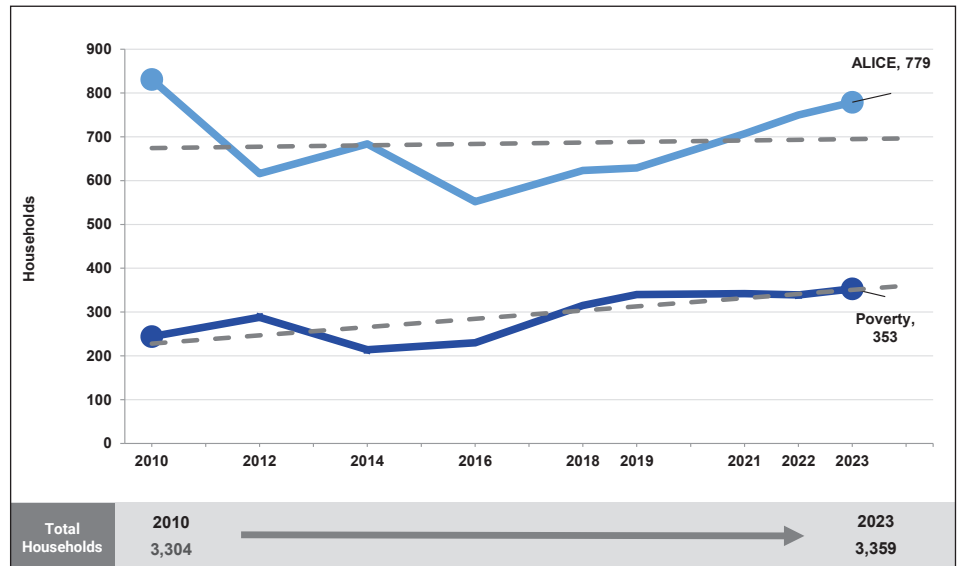

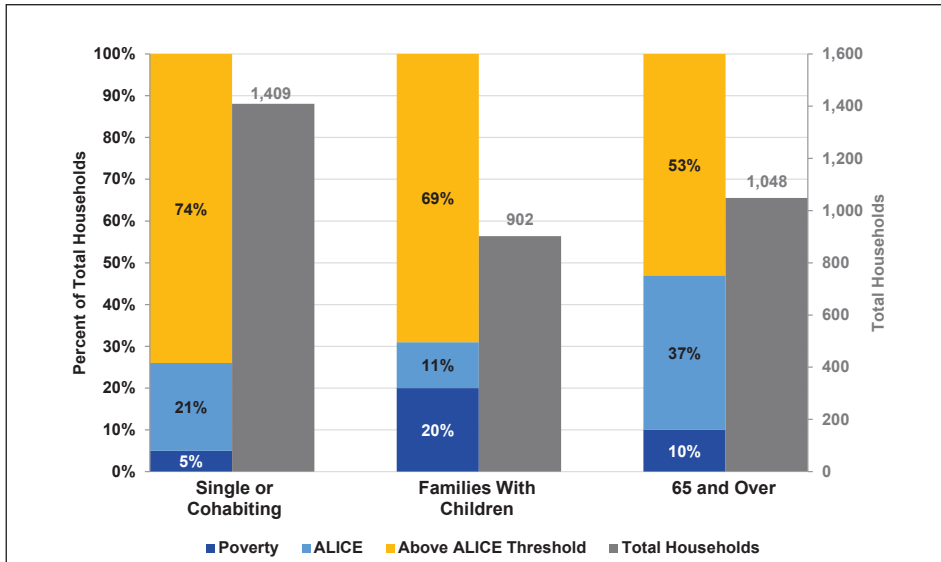

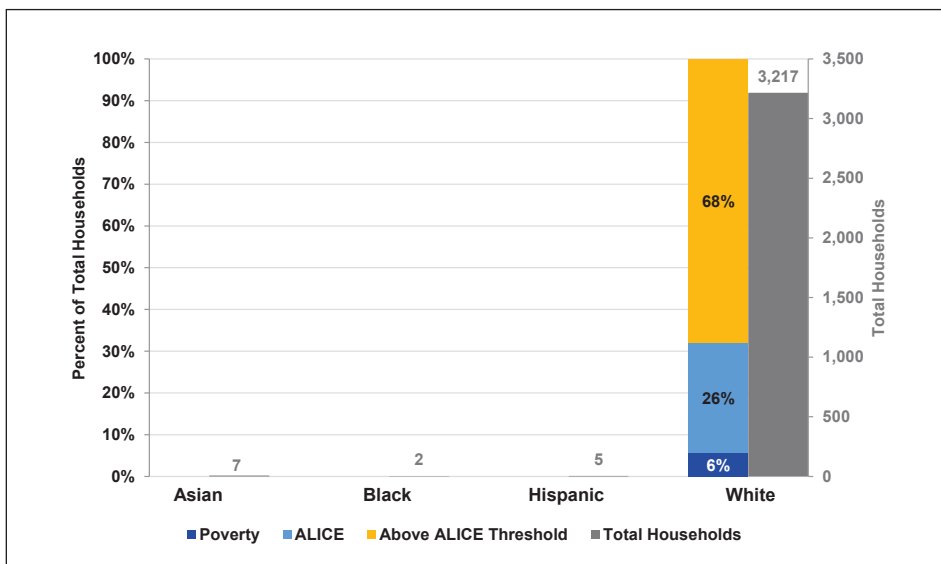
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Warren County, 2023

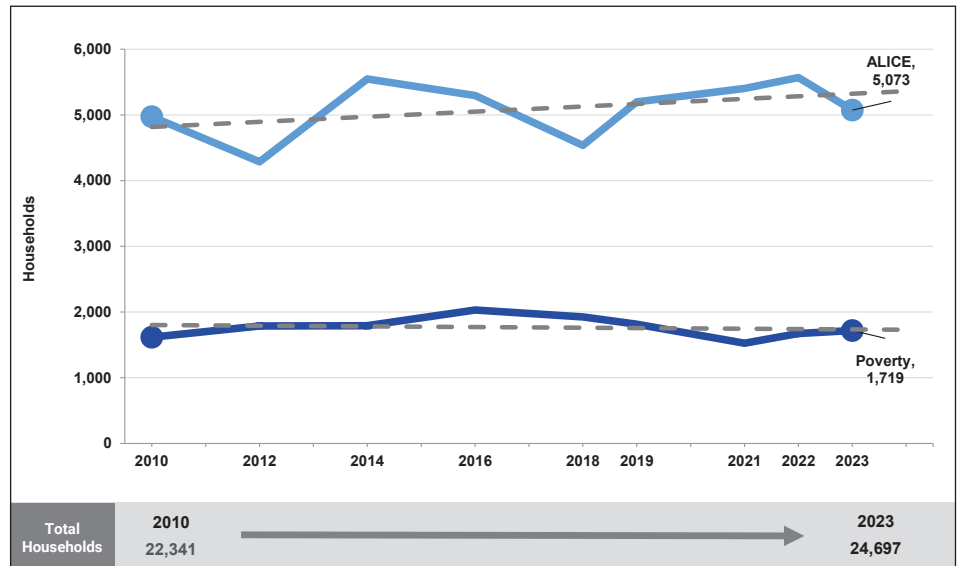

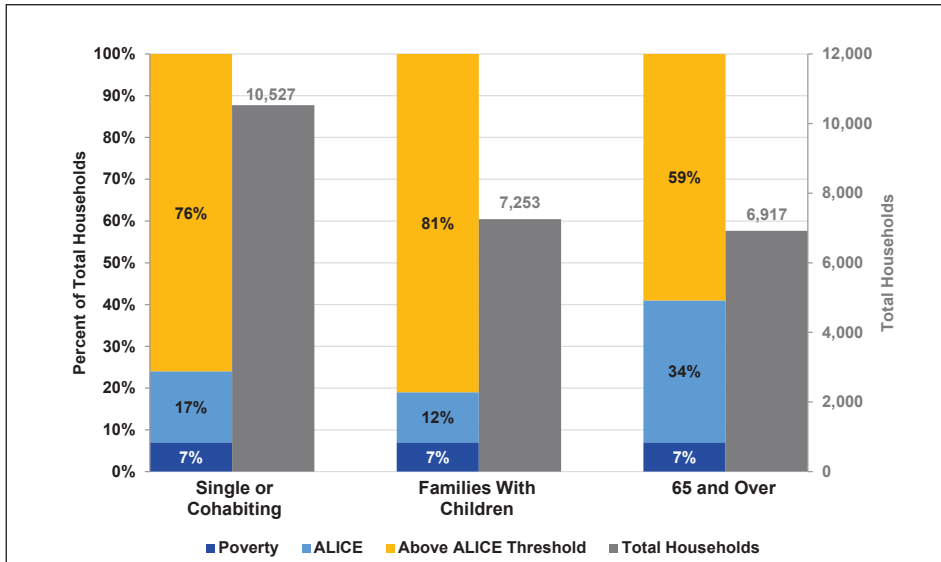

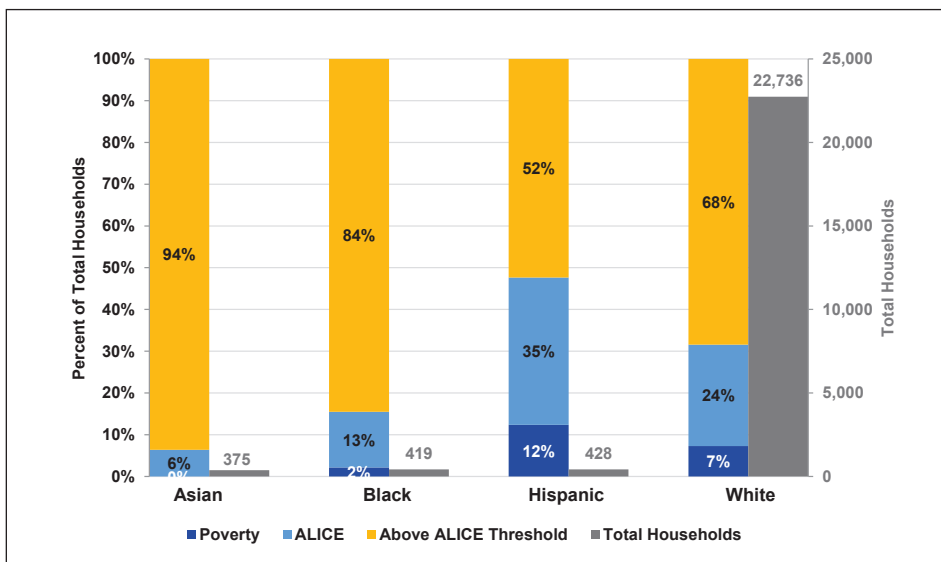
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Warrick County, 2023

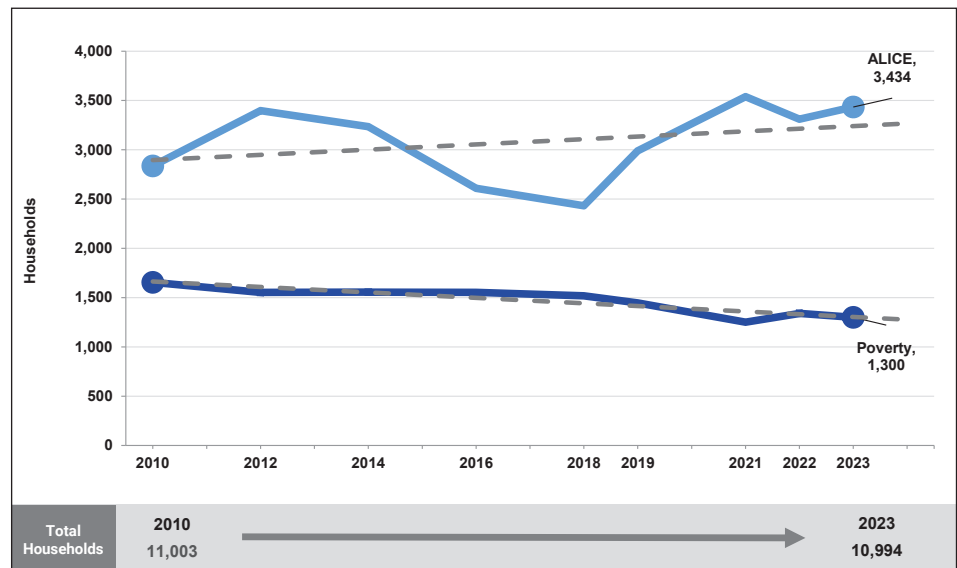

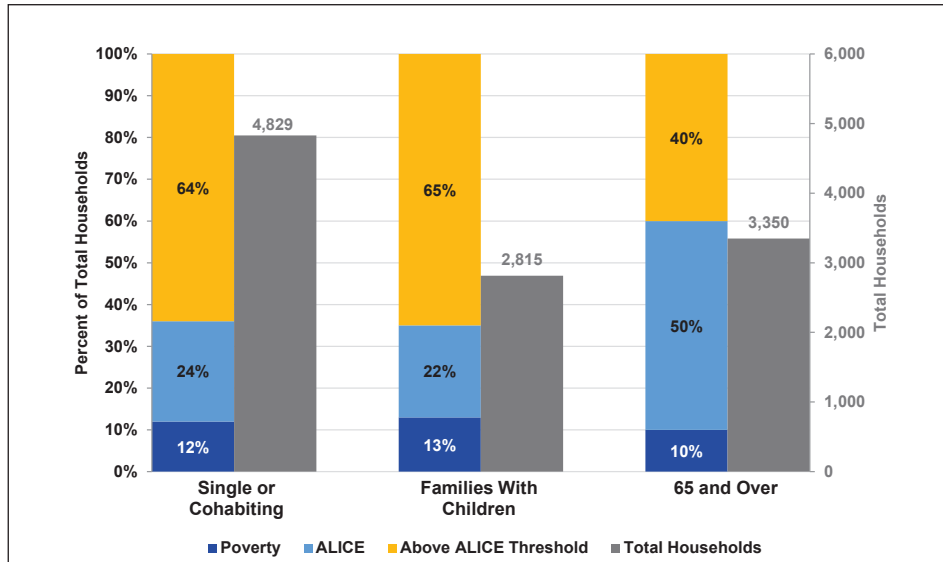

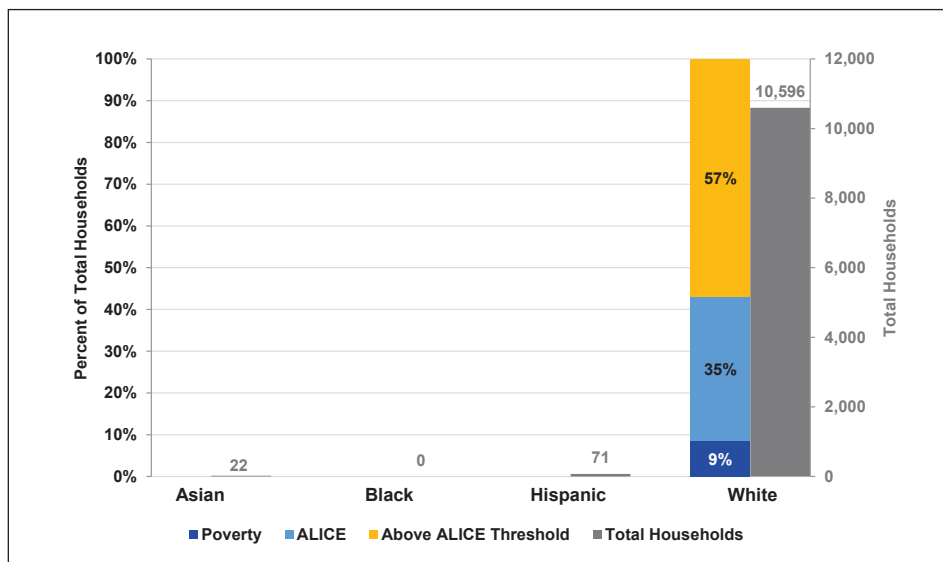
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Washington County, 2023

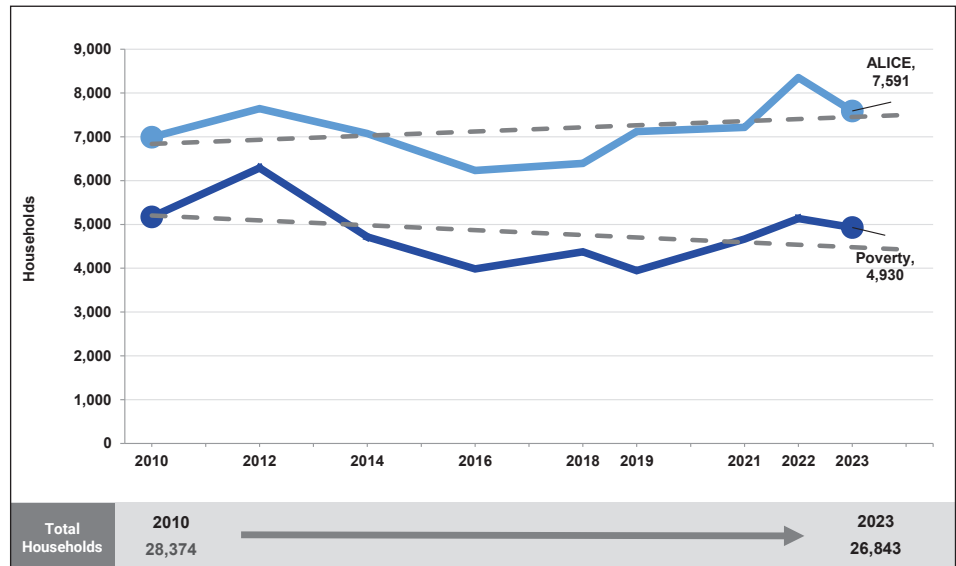

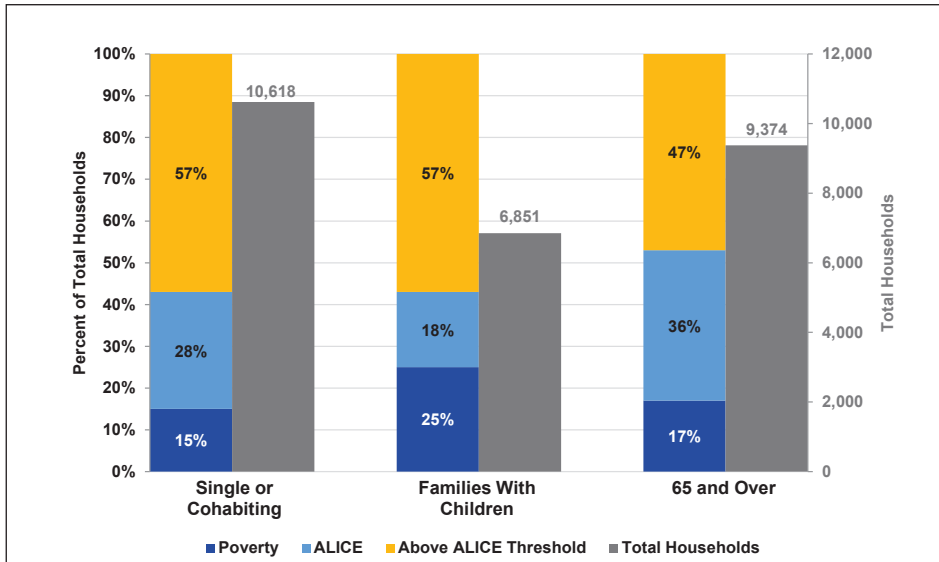

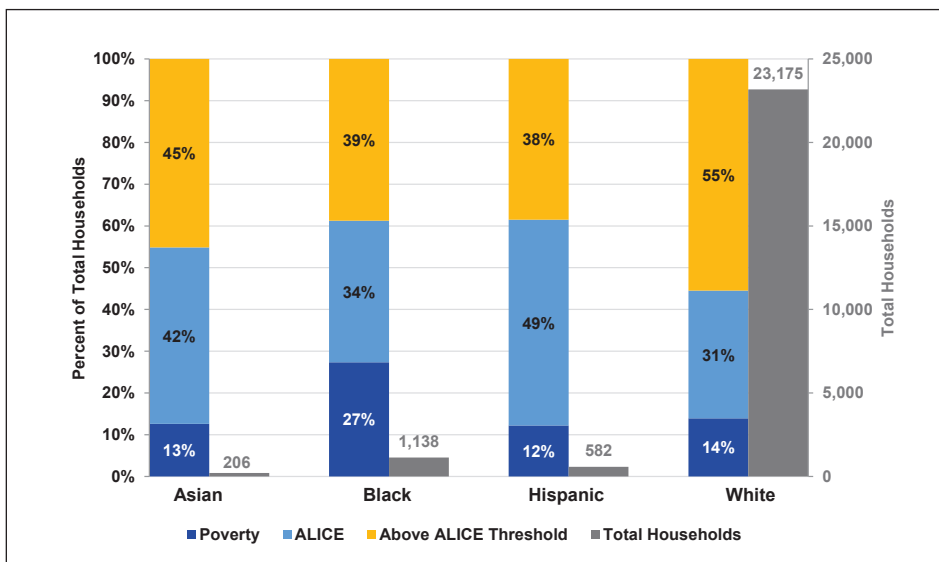
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Wayne County, 2023

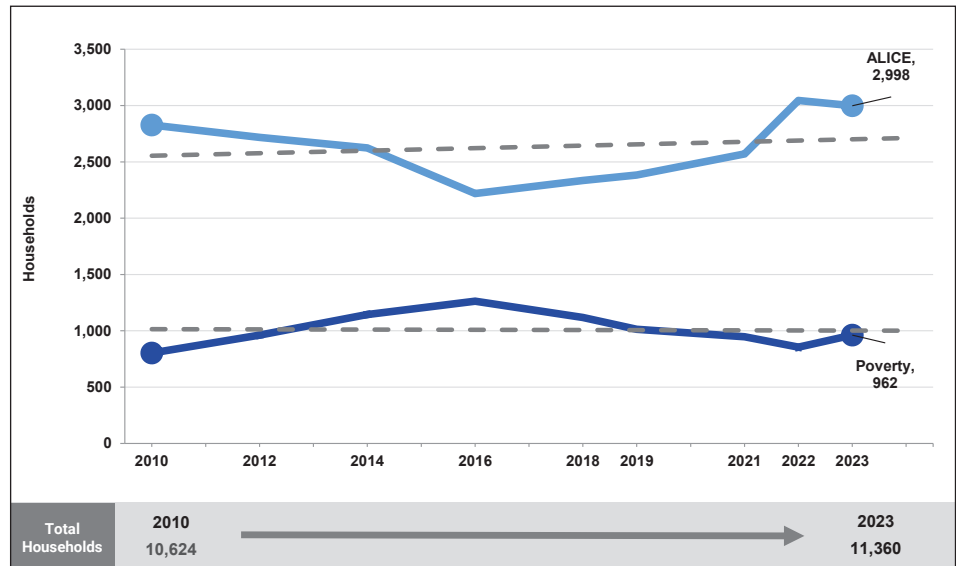

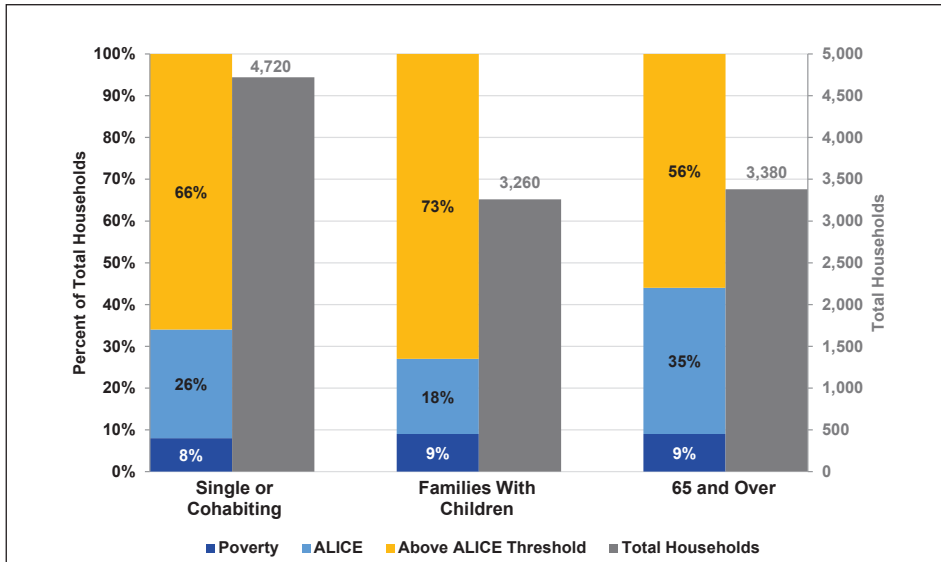

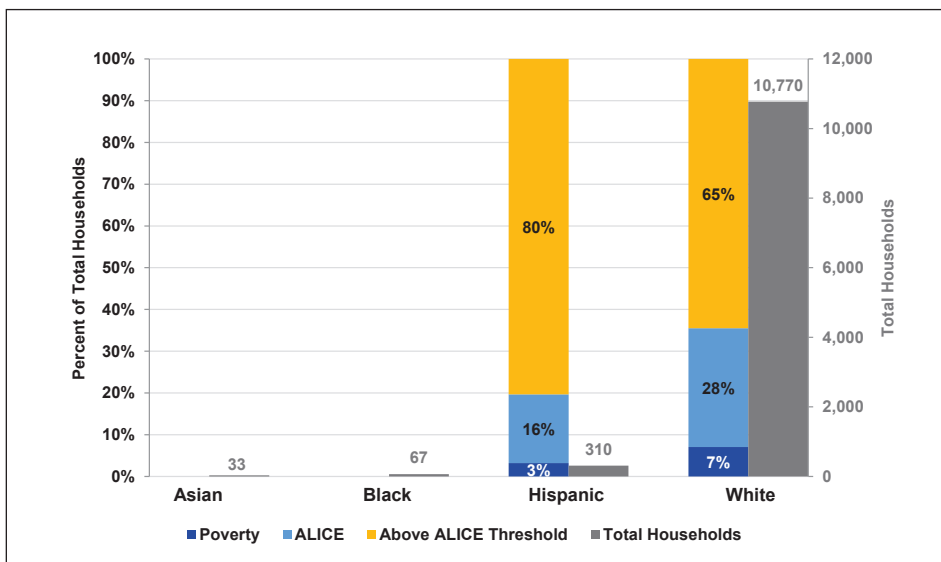
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Wells County, 2023

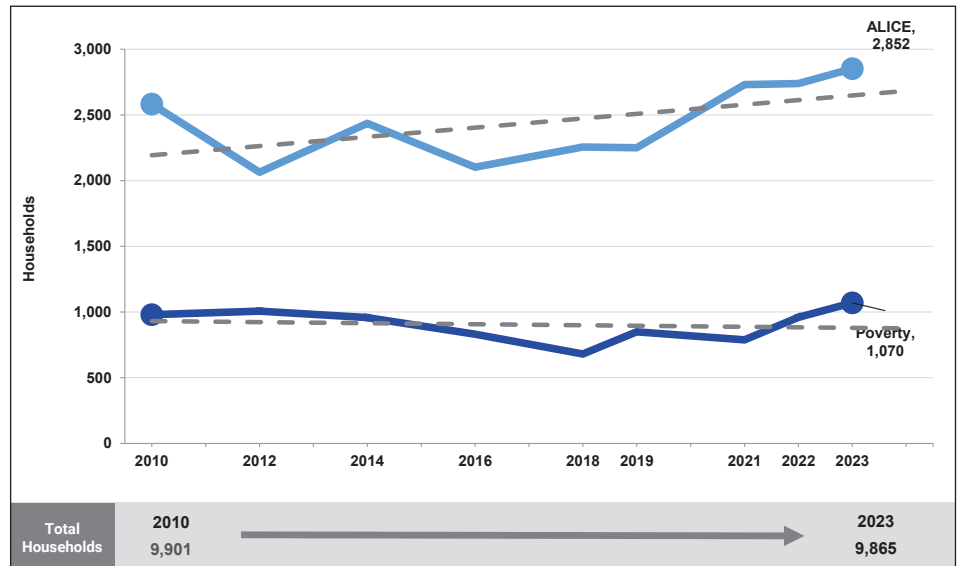

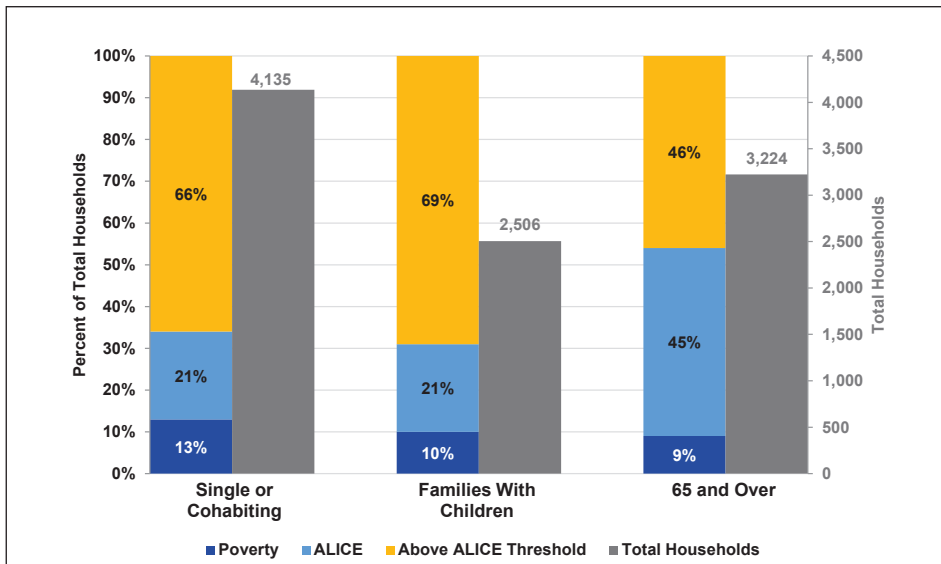

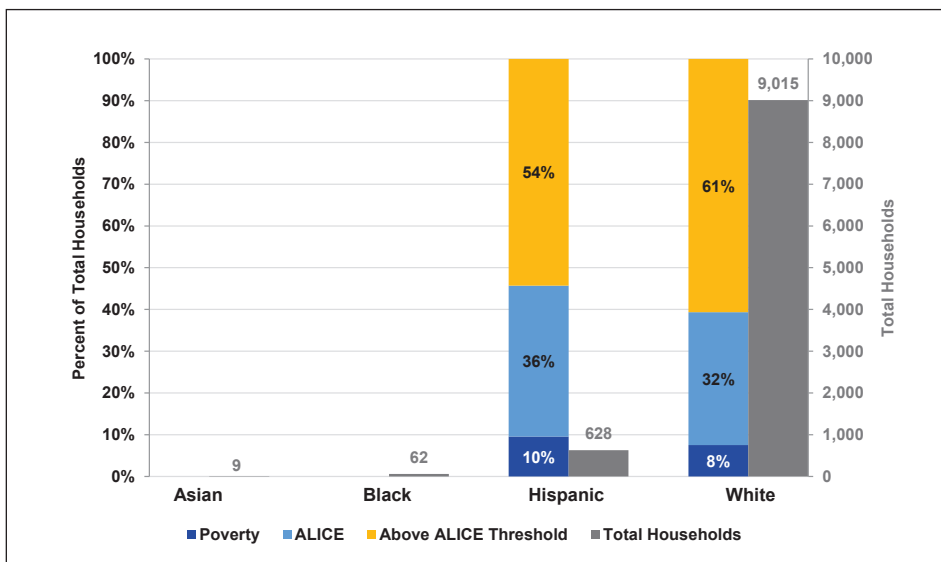
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, White County, 2023

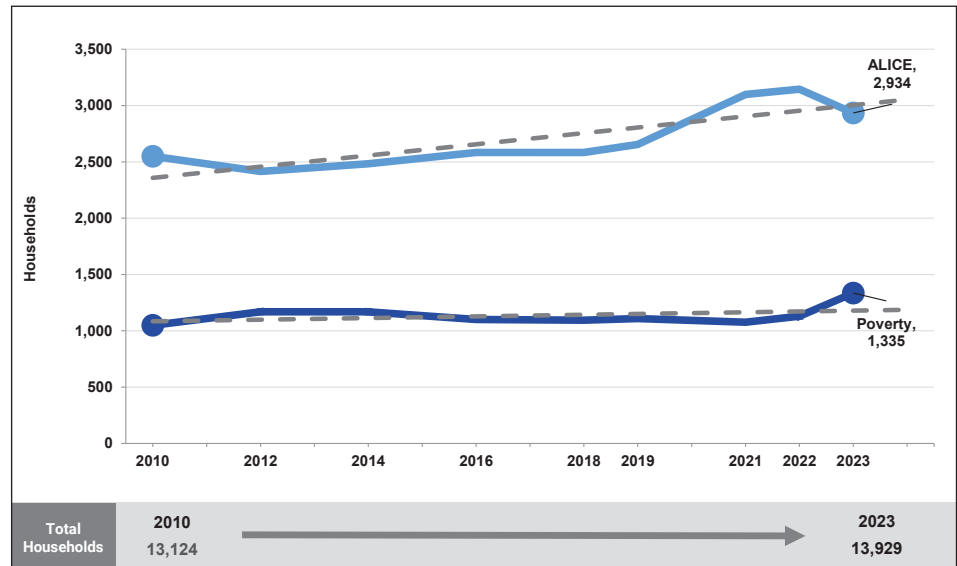

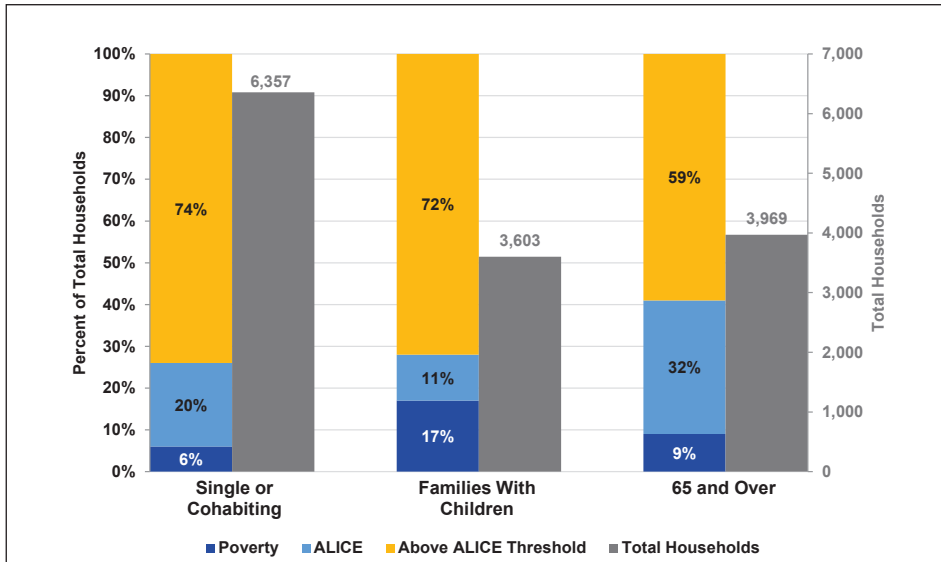

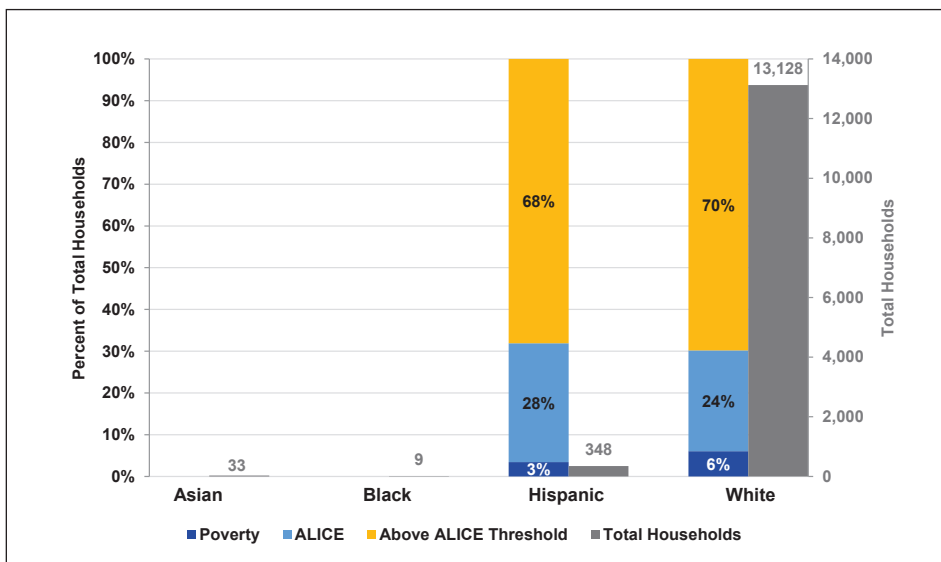
## Household Financial Status by Household Type, Whitley County, 2023
